Article 5.4

The Members of the Council under Article 5.1 (k) and 5.1(l), shall be appointed in the manner as prescribed in the Bylaws.





MINUTES OF 59TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA HELD ON 21 APRIL 2018 AT MALAKOFF AUDITORIUM, GROUND FLOOR, WISMA IEM, PETALING JAYA AT 9.00 AM

MEMBERS PRESENT - AS PER APPENDIX A

1.0 OPENING ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT

1.1 The President, Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin thanked and welcomed members present at the 59th AGM. He informed that three (3) different rooms were being used for the AGM, namely the Tan Sri Prof Ir. Chin Fung Kee Auditorium located on the 3rd Floor, the C&S/TUS Lecture Room on the 2nd floor and lastly the Malakoff Auditorium on the ground floor, which was the main room for the AGM.

The President further informed that video conferencing would be held in the two rooms on the third floor and second floor respectively (*Tan Sri Prof Ir. Chin Fung Kee Auditorium and C&S/TUSTD Lecture room*). The President also informed that Secretariat staff were stationed in each of the rooms to assist members during the AGM especially on posing questions as well as confirming the minutes the last AGM. The President also reminded that members who wish to raise questions should provide their name and membership number during the Q&A sessions for record purposes. The President then proceeded to present the overall report/updates on IEM for session 2017/2018.

1.2 Updates on IEM for Session 2017/2018

The President informed that the current standing of the IEM membership was 45,666 members comprising of the various grades. The President further explained that IEM had been promoting the Incorporated and Associate membership to mainly cater for the Engineering Technologists and Technicians. The main objective was to make IEM more inclusive and to attain long term sustainability for the Institution.

The President continued his presentation on the issue concerning the amendments to IEM Constitution. He informed the AGM that IEM had allocated five (5) seats for the Companion or Graduate and one (1) seat for Women Engineers in Council for voting rights. It was noted that the Registrar of Society (ROS) had approved the amendments.

The AGM was informed that IEM had signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) on 16 November 2017. In addition to this, IEM had also signed MoUs with five (5) Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) during the session namely Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP), AIMST University, Nilai University, Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) and USCI.

In addition to the above, the President further informed that IEM had renewed the MoU with the Miri City Council on 20 April 2017. This initiative was mainly to continue the good relations, cooperation and networking especially in jointly organising public awareness programmes and assisting the local councils to provide better services and amenities to the community.

With regard to signing MoU with organisations and corporations, the AGM was informed that IEM had signed MoUs with six (6) organisations i.e. Malaysian Geotechnical Society (MGS), The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia (TEEAM), Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (MIROS), Technological Association of Malaysia (TAM), Malaysian Oil and Gas Engineering Council (MOGEC) and Rapid Rail Sdn Bhd. It was hoped that more MoUs would be signed to ensure that IEM was well represented in other organisations.

The President also briefed the AGM that IEM is currently active with other Government agencies by sending representatives to collaborate with the agencies on engineering matters as well as serving in the Government departments or technical committees. The President hoped that IEM should continue to work with the Government agencies and assist them wherever possible.

The AGM was informed that IEM continues to maintain a good rapport with local professional bodies and learned societies. With regards to media engagement, IEM continued to produce press statements. For the session 2017/2018, IEM had issued eight (8) press statements and fifty (50) press clippings were published in the media, and these statements had been uploaded onto the IEM Web Portal.

On conferences and activities, the President informed the AGM that IEM had organised two (2) major conferences, four hundred twenty (420) evening talks, four hundred and twenty one courses together workshops/seminar as well as seven (7) technical visits during the last session.

The AGM was also informed that IEM had bid for the World Tunnel Congress 2020 (WTC2020) of which Malaysia beat India and Australia with 30 votes. The President further informed that this event was considered the largest that IEM had ever organised as there would be 2000 international delegates as well as 100 booths to be exhibited for the event. The President mentioned that the event would be organised by the IEM Training Centre and it was hoped that it would be a success so that IEM would be able to gain profit of approximately one (1) to two (2) million ringgit. Apart from WTC2020, there would be another big event for IEM to host i.e. the Asia Pacific Confederation of Chemical Engineering (APCChE) Congress and Board Meeting 2021.





The President further briefed the AGM that IEM participated in the following international events and meetings that took place during the session 2017/2018:

- 17th APPChE Congress from 23-27 Aug 2017 in Hong Kong
- 35th AFEO Governing Board Meeting from 15 -18 Nov 2017 Bangkok, Thailand
- WFEO General Assembly, WFEO Committee in Women in Engineering (WIE) and WFEO Standing Committee on Engineering for Innovative Technologies (WFEO-CEIT), 26 Nov - 3 Dec 2017 in Rome, Italy

2.0 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF 58th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 15 APRIL 2017

The President invited members present to go through the minutes of the previous AGM which was printed on pages 75 until page 85. The AGM was also requested to go through the attendance list from pages 86 to 89 as well as the Bahasa Malaysia version which was on pages 90 to 100.

As there were no errors highlighted in the minutes, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) proposed that the minutes of the 58th Annual General Meeting held on 15 April 2017 be confirmed and adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Zulkifly bin Madon (M05132).

2.1 Confirmation of Minutes of the Special General Meeting held on 14 October 2017

The President then invited members present to go through the minutes of the previous Special General Meeting from pages 101 to 102 and the Bahasa Malaysia version which was on pages 103 to 104.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) raised the question for item 1.4.2 of the Special General Meeting minutes whether Article 4.3 was approved. He commented that the way it was written indicated that it was not approved. He further informed that the suggestion he made at the said meeting with the added phrase ".....which are in line with the objective of the Institution" was actually not approved whereas the original proposal was approved by the Registrar of Societies (ROS). Hence, the President agreed that the following should be amended accordingly:

"Voting was carried out on the original proposal and the results were as follows":

Since there were no further amendments/errors highlighted in the minutes, Ir. Razmahwata bin Mohamad Razalli (F17029) proposed that the minutes of the Special General Meeting held on 14 October 2017 be confirmed and adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Ho Choon Kwang (M17178).

3.0 MATTERS ARISING

The President went through and provided clarifications on the following items:

58th Annual General Meeting held on 15 April 2017

Page 81 - 8.1.1

Amendments to the IEM Constitution

The President reported that the amendments on this item as well as the other amendments passed by the SGM on 14 October were sent out for balloting. The AGM was further informed that the members returned the favourable votes on the proposed amendments and the amendments were then submitted to ROS. The approval was received on 20 December 2017.

The President further informed that the five (5) Companion and Graduate Members would be invited to serve in Council after the AGM of the Young Engineers Section in June 2018 while a representative from the WE Section would be invited at the first Council meeting of the session 2018/2019.

Page 76 - 3.0

Award for Branches

The President reported that with regard to the proposal to extend the Presidential Award of Excellence (PAOE) competition to the IEM Branches, the Standing Committee on Activities was of the opinion that since not all Branches were at the same level of development and activeness, this could result in a lopsided competition.





4.0 ANNUAL REPORT FOR SESSION 2018/2019

The President then invited the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Yap Soon Hoe to present the various activities and events organised in 2017 which were printed on pages 117 to 168 of the Annual Report.

4.1 Council and Excomm

For the session 2017/2018, a total of five (5) Council meetings were held. The Council at their meetings discussed matters related to management of properties and affairs of the Institution. Excomm had thirteen (13) meetings for session 2017/2018 and the role of Excomm was to implement and carry out the decisions of the Council.

4.2 Representation to BEM

The AGM was informed that there were five (5) representatives who have been appointed to serve in the BEM. In addition, there were a total of nine (9) IEM representatives who had also be appointed to serve in various Committees of BEM as well as six (6) representatives appointed to serve in the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC).

4.3 Membership

The total membership to date was 45,666 and the AGM was informed that IEM is trying its best to achieve 100K which was set by Past President, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong.

The Honorary Secretary further informed that up to 31 December 2017, a total of 7,808 candidates were approved for admission/election/transfer to the various grades which was under the purview of the Standing Committee on Admissions and Practical Training (APT) chaired by Ir. Prof Dr Norlida bt Buniyamin.

4.4 International Registers

For the international registers and affiliations, it was recorded that for the year 2017, 20 members had signed up as ASEAN Engineers (ASEAN Eng), and 43 were approved for the Associate ASEAN Engineers (AAE) while 43 were approved for IPEA/ APEC International Engineer Registers (IntPE).

4.5 IEM Log Book

The AGM was informed that the Sub Committee on Log Book chaired by Ir. Peter Han Seng Kong was in the midst of revising the format of the log book to align with the enhanced Professional Interview.

4.6 **IEM Training Board**

Ir. Li Thang Fai chaired the Training Board and a total of 618 applications both from IEM's own programmes and other training providers' programmes had been approved for CPD by the Training Board.

4.7 Enhanced PI Process

The AGM was informed that starting 1 January 2018, the conventional PI was no longer accepted. It has been replaced with the enhanced PI process. The AGM was further informed that as a result, the number of conventional PI applications received end of 2017 was approximately 1000.

The implementation of the enhanced PI was under the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualification (E&Q) chaired by Ir. Lee Boon Chong.

4.8 Professional Interview Board

AGM noted that for session 2017/2018, a total of 925 applied to sit for the Professional Interview (PI). A total of 497 candidates have passed which made up rate of 86.5%. The number of candidates who failed the PI was 77 which made up a failure rate of 13.5%. A total of 186 candidates are still waiting for their results. The PI Board was chaired by Ir. Tu Yong Eng.

4.9 Information and Publications

The Honorary Secretary informed the AGM that Ir. Prof. Dr Ruslan bin Hassan who chaired the Standing Committee on InfoPub had published twelve (12) issues of the "Jurutera" (IEM Bulletin) in 2017. It was further reported that two (2) issues of the Journal was published in 2017.

4.10 **IEM Library**

The AGM further noted that the IEM Library had increased its collection of 6,834 printed book titles in 2017 to 6,954 in 2018 covering a variety of disciplines. The IEM library has also acquired 272 e-books on engineering and technology topics.





4.11 Presidential Award of Excellence

The Honorary Secretary then announced the results of the 2017 Presidential Award of Excellence as follows:

4.12 Outside Bodies Representations

The AGM was informed that a Working Group was formed under the Standing Committee on Professional Practice (PPC) chaired by Ir. Lai Sze Ching to study and re-structure the current Outside Body Representation (OBR) appointment system and thereon produce an OBR Manual. The main objective was to ensure that there was sustainability where the OBR was concerned and that the representatives should be well versed in that particular subject in order to produce quality reports.

4.13 Operations Manual for Branches

The Honorary Secretary informed the AGM that the IEM Operations Manual for Branches (OMB) was published to assist and guide the IEM Branches in planning, organising and improving their operations. This was under the purview of the Standing Committee on Corporate Affairs headed by Ir. Ong Ching Loon. It was further noted that the OMB contains the terms, procedures and guidelines in which the Branches should govern themselves and for conducting Branch business. The Branch Manual would serve as the foundation document to provide continuity and standardisation of Branch operations across all Branches.

4.14 IEM Benevolent Fund

A total of RM27,979.94 was contributed by members for the session 2017/2018. IEM would like to record its appreciation to the members for their kind support and generosity. The balance available in the fund as at December 2017 is RM464,999.75.

4.15 IEM Family Day

The IEM Family Day 2017 was held on 7 May 2017 at SEGi University, Kota Damansara, Selangor and attracted more than 500 participants comprising IEM Council, IEM members and their families. It was reported that the next IEM Family Day would be held on 22 July 2018 at Persatuan Alumni Universiti Malaya.

4.16 Engineering Week 2017

The 21st IEM Engineering Week (EW2017) was held from 20-27 August 2017 with the theme "Engineering the World for a Better Future". EW2017 officially open with the IEM Engineer's Run 2017 held in Perdana Botanical Garden Kuala Lumpur participated by 1,000 runners. It was also reported that for the current year, Engineering Week will commence with the E-Run 2018 which is planned on 12 August 2018 at Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) and will end with the Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) competition on 18 August 2018. The venue would be Monash University.

4.17 Branding

The AGM was informed that the Intellectual Property Office (MyIPO) had approved IEM's application to trademark its new logo in July 2017. IEM thus embarked on a branding exercise to feature the new logo on its official letterhead, building signage, name-cards, lapel pins and car-stickers.

4.18 IEM Position Papers

The AGM was informed that currently there were two (2) position papers that were ongoing; one on "Employment of Professional Engineers in Key Government Positions" by Public Sector Engineers Special Interest Group (PSESIG) and there other was on "Building Railway Engineering Capacity for the Future" by Electrical Engineering Technical Division (EETD).

4.19 Questions Session – Annual Reports

4.19.1 Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) sought clarification from the Honorary Secretary with regard to the Membership (page 117, item 2.1). He queried on the membership figure for Senior Member which was 35. He felt that more members should be applying for this grade of membership. Ir. Vincent Chen believed that there could be a few reasons as to why the figure was low. He cited that one of the reasons could be the process involved and also commented that many members were reluctant to apply for the Senior Member grade due to the difference of the subscription fee between Member and Senior Member i.e. RM210.00 to RM155.00. He suggested that Council could look into simplifying the process by making it an automatic transfer and at the same time maintain the subscription at RM155.00 i.e. the same as Member grade.

He further added that another category that needed for Council to look into was the membership grade of Companion. He noted that many members were not comfortable with the name "Companion" and hence might not want to apply for the said grade. He further informed that there was a debate on suggesting a name for the grade at that time when the membership grade "Companion" was introduced. However, it was noted there were comments that the title was not appropriate. Hence, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) agreed with the proposed new name Senior Graduate Member and hoped that Council would approve the new name and do an automatic conversion for the said membership grade. He also hoped that with such changes made, IEM would be able to have at least 5,000 Senior M.I.E.M and 3,000-4,000 Companion members in a couple of years' time.

With regard to the IEM membership of 46,555, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) congratulated the Sub Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions (MDP) for doing a good job in increasing the membership. However, he pointed out that there was not much difference on the membership increase from 2014 until 2018 (page 117) if the Student membership figure was to be removed. He also commented that the same goes with Corporate as well as Graduate membership. Ir. Vincent Chen further commented that the main problem was the leakage in the membership. He explained that there would be quite a number of members who did not renew their membership and after a period of two (2) years, the members' status in the IEM membership portal would be stated as "Deleted" and this number normally make up around 4,000 - 5,000. Although the Sub Committee on Membership Drive would have been effortlessly recruiting members, the number of defaulting members and new members seemed to be about the same resulting in very low increase in the overall membership.

He reiterated that BEM's web portal as the day before indicated a registration of around 123,000 Professional Engineers and Graduate Engineers. He hoped that both Council and Excomm would be able to look into getting these engineers to be IEM members.

The President thanked Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong for his comments and suggestions and agreed that the Council would seriously look into putting more effort in this area. Although it was noted that registering with BEM was a one off payment fee while IEM membership was annually, he agreed with Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong's proposal to increase IEM membership.

Ir. Jayaseelan Nadarajah (F14445) requested for explanation on item 6.2.1 on page 123 and also item 4.4 on page 77. He queried that the number of passes in percentage did not tally. President clarified that the data on page 77 was based on 2016/2017 minutes whereas item 6.2.1 on page 123 was based on last year's figure (2017/2018). Nevertheless, President agreed that there should be another column to state the number of candidates who sat for the PI in order to have the figures tally.

Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) commented on President's statement that for Graduate Engineer, the registration fee was one-time whereas for IEM the member had to pay the subscription annually. Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) explained that besides the fee, Graduate Engineer registration was compulsory under the Registration of Engineers Act (REA) 1967 (revised 2015) while IEM Graduate membership was voluntary.

He added that even though BEM's registration of engineers was about 123,000, there was however a drop in the Professional Engineer registration as the fee was increased from RM200.00 to RM400.00.

Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) also commented that the "Companion" grade was not properly defined. President updated the AGM that the Council was seriously looking for a suitable name to replace "Companion" and this issue had been debated a year and half ago at Excomm level. The President further informed that this issue had to be studied carefully and hopefully by the next Excomm and Council meeting, the change of name would be accepted. It was also hoped that with the change of name, IEM membership would increase in the future.

Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) responded with regard to the comment on the IEM membership fee of RM155.00 to RM210.00. He informed that IEM was working hard to offer better benefits to the members and one of it was the 6% rebate given for purchasing a Mercedes Benz or BMW. In view of this, he felt that paying RM155.00 or RM210.00 was quite reasonable compared to being a member with other foreign Institutions where the membership fee was quite high. He concluded by stressing that it was the quality that matters for being an IEM member and not on the amount to pay for the membership fee.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828) supported Ir. David Lai's comment that the additional benefits offered was a great attraction and called on members present at AGM to capitalise on such benefits. He proposed that IEM should approach PROTON to engage a similar strategy for the benefit of the IEM members. Ir. Choo Kok Beng further informed that one of recommendations stated in the "Productivity Blue Print" that was launched last year, Malaysia does not have sufficient professionals to drive the productivity of the country. Hence, he suggested some incentives should be created for the professionals and as such, requested Council and Excomm to look into providing incentives for the IEM members to inspire them to be professional engineers.

Ir. Fam Yew Hin (M20926) informed the AGM that the Standing Committee on Welfare and Service Matters had produced the "IEM Loyalty Card" which also had other merchandises such as discounts from Focus Point where the members could enjoy 40% - 60% at their outlets. Apart from the purchase of cars, there were also discounts on accommodation at hotels etc. President thanked Ir. Fam Yew Hin for highlighting the various merchandises associated with the "IEM Loyalty Card".

Since there were no further comments or questions from the floor, Ir. Dr Ahmad Anuar bin Othman (F13148) proposed that the Annual Report be adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Dr Ng Soon Ching (M30662).





5.0 ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2017

- 5.1 The President then invited the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Dr. Wang Hong Kok to present the financial statements for The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia for the period 1st January 2017 to 31st December 2017. Ir. Dr Wang Hong Kok informed the AGM that the accounts presented would be from pages 193 to 216. However, he would only focus on pages 194, 195 and 196.
- 5.2 The Honorary Treasurer informed the AGM that the financial statements presented comprised of two sets of accounts. The figures did not include the financial position of the IEM Branches. He further informed that the Branches would file their own set of financial statements with the IRB of their respective States. It was reported that Excomm on 5 March 2018 decided that IEM would need to check the legality of not consolidating the Branch accounts. The Honorary Treasurer further informed that the columns denoted by "Group" referred to the consolidated accounts of the IEM Headquarters, IEM Training Centre and IEM Academy Sdn Bhd. He also explained that there were some columns where there were figures under "Institution" but blank under "Group" due to the figures being payment/receipt between IEM, IEM Training Centre (TC) and IEM Academy Sdn Bhd (ASB) which were eliminated on consolidation.
- 5.3 The Honorary Treasurer reported that on the overall, the Institution made a surplus of RM1,823,390 in 2017 compared to RM1,464,518 in 2016. It was further reported that the increase in total surplus was recorded at 24%. The total income for 2017 was RM6,617,499 compared to RM6,005,611 in 2016. The increase was due to the income from sale of Penang Branch property and also the dividend declared by IEM Training Centre amounting to RM489,289 an increase of 62%.
- 5.4 The AGM was further informed that the main contributors to the total income was the members subscription which was 51%; disposal of properties which was 22%; others which comprised of subscription recovered, membership reinstatement, miscellaneous income, arbitration levy, etc. which came up to 9%; disposal of property 22%; institutional services 6%; dividend 7%; rental surplus 3% and interest income was 2% of the total income.

The Annual Subscriptions collection for the year 2017 was 84.8%, a dropped of 5.2% compared to 2016 which was 90%.

- 5.5 The Honorary Treasurer informed that the total expenses for 2017 was RM4,712,539 an increase of 3.5% compared to 2016 amounting to RM4,550,160. The increase was mainly due to personal emoluments and administrative expenses.
- 5.6 The Honorary Treasurer further reported that the main contributors to the total expenses items were personnel emoluments 57% whereas the administrative expenses was 27%. The increase in the administrative expenses was due to increase in office printing and stationery as well as the mailing expenses and postage due to the increase in membership.

The President thanked the Honorary Treasurer for his report and proceeded to invite questions from the floor.

5.7 Questions Session – Accounts

5.7.1. YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) commented that the arrears in subscription was approximately half a million and queried whether there were any findings on why the membership was in arrears and whether any action taken by IEM to encourage the members to pay. He suggested that a study be made to encourage the members to pay especially when IEM had introduced additional benefits such as the purchase of a luxury car with a 6% discount.

President agreed that more improvements should be done on promotions. Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) explained that the subscriptions in arrears was approximately RM226,000 and efforts had been made such as Secretariat contacting the members on their subscription in arrears. Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) also supported the motion that IEM should find ways in strengthening the benefits in various areas. This could be in the form of increasing the number of merchants for discounts, conducting more activities with CPD points, etc. He further explained that the Standing Committee on Finance had set up a Special Committee and they were looking seriously on the arrears in subscription.

5.7.2 Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah @ Lim Teik Keat (Hon.F01691) commented on the surplus of RM1,863,000 in 2017 against RM1,263,000 in 2016. He further commented that IEM actually had a smaller surplus compared to last year. The AGM was further informed that the surplus came from the disposal of the IEM Penang Branch property. Hence, this should be removed to show that IEM had actually 1/3 of the surplus from the year 2017. He further explained that IEM's rental had dropped and might even drop further in 2018.

The Honorary Treasurer explained to the AGM that due to the termination of rental from the last tenant, the Standing Committee of Finance was seriously working hard to get tenants to occupy the vacant space at Wisma IEM.

The Deputy President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) continued to inform that it was true that the income from IEM was decreasing. He pointed out that IEM lost RM120,000 every month since the tenant moved out. The AGM was later informed that the IEM Training Centre (TC) had then taken up certain section. He further explained that there were discussions with various interested parties and there was one who was keen on renting the space at Wisma IEM

The Deputy President also informed that based on the current market rate on rental, the prospective tenant would only be paying approximately RM30,000 per month. In order to maintain the financial position of IEM, there would be a need to generate about RM50,000 from Wisma IEM's rental. The Standing Committee on Finance had been considering other alternatives to make up the shortfall of RM20,000, one of which was to convert the some area of the ground floor into a "display gallery" as an attraction for the market players to display their products. It was hoped that this could help recover the RM200,000 subscription in arrears as well as the shortfall on the revenue from the Technical Divisions which was approximately RM200,00.





- 5.7.3 Ir. Gunasagaran a/I Kristnan (M08216) queried that the Honorary Treasurer reported that there was a drop of RM516,065 on the arrears in subscription but Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi mentioned that it was RM216,000. He wanted to know why there was a difference in the explanation given.
 - The Honorary Treasurer explained that when IEM billed in 2017, it was RM3,388,097 but what was collected was RM2,872,032. Hence, the difference in arrears was RM516,065 whereas in the year 2016, the collection was RM3,440,942 and the subscription in arrears was RM341,989. He further explained that this could be seen in Note 7 of the financial statement.
- 5.7.4 Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) pointed out that apart from the disposal of the IEM Penang Branch property, generally IEM had a few hundred thousand surplus. Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik also agreed with Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah @ Lim Teik Keat (Hon.F01691) on the anticipated drop in rental income. However, he reminded the AGM that the main intention of purchasing Wisma IEM was to have more space for IEM to conduct more activities for the members. He commented that it was time for Council to seriously consider of allocating more space for activities and benefits for the members to enjoy the facilities at Wisma IEM such as setting up a fitness or health centre which could also generate income as well as provide good services to the members. In conclusion, Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) informed the AGM that IEM's financial situation was considered sustainable. The President then thanked Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) for his comments and proposal.
 - Ir. Dr Ahmad Anuar bin Othman (F13148), mentioned that 51% came from the members' subscriptions. He further informed that a few years ago, IEM used to give a token of appreciation for example a "pen-drive" to the members who renewed their annual subscription. Hence, he felt that IEM should be providing such token again for the renewal. The President agreed to look into this issue.
- 5.7.5 As there were no further questions from the floor, Ir. Gunasagaran a/l Kristnan (M08216) proposed the adoption of the Financial Statements for IEM for the year ended 31 December 2017. The motion was seconded by YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015). The AGM then adopted the Financial Statement.

6.0 EDUCATION FUND FINANCIAL STATEMENT - 31 DECEMBER 2017

- 6.1 The Honorary Treasurer then continued to report on the Financial Statements of the Education Fund for the year ending 31 December 2017 from page 222 to page 232.
- 6.2 The AGM was informed that donations received amounted to RM227,036 in 2017 compared to RM127,881 in 2016. The Fixed Deposit Interest earned amounted to RM38,132 compared to RM37,433 in 2016.

On the expenditure side, the Honorary Treasurer reported that the scholarship given out in 2017 was RM29,500. He further informed that other expenses were for talks amounting to RM6,225; Overseas Conferences RM49,406 and Student Section Subsidy RM5,500 and other expenses were at RM2,414.

He also informed the AGM that for scholarships, students who received the grants under the Mr. Koon Yew Yin Scholarship had completed the studies in 2017. The scholarship had also depleted. However, with the additional contribution of RM100,000 from Mr. Koon Yew Yin at the end of 2017, interviews would be held in 2018 for new scholarship recipients.

The Honorary Treasurer further reported that for the overall performance, there was a surplus of RM178,633 compared to deficit of RM233,168 in 2016. The AGM noted that the total sponsorship and scholarship expenditure of RM97,365 complied with the Revenue Board's (IRB) requirement to spend at least 50% of the donation received in the previous year.

The Honorary Treasurer explained that the total income for 2016 was RM166,233 and the need to achieve 50% had been achieved (RM83,116).

- 6.3 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) queried whether IEM had any programme to encourage the members to donate to the Education Fund. He noted that the fund was rather stagnant apart from the donation received from Mr. Koon Yew Yin. The President then explained that IEM had come up with a scholarship fund to be named after the person who contributed and have also reserved a few scholarship funds named after the Past Presidents.
- 6.4 Since there were no questions from the floor, Ir. Sreedaran a/l A. Raman (M38681) proposed the adoption of the Education Fund financial statement for the year ended 31 December 2017 and the motion was supported by Ir. Dr Chuah Joon Huang (M57551). The AGM then adopted the Education Fund financial statement.

7.0 DISCUSSION ON WRITTEN ISSUES RECEIVED FROM MEMBERS

The President informed the AGM that there were no written issues received from the members.

8.0 ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ELECTION RESULTS FOR COUNCIL 2018/2019 SESSION

The President then invited the Election Officer, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon to announce the results of the election for the session 2018/2019.





8.1 President

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon informed the AGM that in accordance with Section 5.2 of the IEM Bylaws, the current Deputy President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi, being the President-elect assumes the office of President for sessions 2018/2019 upon the completion of the term of office of the incumbent President, Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin.

8.2 **Deputy President**

The AGM was informed that the successful candidate for the post of Deputy President was Ir. Ong Ching Loon for the sessions 2018/2019.

8.3 Vice Presidents, Hon Secretary, Hon Treasurer and Others

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon then informed the AGM on the results of nomination and the subsequent balloting exercise.

8.3.1 Office of Council Member - Chemical Representative (One (1) vacancy for 3 sessions, 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021)

The AGM was informed that there was no nomination received for this post. The IEM Council at its 410th meeting held on 15 January 2018 decided to nominate Ir. Prof. Dr Lee Tin Sin as the candidate for this office. Thus, Ir. Prof. Dr Lee Tin Sin was duly elected unopposed to the office of Council Member – Chemical Representative for the sessions 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021.

- 8.4 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon then informed the AGM that the following offices required balloting:
 - Vice President
 - · Honorary Secretary
 - Honorary Treasurer
 - Council Members Ordinary Representatives

8.4.1 Office of Vice President (Three (3) vacancies for 2 sessions 2018/2019 and 2019/2020)

The AGM was informed that measures were taken to get the ballot papers sent out to members for the offices which required balloting i.e. Vice Presidents, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and Ordinary Council members. A total of 10,580 ballot papers were sent and delivered to Corporate Members. A total of 1,706 ballot papers were received at the IEM when the Ballot Box was opened on 7 April 2018. After checking and verification of ballot papers, counting of votes were carried out to determine the successful candidates.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon further informed the AGM that there were six (6) nominations received for the three (3) vacancies. The following three (3) candidates with the highest number of votes were duly elected to the office of Vice President for the sessions 2018/2019 and 2019/2020:

8.5 Office of Honorary Secretary (One (1) vacancy for session 2018/2019)

There were two (2) nominations received for the one (1) vacancy. The candidate, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad received the higher number of votes and was duly elected to the office of Honorary Secretary for the session 2018/2019.

8.6 Office of Honorary Treasurer (One (1) vacancy for session 2018/2019)

Three (3) nominations were received and the candidate, Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai receiving the highest number of votes, was duly elected to the office of Honorary Treasurer for the session 2018/2019.

8.7 Office of Council Member – Ordinary Representative (Ten (10) vacancies for 3 sessions, 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021)

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon proceeded to report that there were twenty-one (21) nominations received and the following ten (10) candidates with the highest number of votes were duly elected to the Office of Council Member – Ordinary Representative for 3 sessions, 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021):

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- 8.8 The AGM noted that the Election process took about three (3) months and the total cost was RM28,157.11 (balloting document and postage) excluding IEM staff cost.
- 8.9 The AGM was also informed that a total of 10,580 ballot papers were mailed out. Approximately 84% of the members did not return their ballot papers to record their votes for the candidates nominated to represent their interests on the IEM Council.
- 8.10 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon then thanked the Scrutineers, Ir. Prof. Dr Zainal Abidin bin Ahmad, Ir. Prof. Dr Siti Hawa Hamzah, Ir. Hj. Mohd Ali Yusof, Ir. S. Kukanesan, Ir. Ong Ching Loon and Ir. Prof. Dr Leong Wai Yie for their valuable assistance and support and also thanked the Secretariat for their full cooperation.

The President thanked YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon for his presentation and also the Scrutineers and the IEM Secretariat for their assistance and support.

9.0 PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

The Executive Director, Ir. Cheang Kok Meng then invited the President, Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin to present the following awards:

- 9.1 IEM Best Technical Paper for Corporate Member Category Civil Discipline (for two winners) The Tan Sri Ir. Hj. Yusoff Prize
 - (i) The award was presented to Dato' Ir. Paul Ha Tiing Tai for his paper entitled "Positioning to Undertake Underground Works Contract a Malaysian Experience"
 - (ii) The other recipient to receive the award was Ir. Dr Dominic Ong Ek Leong for his paper entitled "Severe Damage of a Pile Group Due to Pile Group to Slope Failure". Ir. Dr Dominic Ong Ek was not present to receive the award.

9.2. Tan Sri Hj. Yusoff Ibrahim Best Final Year Project

The AGM was informed that in 2017, IEM introduced the Tan Sri Hj. Yusoff Ibrahim Best Final Year Project.

The AGM was further informed that invitation letters were sent to 37 accredited universities and a total of 24 submissions were received. The overall winner will receive a cash prize of RM1000, a trophy and certificate. The winner was Sdr. Yap Kian Kun, a Mechanical Enigneering student from Malaysia – Japan International Institute of Technology (MJIIT), Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) with his project entitled "Influence of Adsorbed Water on Adhesive Wear".

It was noted that there were three (3) special prize winners in the specific disciplines who were not able to be present to receive the awards. Nevertheless, the prizes would be sent to them. They were:

- (i) Sdr Zech Chan Sze Zher from Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR) with his project entitled "Skin-Alike Soft Sensing Wearable Device"
- (ii) Sdr Foo Swee Wen from Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) with his project entitled "3D Modelling Using Solidworks: Wall Mounted Rainwater Tank from Stormwater Detention in Commercial Areas"
- (iii) Sdri Nur Fatin Ajeera binti Mohd Isa from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM) with project entitled "Proses Penulenan Asid Suksinik dari Medium Sintetik dan Campuran Kaldu Fermentasi melalui Kaedah Penghabluran"

12.0 Changeover of Office

The Executive Director then invited Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin and the new President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi for on the handover of chain of office. A token of appreciation was presented to Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin by the new President.

The new members of Council including the Vice Presidents, Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer were then invited to take their place at the podium. Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi then proceeded to chair the AGM.

13.0 PAST PRESIDENTS ELECTED BY COUNCIL TO SERVE IN THE COUNCIL

- 13.1 The new President informed the AGM that Council had extended invitations to the following five (5) Past Presidents and they had accepted the invitation:

14.0 ELECTION OF HONORARY INTERNAL AUDITORS

14.1 The President then proceeded to call for nominations for the position of Honorary Internal Auditors. The AGM decided to retain Ir. Awangku Hidup Bin Awangku Hosain (M03053) as the Honorary Internal Auditor for session 2018/2019. The motion was proposed by Ir. Ellias bin Saidin (F10100) and seconded by Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (F01922). Ir. Tiong Ngo Pu (M07252) was also re-appointed as the second internal auditor for session 2018/2019. The re-appointment was proposed by Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05613) and seconded by Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128).

As there was no objection from the floor, both re-appointments were unanimously approved.

15.0 APPOINTMENT OF EXTERNAL AUDITORS

15.1 The President informed the AGM that the Council at the last meeting had re-appointed PKF Malaysia as the External Auditors for 2018/2019. The AGM endorsed the appointment.





16.0 ANY OTHER BUSINESS (AOB)

The President invited the AGM to raise any issues for discussion.

- 16.1 Ir. Sivalingam a/I Velupillai (F09546) informed the AGM that he used to attend the IEM activities during the late 1990's and early 2000 and thereafter did not attend until the year 2017. He informed that the services provided by the IEM Secretariat had improved tremendously and would like to congratulate the Secretariat as well as the management staff who were involved with the recruitment for a job well done. President then thanked Ir. Siva for such remarks as this would motivate the IEM Secretariat.
- 16.2 Dr Siow Chun Lim (M79391) queried on IEM's vision of being "the premier professional organisation pivotal to Malaysia achieving 2020". He questioned on IEM's vision after the year 2020 since it would be just a couple of years away. The President informed that IEM had now changed the vision to 2050 and this would be mentioned in his Presidential Address.
- 16.3 Ir. Lau Win Sang (M04323) who was the Past Chairman of the IEM Perak Branch requested for the list of members in arrears of subscription so that the Branch would take the responsibility of reminding these members in default to pay and be active members again. President thanked Ir. Lau Wing Sang for the suggestion as the assistance from the IEM Branches was essential especially on the arrears in subscription.
- 16.4 Ir. Lim Kim Ten (M24468) commented on IEM's representative to outside bodies especially on attending the technical meetings. He felt that IEM should come up with a guideline as well to ensure that the representatives attending the meeting should be competent in the areas they were required to represent. President explained that the Standing Committee on Corporate Affairs was currently drafting the guidelines on this issue.
- Ir. Jayaseelan Nadarajah (F14445) commented that the level of English in the IEM flyers and Jurutera was lacking as he noticed that there were too many grammatical and spelling errors. He suggested that the Editorial Board should proofread before publishing the articles. He felt it would be quite embarrassing for IEM should such mistakes occur in the Jurutera and the flyers especially so when the magazine had been sent to other foreign engineering institutions such as ICE, IMechE, IET and so forth. President thanked Ir. Jayaseelan for his comments and assured that this matter would be looked into for further improvement.
- 16.6 Ir. Dr Jeyanthi Ramasamy (M29131) observed that more women engineers are studying in the institutions of higher learning compared to men. However, where IEM was concerned, the majority members were men. She further informed the AGM that according to the national agenda, there was a need to have at least 30% involvement of female workers in the organisation/workforce. However, she commented that for the IEM election, only three (3) women members were elected to serve in the Council. She stressed that there were talented women engineers in the market who could be given the opportunity to be invited. These women engineers could then be groomed to become professional engineers. President thanked Ir. Jeyanthi for her comments and concerns and informed that this issue would also be mentioned in his presidential address. He cited that having three (3) women engineers in the IEM Council was indeed an achievement where IEM was concerned.
- 16.7 Ir. Simon Yeong Chin Chow (18660) questioned whether there was any result on the passing rate of the Professional Competency Examination (PCE) conducted by BEM last November. President informed that the first PCE conducted had 6% passing rate whereas the second examination had 18%.
 - Ir. Lee Boon Chong (F08092) further clarified that most of them were repeating candidates. It was noted that approximately 200 candidates sat for the PCE which was considered an improvement on the passing rate.
- 16.8 Ir. Mohd Radzi bin Salleh (F20112) agreed that although the location of the Wisma IEM was good, he queried whether there were any safety features and conditions that would attract the tenants. 1.0 UCAPAN ALUAN OLEH YANG DI PERTUA

1.1 Yang DiPertua, Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin mengucapkan terima kasih dan mengalu-alukan kehadiran ahli ke Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan yang ke-59. Beliau juga melaporkan bahawa IEM sedang menjalankan promosi untuk gred keahlian "Incorporated" dan "Associate" khususnya untuk para "Engineering Technologists" dan "Technician". Matlamat utamanya adalah supaya IEM dapat mengekalkan kemampanan jangka panjang.

Beliau juga melaporkan bahawa pindaan Perlembagaan IEM di mana lima (5) kerusi diperuntukkan untuk ahli "Companion" dan Siswazah dan satu (1) kerusi untuk wakil Jurutera Wanita dalam Majlis IEM telah diluluskan oleh Pendaftar Pertubuhan.

MAT juga telah dimaklumkan bahawa IEM telah menandatangani Memorandum Persefahaman (MoU) dengan American Institute of Chemical Engineers (AIChE) pada 16 November 2017. Di samping itu, MoU juga telah ditandatangani dengan lima (5) institusi pengajian tinggi iaitu Universiti Malaysia Pahang (UMP), AIMST, Nilai University, Universiti Malaysia Sarawak (UNIMAS) dan USCI.

MoU dengan Majlis Bandaraya Miri (MBM) juga telah diperbaharui pada 20 April 2017. Tujuan utama initiatif ini adalah untuk meneruskan perhubungan dan kerjasama yang baik dengan MBM terutamanya dalam penganjuran bersama program kesedaran awam selain daripada membantu majlis-majlis tempatan menyalurkan perkhidmatan dan kemudahan yang baik kepada komuniti masing-masing.

IEM juga telah menandatangani MoU dengan enam (6) buah organisasi iaitu Malaysian Geotechnical Society (MGS), The Electrical and Electronics Association of Malaysia (TEEAM), Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (MIROS), Technological Association of Malaysia (TAM), Malaysian Oil and Gas Engineering Council (MOGEC) dan Rapid Rail Sdn Bhd. Objektif utama MoU adalah untuk membina kerjasama yang baik dengan organisasi-organisasi tersebut.

Yang DiPertua juga telah memaklumkan bahawa wakil-wakil IEM aktif dalam memberi khidmat nasihat khususnya perkaraperkara berkaitan dengan isu-isu kejuruteraan dalam agensi-agensi kerajaan dan jawatankuasa-jawatankuasa teknikal. IEM juga giat dalam meneruskan hubungan baik dengan pertubuhan-pertubuhan profesional dalam negara.

Sepanjang sesi 2017/2018, IEM telah mengeluarkan lapan (8) kenyataan akhbar dan 50 klip akhbar yang diterbitkan oleh pihak media. Kesemuanya boleh didapati dari laman web IEM.

IEM telah menganjurkan dua (2) persidangan antarabangsa, empat ratus dua puluh (420) ceramah, empat ratus dua puluh satu (421) kursus/bengkel/seminar serta tujuh (7) lawatan teknikal sepanjang sesi yang lepas.

MAT turut dimaklumkan bahawa IEM telah berjaya dalam tawaran untuk menganjurkan "World Tunnel Congress 2020" (WTC2020) di mana Malaysia Berjaya menewaskan India dan Australia dengan jumlah kiraan 30 undi. Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan MAT bahawa persidangan ini akan menjadi aktiviti paling besar yang pernah dianjurkan oleh IEM dengan anggaran kehadiran 2,000 peserta persidangan dan 100 penganjur pameran. Persidangan dan pameran tersebut akan dianjurkan oleh IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd dan diharapkan kejayaan aktiviti itu akan meraih keuntungan untuk IEM antara satu hingga dua juta ringgit malaysia. Selain daripada WTC2020, IEM juga telah berjaya dalam tawaran untuk mejadi penganjur bagi Asia Pacific Confederation of Chemical Engineering (APCChE) Congress dan Mesyuarat Lembaga APCChE pada tahun 2021.





Yang DiPertua seterusnya memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa IEM telah mengambil bahagian dalam aktiviti-aktiviti antarabangsa yang berikut sepanjang sesi 2017/2018:

2.0 PENGESAHAN MINIT MESYUARAT AGUNG TAHUNAN YANG KE 58 YANG DIADAKAN PADA 15 APRIL 2017

Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput ahli yang hadir untuk membuat semakan minit Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan seperti yang telah dicetak di muka surat 75 hingga 85 dalam Laporan Tahunan serta senarai kehadiran dari mukasurat 86 hingga 89. Versi Bahasa Malaysia terdapat di mukasurat 90 hingga 100.

Memandangkan tidak ada ralat yang disuarakan dalam minit tersebut, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) mencadangkan minit Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-58 yang diadakan pada 15 April 2017 disahkan. Usul itu disokong oleh Ir. Zulkifly bin Madon (M05132).

2.1 Pengesahan Minit Mesyuarat Agung Khas yang diadakan pada 14 Oktober 2017

Yang DiPertua seterusnya menjemput ahli yang hadir untuk membuat semakan minit Mesyuarat Agung Khas seperti yang telah dicetak di mukasurat 101 dan 102 serta versi Bahasa Malaysia di mukasurat 103 dan 1044.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) membangkitkan soalan untuk perkara 1.4.2 dalam minit Mesyuarat Agung Khas samada Artikel 4.3 telah diluluskan. Beliau memberi komen bahawa cara laporan dibuat dalam minit menunjukkan seolah-oleh perkara tersebut tidak diluluskan. Beliau juga mengingatkan MAT bahawa usul yang beliau cadangkan pada masa itu untuk menambahkan frasa ".....which are in line with the objective of the Institution" tidak diluluskan. Hanya usul cadangan asal telah diluluskan oleh Pendaftar Pertubuhan. Yang DiPertua bersetuju bahawa rekod minit tersebut perlu diubah kepada "Voting was carried out on the original proposal and the results were as follows".

Memandangkan tiada lagi komen atau kesilapan yang dibangkitkan, Ir. Razmahwata bin Mohamad Razalli (F17029) mencadangkan supaya minit Mesyuarat Agung Khas yang diadakan pada 14 Oktober 2017 disahkan. Usul tersebut disokong oleh Ir. Ho Choon Kwang (M17178) dan seterusnya diterima oleh MAT.

3.0 PERKARA BERBANGKIT

Yang DiPertua meneruskan dengan perkara berbangkit dan memberikan penjelasan mengenai perkara-perkara berikut:

Mesyuarat Agung Ke-58 pada 15 April 2017

Mukasurat 81 - perkara 8.1.1

Pindaan Perlembagaan

Yang DiPertua melaporkan bahawa kesemua cadangan pindaan perlembagaan yang diluluskan oleh Mesyuarat Agung Khas 14 Oktober 2017 telah dihantar kepada semua ahli korporat untuk tujuan undian. MAT dimaklumkan bahawa para ahli korporat telah memberi maklumbalas yang positif dan justeru kesemua pindaan telah dikemukakan kepada Pendaftar Pertubuhan. Kelulusan telah diterima daripada Pendaftar Pertubuhan pada 20 Disember 2017.

Lima (5) orang wakil "Companion" dan "Siswazah" akan dijemput ke dalam Majlis selepas Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan Bahagian Siswazah (YES) pada bulan Jun 2018 manakala wakil Bahagian Jurutera Wanita akan dijemput menghadiri mesyuarat Majlis yang pertama untuk sesi 2018/2019.

Mukasurat 76 - perkara 3.0

Anugerah untuk Cawangan

Yang DiPertua melaporkan bahawa cadangan Anugerah Kecemerlangan Yang DiPertua patut merangkumi kesemua cawangan-cawangan IEM, Jawatankuasa Aktiviti berpendapat bahawa cawangan-cawangan IEM berada pada tahap yang amat berbeza dari segi pertumbuhan dan aktiviti. Dari segi penilaian, ini akan menjadikan pertandingan tersebut kurang adil.

4.0 LAPORAN TAHUNAN SESI 2017/2018

Yang DiPertua seterusnya menjemput Setiausaha Kehormat, Ir. Yap Soon Hoe untuk membentangkan aktiviti-aktiviti yang telah dianjurkan pada tahun 2017 sepertimana yang dicetak pada mukasurat 117 hingga 168 dalam Laporan Tahunan.





4.1 MAJLIS DAN JAWATAN KUASA KERJA

Untuk sesi 2017/2018, sebanyak lima mesyuarat (5) Majlis telah diadakan. Mesyuarat-mesyuarat tersebut membincangkan perkara-perkara yang berkaitan dengan dasar-dasar IEM dalam membuat keputusan atas perkara-perkara yang berkaitan cara operasi dan pentadbiran Institusi. Jawatankuasa Kerja pula telah mengadakan sebanyak tiga belas (13) mesyuarat untuk sesi 2017/2018. Peranan Jawatankuasa Kerja adalah untuk melaksanakan dan menjalankan keputusan-keputusan Majlis.

4.2 PERWAKILAN DALAM LEMBAGA JURUTERA MALAYSIA

MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa IEM mempunyai lima (5) orang wakil yang dilantik ke dalam Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia (LJM). Sembilan (9) ahli juga mewakili IEM dalam jawatankuasa-jawatankuasa LJM yang lain sementara enam (6) wakil IEM dilantik untuk bertugas dalam Majlis Akreditasi Kejuruteraan.

4.3 Keahlian

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa keahlian IEM setakat ini berjumlah 45,666 dan pelbagai aktiviti dilaksanakan demi mencapai bilangan 100,000 orang ahli sepertimana yang ditentukan oleh Bekas Yang DiPertua Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong.

Setiausaha Kehormat melaporkan bahawa setakat 31 Disember 2017, seramai 7,808 orang calon telah diterima oleh Jawatankuasa Kemasukan dan Latihan Praktik di bawah jagaan Ir. Prof Dr Norlida Buniyamin untuk kemasukan/pemindahan ke gred-gred berlainan.

4.4 Daftar Antarabangsa

Dari segi daftar-daftar dan gabungan-gabungan antarabangsa, bagi tahun 2017, seramai 20 orang ahli telah didaftarkan sebagai Jurutera ASEAN (ASEAN Eng), 43 diluluskan untuk Jurutera ASSOciate ASEAN (AAE) dan 43 diluluskan bagi pendaftaran APEC dan International Engineer (IntPE).

4.5 Buku Log IEM

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Jawatankuasa Kecil Buku Log yang dipengerusikan oleh Ir. Peter Han Seng Kong sedang dalam proses membuat penambahbaikan kepada format buku log selaras dengan proses Temu Duga Profesional IEM yang baru.

4.6 Lembaga Latihan IEM

Ir. Li Thang Fai meneruskan tugas beliau sebagai pengerusi Lembaga Latihan di mana 618 permohonan CPD diluluskan untuk IEM dan juga pembekal-pembekal latihan yang lain.

4.7 Proses Temu Duga yang Dipertingkatkan

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa mulai 1 Januari 2018, proses Temuduga IEM yang konvensional telal ditamatkan dan digantikan dengan proses yang telah dipertingkatkan. Ini menyebabkan penerimaan lebih kurang 1000 permohonan telah diterima pada bulan Disember 2017 untuk temuduga professional konvensional.

Implementasi proses Temu Duga Profesional yang baru ini dikendalikan oleh Jawatankuasa Peperiksaan dan Kelayakan yang dipengerusikan oleh Ir. Lee Boon Chong.

4.8 Lembaga Temuduga Profesional

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa bagi sesi 2017/2018, seramai 925 premohonan telah diterima untuk menduduki Temuduga Profesional. 497 telah lulus dan ini merupakan kelulusan 86.5%. 77 calon telah gagal (13.5%) manakala 186 calon sedang menunggu keputusan. Lembaga Temuduga Profesional dipengerusikan oleh Ir. Tu Yong Eng.

4.9 Penerbitan dan Informasi

Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa Jawatankuasa ini yang dipengerusikan oleh Ir. Prof. Dr Ruslan bin Hassan telah menerbitkan (12) terbitan berkala "Jurutera" (majalah IEM) dalam tahun 2017. Sebanyak dua terbitan IEM Jurnal juga telah berjaya diterbitkan pada tahun 2017.

4.10 Perpustakaan IEM

MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa Perpustakaan IEM telah menambahkan koleksi buku-buku fisikal daripada 6,834 pada tahun 2016 kepada 6,954 pada tahun 2017 yang meliputi pelbagai topik. Perpustakaan IEM juga telah memperolehi 272 buku elektronik khususnya dalam bidang kejuruteraan dan teknologi.





4.11 Anugerah Kecerlangan Yang DiPertua

Setiausaha Kehormat seterusnya mengumumkan keputusan untuk tahun 2017 adalah seperti di bawah:

Pemenang Bahagian Teknik Kejuruteraan Geoteknik Tempat Kedua Bahagian Teknik Kejuruteraan Elektrik

Tempat Ketiga Bahagian Teknik Kejuruteraan Awam dan Struktur

Tempat Keempat Bahagian Teknik Kejuruteraan Mekanik Tempat Kelima Bahagian Teknik Pengurusan Projek Paling Baik Bahagian Teknik Pendidikan Kejuruteraan

4.12 Perwakilan ke Badan-badan Luar

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa satu Kumpulan Kerja telah ditubuhkan untuk mengkaji serta menambahbaikkan struktur perlantikan ahli-ahli untuk mewakili IEM dalam badan-badan luar. Kumpulan Kerja ini adalah di bawah jagaan Jawatankuasa Amalan Profesional yang dipengerusikan oleh Ir. Lai Sze Ching. Sebuah manual sedang disediakan dengan tujuan untuk memastikan kemampanan perwakilan IEM dan juga memastikan wakil-wakil ini mempunyai pengetahuan yang mantap dalam subjek-subjek berkenaan.

4.13 Manual Operasi Cawangan

Setiausaha Kehormat juga melaporkan bahawa Manual Operasi Cawangan (OMB) juga telah disediakan demi membantu dan memberi panduan kepada cawangan-cawangan IEM dalam perancangan, penganjuran dan penambahbaikan operasi cawangan. Manual tersebut telah disediakan oleh Jawatankuasa Hal-hal Korporat yang dipengerusikan oleh Ir. Ong Ching Loon.

OMB merangkumi terma-terma, prosedur-prosedur serta garis panduan dalam mengendalikan operasi dan pentadbiran cawangan. OMB itu juga akan menjadi dokumen asas untuk memastikan kesinambungan dan penyeragaman opersasi kesemua cawangan IEM.

4.14 Dana Benevolen IEM

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa sebanyak RM27,979.94 telah disumbangkan oleh para ahli bagi sesi 2017/2018. IEM mengucapkan setinggi-tinggi terima kasih kepada semua ahli-ahli di atas sokongan mereka. Baki akaun Dana Benevolen pada akhir Disember 2017 berjumlah RM464,999.75.

4.15 Hari Keluarga IEM

Hari Keluarga IEM tahun 2017 yang telah dianjurkan pada 7 Mei 2017 di Universiti SEGi, Kota Damansara telah dihadiri oleh lebih daripada 500 peserta yang terdiri daripada ahli Majlis IEM, ahli-ahli IEM dan ahli keluarga mereka. MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa Hari Keluarga seterusnya akan dianjurkan pada 22 Julai 2018 di Persatuan Alumni Universiti Malaya.

4.16 Minggu Kejuruteraan 2017 (EW2017)

Minggu Kejuruteraan IEM ke-21 dengan tema 'Engineering the World for a Better Future' telah dianjurkan pada 20-27 Ogos 2017. EW2017 dirasmikan dengan Larian Jurutera IEM 2017 bertempat di Perdana Botanical Garden Kuala Lumpur dengan penyertaan 1,000 peserta larian. MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa untuk tahun 2018, Minggu Kejuruteraan akan bermula dengan acara Larian Jurutera 2018 pada 12 Ogos 2018 bertempat di Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) dan akan diakhiri dengan Pertandingan Sains, Teknologi, Kejuruteraan dan Matematik (STEM) pada 18 Ogos 2018 bertempat di Monash University.

4.17 Penjenamaan

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Perbadanan Harta Intelek Malaysia (MyIPO) telah meluluskan permohonan IEM untuk mendaftarkan logo IEM yang baru. IEM telah memulakan aktiviti penjenamaan dengan meletakkan logo tersebut dalam surat-menyurat, papantanda, kad nama, pin-pin dan pelekat kereta.

4.18 Kertas Posisi IEM

MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa terdapat dua kertas posisi yang kini dalam proses iaitu "Employment of Professional Engineers in Key Government Positions" oleh Kumpulan Kecendrungan Khas Jurutera Awam (PSESIG) dan "Building Railway Engineering Capacity for the Future" oleh Bahagian Teknik Kejuruteraan Elektrik (EETD).

4.19 Sesi Soalan - Laporan Tahunan

4.19.1 Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) memohon penjelasan daripada Setiausaha Kehormat berkenaan keahlian (perkara 2.1 mukasurat 117) di mana laporan menyatakan terdapat sebanyak 35 orang "Senior". Beliau berpendapat bahawa bilangan yang rendah ini mungkin disebabkan oleh beberapa perkara. Salah satu perkara mungkin disebabkan proses yang terlibat dan yuran keahlian untuk gred Senior yang bernilai RM210 berbanding RM155 untuk Ahli biasa.

Beliau mencadangkan supaya Majlis mempertimbangkan pemindahan automatik dan mengekalkan yuran yang sama dengan Ahli biasa iaitu RM155.

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Ir. Vincent Chen seterusnya menambah bahawa satu lagi kategori yang memerlukan perhatian adalah gred "Companion". Beliau memaklumkan bahawa ramai ahli kurang selesa dengan terma "Companion" dan dengan itu tidak berminat untuk membuat permohonan gred tersebut. Beliau seterusnya memaklumkan bahawa terdapat cadangan untuk menggunakan terma "Senior Graduate Member" dan beliau berpendapat terma ini adalah amat sesuai.

Beliau juga berharap pihak Majlis dapat meluluskan cadangan untuk pemindahan automatik untuk dua kategori. Beliau yakin dengan perubahan ini, IEM berkemungkinan dapat merekrut dalam 5,000 orang Ahli Senior dan 3,000-4,000 ahli gred Companion dalam dua-tiga tahun seterusnya.

Berkenaan keahlian sebanyak 46,555, Ir. Vincent Chen mengucapkan tahniah kepada Jawatankuasa Kecil Menggiatkan Keahlian (MDP) di atas pencapaian yang baik. Namun, beliau berpendapat bahawa tidak terdapat jurang perbezaan yang besar antara jumlah ahli pada tahun 2014 dan 2018 (mukasurat 117) jika bilangan Ahli Siswa tidak diambil kira. Beliau juga membuat komen bahawa bilangan ahli Korporat dan ahli Siswazah tidak menunjukkan perbezaan yang ketara. Beliau berpendapat ini disebabkan kehilangan ahli di mana ramai juga ahli yang tidak memperbaharui keahlian mereka dan selepas dua (2) tahun, keahlian mereka akan dipadam. Jumlah yang terlibat adalah antara 4000 hingga 5000 orang. Walaupun MDP berusaha untuk merekrut ahli, bilangan ahli yang tidak memperbaharui keahlian mereka dan kemasukan ahli baru adalah agak sama. Ini menyebabkan jumlah penambahan ahli menjadi kurang.

Beliau juga memaklumkan bahawa berdasarkan maklumat daripada laman web Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia (LJM), bilangan jurutera yang berdaftar adalah dalam lingkungan 123,000 termasuk Jurutera Professional dan Jurutera Siswazah. Beliau berharap Majlis dan Jawatankuasa Kerja dapat mencari alternatif untuk merekrut mereka sebagai ahli IEM.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Ir. Vincent Chen di atas komen dan cadangan beliau. Yang DiPertua mengatakan bahawa Majlis akan memberi perhatian serius di dalam usaha ini. Namun, beliau mengingatkan MAT bahawa para jurutera siswazah hanya perlu membuat satu kali bayaran sahaja untuk berdaftar dengan LJM manakala yuran keahlian IEM adalah secara tahunan.

Ir. Jayaseelan Nadarajah (F14445) memohon penjelasan untuk perkara 6.2.1 pada mukasurat 123 dan perkara 4.4 pada mukasurat 77. Beliau mendapati peratusan yang dinyatakan tidak betul. Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa data pada mukasurat 77 adalah berdasarkan minit mesyuarat 2016/2017 manakala data 6.2.1 pada mukasurat 123 adalah berdasarkan data 2017/2018. Bagaimanapun Yang DiPertua bersetuju bahawa satu ruang patut ditambah untuk menunjukkan bilangan ahli yang telah menduduki Temuduga Profesional supaya peratusan akan lebih nyata.

Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) memaklumkan selain daripada bayaran yuran sekali untuk LJM, pendaftaran LJM adalah wajib dalam Akta Pendaftaran Jurutera 1967 (pindaan 2015) sementara keahlian Siswazah IEM adalah sukarela.

Beliau menambah walaupun terdapat 123,000 jurutera yang berdaftar dengan LJM, namun bilangan Jurutera Profesional telah berkurangan memandangkan kenaikan kadar yuran daripada RM200 kepada RM400.

Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) juga membuat komen bahawa gred "Companian" perlu diberi definisi yang lebih mendalam. Namun Yang DiPertua memaklumkan MAT bahawa Majlis sedang mengkaji secara serius dalam mencari terma yang lebih sesuai utuk gred "Companion" dan beliau berharap pada sesi seterusnya, Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis dapat mengemukakan cadangan kepada MAT.

Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) juga memberi respons berkenaan yuran RM210 berbanding RM150, di mana beliau memaklumkan MAT bahawa IEM sedang berusaha untuk mendapatkan lebih banyak manfaat untuk para ahli. Salah satu manfaat yang telah didapati adalah diskaun sebanyak 6% untuk pembelian kereta Mercedes dan BMW. Beliau juga menjelaskan bahawa yuran sebanyak RM210 masih rendah jika dibandingkan dengan yuran tahunan institusi-institusi luar negara. Beliau menegaskan bahawa ahli-ahli patut memberi perhatian kepada kualiti keahlian IEM dan bukan kadar yuran yang dibayar.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828) menyokong komen Ir. David Lai bahawa manfaat-manfaat yang dapat diperolehi untuk ahli-ahli IEM adalah tarikan yang baik dan beliau menyeru kepada ahli-ahli yang hadir supaya mengambil kesempatan di atas manfaat tersebut. Beliau juga mencadangkan supaya IEM cuba mendapatkan diskaun yang sama daripada Proton untuk manfaat bersama ahli-ahli IEM. Beliau menegaskan bahawa salah satu kesimpulan dalam "Productivity Blue Print" yang telah dilancarkan tahun lepas adalah kekurangan profesional untuk memacu produktiviti negara. Beliau mencadangkan Majlis dan Jawatankuasa Kerja supaya memperkenalkan insentif untuk menggalakkan ahli-ahli Siswazah IEM mendaftar sebagai Jurutera Profesional.

Ir. Fam Yew Hin (M20926) juga memaklumkan MAT bahawa Jawatankuasa Kebajikan dan Servis telah memperkenalkan "IEM Loyalty Card" yang menyenaraikan beberapa jenis diskaun contohnya dari Focus Point di mana ahli IEM boleh mendapat diskaun 40%-60% di rangkaian kedai-kedainya. Selain daripada diskaun untuk pembelian kereta, terdapat juga diskaun untuk penginapan hotel dsb. Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Ir. Fam Yew Hin di atas penjelasan beliau.

Oleh kerana tidak terdapat komen dan soalan yang lain, Ir. Dr Ahmad Anuar bin Othman (F13148) mencadangkan supaya Laporan Tahunan diterima. Cadangan tersebut disokong oleh Ir. Dr Ng Soon Ching (M30662) dan seterusnya diterima oleh MAT.





5.0 AKAUN BAGI TAHUN BERAKHIR 31 DISEMBER 2017

- 5.1 Yang DiPertua kemudiannya menjemput Bendahari Kehormat, Ir. Dr. Wang Hong Kok untuk membentangkan laporan kewangan IEM untuk tahunan kewangan 1 Januari 2017 sehingga 31 Disember 2017. Ir. Dr Wang Hong Kok memberitahu MAT bahawa laporan akaun terdapat dari mukasurat 193 hingga 216. Namun beliau hanya akan fokus pada mukasurat 194, 195 dan 196.
- 5.2 Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa penyata kewangan terdiri daripada dua (2) set akaun di mana ruang yang ditandakan "Institusi" yang disebut prestasi kewangan IEM HQ dan angka-angka ini tidak termasuk kedudukan kewangan Cawangan IEM. MAT memaklumkan bahawa Cawangan IEM akan memfailkan set penyata kewangan mereka sendiri dengan Lembaga Hasil Dalam Negeri (LHDN) cawangan negeri masing-masing.
 - Beliau juga memaklumkan bahawa ruang yang ditandakan dengan "Kumpulan" merujuk kepada akaun gabungan bagi kedua-dua IEM HQ dan IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd. Sebahagian ruang dengan angka yang dipaparkan di bawah "Institusi" ditinggalkan kosong di bawah "Kumpulan" disebabkan angka-angka pembayaran / penerimaan antara IEM dan IEM TC yang telah dilupuskan semasa penyatuan dibuat.
- 5.3 Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan bahawa pada keseluruhannya, IEM telah meraih lebihan sebanyak RM1,823,390 dalam tahun 2017 berbanding RM1,464,518 dalam tahun 2016. Peratusan lebihan adalah 24%. Jumlah pendapatan tahun 2017 adalah RM6,617,499 berbanding RM6,005,611 dalam tahun 2016. Kenaikan jumlah pendapatan ini adalah disebabkan jualan pejabat IEM Cawangan Pulau Pinang dan juga dividen yang telah diisytiharkan oleh IEM Training Centre sebanyak RM489,289 kadar kenaikan adalah 62% berbanding tahun 2016.
- 5.4 MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa penyumbang utama kepada jumlah pendapatan adalah yuran keahlian (51%), pelupusan hartanah (22%), servis institusi (6%) dan dividen (7%).
 - Kutipan yuran keahlian bagi tahun 2017 adalah 84.8%, kadar penurunan 5.2% berbanding 90% pada tahun 2016.
- 5.5 Bendahari Kehormat juga memaklumkan bahawa jumlah perbelanjaan RM4,712,539 pada tahun 2017 berbanding RM4,550,160 bagi tahun 2016 merupakan kenaikan sebanyak 3.6%. Kenaikan ini khususnya melibatkan pengajian dan perbelanjaan pentadbiran.
 - Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Bendahari Kehormat di atas pembentangan laporan akaun dan seterusnya menjemput persoalan dari para hadirin.
- 5.6 Bendahari Kehormat juga melaporkan bahawa jumlah perbelanjaan dalam tahun 2016 adalah RM4,550,160 penuruan sebanyak RM1,815 (0.03%) berbanding RM4,548,345 dalam tahun 2015.
- 5.7 Sesi Soalan Akaun
- 5.7.1 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) menyoal berkenaan kadar yuran tertunggak yang agak tinggi dan meminta penjelasan samada IEM telahpun mengambil sebarang tindakan untuk menggalakkan para ahli membayar yuran. Beliau mencadangkan supaya IEM membuat kajian bagaimana dapat menggalakkan para ahli supaya membayar yuran contohnya dengan pengenalan manfaat mendapat diskaun 6% dalam pembelian kereta mewah.
 - Yang DiPertua bersetuju bahawa IEM perlu menambahbaikkan promosi yang dijalankan. Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) menjelaskan bahawa yuran tertunggak adalah lebih kurang RM226,000 dan usaha sedang dijalankan untuk mengutip yuran tertunggak ini termasuk urusetia membuat panggilan kepada ahli yang belum membayar yuran. Beliau juga bersetuju bahawa IEM perlu meningkatkan manfaat untuk ahli terutamanya dri segi diskaun, aktiviti CPD dsb. Beliau juga memaklumkan bahawa satu Jawatankuasa Khas telah ditubuhkan oleh Jawatankuasa Kewangan untuk memberi perhatian serius terhadap isu yuran tertungak ini.
- 5.7.2 Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah @ Lim Teik Keat (Hon.F01691) membuat kesimpulan bahawa lebihan bagi tahun 2017 sebanyak RM1,863,000 berbanding RM1,263,000 bagi tahun 2016 adalah termasuk keuntungan daripada pelupusan hartanah cawangan Pulau Pinang. Beliau menjelaskan bahawa lebihan tahun 2017 adalah rendah jika keuntungan ini dikecualikan. Beliau juga menegaskan bahawa lebihan juga berkurangan akibat kehilangan sewaan dari Wisma IEM yang dijangka akan menurun lebih lagi dalam tahun 2018.
 - Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa sememangnya pendapatan daripada sewa bangunan akan merosot dengan penamatan penyewa di Wisma IEM. Namun, Jawatankuasa Kewangan sedang berusaha untuk mendapatkan penyewa baru.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) seterusnya memaklumkan bahawa IEM kehilangan pendapatan sebanyak RM120,000 setiap bulan dengan penamatan perjanjian sewaan di Wisma IEM. Namun, IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd telah diminta mengambil alih sebahagian daripada ruang yang ada. Perbincangan dengan pihak-pihak yang berminat sedang diadakan.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua juga menjelaskan bahawa berdasarkan keadaan pasaran masa kini, sewa yang dapat dikutip dari ruang yang dapat disewakan adalah dalam lingkungan RM30,000 sebulan. Untuk menampung perbelanjaan bangunan tersebut, IEM perlu menjana pendapatan sebanyak RM50,000 sebulan. Beliau seterusnya memaklumkan bahawa Jawatankuasa Kewangan bercadang untuk menukarkan sebahagian daripada tingkat bawah bangunan tersebut kepada galeri pameran di mana syarikat-syarikat yang berminat dapat mempamerkan produk-produk mereka. Adalah diharapkan penyewa-penyewa ini dapat menyalurkan pendapatan sekurang-kurangnya RM20,000 sebulan. Cadangan-cadangan ini diharap dapat menampung kekurangan akibat yuran tertunggak dan kekurangan dari pendapatan Bahagian Teknik.

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5.7.3 Ir. Gunasagaran a/l Kristnan (M08216) menyoal berkenaan perbezaan laporan Bendahari Kehormat mengenai yuran tertunggak sebanyak RM516,065 berbanding laporan Timbalan Yang DiPertua sebanyak RM216,000.

Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan bahawan yuran yang dijangka daripada ahli-ahli yang aktif berjumlah RM3,388,097 dan yuran yang telah diterima berjumlah RM2,872,032. Ini mengakibatkan jumlah tertunggak sebanyak RM516,065. Beliau juga menambah bahawa yuran yang sepatutnya diterima pada tahun 2016 berjumlah RM3,440,942 dan yuran tertunggak adalah berjumlah RM341,989. Beliau menjemput ahli-ahli yang hadir supaya merujuk kepada Nota 7 dalam laporan kewangan.

5.7.4 Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) bersetuju dengan penjelasan Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah bahawa jika pelupusan hartanah cawangan Pulau Pinang tidak diambilkira, maka jumlah lebihan hanyalah beberapa ratus ribu ringgit. Beliau juga mengingatkan MAT bahawa tujuan pembelian Wisma IEM untuk adalah menyediakan lebih banyak ruang untuk aktiviti bagi manfaat bersama para ahli.

Oleh itu, beliau mencadangkan Majlis supaya mempertimbangkan dengan lebih serius untuk menyediakan lebih banyak ruang untuk aktiviti ahli seperti pusat kesihatan dan kecergasan untuk manfaat para ahli. Walaubagaimanapun, beliau menegaskan bahawa keadaan kewangan IEM adalah stabil dan mampan.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Y.Bhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Chuah Hean Teik (Hon.F09157) di atas komen dan cadangan beliau.

Ir. Dr Ahmad Anuar bin Othman (F13148) memaklumkan bahawa pendapatan dari yuran keahlian merangkumi 51% daripada jumlah pendapatan. Beliau mengatakan bahawa beberapa tahun yang lepas, IEM ada memberi token kepada ahli semasa mereka membayar yuran. Beliau menyarankan supaya IEM dapat mempertimbangkan alternatif ini.

5.7.5 Disebabkan tiada lagi persoalan, Ir. Gunasagaran a/I Kristnan (M08216) mencadangkan penerimaan laporan kewangan bagi IEM untuk tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2017. Usul tersebut disokong oleh YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015). MAT kemudiannya menerima laporan kewangan tersebut.

6.0 LAPORAN KEWANGAN DANA PENDIDIKAN - 31 DISEMBER 2017

- 6.1 Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya membentangkan laporan kewangan untuk Dana Pendidikan bagi tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2017 dari mukasurat 222 hingga mukasurat 232.
- 6.2 MAT dimaklumkan bahawa derma yang telah diterima berjumlah RM227,036 bagi tahun 2017 berbanding RM127,881 pada tahun 2016. Faedah Simpanan Tetap adalah berjumlah RM38,132 berbanding RM37,433 pada tahun 2016.

Dari segi perbelanjaan, Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan bahawa biasiswa yang telah diberikan pada tahun 2017 adalah berjumlah RM29,500. Beliau juga melaporkan bahawa perbelanjaan untuk ceramah adalah berjumlah RM6,225; Persidangan Antarabangsa RM49,406 dan subsidi Bahagian Siswa RM5,500 dan perbelanjaan lain berjumlah RM2,414.

Beliau memaklumkan MAT bahawa siswa-siswa yang menerima biasiswa En Koon Yew Yin telah menamatkan pengajian mereka pada tahun 2017. En Koon Yew Yin telah menderma RM100,000 untuk biasiswa tersebut pada akhir tahun 2017. Pengumuman untuk biasiswa ini akan dibuat pada tahun 2018.

Bendahari Kehormat juga melaporkan bahawa lebihan keseluruhan bagi tahun 2017 berjumlah RM178,633 berbanding defisit RM233,168 dalam tahun 2016. MAT mengambil maklum bahawa jumlah penajaan dan biasiswa yang diberi pada tahun 2017 berjumlah RM97,365 dan ini mematuhi keperluan Lembaga Hasil Dalam Negeri di mana sebanyak 50% daripada pendapatan tahun lepas perlu dibelanjakan.

Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan bahawa jumlah pendapatan pada tahun 2016 adalah RM166,233 dan perbelanjaan perlu mencapai 50% iaitu RM83,116.

- 6.3 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) menyoal samada IEM mempunyai program untuk menggalakkan penderma kepada Dana Pendidikan. Beliau mendapati selain daripada derma dari En Koon Yew Yin, dana tersebut tidak menunjukkan apa-apa perbezaan pendapatan. Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa IEM telahpun membuat keputusan untuk menamakan biasiswa yang didermakan oleh para ahli di atas nama penderma masing-masing. Para Bekas Yang DiPertua juga digalakkan menderma untuk tujuan ini.
- 6.4 Memandangkan tiada lagi sebarang soalan dari ahli yang hadir, Ir. Sreedaran a/I A. Raman (M38681) mencadangkan penerimaan laporan kewangan Dana Pendidikan bagi tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2017. Usul tersebut disokong oleh Ir. Dr Chuah Joon Huang (M57551) dan MAT seterusnya menerima laporan kewangan Dana Pendidikan.

7.0 PERBINCANGAN ISU BERTULIS DARIPADA AHLI YANG MENYERAHKAN NOTIS BERTULIS

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa IEM tidak menerima sebarang isu bertulis untuk dibentangkan.

8.0 PENGUMUMAN PEMILIHAN KEPUTUSAN MAJLIS 2018/2019 SESI

Yang DiPertua menjemput Pegawai Pemilihan, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon mengumumkan keputusan bagi sesi 2018/2019.





8.1 Yang DiPertua

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa mengikut Seksyen 5.2 daripada Undang-Undang Kecil IEM, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi, merupakan bakal Yang DiPertua yang terpilih akan mengambilalih jawatan Yang DiPertua bagi sesi 2018/2019 dengan tamatnya tempoh jawatan Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin.

8.2 Timbalan Yang DiPertua

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa calon yang berjaya dalam pemilihan jawatan Timbalan Yang DiPertua bagi sesi 2018/2019 adalah Ir. Ong Ching Loon.

8.3 Naib Yang DiPertua, Setiausaha Kehormat, Bendahari Kehormat dan lain-lain

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon kemudiannya mengumumkan keputusan pencalonan dan pemilihan seperti berikut.

8.3.1 Jawatan Ahli Majlis - Wakil Kimia (Satu (1) kekosongan untuk 3 sesi - 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021)

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa tiada pencalonan yang diterima untuk jawatan ini. Oleh itu, Majlis dalam mesyuarat yang ke 410 pada 15 Januari 2018 telah memutuskan untuk mencalonkan Ir. Prof. Dr Lee Tin Sin sebagai calon untuk jawatan ini. Oleh itu, Ir. Prof. Dr Lee Tin Sin dilantik tanpa bertanding untuk jawatan Ahli Majlis – Wakil Kimia bagi sesi 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021.

- 8.4 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon seterusnya memaklumkan MAT tentang jawatan-jawatan lain yang dipertandingkan:
 - Naib Yang DiPertua
 - · Setiausaha Kehormat
 - · Bendahari Kehormat
 - Ahli Majlis Wakil Biasa

8.4.1 Jawatan Naib Yang DiPertua (Tiga (3) kekosongan untuk dua sesi 2018/2019 dan 2019/2020)

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa tindakan telah diambil untuk mengeluarkan kertas undi kepada para ahli untuk jawatan-jawatan yang dipertandingkan iaitu Naib Yang DiPertua, Setiausaha Kehormat, Bendahari Kehormat dan Ahli Majlis – Wakil Biasa. Sebanyak 10,580 kertas undi telah dihantar kepada semua Ahli Korporat yang layak mengundi. 1,706 kertas undi telah diterima bila Kotak Undi dibuka pada 7 April 2018.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa terdapat enam orang calon untuk tiga kekosongan. Tiga orang calon yang berjaya dilantik ke jawatan Naib Yang DiPertua untuk sesi 2018/2019 dan 2019/2020 adalah:

8.5 Jawatan Setiausaha Kehormat (Satu (1) kekosongan bagi sesi 2018/2019)

Dua pencalonan telah diterima untuk satu kekosongan. Calon Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad telah menerima bilangan undi yang lebih tinggi dan dengan itu dilantik ke jawatan Setiausaha Kehormat bagi sesi 2018/2019.

8.6 Jawatan Bendahari Kehormat (Satu (1) kekosongan bagi sesi 2018/2019)

Tiga pencalonan telah diterima dan calon, Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai yang menerima undi yang lebih tinggi dilantik ke jawatan Bendahari Kehormat bagi sesi 2018/2019.

8.7 Jawatan Ahli Majlis – Wakil Biasa (Sepuluh (10) kekosongan bagi 3 sesi - 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021)

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon seterusnya melaporkan bahawa terdapat dua puluh satu (21) pencalonan yang diterima dan sepuluh (10) orang calon berikut yang menerima undi tertinggi telah dilantik ke jawatan Ahli Majlis – Wakil Biasa bagi tiga sesi iaitu 2018/2019, 2019/2020, 2020/2021):

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- 8.8 MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa proses pemilihan telah mengambil masa tiga bulan dengan jumlah perbelanjaan iaitu RM28,157.11 (dokumen pemilihan dan pos) dan jumlah ini tidak termasuk kos urusetia IEM.
- 8.9 MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa 10,580 kertas undi telah dihantar. Lebih kurang 84% daripada ahli yang layak mengundi tidak mengembalikan kertas undi mereka untuk merekod undi untuk calon yang akan mewakili kepentingan mereka dalam Majlis IEM.
- 8.10 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon mengucapkan penghargaan kepada pengawas pemilihan, Ir. Prof. Dr Zainal Abidin bin Ahmad, Ir. Prof. Dr Siti Hawa Hamzah, Ir. Hj. Mohd Ali Yusof, Ir. S. Kukanesan dan Ir. Ong Ching Loon diatas bantuan yang tidak terhingga serta sokongan mereka dan juga ucapan terima kasih kepada Urusetia di atas kerjasama sepenuhnya dari mereka.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon diatas penerangan beliau, pengawas pemilihan dan Sekretariat IEM atas bantuan dan sokongan mereka.

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa jemputan telah dihantar kepada 37 universiti yang diikhtiraf dan sebanyak 24 pencalonan diterima. Pemenang Keseluruhan akan menerima hadiah wang tunai RM1,000, piala dan sijil. Pemenang tahun 2017 adalah Sdr. Yap Kian Kun, siswa Kejuruteraan Mekanik dari Malaysia – Japan International Institute of Technology (MJIIT), Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) dengan projek bertajuk "Influence of Adsorbed Water on Adhesive Wear".

Tiga (3) pemenang hadiah khas dalam disiplin kejuruteraan lain tidak dapat hadir untuk menerima hadiah. Hadiah-hadiah akan dihantar kepada mereka yang dinyatakan di bawah:

Namun, beliau berpendapat bahawa dengan adanya tiga orang jurutera wanita dalam Majlis IEM juga merupakan satu pencapaian bagi IEM.
- 15.7 Ir. Simon Yeong Chin Chow (18660) memohon maklumat berkenaan kadar kelulusan untuk PCE (Peperiksaan Kompetensi Profesional) yang dikendalikan oleh LJM. Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa kadar kelulusan adalah 6% pada sesi peperiksaan pertama dan 18% dalam sesi kedua.

3 THE COUNCIL AND THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 3.1 Five Council and thirteen monthly Executive Committee (Excomm) meetings were held during the session to look into the management of the properties and affairs of the Institution.
- 3.2 I wish to thank all members of the Council, Executive Committee, Standing Committees, Technical Divisions, Sub Committees, Ad Hoc Committees and other Committees for their participation, contribution and support in the activities of the institution in the furtherance of its objective to promote the science and profession of engineering in the spirit of a learned society.
- 3.3 I must also express a vote of thanks to the various members who may not have served on the above Committees, but voluntarily served as IEM representatives to the various government bodies and organisations.

4 STANDING COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

4.1 The role of the Standing Committee chaired by the Deputy President, Ir. Ong Ching Loon is to conduct the financial management of the properties and affairs of the IEM. Regular meetings were held every 3rd Thursday of the month.

4.2 Main Sources of Income

4.2.1 Annual Subscription

Financing of the operating expenditure of the Institution continue to depend largely on the collection of members' annual subscriptions. For the year 2018, income from annual subscriptions stood at approximately 65% of the total income compared to 51% in 2017 and 54% in 2016.

In accordance with the Bylaws, reminders to members on their annual subscription payments were sent out by the Institution. For the year 2018, 89% of the members had settled their subscriptions by the end of the year. IEM wish to thank all members who had promptly settled their subscriptions.

As at the end of the financial year 2018, 2,617 members are in arrears of subscription for 2018 compared to 4,638 in 2017. The total outstanding collection for the year amounted to RM372,050 compared to RM516,065 in 2017. IEM would like to appeal to these members to settle the arrears as soon as possible.

4.2.2 Rental

With the termination of tenancy by Maktab Koperasi Malaysia on 30 June 2017, the rentable space at Wisma IEM had become vacant since then. Various efforts were taken to secure tenants including putting up banners, appointing real estate agents etc. In order to minimize outflow of funds, IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd and IEM Academy Sdn Bhd decided to give up their rented premises and moved in to Wisma IEM in 2018.



The two auditoriums were also put up for rental to generate income. Technical Divisions were requested to utilize Wisma IEM premises for their events rather than hotels so as not to incur unnecessary expenses. With the concerted efforts, a tenant was finally secured at the end of 2018. Merdeka Stragetic Development Centre Sdn Bhd accepted the offer of tenancy for first and second floor of Wisma IEM. Tenancy commenced in February 2019.

The ground floor of Bangunan Ingenieur continue to be rented out to Pizza Hut at a monthly rental of RM16,907. Pizza Hut's tenancy was renewed in November 2018 for another three years.

4.2.3 Activities Income

The IEM Technical Divisions organised numerous activities such as courses, seminars, workshops etc for the benefit for members' professional development as well as generate some income for the Institution. Income generated contributes to the improvement of facilities as well as services of the Institution. For the year 2018, with great efforts by the Technical Divisions, IEM generated RM599,657. The Women Engineers' Section organized the 2nd International Conference of Women in Science, Engineering and Technology in July 2018. The WE Section put in great efforts to generate surplus of RM190,811 making it a very successful event to assist IEM's financial position.

4.3 Administrative Expenses

In order to control expenses and at the same time, provide adequate services to members, the Standing Committee implements strict but effective budgetary control measures. In view of the increase in operating costs and the drop in income due to the economic situation, various costs control measures were implemented to ensure that operating costs are controlled within the limited funds of the Institution while at the same time ensuring that services to members are not impaired.

4.4 Sub Committee on Human Resources

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad looked into the recruitment and deployment of staff for the Secretariat. Meetings were regularly held to deal with matters relating to Human Resource of Secretariat. As at 31 December 2018, the Secretariat's staff strength 40.

4.5 Sub Committee on IEM Infrastructure

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai continued to monitor the maintenance and renovation of Bangunan Ingenieur and Wisma IEM. The function of the Sub Committee also covered managing the usage of the meeting rooms, security system of IEM, fire protection, electrical installations, ICT computerisation and networking, general facilities, etc. The Sub Committee is currently looking into improving the facilities at Wisma IEM in terms of available space and conduciveness for IEM activities. Action has been taken to look into renovation to the Ground Floor of Wisma IEM to provide a cafeteria for members as well as a Digital Maker Space to be operated by the ICT Special Interest Group.

The Sub Committee will continue to look into increasing facilities for the benefit of members and to make Wisma IEM as a place for members to call "HOME".

5 STANDING COMMITTEE ON ADMISSIONS AND PRACTICAL TRAINING

- Ir. Prof Dr Norlida binti Buniyamin continued to chair the Standing Committee for the third session for the session 2018/2019. The main role of this Standing Committee was to scrutinise applications for candidates applying for election/admission/transfer to the various grades of membership. This Standing Committee also worked closely with the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualifications in organising awareness talks relating to Corporate membership of IEM and career in engineering.

5.3 Sub-Committee on Membership Applications Board (MAB)

The Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Dr Lee Yun Fook continued its role of vetting and assessing applications for the various grades of membership of the Institution.

5.3.1 Processing of AER, AAE and IPE/APEC International Engineer Register Applications

The Membership Applications Board's also vetted and recommended applications from members for their IPE/APEC International Registers, ASEAN Engineer and Associate ASEAN Engineer membership. The following is the breakdown of applications for these Registers:

- · 32 approved for International Engineer (IPEA/APEC)
- 24 approved for ASEAN Engineer (AE)
- 16 approved for Associate ASEAN Engineer (AAE)

5.4 Sub-Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions

Ir. Fam Yew Hin was reappointed as the Chairman of the Sub Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions for the session 2018/2019. During the entire year, the Sub Committee conducted numerous membership drive talks/events at various international and local engineering related organizations, Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) and government agencies.

The Technical Divisions and IEM Branches have also contributed towards the success of the membership drive events by organizing 107 membership drive events/talks and other related activities in 2018.

In order to further enhance the collaboration with the IHLs, the Sub Committee conducted an annual meeting with invited IEM Student Sections and IHLs representatives on 26 February 2018. A total of 23 public and private universities participated in the meeting where the main objective was to collect feedback, exchange ideas and to nurture an effective partnership between IEM and tertiary institutions.

The Sub Committee also organised a brainstorming session on 30 June 2018. The main objective of the session was to review the activities for the past year, and to establish an effective plan to increase the Institution's membership and promote the relevancy of IEM in the engineering fraternity, as well as to explore on new ideas to attract new potential members.

Apart from the above, the Sub Committee also initiated a roadshow to the IEM Branches to create awareness and engage with engineers who are IEM members and non-members as well as encourage them to join IEM as members and become Professional Engineers. The Sub Committee visited Kedah, Perlis, Negeri Sembilan, Kelantan and Sarawak within year and will continue to visit other states in 2019.

The Sub Committee continued to promote organisation partnership to engineering related companies in 2018. The objective of such partnership is to provide an effective platform for IEM and its partners to collaborate and contribute constructively to the advancement of the engineering society. Several reputable companies are currently in the advance stage of discussions to establish this arrangement.

For the year 2018, the Sub Committee managed to engage seven (7) Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) to sign MoUs with IEM on the recruitment of new and graduating students.

With the above initiatives, IEM shall continue to expand and become an inclusive, relevant organization to all engineering practitioners.

5.5 Sub Committee on IEM Log Book Training Scheme

The responsibility of the Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Abdul Razak bin Yakob was to review and confirm that the work and practical experience training progress as annually submitted by Graduate Members (mentee) and to ensure the reports conformed to the requirement and guidelines of the IEM's Log Book Training Scheme. A total of 192 log books were reviewed and confirmed in year 2018.

The Sub Committee organized two workshops for Mentors in March and September 2018. The workshop for Mentees was held in May 2018. It was agreed that for 2019, the sessions for Mentors and Mentees would be combined and two (2) workshops would be conducted yearly. The Sub Committee would also conduct Mentor/Mentee Engagement in HQ which will be broadcasted to the Branches. The first session will be on 16 March 2019.

The Sub Committee had rebranded the Log book and created a new Log Book format via online forms for the Log Book scheme. The launching was held with the issuing of an article in the August 2018 Jurutera.

The Sub Committee had also posted the database of active Mentor and Mentee on the website. The database was obtained from the feedback on the survey forms sent to Mentors / Mentees in early January 2018.



5.6 **IEM Training Board**

The IEM Training Board chaired by Ir. Li Thang Fai continued to deal mainly on the approval of the training programmes in relation to the requirement of BEM's Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for Professional Engineers.

The main task of the Training Board is to evaluate the training programmes organised by IEM's various Committees and Branches. In addition, the Training Board was also responsible for the approval of CPD hours for other training providers. Apart from assessing the submission of the training programmes, the Training Board also conducted audits on the selected programmes for verifying conformity.

5.7 Special Committee on Structured Training

Ir. Mohd. Radzi Salleh continued to chair the Special Committee on Structured Training for session 2018/2019 for the fourth session. The objective of the Structured Training programme was to assist the graduate members/engineers who lacked design experience to gain relevant experience to enable them to be eligible to sit for the Professional Interview.

For the year 2018, the Search Committee in Electrical Engineering conducted the second session (2017/2018) of the 24-day Electrical Engineering Design on 16 December 2017 and completed on 15 September 2018. A total of 5 participants attended the course.

Apart from the Search Committee in Electrical Engineering, the Search Committee in Civil Engineering had also conducted an 8-day Geotechnical Engineering Design course from 15 September until 3 November 2018 of which six (6) participants attended the course. Upon completion of the said course, the Search Committee would be looking into organizing another 8-Day course on the Structural Design.

The Special Committee hoped to start off the other two structured training programmes; IEM-STPD Chemical Engineering and the HVAC/ACMV Design programme (under the Search Committee in Mechanical Engineering) in the first quarter of 2019.

6. STANDING COMMITTEE ON EXAMINATIONS AND QUALIFICATIONS

6.1 Ir. Lee Boon Chong continued to chair this Standing Committee for the fourth session. The main responsibility of this Standing Committee was to regulate the professional interviews as well as working closely with the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC) on the accreditation of the engineering degree programmes.

6.2 Professional Interview Board

Ir. Tu Yong Eng continued as Chairman of the PI Board for the session 2018/2019. The main responsibility of the Professional Interview Board was to co-ordinate the professional interviews held at the Head Office as well as the IEM Branches. On behalf of the IEM, the Professional Interview Board also assigned Examiners for the Professional Assessment Examination (PAE) candidates of the BEM. The PI Board would also recommend the Professional Interview results to the Standing Committee for acceptance. For the year 2018, the PI Board had organized ten (10) Professional Interview awareness talks and workshops for the Graduate Members and three (3) IEM Certification and Training workshops on the Outcome Based Professional Interview (fka Enhanced Professional Interview) for the Interviewers.

6.2.1 Professional Interviews

IEM received a total of eighty four (84) applications for the Professional Assessment Examination (PAE) from the Board of Engineers, Malaysia (BEM) in 2018. Seventy five (75) candidates passed whereas thirteen (13) were unsuccessful for the PAE.

6.3 IEM Accreditation Board

Ir. Prof Dr. Zainal Abidin Ahmad continued to be the Chairman for the IEM Accreditation Board for session 2018/2019. The main role of the IEM Accreditation Board was to assist the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC) as IEM is one of the constituents of the EAC to evaluate local engineering degree programmes offered by both private and public Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) in the country.



6.4 Sub Committee on Professional Interview Development

The Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Chen Harn Shean had drafted the Professional Interview Guidelines 2018 for Applicant and Candidate last year for the applicants applying to sit for the Outcome Based Professional Interview which had been enforced since 1 January 2018. The Sub Committee was currently looking into drafting guidelines for the Assessors and also the Interviewers and also amending the application forms from time to time.

The Sub Committee also worked closely with the Professional Interview Board on conducting the outcome based Professional Interview workshops for the Interviewers, Assessors as well as the Graduate members. Apart from working closely with the Professional Interview Board, the Sub Committee had been going on road-shows with the Sub Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions (MDP) to the IEM Branches to present talks on IEM as well as on the outcome based Professional Interview process to the graduate members and the Interviewers. For the year 2018, the joint event/workshop had been conducted at four (4) of the IEM Branches. The Sub Committee would continue on this joint event to the other IEM Branches for the year 2019. The Sub Committee was also currently looking into implementing at least 80 percent of the professional interview process be automated. The main objective to automate was to reduce the errors and mistakes done manually and to increase efficiency in the processing of the outcome based Professional Interview applications.

6.5 Task Force on International Engineering Technologist Agreement (IETA) and Agreement for International Engineering Technicians (AIET)

Chaired by Ir. Lee Boon Chong, the Task Force was formed mainly to apply for the provisional membership of Engineering Technologist Agreement (IETA) and Agreement for International Engineering Technicians (AIET) which fall under the Sydney Accord and Dublin Accord accordingly.

7 STANDING COMMITTEE ON INFORMATION AND PUBLICATIONS

7.1 For Session 2018/2019, the Standing Committee was chaired by Ir. Prof. Dr. Ruslan Hassan. The Standing Committee is responsible for the publication of the IEM monthly Jurutera bulletin, the IEM Journal, the IEM Directory, the website and the library. In the year under review, the Standing Committee met regularly on every 2nd Tuesday of the month.

7.2 Jurutera

The Chief Editor and Bulletin Editor for the session were Ir. Prof. Dr. Ruslan Hassan and Ir. Abdul Razak bin Yakob respectively. Twelve issues of the bulletin were published for the year 2018. The titles for the issues are:

7.4 IEM Directory 2015/2016

The Standing Committee had decided not to publish any hard copies of the IEM directory. The last printed IEM directory (printed copy and CD) was produced in 2016. An online directory which is updated "real time" is made available on the IEM website.

7.5 IEM Website and Homepage

The Standing Committee continued to monitor and improve the webpage. Efforts were made to make the website more user-friendly and to keep members updated with useful announcements. 7.6 Sub Committee on Documentation and Recording of IEM Historical Events

The Committee shall continue to document relevant IEM Historical events for the current year which Committee plans to archive for later uploads onto the IEM Website

7.7 Library

The Sub Committee on Library chaired by Ir. CMM Aboobucker met 8 times in the year 2018.

This year, 83 new physical books were added to the library collection. Increasing from 6,953 in 2017 to 7,036 in 2018, the titles covered numerous disciplines. Apart from engineering and management topics, there are books on other general topics which are of interest to the engineering fraternity, e.g. architecture, health, food science and autobiographies.

The IEM Library also acquired 347 eBooks on engineering and technology topics by end of year 2018. These collections are very popular among members. Apart from technical books, on-line Journals in the field of Geotechnical Engineering also can be accessed.

Announcement and information on new physical books as well as eBooks are made regularly through the IEM Portal under the heading, "Publications and Library". Announcements are also made during IEM events and through TV display screen at Bangunan Ingenieur located near the lift lobby entrance.

Members who wish to borrow physical books can reserve them through the IEM Portal. Members are also encouraged to submit recommendations of new titles either physical or eBooks using special format available in the IEM Portal.

The IEM Library also has continuously liaised with SIRIM Technical Library in providing a service to borrow local and international Standards through SIRIM Membership Card. Members can use this SIRIM Membership Card to borrow required materials except Malaysian Standard, journals, and technical reports. Borrowed materials are to be returned within two weeks. Many members in the academic and consulting field had been using this facility.

Ir. Loo Chee Kin was re-appointed as the Chairman of the Disaster Risk Reduction Advisory Board (DRRAB) for the session 2018-2019.

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9.5.1 The scope and main objectives of this Advisory Board are as follows:

- 1. focus on disaster preparedness, mitigation and planning for a community scale or larger. The type of disaster includes natural, catastrophic, fire, biological and chemical disasters.
- provide advise on mitigation of, prepare for, respond to, and recover from large-scale disasters. This will include drafting standards and procedures, education, high level advocacy and consultation to ensure that the preparedness and best practices of national disaster recovery work.
- 3. to be the focal point of technical expertise on disaster preparedness within IEM.
- 4. Topics involve: Floods, Haze and Wild Fires, Landslides and Rockslides, Earthquake, Coastal Erosion, Land Subsidence, Tsunami, Catastrophic Chemical Release**, etc.
 - * these are taken as large catastrophic events. Smaller fires or chemical control measures would Involve other committees (Fire Advisory Board and/or Technical Divisions i.e. Chemical Engineering Technical Division).

Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon continued to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee to screen complaints made against members on grounds of ethics, unfair dismissal, professional misconducts, unethical practice of Professional Engineers and other issues

The Sub Committee will determine whether such complaints warrant a need to set up disciplinary Adhoc Committee to hear such cases. During the 2018-2019 session, 4 complaints were received as follows:

- a) Complaint against IEM Member for using M.I.E.M and ASEAN Engineer on business card. The hearing was postponed due to the request for disclosure of the complaint with the complainant details. New date of hearing is set and progress is on-going.
- b) Complaint against IEM for releasing other members' addresses/contact numbers to third party. No action was taken by IEM as there was no evidence provided to prove who had distributed the names and contact details of the members to others.
- c) Complaint against IEM member for forged certificates of qualification. No hearing was conducted as the case was proven. The membership status was therefore withdrawn by IEM.
- d) Complaint between IEM Council and Executive Committee Member on Unethical & Unprofessional Behaviour. The discussion between members involved is still on going as to seek more clarification.

9.10 Sub Committee on Legislation Affecting Engineering Profession

Ir. Lai Sze Ching continued his service to provide regular updates and information on the following legislation on how such legislation would impact the engineering profession:

9.11 Outside Bodies Representation (OBR)

The re-appointed Chairman, Ir. Lai Sze Ching continues to appoint representatives to attend and participate by maintaining and establishing close rapporteur with various government agencies in meetings with various outside bodies between IEM with Local Authorities and Government or Public sector. A manual for the IEM Outside Bodies Representation was completed in the session 2017/2018.

Currently, more than 100 members from IEM Excomm, Council and the respective Standing Committee, Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups (SIG), Sections and branch representatives representing IEM in more than 150 technical committees, working groups, opening ceremonies, dinner, events, technical dialogues and meetings at various local governments, agencies, institutions, organisations and universities.

All representatives who attended the external meetings will be required to submit a copy of the Outside Bodies Representation (OBR) report form within a week from the meeting date. The reports shall indicate the issues raised in the meetings which affect engineering profession in general and in particular those which concerned IEM. All incoming reports will be tabled at the monthly meeting of the Standing Committee on Professional Practice, Technical Divisions and thereafter will be reported to the President and Excomm if there were any matters that required further deliberation or action.

Out of total of 292 meetings (296 representatives attended the meetings) and 138 organisations (159 representatives attended the social activities) tabulated in year 2018, only 66 representatives with 66 reports submission received. Representatives who attended these external meetings were regularly reminded to expedite the submission of the reports.

IEM continues to provide and assist with comments and input required by the industries such as Malaysian Standard (MS) draft for the Department of Standards Malaysia (DSM), SIRIM Berhad and Jabatan Kerja Raya (JKR).

10 STANDING COMMITTEE ON WELFARE AND SERVICE MATTERS

10.1 Under the Chairmanship of Vice President, Ir. Ellias Saidin, this Standing Committee held its monthly meetings on every 3rd Tuesday of the month to discuss, review, recommend, approve and implement issues or matters pertaining to the welfare of IEM members. Activities such as the IEM Family Day and IEM Engineering Week were successfully organised during the session. Other welfare activities, which can benefit members of the Institution, were also planned and organised.

10.2 IEM Benevolent Fund

Total contribution amounting to RM31,796.00 was received from members in the year 2018. IEM would like to record its appreciation to the members for their kind support and generosity. Balance available in the fund as at 31 December 2018 is RM500,916.50.



10.3 Jurutera Wargamas (JWS) and Exempted Members

The scheme specially designed for members who are senior citizens or disabled aimed to reduce the annual subscription for these members to an affordable amount. The affected members would only need to pay 25% of the annual subscription fee with the balance to be settled from the IEM Benevolent Fund Account.

10.4 Employment Survey

The Standing Committee continued to study and conduct the employment survey to obtain information pertaining to the employment, remuneration and issues such as job satisfaction concerning the profession. The next survey is anticipated to be distributed by the end of 2019.

10.5 IEM Advertisement

10.5.1 IEM Job Advertisement

This is a job vacancy advertisement programme. The programme provides job vacancy advertisements through the IEM Website to its members who are looking for engineers on a full time/contract or on part time basis to fill job vacancies in their respective companies. Job seekers can search for their desired employment in the IEM Website under 'Job Gallery' section for the latest job vacancy advertisements. There is no fee imposed for the job vacancy advertisement. Job vacancies are also sent to members who fit the required qualifications of the job through email blast.

10.5.2 IEM Advertisement for Products and Services

This is a service that is provided to IEM members as well as companies involved with the supply of products and services related to the engineering profession. With a nominal fee, members could introduce their products and services to fellow engineers by putting up advertisements in IEM website. It is being managed by IEM Academy Sdn Bhd.

10.6 **IEM Family Day 2018**

IEM Family Day serves as an avenue for networking among senior and young engineers and helpful for IEM Council members to obtain feedback on IEM activities. It also promotes the fostering of closer rapport between members. IEM Family Day 2018 was held on 29 July 2019 at Persada PLUS, Petaling Jaya, Selangor and attracted more than 500 participants comprising IEM Council members, IEM members and their families. SPM/STPM/A-Level award recipients were all invited to this function. Certificates of achievement and cash were given to the children of IEM members who achieved outstanding results in their SPM, STPM and A-Level 2017. This year a total of 33 SPM & 8 A-Level students were rewarded. There were more than 10 types of challenging and fun games for children and adults. These include fun games, giant bubbles, traditional games etc. IEM hired a caterer to set up foods serving local and western favourites and many other delicious foods.

10.7 IEM Engineering Week 2018 (EW2018)

The Standing Committee organised the 22nd IEM Engineering Week (EW2018) with the theme "CONNECTING THE NATION". A one week programme that focused on the following was arranged:-

The EW2018 took place from 12 - 20 August 2018. The highlights of the IEM EW2018 were the Opening Ceremony which coincided with the IEM Engineer's Run 2018 that was held at Pusat Sukan Universiti Putra Malaysia, Serdang, Selangor with more than 1000 runners participating.

EW2018 also organised the third IEM Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Competition 2018 where 24 secondary schools from Klang Valley participated.

The Opening ceremony of EW2018 was officiated by IEM President while closing ceremony was officiated by YBhg. Prof. Dr. Arham Bin Abdullah, Director of Industrial Relation on behalf of Y.Bhg. Datin Paduka Ir. Dr. Siti Hamisah Binti Tapsir, the Director General of MOHE.

11.11 International Engineering Alliance (IEA)

The International Alliance Meeting (IEAM 2018) was held in London, United Kingdom from 24-29 June 2018 hosted by The Institution of Civil Engineers, United Kingdom. Malaysia was successfully admitted into the Sydney and the Dublin Accords at this meeting.

Vice President and Chairman of the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualifications, Ir. Lee Boon Chong and IEM President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi represented IEM at the meeting.

For the year under review, the APEC Engineers Register which has its Secretariat in Singapore had compiled a databank of qualified Professional Engineers among APEC economies, for the purpose of mobility across borders in APEC for service provision and employment purposes as there had been urgent need to connect with respective Government agencies to facilitate the APEC objectives through signed MRAs.

The APEC Engineers Register requires all APEC economies to expand on the list of databank from its membership listing, and also to encourage all APEC members to log into the databank info, which is hosted in IEA website.

Ir. Lee Boon Chong, Vice President and Chairman of the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualifications, concurrently APEC/IPEA Reviewer was invited to deliver a talk on "Some Views of Project Prospects in Malaysia" at its Group on Services Human Resources Development Working Group (GOS-HRDWG) Workshop on Promoting Regional Connectivity of Professionally Qualified Engineers in APEC. The event was held at the International Convention Centre, Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea from 12-13 August 2018.

Also present at the event was Ir. Prof Dr Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin, Vice Chairman and Chairman of the Standing Committee of Corporate Affairs. Both their trips were sponsored by the APEC Secretariat

11.13 Federation of Engineering Institutions of Asia and the Pacific (FEIAP)

IEM continues to host the permanent FEIAP Secretariat for another five years from 2018 until 2023. Chinese Institute of Engineers (Chinese Taipei) appointed Dr John Li Chien Lung to continue as the FEIAP President for the final session. Chinese Association of Science and Technology (CAST) was elected as the Vice President with Prof Huang Wei as the President-Elect. The next General Assembly would be held in Xian, China from 27-31 May 2019. IEM once again named Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin as the FEIAP Secretary General and head of the FEIAP Secretariat.

The 26th FEIAP General Assembly was organised and held by IEM from 11-14 July 2018 in Ipoh, Perak. The event was hosted by Tourism Perak and the Perak State Government. The Menteri Besar of Perak, YAB Dato' Seri Ahmad Faizal Dato' Haji Azumu was invited as Guest of Honour for the Opening of the General Assembly, the FEIAP Dinner and the Distinguished Lecture. As he was not able to attend the events in person, Dato' Seri Ir. Haji Mohammad Nizar bin Jamaluddin, the Perak State Assembly Member for Sungai Rapat represented the Menteri Besar on all the occasions.

A total of 269 participants attended the Seminar on The 4th Industrial Revolution organised in conjunction with the FEIAP General Assembly. A total of 90 members from member economies attended the FEIAP General Assembly and meetings whereas 60 delegates participated in the technical visit to Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR).

The State of Perak under Exco member YB Tuan Tan Kar Hing sponsored the welcoming reception dinner of 50 pax for the night of 11 July 2018. Also sponsored were two coaches to take the FEIAP Delegates on a guided tour of Ipoh and Tualang; the opening gambit for the opening ceremony, the cultural dance for the Gala Dinner and tourist pamphlets and brochure on Ipoh.

11.14 Federation of Engineering Institutions of Islamic Countries (FEIIC)

The 32nd FEIIC Council Meeting will be held from 6-9 January 2019 in Makkah, Saudi Arabia. The Engineering Qualification, Accreditation & Professional Systems (EQAPS) Committee meeting would also be held concurrently. The FEIIC General Assembly is held biennially while its Council meetings are held annually and at times together with the General Assembly.

11.15 World Federation of Engineering Organisations (WFEO)

Dr Marlene Kanga, the Past President of Engineers Australia (EA) is the current WFEO President whereas Dr Gong Ke of the China Association for Science and Technology (CAST) is the President-Elect. The WFEO General Assembly is held alternate years.

Ir. Prof Dr Leong Wai Yie and Ir. Dr Tan Chee Fai represented the IEM in WFEO Committee on Women in Engineering and Standing Committee on Engineering for Innovative Technologies respectively on a self-funding basis. The next WFEO General Assembly would be from 22-26 November 2019 in Melbourne, Australia. IEM President and Honorary Secretary are the official representatives of the IEM in WFEO.





11.16 Asian Pacific Confederation of Chemical Engineers (APCChE) Director's Board Meeting and Congress

IEM was successful in bidding to host the 19th APCChE Congress in 2021. Ir Prof Dr Dominic Foo is currently a Vice President of the APCChE Board and continues as the representatives of IEM at APCChE meetings. The construction, which was undertaken by Balfour Beatty and Cementation International, started 1991 and completed in 2000. The dam began operation on 2003 and was officially opened in 2003. It is considered the smallest power station and is capable of generating 600 MW of electric power. Besides, it has the second largest hydroelectric generation installed capacity in Malaysia, after the 2400MW installed capacity at Bakun Hydroelectric Project in Sarawak.

This technical visit allows visitors to understand about:

- a. The operation method of the Sultan Ismail Petra Dam Station;
- b. It's maintenance and safety aspects of operation;
- c. The role and function of the dam during the flood.

#### 17.14 Women Engineers Section (WE)

Under clause 9 of Rules of the Women Engineers Section at the 60th meeting held on 9th August 2018, the WE Committee unanimously confirmed Ir. Mah Siew Kien as Chairman and Ir. Rusnida binti Talib was elected as Vice Chairman I, while Ir. Tan Loo Yen was elected as Vice Chairman II for session 2018/2019.

The section continues to play an active role in promoting and supporting women engineers. The section works to advance gender equality in STEM studies and engineering careers through various activities. In 2018, IEM WE Section hosted "The 2nd International Conference of Women in Science, Engineering and Technology" (WiSET 2018) from 17th to 19th July 2018 at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre (KLCC). The event was officiated by YB Hannah Yeoh, Deputy Minister of Women, Family and Community Development and attracted 174 delegates. The delegates also adopted the resolution to support the United Nation's SDG5 on womens' effective participation and equal opportunities for leadership, as well as to recognise, nurture and value emerging female talent in STEM.

The conference also increased women in STEM's visibility in the media as it was featured on The Bigger Picture Segment with BFM89.9 (The Business Radio Station), "Selamat Pagi Malaysia" on RTM TV1 and "Wanita Hari Ini" on TV3. The conference brought together academics and practitioners of various STEM related industry to discuss and look for ways to help alleviate women for leadership as well as promote interest in STEM not only amongst girls but also the whole community in general.

#### 18 TECHNICAL DIVISIONS

#### 18.1 Building Services Technical Division (BSTD)

- 18.1.1 Under provision 3.2 and 3.3 of the Rules, the Building Services Technical Division (BSTD) Committee at the 318th meeting held on 13th July 2018, unanimously agreed to re-elect Ir. Wong Win Heng as the Chairman and elected Ir. Yap Chee Hong as the Deputy Chairman for the session 2018/2019. The meeting also unanimously agreed to appoint Ir. Ir. Wong Chu Loong as the Advisor for the new term.
- 18.1.2 The Technical Division held its 32nd Annual General Meeting in conjunction with a Pre-AGM Talk on "Pre Inspection and Testing on TNB Infrastructures", presented by Mr Harpeet Singh on 11th August 2018.
  - Eighty-eight (88) members attended the 32nd AGM, while one hundred twenty-one (121) members and non members attended the Pre-AGM Talk. At the 32nd AGM, Ms Sofia Johari was re-elected as the Secretary / Treasurer.
- 18.1.3 The Division continued to play an active role in maintaining a leading role in promoting closer interaction and co-operation amongst the various professional groups such as governmental agencies, professional bodies, academic institutions and universities by serving as Committee members in these organisations.
- 18.1.4 The Committee members were also involved in various activities related to the division like drafting of Malaysia Standard with SIRIM, as IEM representative in CIDB and in various government agencies.
- 18.1.5 The Division as in the past continued with the close rapport with MASHRAE, the local counterpart of American Society of Heating, Refrigeration and Air-Conditioning Engineering, US in organising joint activities for both members and also collaboration with other companies in organizing talks for IEM members.
- 18.1.6 2018 has been a successful and active year for the Technical Division. The Technical Division organised four (4) talks, four (4) visits, eleven (11) paid activities and successfully organised IEM Golf Tournament on 7 July 2018 with 124 participants at Kelab Rekreasi Tentera Udara (KRTU).
- 18.1.7 The Division will continue to play an effective role in organising activities for members in the building services interest. The activities organised by the Division were summarised in the summary sheet of this Annual Report.

### 18.2 Chemical Engineering Technical Division (CETD)

18.2.1 Ir. Dr Lee Tin Sin was re-elected as the Chairman, while Ir. Dr Chong Chien Hwa was elected as Deputy Chairman respectively for Session 2018/2019. The position of Chairman and Deputy Chairman was elected at the 211th meeting of the Division held on 22nd September 2018.

The AGM was attended by 82 members. Throughout Session 2018/2019, the Division was active in organising various activities for its members.

- 18.2.2 Regular monthly committee meetings were held to plan for various activities. The activities of the Technical Division are given in the summary sheet.
- 18.2.3 The Division continued to organise Malaysian Chem-E-Car Competition. On 30th and 31st March 2018, the 13th Malaysia Chem-E-Car Competition was held at TATI Universiti, Terengganu with 252 participants forming 63 teams. The competition consisted of two categories, i.e. model car and poster evaluation. The winning team in the car competition was "MAXIMUS" from UCSI University.

The competition had provided good exposure as well as created tremendous interest in various institutions of higher learning (IHLs) with a number of them stepping forward to indicate interest to host the next competition. The Division is looking at ways to improve the competition in the future.

- 18.2.4 IEM Chemical Engineering Design Competition 2017/2018 was organised for the sixth time by CETD, and had attracted 19 teams from the higher learning institutions nationwide. 8 teams were successfully shortlisted and participated in the Final Poster Presentation held on 12 May 2018 at Wisma IEM, Petaling Jaya.
- 18.2.5 CETD has organised the 3rd Junior Chem-E-car Competition 2018 together with Sekolah Kebangsaan Presint 18 (1) Putrajaya on 2nd and 3rd November 2018 at Mines Convention Centre. This competition aims to challenge students of primary schools to design and construct a small-sized car that is fabricated from reusable/recyclable items such as ice-cream sticks, bottle caps and straws. The event was held successfully held with the total of 40 teams from all over Malaysia.

#### 18.3 Civil and Structural Engineering Technical Division (CSETD)

18.3.1 Under provision 3.2 and 3.3 of the Rules, the Civil and Structural Engineering Technical Division (CSETD) Committee at the 276th meeting held on 26th June 2018, unanimously elected Ir. Chong Chee Meng as the Chairman and Ir. Loh Kai Wah as the Deputy Chairman for the session 2018/2019. The meeting also unanimously agreed to appoint Ir. Dr. Ng Soon Ching as the Advisor for the new term.

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- 18.3.2 The Technical Division held its 32nd Annual General Meeting in conjunction with a Pre-AGM Talk on title "Ultra-High Performance Fiber Reinforced Concrete (UHPFRC) Technology for the Present and Future" by Ir. Dr. Adj. Associate Professor Voon Yen Lei on 14th July 2018.
  - One hundred twenty-one (121) members attended the 32nd AGM, while one hundred and forty (140) members and non members attended the Pre-AGM Talk. At the 32nd AGM, Ir. Lo Seng Ling was re-elected as the Secretary / Treasurer for the term.
- 18.3.3 The Division continued to play an active role in maintaining a leading role in promoting closer interaction and co-operation amongst the various professional groups such as governmental agencies, professional bodies, academic institutions and universities by serving as Committee members in these organisations.
- 18.3.4 Members of the Division continued to serve as IEM Representatives in various Technical Committees (TCs) and Working Groups (WGs) in Department of Standard Malaysia, SIRIM, CIDB, MTIB, DBKL and in various government agencies.
- 18.3.5 As in the past, the Division continued the close rapport with Institution of Structural Engineers (Malaysia Division) (IStructE) in organising joint seminars, courses and talks for members of both Institutions and collaboration with universities for Competitions & Talks.
- 18.3.6 2018 has been a successful and active year for the Technical Division. The Technical Division organised fifteen (15) talks, five (5) visits and eight (8) paid activities. The "Civil & Structural Engineering Technical Division Prestige Talk" with title "TN50 Green Aspirations for Engineering Fraternity" by Y.Bhg. Dato' Prof. Ir. Zaini Ujang was successfully held on 1 March 2018 and attended by sixty nine (69) participants.
- 18.3.7 The Division will continue to play an effective role in organising activities for members in the Civil Structural Engineering interest. Numerous write-ups on evening talks/seminars/courses were published in the IEM Jurutera Bulletin and in IEM's Portal for the benefit of members who were unable to attend these events. The activities organised by the Division were summarised in the summary sheet of this Annual Report.

#### 18.4 Electrical Engineering Technical Division (EETD)

- 18.4.1 The 33rd Annual General Meeting of the Electrical Engineering Technical Division was held on 5th May 2018 (Saturday) at 11.00 a.m. at the Tan Sri Prof Chin Fung Kee Auditorium, Level 3, Wisma IEM, Petaling Jaya, Selangor Darul Ehsan and was attended by 131 members.
  - As per the tradition, the AGM began with a Pre- AGM Talk on "Sustainable Energy Policy in Malaysia What's Next?" which was presented by Ir. Akmal Rahimi Abu Samah, the then Chief Operating Officer (COO) of Sustainable Energy Development Authority (SEDA) Malaysia. A total of 138 participants attended the Pre-AGM talk.
- 18.4.2 Ir. Chong Chew Fan and Ir. Francis Xavier Jacob were re-elected as Chairman and Deputy Chairman of the Division respectively during the 319th meeting of the Division held on the 12th April 2018. During the AGM, Ir. Yau Chau Fong was invited to serve as Advisor of the Technical Division for Session 2018/2019. A total of 6 general members were elected for this new session with 5 co-opted members.
- 18.4.3 The EETD Committee members actively represented IEM at numerous meetings such as Working Groups and Technical Committee meetings organised by outside organisations, government and professional bodies such as Suruhanjaya Tenaga, SIRIM Berhad, TEEAM, trainings and others.
- 18.4.4 EETD Committee members have embarked on some new activities, one of it being the spearheading of the Position Paper Statement Committee Working Group for the topic "Building Railway Engineering Capacity for The Future"
- 18.4.5 One of the main highlights of 2018 was the IEM-Standards Malaysia-Suruhanjaya Tenaga ASEAN Electrotechnical Symposium & Exhibition 2018, which completed successfully on 4th 5th December 2018. A total of 564 participants attended the event and 39 exhibitors showcased their products for two days as well.
- 18.4.6 The Division continued to organise various activities for the members such as visits, talks, dialogues with other bodies and seminar/courses. Details of the activities organised are captured and highlighted in the summary sheets of this Annual Report 2018.

# 18.5 Environmental Engineering Technical Division (ENETD)

- 18.5.1 Under the provision of 3.2 and 3.3 of the Rules of the Division, and at the 274th Committee meeting held on 28th June 2018, Ir. Choo Chee Ming was re-elected as the Chairman and Ir Tang Boon Heong as Deputy Chairman for Session 2018/2019.
- 18.5.2 The 26th Annual General Meeting of the Division held on 28th July 2018 was attended by 84 members. In conjunction with the 26th Annual General Meeting, a talk entitled "WASTE TO WEALTH" by Ir. Mohamad Adan was held which attracted 90 members.
- 18.5.3 The activities of the Division are highlighted in the summary sheet of this Annual Report.



- 18.5.4 The Division continued to maintain good working relationships and rapport with governmental agencies and professional bodies by serving in their Technical Committees such as SIRIM, CIDB, BEM, SPAN, DOSH, MOSTI and DOE by serving as IEM representatives.
- 18.6 Geotechnical Engineering Technical Division (GETD)

- 18.6.1 Under provision 3.2 and 3.3 of the Rules of the Division, the 12th Committee Meeting held on 4th June 2018 unanimously re-elected Ir. Lee Peir Tien and Ir. Sin Peng Tean as the Chairman and Deputy Chairman respectively for the session 2018/2019.
- 18.6.2 The membership of the Division had decreased from 1,375 members in 2017 to 1,345 members in 2018 (as of 5th June 2018). This decrease is due to suspended members who did not pay the 2018 IEM Annual Subscription.
- 18.6.3 The 29th Annual General Meeting of the Division was held on 9th June 2018 and attended by 109 Members. A Technical Talk on Geotechnical Engineering Analysis and Design A Personal Journey was presented by Ir. Dr Ooi Lean Hock in conjunction with the AGM.
- 18.6.4 The Technical Division held its regular monthly meetings on every second Monday of the month with 12 monthly meetings to plan, discuss matters pertaining to geotechnical practices and co-ordinate the implementation of the various activities during the session.
- 18.6.5 For the year 2017, the Division managed to achieve top score in organising technical talks and seminars and was awarded as the winner for the IEM Presidential Award of Excellence.
- 18.6.6 The Division continued to invite distinguished and international speakers to share their knowledge and expertise with the members.
- 18.6.7 With the efforts from GETD, a total of 15 talks, 4 technical visits and 10 paid activities were organized during the session. The activities of the Division are highlighted in the summary sheet of this Annual Report.
- 18.6.8 The Division continue to extend its collaboration and jointly organised events with the following regional societies and branches:

- 18.9.3 The Chairman and members of this Division continued to play an active role in promoting close interaction and cooperation with various groups such as other Professional bodies (Energy Institute), Academic Institutions (Universiti Teknologi Petronas) and Oil and Gas Consultancy bodies (MOGEC / MOGSC) by engaging them in activities related to oil and gas industry.
- 18.9.4 As in the past, the Committee members also served actively in various activities relating to the division and other committees in the IEM.
- 18.9.5 This year, the Committee orchestrated an exciting event named "Pipeline Technical Day" which saw Oil and Gas mainstream players such as Oceaneering, H. Rosen and Stats Group, participating and sharing their experience to the 41 participants who attended the event.

# 20 IEM TRAINING CENTRE SDN. BHD.

#### 20.1 Courses

IEM Training Centre Sdn. Bhd. continues to organise Continuing Professional Development (CPD) courses for the benefits of engineers in particular IEM members. During the financial year ended 31 December 2018, a total of 44 BEM and Training courses were successfully organized.

#### 20.2 Training Courses

A total of 30 training courses were organized, 19 in Wisma IEM, 4 in IEM Branches, 4 In-house training and 3 other courses supporting GreenRE for profit-share of 15%.

#### 20.3 BEM Courses

A total of 14 BEM courses were organized, 12 in Wisma IEM, 1 in TNB-ILSAS and 1 held in Kuching together with IEM Kuching Branch (profit-sharing IEMTC: IEM Kuching = 70:30).

#### 20.4 ITA-AITES World Tunnel Congress 2020 (WTC2020)

In 2017, a formal bid document was submitted to the 43rd General Assembly of ITA-AITES. Voting took place at the General Assembly and Malaysia won to host WTC2020 beating the contenders, India and Australia.

WTC2020 and 46th General Assembly will be held on 15th – 21st May 2020 at Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre (KLCC). The event is expected to attract more than 2000 delegates and 200 exhibitors from all over the World. This is the first time Malaysia is playing host to such a huge world engineering gathering in Kuala Lumpur in the 46 years history of ITA-AITES.

The theme of the Congress is Innovation and Sustainable Underground Serving Global Connectivity.

Malaysia tunneling industry has been growing since the launch of SMART Project in 2003 and completed in 2007.

#### 20.5 Financial Year

Total income for the financial year ended 31 December 2018 was RM826,338.00 and total expenditure was RM1,144,539.00 for the year's operation, the Training Centre recorded a pre-tax deficit of RM318,201.00.

The drop-in revenue is due to low participation in BEM training courses for this fiscal year. The reason being BEM courses are no longer mandatory. As for training courses, the slow economy and inflation plus external competitors has very much affected the training courses.

For this financial year, the income and expenses of WTC2020 were not taken up into the accounts. It was recorded in the Balance Sheet as deferred income amounting to RM3,614,000.00 and expenses RM553,670.00. The WTC2020 accounts will only be reflected in year 2020.

# 21 IEM ACADEMY SDN. BHD.

IEM Academy Sdn Bhd (IEMASB) was incorporated on 11th September 2012 and is a wholly owned subsidiary of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia (IEM).

#### HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

- The 2018 fiscal Statement of Accounts and the Balance Sheet of the Institution are as presented. The accounts are maintained 1. by the Standing Committee on Finance to which the Hon. Treasurer is the Secretary.
- 2 The financial statements presented comprise of three sets of accounts. The columns denoted by "Institution" refers to the financial performance of IEM but these figures do not include the financial position of the IEM Branches who file their financial statements with the IRB of the respective states.
- The columns denoted by "Group" refers to the consolidated accounts of IEM, IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd and IEM Academy 3. Sdn Bhd. There are some columns where figures are shown under "Institution" but blank under "Group" and vice versa. This is due to the figures being payment/receipt between IEM, IEM TC and IEMASB which were eliminated on consolidation.
- The total income for year 2018 is RM5,113,070 which is RM2,432,161 lower than that of year 2017. The total income included 4. RM517.275 being net income from Institutional services. RM558.314 being surplus from activities of the Technical Divisions and RM193,458, surplus from the Women in Science, Engineering and Technology conference organized in 2018.
- 5. The drop in performance is due mainly to the disposal of the Penang Branch property in 2017 which resulted in a profit of RM1,436,618 and the backdated dividend from IEM Training Centre amounting to RM489,289 from 2016 and 2017. As reported at the AGM in 2018, the tenant for Wisma IEM had terminated their tenancy in June 2017 and that resulted in a loss of rental amounting to approximately RM1,176,000. The Standing Committee on Finance had been working hard to get a tenant for the building but only managed to secure a tenant for first and second floor in April 2019.
- In addition, other sources of income also showed a decrease Annual Subscriptions dropped by 1.7% while rental income 6. dropped by 45%. There was also no dividend declared from IEM Training Centre and Academy in view of drop in their performance as well.
- The main source of income continue to be annual subscriptions which amounted to RM3,329,803 for 2018 which made up 7. approximately 66% of the total income of the Institution compared to 51% in 2017. At the end of 2018, there was RM372,050 subscriptions still owing from members.
- The total expenditure of the Institution was RM6.081.431, which was RM441.160 higher than that of year 2017. The main 8. operating expenditure items were personnel emoluments RM2,773,351 (46%), administrative expenses RM1,259,864, finance cost (term loan interest) RM97,319 and Branch Subsidies RM418,264. Expenses for year 2018 was 7.8% higher than
- 9. Various initiatives had been implemented to save operating costs including the move to paperless meetings in IEM thereby reducing cost of printing as well as posting of minutes of meetings/meeting documents to Committee Members. A circular was also sent together with the annual renewal notice to seek members' consent to send e-Bulletin instead of the hard copy. Members who consent to this will be issued the e-Bulletin via email beginning middle of 2019.
- 10 The Standing Committee on Finance is also looking into ways to encourage members to pay their annual subscriptions on

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2018

#### 1. Basis of preparation

#### (a) Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of the Institution of Engineers, Malaysia ("hereinafter referred to as the "Institution") have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standards ("MPERS") and the constitution and by-laws of the institution.

The financial statements of the Group and the Institution have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise indicated in the significant accounting policies below.

#### (b) Functional and Presentation Currency

These financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is the Group's and the Institution's functional currency. All financial information is presented in RM and has been rounded to the nearest RM except when otherwise stated.

#### (c) Significant accounting judgments, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the Group's and the Institution's financial statements requires the Council to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income, expenditure, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities at the reporting date. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that could require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in the future.

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of the reporting period, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next reporting period are set out below:

# (i) Useful lives of property, plant and equipment

The Group and the Institution regularly review the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment based on factors such as business plan and strategies, expected level of usage and future technological developments. Future results of operations could be materially affected by changes in these estimates brought about by changes in the factors mentioned above. A reduction in the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment would increase the recorded depreciation and decrease the value of property, plant and equipment.

#### (ii) Impairment of loans and receivables

The Group and the Institution assess at end of each reporting period whether there is any objective evidence that a receivable is impaired. To determine whether there is objective evidence of impairment, the Group and the Institution consider factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments.

Where there is objective evidence of impairment, the amount and timing of future cash flows are estimated based on historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics.

# (iii) Income taxes

Judgement is involved in determining the provision for income taxes. There are certain transactions and computations for which the ultimate tax determination is uncertain during the ordinary course of business.

The Group and the Institution recognise liabilities for expected tax issues based on estimates of whether additional taxes will be due. Where the final tax outcome of these matters is different from the amounts that were initially recognised, such differences will impact the income tax and deferred tax provisions in the period in which such determination is made.



# 2. Summary of significant accounting policies

#### (a) Business combinations and consolidation

#### (i) Business combinations

The Group applies the acquisition method to account for all business combinations. If the acquisition of an assets or of assets does not constitute a business, it is accounted for as an asset acquisition.

The Group identifies the acquisition date of a business combination as the date on which the Group obtains control of an acquiree. Control is obtained when the Group commence to have the power to direct financial and operating policy decisions of the investee so as to obtain benefits from its activities. This may require fulfilment of precedent conditions, such as completion of due diligence audit, and shareholder's approvals if they are specified in a sale and purchase agreement.

As of the acquisition date, the Group recognises, separately from goodwill, the identifiable assets acquired (including identifiable intangible assets), the liabilities assumed (including contingent liabilities) and any non-controlling interest in the acquiree. The identifiable assets acquired and liabilities assumed are measured their acquisition - date fair values, except for those permitted or required to be measured on other bases by MPERS. Non-controlling interest at the acquisition date is measured at its acquisition date share of net assets, excluding goodwill.

The costs of a business combination is measured at fair value, calculated as the sum of the acquisition-date fair value of assets transferred (including contingent consideration), the liabilities incurred to former owners of the acquiree and the equity instruments issued by the Group. Expenses incurred in connection with a business combination are capitalised in the cost of business combination.

The cost of a business combination is allocated to the share of net assets acquired to determine the initial amount of goodwill on combination. In a business combination achieved in stages (including acquisition of a former associate or a former joint venture), the cost of each exchange transaction is compared with the share of net assets to determine the goodwill of each exchange transaction on a step-by-step basis. Any increase in equity interest in an investee after the acquisition date is accounted as an equity transaction between the parent and the non-controlling interest and the effect is adjusted directly in equity.

In the initial accounting for a business combination is not complete by the end of the reporting period in which the combination occurs, the Group uses provisional fair value amounts for the items which the accounting is incomplete. The provisional amounts are adjusted to reflect new information obtained about facts and circumstances that existed as the acquisition date, including additional assets or liabilities identified in the measurement period. The measurement period for completion of the initial accounting ends after one year from the acquisition date.

# (ii) Subsidiaries and Basis of Consolidation

The Group recognises a subsidiary based on the criterion of control. A subsidiary is an entity (including special purpose entities) over which the Group has the power to govern the financial and operating policy decisions of the investee so as to obtain benefits from its activities. In circumstances when the voting right's are not more than half or when voting rights are not the dominant determinant of control, the Group uses judgements to assess whether it has de facto control, control by other arrangements (including control of special purpose entities), or by holding substantive potential voting rights.

The financial statements of the Institution and all its subsidiaries used in the preparation of the consolidated financial statements are prepared as of the same reporting date. The consolidated financial statements are prepared using uniform accounting policies for like transactions, other events and conditions in similar circumstances.

The carrying amount of investments in each subsidiary of a parent in the Group is eliminated against the parent's portion of equity in each subsidiary. The consolidated financial statements combine like items of assets, liabilities, equity, income, expenses and cash flows of the Institution and all its subsidiaries. The results of subsidiaries acquired or disposed of during the year are included in the consolidated statement of income and expenditure from the effective date of acquisition (which is the date the group assumes control of an investee) or up to effective date (which is the date group ceases to have control of an investee).

All intra-group balance and transactions are eliminated in full on consolidation. Unrealised profits or losses arising from intra-group transactions are also eliminated in full on consolidation, except when an unrealised loss is an impairment loss.

When the Group ceases to control a subsidiary, the difference between the proceeds from the disposal of the subsidiary and its carrying amount at the date control is lost is recognised in profit or loss in the statements of Income and Expenditure as a gain or loss on disposal of the subsidiary. The cumulative amount of any exchange differences that relate to a foreign subsidiary recognised in other comprehensive income is not reclassified to profit or loss on disposal of the subsidiary. If the Group retains an equity interest in the former subsidiary, it is accounted for as a financial assets (provided it does not become an associate or a joint venture). The carrying amount of the investment retained at the date that the entity ceases to be a subsidiary is regarded as the cost on initial measurement of the financial assets.

Any decrease in equity stake in a subsidiary that does not result in a loss of control is accounted for as an equity transaction and the financial effect is adjusted directly in the consolidated statements of recognised gains and losses.

### (b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The policy of recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with Note 2 (j).

#### (i) Recognition and measurement

Cost includes purchase price for purchased assets, any other costs directly attributable in bringing the asset to its present location and condition for its intended use, cost of replacing component parts of the assets, and the present value of the expected cost for the decommissioning of the assets after their use. The cost of self-constructed assets also includes the cost of materials and direct labour. Borrowing cost and all other repair and maintenance costs are recognised in income and expenditure as incurred.

The cost of property, plant and equipment recognised as a result of a business combination is based on fair value at acquisition date. The fair value of property is the estimated amount for which a property could be exchanged on the date of valuation between a willing buyer and a willing seller in an arm's length transaction after proper marketing wherein the parties had each acted knowledgeably, prudently and without compulsion. The fair value of other items of plant and equipment is based on the quoted market prices for similar items.

When significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Gains or losses arising on the disposal of property, plant and equipment are determined as the difference between the disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the assets and are recognised in income and expenditure.

#### (ii) Subsequent costs

The cost of replacing part of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the carrying amount of the item if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the part will flow to the Group and the Institution and its cost can be measured reliably. The costs of the day-to-day servicing of property, plant and equipment are recognised in the profit or loss as incurred. Investment property whose fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort is measured on the cost model.

#### (iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is recognised in the profit or loss on straight line basis to write off the cost or valuation of each asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life. Freehold land is not depreciated. Leased assets are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Property, plant and equipment under construction are not depreciated until the assets are ready for its intended use.

Property, plant and equipment are depreciated based on the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Freehold buildings	2%
Leasehold land and buildings	2%
Furniture and fittings	5% - 20%
Office equipments	10% - 20%
Library books	10%
Library software	10%
Building renovation	5%
Lift	10%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed at each reporting period end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the property, plant and equipment.

# (c) Investment properties

Investment properties are properties which are held either to earn rental income or for capital appreciation.

Properties which are occupied by the Institution are accounted for using cost model as undue cost of no material benefit to the member is required, if an independent valuation is carried out.

Investment properties are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, consistent with the accounting policies for property, plant and equipment.

Depreciation of the leasehold land and building is charged to statements of income and expenditure on a straight line basis over the estimated useful lives of 99 years and 50 years respectively.

Investment properties are derecognised when they have been disposed of or when investment properties is permanently withdrawn from use and no future economic benefit is expected from its disposal. Any gain or loss on the retirement or disposal of an investment property is recognised in statements of income and expenditure in the year of retirement or disposal.

#### (d) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities, including derivative instruments, are recognised on the statements of financial position when, and only when, the Group and the Institution become a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recognised at the transaction price plus transaction costs if they are not measured at fair value through profit or loss unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction. Financial assets and financial liabilities that constitute a financing transaction are measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument. Transaction costs for financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in income and expenditure in period in which they are incurred.

The Group and the Institution classify their financial assets and financial liabilities into the following categories:

#### (i) Financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value with any gains or losses arising from changes in the fair values recognised in income and expenditure in the period in which the changes arise. If the fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort, the financial assets is subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

#### (ii) Other financial assets and other financial liabilities measured at amortised cost

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Financial assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the financial assets and financial liabilities are derecognised or impaired, and through the amortisation process.

A financial asset or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset has expired or has been settled, or control of the asset is not retained or the Group and the Institution have transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership. On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the carrying amount and the sum of consideration received, including any newly created rights and obligations, is recognised in income and expenditure.

A financial liability or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as a derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability, and the difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in income and expenditure.

### (e) Subscription in arrears

Subscription in arrears of one year and more and where, in the opinion of the Council, are no longer recoverable from its members are written off to the Statements of Income and Expenditure.

#### (f) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, balances and deposits with banks and highly liquid investments which have an insignificant risk of changes in fair value with original maturities of three months or less, and are used by the Group and the Institution in the management of their short-term commitments. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents are presented net of bank overdrafts and pledged deposits.

#### (g) Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the statements of financial position if, and only if, there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

#### (h) Capital reserve fund

Fund raised from members for the purchase of property, plant and equipment are capitalised as Capital Reserve Fund.

#### (i) Library fund

Enrolment fee received from corporate members for library membership of the Institution and donation received from members or non-members for capital expenditure of the library are capitalised as Library Fund.

#### (j) Building fund

Funds and donations received from members for the purchase of Wisma IEM are capitalised in Building Fund. A separate bank account has been kept for the fund.

# (k) Stem fund

STEM stands for Science, Technologies Engineer Malaysia. It is a fund collected from members for student.

#### (I) Impairment of assets

#### (i) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of non-financial assets (except for inventories, amount due from contract customers, deferred tax assets, and investment property measured at fair value) are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or cash-generating units. For the purpose of goodwill impairment testing, cash-generating units to which goodwill has been allocated are aggregated so that the level at which impairment testing is performed reflects the lowest level at which goodwill is monitored for internal reporting purposes. The goodwill acquired in a business combination, for the purpose of impairment testing, is allocated to a cash-generating unit or a group of cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and its value-in-use. In assessing value-in-use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset or cash-generating unit.

An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or cash-generating unit exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which such impairment loss is recognised directly against any revaluation surplus for the asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same asset. Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) and then to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) on a pro rata basis.

An impairment loss in respect of goodwill is not reversed. In respect of other assets, impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at the end of each reporting period for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognised. The reversal is limited so that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its recoverable amount, nor exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, had no impairment loss been recognised for asset in prior years. Such reversal is recognised in the profit or loss unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase.

#### (ii) Financial assets

All financial assets, other than those categorised as fair value through profit or loss, investments in subsidiary companies, associates and joint ventures are assessed at each reporting date whether there is any objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events having an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the asset.

To determine whether there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets has been incurred, The Education Fund considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments. For certain categories of financial assets, such as trade receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are subsequently assessed for impairment on a collective basis based on similar risk characteristics. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Group's past experience of collecting payments, an increase in the number of delayed payments in the portfolio past the average credit period and observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with defaults on receivables.

If any such evidence exists, the amount of impairment loss is measured as the difference between the assets' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows (excluding future expected credit losses that have not yet been incurred) discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The carrying amount of the asset is reduced through the use of an allowance account and the amount of impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss. Receivables together with the associated allowance are written off when there is no realistic prospect of future recovery.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised in profit or loss, the impairment loss is reversed, to the extent that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not been recognised at the date the impairment is reversed. The amount of reversal is recognised in income and expenditure.

#### (m) Revenue

#### (i) Member's subscription fee

Member's subscription fee is payable annually at the beginning of the financial year. Only that subscription which is attributable to the current financial year is recognised as income. Subscription relating to periods beyond the current financial year is taken up in the statements of financial position as subscription in advance under current liabilities. Subscription is payable in full irrespective of the date of resignation of members during the financial year.

## (ii) Advertisement in Buletin/Journal

Advertisement income receivable for the placement of advertisement in bulletin/journal published by the Institution is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

#### (iii) Rental income

Rental income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

#### (iv) Credit cards commission

Credit cards commission from the banks are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

#### (v) Interest Income

Interest income is recognised on accruals basis using the effective interest method.

#### (vi) Dividend income

Dividend income is recognised when the right to received payment is established.

#### (I) Employee benefits

#### (i) Short term employee benefits

Wages, salaries, bonuses and social security contributions are recognised as an expense in the reporting period in which the associated services are rendered by employees of the Group and of the Institution. Short term accumulating compensated absences such as paid annual leave are recognised when services are rendered by employees that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences. Short term non-accumulating compensated absences such as sick and medical leave are recognised when the absences occur.

The expected cost of accumulating compensated absences is measured as additional amount expected to be paid as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the end of the reporting period.

### (ii) Defined contribution plans

As required by law, companies in Malaysia contribute to the state pension scheme, the Employee Provident Fund ("EPF"). Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the profit or loss as incurred. Once the contributions have been paid, the Group and the Institution have no further payment obligations.

# (o) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred. Borrowing costs consist of interest and other costs that the Group and the Institution incurred in connection with the borrowing of funds.

#### (p) Income taxes

Tax expense in income and expenditure comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax and deferred tax is recognised in income and expenditure.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the financial year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is recognised using the liability method for all temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the statement of financial position and their tax bases. Deferred tax is not recognised for the temporary differences arising from the initial recognition of goodwill, the initial recognition of assets and liabilities in a transaction which is not a business combination and that affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to the temporary differences when they reverse, based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

A deferred tax asset is recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2017

#### 1. Basis of preparation

#### (a) Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of The Education Fund of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia ("the Fund") have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standards ("MPERS") and the rules of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia.

The financial statements of the Fund have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise indicated in the significant accounting policies below.

#### (b) Functional and Presentation Currency

These financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is the Fund's functional currency. All financial information is presented in RM and has been rounded to the nearest RM except when otherwise stated.

#### 2. Summary of significant accounting policies

#### (a) Revenue

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised on accruals basis using the effective interest method.

Donation received

Donation is recognised in the statement of income and expenditure on cash receipt basis.

#### (b) Income taxes

Tax expense in income and expenditure comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax and deferred tax is recognised in income and expenditure.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the financial year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is recognised using the liability method for all temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the statement of financial position and their tax bases. Deferred tax is not recognised for the temporary differences arising from the initial recognition of goodwill, the initial recognition of assets and liabilities in a transaction which is not a business combination and that affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to the temporary differences when they reverse, based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

A deferred tax asset is recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of a deferred tax asset is reviewed, and is reduced to the extent that it is no longer probably that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow the benefit of a part or all of that deferred tax asset to be utilised. Any such reduction will be reversed to the extent that it becomes probably that sufficient taxable profit will be available.

A current or deferred tax is recognised as income and expense in profit or loss for the period, except to the extent that the tax arises from items recognised outside profit or loss. For an income or expense item recognised in other comprehensive income, the current or deferred tax expense or tax income is recognised in other comprehensive income. For items recognised directly in equity, the related tax effect is also recognised directly in equity.





#### (c) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The policy of recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with Note 2 (g).

#### (i) Recognition and measurement

Cost includes purchase price for purchased assets, any other costs directly attributable in bringing the asset to its present location and condition for its intended use, cost of replacing component parts of the assets, and the present value of the expected cost for the decommissioning of the assets after their use. The cost of self-constructed assets also includes the cost of materials and direct labour. Borrowing cost and all other repair and maintenance costs are recognised in income and expenditure as incurred.

The cost of property, plant and equipment recognised as a result of a business combination is based on fair value at acquisition date. The fair value of property is the estimated amount for which a property could be exchanged on the date of valuation between a willing buyer and a willing seller in an arm's length transaction after proper marketing wherein the parties had each acted knowledgeably, prudently and without compulsion. The fair value of other items of plant and equipment is based on the quoted market prices for similar items.

When significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Gains or losses arising on the disposal of property, plant and equipment are determined as the difference between the disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the assets and are recognised in income and expenditure.

#### (ii) Subsequent costs

The cost of replacing part of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the carrying amount of the item if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the part will flow to The Education Fund and its cost can be measured reliably. The costs of the day-to-day servicing of property, plant and equipment are recognised in the income and expenditure as incurred. Investment property whose fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort is measured on the cost model.

#### (iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is recognised in the income and expenditure on straight line basis to write off the cost or valuation of each asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life.

Property, plant and equipment are depreciated based on the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Office equipment 10% Furniture and fittings 10% Computers 40%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed at each reporting period end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the property, plant and equipment.

#### (d) Intangible assets

#### (i) Intangible assets acquired separately

The initial cost of a separate acquired intangible asset includes its purchase price and any directly attributable cost of preparing the asset for its intended use. Subsequent to initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses. Amortisation is recognised in the income and expenditure on straight line basis to write off the cost of each intangible asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life from the date it is available for use.

Software are amortised based on the estimated useful lives of 5 years.

The estimated useful lives and amortisation methods are reviewed at the end of each reporting date, with the effect of any changes in estimate being accounted for on a prospective basis.

#### (ii) Derecognition of intangible assets

An intangible asset is derecognised on disposal, or when no future economic benefits are expected from use or disposal. Gains or losses arising from derecognition of an intangible asset, measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset, are recognised in income and expenditure when the asset is derecognised.

See accounting policy Note 2(g) to the financial statements on impairment of non-financial assets for intangible assets.





#### (e) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities, including derivative instruments, are recognised on the statements of financial position when, and only when, The Education Fund become a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recognised at the transaction price plus transaction costs if they are not measured at fair value through profit or loss unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction. Financial assets and financial liabilities that constitute a financing transaction are measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument. Transaction costs for financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in income and expenditure in period in which they are incurred.

The Fund classifies their financial assets and financial liabilities into the following categories:

(i) Financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value with any gains or losses arising from changes in the fair values recognised in income and expenditure in the period in which the changes arise. If the fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort, the financial assets is subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

(ii) Other financial assets and other financial liabilities measured at amortised cost

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Financial assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. Gains and losses are recognised in income and expenditure when the financial assets and financial liabilities are derecognised or impaired, and through the amortisation process.

A financial asset or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset has expired or has been settled, or control of the asset is not retained or the Fund have transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership. On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the carrying amount and the sum of consideration received, including any newly created rights and obligations, is recognised in income and expenditure.

A financial liability or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as a derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability, and the difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in income and expenditure.

# (f) Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the statements of financial position if, and only if, there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

# (g) Impairment of assets

#### (i) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of non-financial assets (except for inventories, amount due from contract customers, deferred tax assets, and investment property measured at fair value) are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or cash-generating units. For the purpose of goodwill impairment testing, cash-generating units to which goodwill has been allocated are aggregated so that the level at which impairment testing is performed reflects the lowest level at which goodwill is monitored for internal reporting purposes. The goodwill acquired in a business combination, for the purpose of impairment testing, is allocated to a cash-generating unit or a group of cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and its value-in-use. In assessing value-in-use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset or cash-generating unit.

An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or cash-generating unit exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which such impairment loss is recognised directly against any revaluation surplus for the asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same asset. Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) and then to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) on a pro rata basis.

An impairment loss in respect of goodwill is not reversed. In respect of other assets, impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at the end of each reporting period for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognised. The reversal is limited so that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its recoverable amount, nor exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, had no impairment loss been recognised for asset in prior years. Such reversal is recognised in the profit or loss unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase.

#### (ii) Financial assets

All financial assets, other than those categorised as fair value through profit or loss, investments in subsidiary companies, associates and joint ventures are assessed at each reporting date whether there is any objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events having an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the asset.

To determine whether there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets has been incurred, the Fund considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments. For certain categories of financial assets, such as trade receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are subsequently assessed for impairment on a collective basis based on similar risk characteristics. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Fund's past experience of collecting payments, an increase in the number of delayed payments in the portfolio past the average credit period and observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with defaults on receivables.

If any such evidence exists, the amount of impairment loss is measured as the difference between the assets' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows (excluding future expected credit losses that have not yet been incurred) discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The carrying amount of the asset is reduced through the use of an allowance account and the amount of impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss. Receivables together with the associated allowance are written off when there is no realistic prospect of future recovery.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised in profit or loss, the impairment loss is reversed, to the extent that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not been recognised at the date the impairment is reversed. The amount of reversal is recognised in income and expenditure.

#### (h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, balances and deposits with banks and other highly liquid investments which have an insignificant risk of changes in fair value with original maturities of three months or less, and are used by the Fund in the management of their short-term commitments. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents are presented net of bank overdrafts and pledged deposits.

#### 3. Tax expense

The Fund is an approved fund under Section 44(6) of the Income Tax Act 1967 ("the Act"). More than 50% of the total income received by the Fund in the preceding year has been spent during the current year. Hence, the total income for the Year Assessment 2017 is exempted from tax under Paragraph 13(a) of Schedule 6 of the Act.
