7.18 The Council shall meet as often as the business may require but at least once in each quarter. Except for an extraordinary meeting, which may be called at any time, the notice of a meeting of Council shall be circulated at least ten (10) days before such meeting.

The accidental omission to send notice of a meeting to, or the non receipt of a notice by, any Corporate Member, <u>and for meetings of Council, including the Appointed Council members</u>, shall not invalidate the proceedings at the meeting.

7.18A Not less than 10% of the total number of Council Members, may at any time requisition a Council Meeting to pass a motion of no confidence against the President.

7.18B The petition for such Council Meeting shall be in writing and signed by the Council Members requisite for the meeting and served on the President. Deputy President and the Honorary Secretary of the Institution; and the Council shall convene a Council Meeting to be held within thirty (30) days of such service.

7.18C The written petition shall specify the object of the proposed meeting, to wit: to pass a motion of no confidence against the President.

7.18D If the Council fails to convene a Council Meeting in accordance with the requisition within thirty (30) days of the service of such requisition, the requisitioning Council Members may convene the Council Meeting within sixty (60) days of such service.

7.18E A simple majority votes will pass the motion. The Chairman will be elected by the Council at that meeting. The President and Deputy President are not eligible to chair this meeting.

7.18F As soon as the motion is passed, the President shall be deemed to have relinquished his post.

7.18G If the President has relinquished his post pursuant to Section.

7.18F, the Deputy President shall assume the post of President in accordance to Article 5.9 of the Constitution.

Section 7.22

Only Corporate Member actually and rightfully present at any meeting of the Council, the Executive Committee, Standing Committees or a general meeting shall have the right to vote on any motion before such meeting.

Section 8.17 The Council may establish or recognise any Section of Non-Corporate Members comprising one or more grades of membership. The formation of each Section shall be sanctioned only if the Council shall have received a requisition for such recognition signed by not less than fifty (50) Non-Corporate Members.

Section VIIIC <u>Women Engineers, Companion, Graduate,</u> Student and Non-Corporate Member Sections

Section 8.17 The Council may establish or recognise any Section of <u>Women Engineers</u>, <u>Companion</u>, <u>Graduate</u>, <u>Student and Non-Corporate Members comprising one or more grades of membership. The formation of each Section shall be sanctioned only if the Council shall have received a requisition for such recognition signed by not less than fifty (50) Members in the respective grade of membership.</u>





MINUTES OF 57TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA HELD ON 16 APRIL 2016 AT TAN SRI PROF. CHIN FUNG KEE AUDITORIUM,

MEMBERS PRESENT – AS PER APPENDIX A

WISMA IEM, PETALING JAYA AT 9.00 AM

1.0 OPENING ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT

1.1 The President, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock thanked and welcomed members present at the 57th AGM. He then informed that three different rooms were being used for the AGM, namely the Tan Sri Prof Chin Fung Kee Auditorium located on the 3rd Floor, which would be the main room, the C&S/TUS Lecture Room on the 2nd floor and lastly the Malakoff Auditorium on the ground floor.

The President further informed that video conferencing would be held in the two rooms on the ground floor and second floor respectively (Malakoff Auditorium and C&S/TUSTD Lecture room).

The President also mentioned that Secretariat staff were stationed in each of the rooms to assist members during the AGM. The President then requested members to provide their names and membership numbers during the Q&A session for record purposes.

The AGM was updated on some of the events that took place for the session.

1.2 Demise of Past President

The AGM was informed of the passing of Ir. Chiam Teong Tee (Ir. T. T. Chiam), IEM Past President on 30 January 2016. The President requested all members to observe one minute of silence as a mark of respect.

1.3 IEM New Logo

The President introduced the new IEM Logo with the letterings IEM beside the Crest and the new tagline "Internationalising Engineers' Mobility". The intention of the improved logo was to make the IEM crest more recognisable.

1.4 Signing of Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs)

The AGM was informed that IEM had recently signed two (2) MoUs with overseas engineering institutions, i.e. with The Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh and The Institution of Engineers, India during the session.

Another six (6) MoUs were signed with Universities and Institutions of Higher Learning, bringing the total Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs) signed with Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) to sixteen (16). The MoUs signed during the session with IHLs included Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), Taylors University, Politeknik Sultan Hj Ahmad Shah (POLISAS), Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) and University of Malaya (UM)

The President added that IEM had also signed MoU with Majlis Perbandaran Hang Tuah Jaya (MPHTJ) to conduct joint activities such as public awareness programmes and assisting the local council in providing better engineering services and amenities to the community.

On the corporate sector side, IEM is also initiating partnerships with industry on membership drive. The first MoU with industry was signed with MMC Corporation Berhad (MMC). The MoU would pave the way for IEM to facilitate organising workshop sessions and to upgrade the competencies of MMC engineers to become M.IEM/P.Eng., as well as to collaborate with MMC in areas of mutual interest.

1.5 Active Engagement with Government Bodies and Local Authorities

The President further reported that IEM was also currently involved with other Government agencies mainly to forge collaborations with various departments on issues concerning engineering. Such agencies included MATRADE, MITI, SIRIM, Standards Malaysia, CIDB, CREAM, DOSH, DBKL, Energy Commission, KPKT etc. IEM's Branches also actively engaged with their respective local councils and authorities by sitting as Committee members on numerous state Councils and Special State Committees.

IEM also continued to have close rapport with other Professional Bodies.

1.6 Media Engagement and Coverage

The AGM was informed that IEM continued to be active in providing press releases and press statements on various engineering issues and matters of national interest. A total of eleven (11) press statements were issued and 26 press clippings were published in the media, and all were uploaded onto the IEM Web Portal.

1.7 Conferences and Activities

IEM also organised CAFEO33 in Penang from 23 - 26 November 2015. IEM Penang Branch was appointed to host the conference on behalf of IEM. The Branch had performed remarkably in organizing the conference which also included meetings of the AFEO Governing Board, Woman and Young Engineers programmes, networking dinners and technical visits. The conference was officially opened by Tun Dato' Seri Utama (Dr.) Hj Abdul Rahman bin Haji Abbas, Tuan Yang Terutama Penang and attended by more than 1200 delegates. The President also congratulated the Organising Chairman, Ir. Paul Phor for organising the successful event.





IEM organised three other major conferences and 154 evening talks, 77 courses, workshops and seminars as well as 48 technical visits during the last session.

1.8 Membership

The AGM was informed that IEM membership increased from 36,000 (reported at the 2015 AGM) to 40,118 at this AGM.

The President congratulated the Sub Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions (MDP) headed by Ir. Dr. Cheong Thiam Fook for the substantial increase in membership.

Concerted efforts were put in to gear towards achieving 100,000 members by the year 2020. The President expressed his appreciation for the relentless effort of all Committee involved as well as the Secretariat in the increased activities of the Institution.

1.9 IEM Building Fund

The President also appealed to members to continue contributing towards the Building Fund as the Institution still have an outstanding loan of more than RM3 million.

2.0 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF 56th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 16 APRIL 2014

2.1 TThe President then invited members present to go through the minutes of the previous AGM which was printed on pages 67 to 77 of the Annual Report as well as the Bahasa Malaysia version which was on pages 82 to 94.

Since there were no errors highlighted from the minutes, Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086) proposed that the minutes of the 56th Annual General Meeting held on 18 April 2015 be confirmed and adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Jayaseelan Nadrajah (F14445).

3.0 MATTERS ARISING

The President then went through and provided clarifications on the following items:

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KPIs for Technical Divisions

The President reported that under KPIs for Technical Divisions, the Standing Committee on Activities now have an agenda to monitor the performance of all the Technical Divisions. In 2015, all Technical Divisions were performing well and met most of their targets.

4.0 ANNUAL REPORT FOR SESSION 2015/2016

The President then invited the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Yam Teong Sian to present the various activities and events organised in 2015.

4.1 Council and Excomm

For the session 2015/2016, a total of five (5) Council meetings were held. The Council at their meetings discussed matters related to IEM policies and made decisions on matters pertaining to the running of the Institution. Excomm had thirteen (13) meetings for session 2015/2016 and the role of Excomm was to implement and carry out the decisions of the Council.

4.2 Membership

The AGM was informed that for 2015, a total of 11,708 candidates were approved for admission/election/transfer to the various grades. Out of the new members recruited, 9,231 were students. However, 4,403 members were in arrears of subscriptions and needed to be suspended at the end of the year.

It was also reported that there had been a steady growth of membership since the Standing Committee on Admissions and Practical Training (APT) embarked on the membership drive and recruitment efforts.

In addition, it was noted that Civil engineering discipline had the highest number of members at 13,790 followed by Mechanical (9,973), Electrical (6,414), Electronic (3,743) and Chemical (2,742).

4.3 International Registers

For the international registers and affiliations, it was recorded that for the year 2015, 17 members had signed up as ASEAN Engineers (ASEAN Eng) and 23 were approved as Associate ASEAN Engineers (AAE) while 35 were approved for APEC / International Engineer Registers (IntPE).





4.4 Examinations and Qualification

The AGM was further informed that for session 2015/2016, a total of 571 applied to sit for the Professional Interview (PI). The number of candidates who failed the PI was 106 which made up a failure rate of 18.5%.

It was noted that the enhanced PI Process will be implemented on trial basis in 2016. The Ad Hoc Committee had conducted four (4) training and certification workshops at HQ in 2015. Similar workshops would be conducted at all IEM Branches in 2016.

The IEM/BEM Graduate Examination was conducted for the last time in October 2015 and with effect from 2016, the examination which started in May 1978 would be discontinued.

4.5 Information and Publications

The Honorary Secretary informed the AGM that twelve (12) issues of the "Jurutera" – IEM Bulletin were published in 2015. The number of pages was increased to include more news and information. It was further reported that one (1) issue of the Journal was published in 2015.

Three (3) articles on History of IEM - acquisition of Wisma IEM, was published in the Bulletin in 2015. A note of appreciation was recorded to YBhg Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon for his work going through the records in IEM to produce the articles.

4.6 IEM Library

The AGM further noted that the IEM Library currently had a collection of 6,711 printed book titles covering a variety of disciplines. Since the introduction of the e-Book in 2014, IEM had a collection of more than 110 titles. All members are encouraged to make use of this feature which is available in the portal. New book collections would be announced regularly through the IEM portal as well as the Bulletin.

4.7 Activities

The Honorary Secretary highlighted that organising activities had been IEM's priority for the members especially to assist them in satisfying the CPD requirements of BEM. Approximately 300 talks, visits and courses were organised during the session. IEM also organised a number of international conferences, competitions and social events.

Some major events that IEM organised included CAFEO 33, WE Summit 2015, IEM-IET Electrical Conference, 11th Malaysia Chem-e-Car Competition and CIDB-IEM Construction Career Fair.

4.8 Upcoming Events

The AGM noted the upcoming events such as the 57th IEM Annual Dinner and Awards Night at Sunway Resort Hotel & Spa, the IEM 2016 Family Day on 18 May 2016 at Persada Plus, ASEAN M&E Show from 23-25 May 2016, SEAGC 2016 at Dorsett Grand Subang from 31 May – 3 June 2016, IEM Golf Tournament in June 2016, IEM Engineering Week from 14 – 21 August 2016, E-Run on 14 August 2016 and the Asian Congress on Fluid Mechanics from 21 – 24 November 2016 in Kuching, Sarawak.

4.9 Presidential Award of Excellence

4.10 IEM Form of Contract

The AGM was also informed that under IEM Form of Contract, road shows were conducted to promote the two revised editions of the IEM Form of Contracts i.e;

- (i) IEM.CE 2011 IEM Form of Contract for Civil Engineering Works (Second Edition, July 2011); and
- (ii) IEM.ME 2012 IEM Form of Contract for Mechanical and Electrical Engineering Works (Second Edition, 2012)

4.11 Fire Advisory Board (Sub Committee of Standing Committee on Professional Practice)

The Honorary Secretary reported that the Fire Advisory Board (FAB) had compiled circulars and latest guidelines produced by the Local Authority e.g. BOMBA. This effort was a service to members to provide informative news and circulations through the IEM Website (currently parked under the "Publications" Sub-Section under the "Authorities Having Jurisdiction (AHJ)".

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4.12 Affinity Programme And Corporate Discounts

A new agreement had been signed with CIMB to replace the Affinity Programme which IEM had with Direct Access. Members were encouraged to use these cards as there would be benefits provided to IEM.

In addition, IEM also obtained Corporate Discounts from PJ Hilton and Armada Hotel as well as MPH Book Stores and BP Lab for health screening tests.

4.13 Disaster Relief Team

The Honorary Secretary continued to report that IEM would be forming a Disaster Relief Team that could be deployed to help in times of disaster. Twenty (20) members were shortlisted to receive training from MERCY and RedR.

4.14 Memorandum of Understanding

4.13 IEM Branches

The AGM was informed that IEM Penang Branch had successfully organised CAFEO33 with more than 1000 participants. IEM Southern Branch was very active in Student member recruitment with more than 2,000 students recruited in 2015 alone.

IEM Sabah Training Centre at Kota Kinabalu Industrial Park was officially opened in June 2016. IEM Sabah Branch also organised the IEM Engineering Run with record breaking participation of 2,000 runners.

IEM Sarawak Branch also had a very active and fruitful year with more than 800 guests and attendees at their Annual Dinner. IEM Miri Branch's Annual Dinner on 5 March 2016 also garnered a lot of interest with very good coverage by the media including RTM's TV1.

All other Branches were also doing their very best to organize technical talks, visits and courses for the benefit of their members

Since there were no comments or questions from the floor, Ir. Dr Ooi Teik Aun (Hon.F01249) proposed that the Annual Report be adopted. The motion was seconded by Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. (Dr) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon. F01019).

5.0 ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

- 5.1 The President then invited the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin to present the financial statements for The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia for the period 1 January 2015 to 31 December 2015.
- 5.2 The Honorary Treasurer informed the AGM that the financial statement comprised of two (2) sets of accounts where the column denoted by "Institution" referred to the financial performance of IEM HQ and that these figures did not include the financial position of the IEM Branches. The AGM was further informed that the IEM Branches would file their own set of financial statements with the IRB of their respective States.

He further informed that the columns denoted by "Group" referred to the consolidated accounts of both IEM HQ and IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd.

- 5.3 The Honorary Treasurer reported that on the overall, the Institution made a surplus of RM493,872 in 2015 compared to RM901,929 in 2014. He further informed that the surplus of over RM900,000 in 2014 was mainly due to the one-off dividend of RM500,000 issued by IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd.
- 5.4 Annual subscriptions receivable was RM3,446,637 in 2015 compared to RM3,513,348 in 2014 which indicated a drop of 2% in the total Annual Subscription Receivable.

The Annual Subscription in Arrears for 2015 was RM577,058 compared to RM702,445 in 2014 while the Annual Subscription Collection for 2015 had increased to RM2,869,579 as compared to RM2,812,903 for the year 2014. This indicated an increase of 2%.





- 5.6 The Honorary Treasurer informed that the total expenses for 2015 was RM5,732,967 compared to RM5,237,169 in 2014 which indicated an increase of 9.5%.
- 5.7 The increase in expenses was mainly from Personnel Emoluments increased by 11.5% and Administrative Expenses increased by 28.4%.

The increase in the administration expenses was due to increase in office printing and stationery as well as mailing expenses and postage due to the increase in membership.

5.8 The President thanked the Honorary Treasurer for his report and informed that the Financial Statement was printed on pages 178 to 198. The President then proceeded to invite questions from the floor.

5.10 Questions Session - Accounts

5.10.1. Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (M08898) sought clarification from the Honorary Treasurer with regard to the bulding expenses of RM838.477.

There were however comments from the floor that Ir. Gary Lim as a Council member should have raised the question earlier at the Council Meeting and not at the AGM. Ir. Gary Lim nevertheless commented that the figures were not presented during the Council Meeting.

The guery was then posted again by Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218).

The Honorary Treasurer informed that the same figure and accounts were presented at the Council Meeting on 21 March 2016 and the amount shown included the interest paid for the loan taken, depreciation for Wisma IEM as well as building maintenance and other incidental expenses.

5.10.2 Ir. CMM Aboobucker (M13942) sought clarification on the Analysis on Expenses in 2015 showing that the Building Maintenance expenses had reduced by 9.7% and whether it was due to depreciation.

The Honorary Treasurer responded that the amount shown referred to reduction in building maintenance expenditure.

- 5.10.3 Y.Bhg Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) pointed out an error on page 178 where there was a duplication in paragraph six and seven. The AGM noted the error and duplication.
- 5.10.4 Y.Bhg Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) further pointed out that the amount of annual subscriptions receivable amounting to RM3,446,637 referred to subscription which IEM expected to collect and that there was arrears of RM577,058 at the end of the year. He voiced his concern over the huge sum not collected.

The Honorary Treasurer thanked Y.Bhg Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah for his comment. He then informed the AGM that two reminders were sent each year to remind members to pay their subscriptions and Secretariat had also been calling members who have yet to pay the annual subscriptions and remind them to settle their arrears. This exercise had been done every year in order to close the gap between the receivable and actual amount collected.

5.10.5 As there were recurring expenses for upgrading and maintenance of the building every year, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) proposed for IEM to consider setting up set up a sinking fund.

The President responded that currently IEM did not have such sinking funds but the proposal will be considered and tabled at the Council for further discussion.

5.10.6 Ir. Awangku Hidup bin Awangku Hosain (F03053) proposed that IEM consider to have something similar to the Presidential Awards for the Branches. He pointed out that currently, the Branches rely heavily on the Branch Subsidies paid out by HQ. By initiating such competition, the Branches would be encouraged to be more active and at the same time generate more income.

The President thanked Ir. Awangku Hidup bin Awangku Hosain for his proposal and informed that the request would be presented for the next Excomm to consider.

5.10.7 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) queried on Analysis on Expenses in 2015 under the item Finance Costs which had shown a drop of 68.5%. He raised the question that expenses on the building was about RM1 million and requested for a breakdown.

The Honorary Treasurer informed that the reduction in finance cost of 68.5% was due to the reduction in interest payable in view of the repayments which IEM had made on the principal sum.

The Accountant further explained and referred to page 187 (item 9 - borrowings) that shown the loan repayable had been reduced (dropped) from RM5,958,590 in 2014 to RM3,220.260 in 2015. This has resulted in a drop of 68.5% in finance cost.

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5.10.8 As there were no further questions from the floor, Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (F01922) proposed the adoption of the Statements of Accounts for IEM for the year ended 31 December 2015. The motion was seconded by Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086). The AGM then adopted the Financial Statements.

6.0 EDUCATION FUND FINANCIAL STATEMENT - 31 DECEMBER 2015

- 6.1 The Honorary Treasurer then continued to report on the Financial Statements of the Education Fund for the year ending 31 December 2015 from page 199 to page 205.
- 6.2 The AGM was informed that donation received amounted to RM54,757 in 2015 compared to RM33,213 in 2014. The Fixed Deposit Interest earned amounted to RM37,087 compared to RM34,525 in 2014.

The Honorary Treasurer thanked all members for the donations contributed for the year 2015.

On the expenditure side, the Honorary Treasurer reported that scholarship given out in 2015 was RM40,500. He further informed that other expenses were for subsidising talks amounting to RM37,364; Overseas Conferences RM30,932 and Student Section Subsidy RM 3,500.

- 6.3 The Honorary Treasurer concluded the Education Fund report by informing that there was a deficit of RM29,379 on the overall performance for the year ending 31 December 2015. As the Education Fund is a tax exempt fund, the account had to comply with the Inland Revenue Board's (IRB) requirement to spend at least 50% of the income in the previous year. This requirement was complied with in 2015.
- 6.4 The President then thanked the Honorary Treasurer for his presentation on the Education Fund and then requested for comments or queries from the floor. Since there were no comments, Ir. Tan Koh Yon (M11075) proposed that the Education Fund accounts be adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Jagathisen s/o Siva Perumal (M05107). The AGM unanimously adopted the Education Fund accounts.

7.0 DISCUSSION ON WRITTEN ISSUES FROM MEMBERS OF WHICH WRITTEN NOTICE WAS SUBMITTED

The President informed that IEM had received three (3) resolutions from members to be tabled at the 57th Annual General Meeting. The resolutions were as follows:

- 7.1 1. Resolution No. 1 proposer: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)
 - "Excomm and Council of IEM to abide by the directive from Board of Engineers, Malaysia not to use Engr. and not to take legal proceedings to challenge the Board of Engineers, Malaysia directive on the use of Engr."
- 7.1.1 The President provided a short explanation on the background of the "Engr." issue. The AGM was informed that the issue on "Engr." had been a long standing matter. IEM had requested for intervention of the Minister of Works, whereby the Minister had arranged a dialogue between IEM and BEM. The Minister of Works then came to a conclusion for the matter to be brought up to the Attorney General's Office for his views on the interpretation of the Registration of Engineers Act pertaining to this issue.

IEM Council at its meeting on 21st March 2016 had agreed to abide by the Minister's decision until the AG's office provide their opinion before deciding on the next course of action.

In response to the Minister of Works request, IEM had, upon the decision of Council, issued a circular to all members to stop using the "Engr." pending decision from the AG's office via email blast on 26th March and thereafter, posted on the front page of IEM website. A circular was also sent together with the April 2016 Jurutera. The President reiterated that IEM had taken all necessary administrative measures.

However, IEM received a resolution from Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa for IEM to follow the directive of the BEM and at the same time not to take any legal action on the issue.

- 7.1.2 The President then invited Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa to present his resolution before discussion by the AGM.
- 7.1.3 Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086) expressed that it was not right for Ir. Gary Lim to present the resolution to the AGM as he is part of the Council and he has to abide by the decision made by the Council. He reiterated that the issue had been deliberated in the Council Meeting in March and a Council decision has been made.

However, on consultation with the AGM, the President allowed Ir. Gary Lim to proceed with presentation of his resolution.

7.1.4 Ir. Gary Lim informed that IEM works on consensus, thus when a member is out voted on a certain issue, his proposal would not be taken up. He further pointed out that he has a right as a general member for his opinion to be heard. He then informed the AGM that the issue involved legal actions and the legal fee may cost up to RM500,000. The legal process with Board of Engineers, Malaysia (BEM) will consume time, finance and resources. He stated that the process would involve legal cost; which therefore involve IEM members as IEM funds belong to the members.

He requested to put on record that IEM Excomm has proposed "to exhaust all legal process to seek confirmation whether IEM can or cannot use "Engr." title." However, during the subsequent Council meeting, the issue was deliberated and put to vote and the decision of Council was "IEM to wait for the AG's chamber to make its decision and then deliberate on the next course of action to be taken".



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He further elaborated that if Council had not made the decision, Excomm would have proceeded with the decision to exhaust all legal process and the provision of funds for legal action to be taken would have been utilised.

7.1.5 Ir. Gary Lim reiterated his earlier explanation and also pointed out that IEM does not have ownership of the "Engr.". He also stated that IEM was unable to register the title "Engr." and as such, the title does not belong to IEM.

He further informed the AGM that there was a case of a non-IEM member who used the title "Engr" and later changed it to "Eng." which caused confusion to the public.

- 7.1.6 The President informed that the Council had followed the directive of the Minister of Works to wait for the decision from the AG's office. Members present at the AGM were then invited to give their views.
- 7.1.7 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) commented that the remarks from Ir. Gary Lim may not be accurate as it has given the impression that the Council Members were irresponsible or the Excomm was irresponsible.

He added that the Constitution allowed the Excomm to act on behalf of the Council in between meetings of the Council. The Council can deliberate and overrule any decision of the Excomm, where necessary. He pointed out that the working of the Excomm and Council was different from Ir. Gary Lim's perception.

He further commented that IEM members are professionals and the issue should be resolved professionally instead of assuming that there would be a group of people who would oppose the resolution.

7.1.8 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) expressesed concern with the presentation that stated 'Council agreed to abide by the Minister of Works' decision not to use Engr. until we receive outcome from the AG's office before deciding on the next course of action'. He queried on what would be the next course of action.

The President responded that the Council had not decided yet and the next course of action would depend on the outcome from the AG's office. The next course of action might include options such as accept the decision of the AG's Office or to appeal if the decision is not favourable to IEM. However, he informed that Council had not made any decision on the matter vet.

- 7.1.9 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) pointed out that in the eventuality that Council decided to proceed with legal action later, then members would not be aware of the decision. He further added that taking legal action would be costly and this allocation can be better utilised for the IEM Building Fund.
- 7.1.10 Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) provided explanation on the legal cost as mentioned by Ir. Gary Lim earlier.

Ir Lai informed that if IEM were to proceed with legal action, it will involve seeking a declaratory or court order on the intrepretation of the Act. The legal cost for this would not exceed RM40,000 and the Council had previously approved a budget of RM100,000. As for the case to be brought to high court thereafter, it had not been discussed or decided yet.

7.1.11 Ir. Chong Pick Eng (P.E Chong) (HonF01214) highlighted that he is a qualified lawyer and would like to clarify the legal actions highlighted by Ir Gary Lim.

Ir P.E Chong explained that IEM's proposed legal action was to apply for a "Declaratory Order", which is an *ex parte* decision. An *ex parte* decision is one decided by the judge without requiring all of the parties to be present. Therefore, the Declaratory Order is a non confrontational approach.

The Declaratory Order is an approach to obtain an interpretation of the Act from the court before IEM made any decision to proceed or not.

The legal action involved various level of courts and different hierarchy of judges. He further clarified that Ir Gary Lim's assumption of RM 500,000 is not justified as the cost of the legal action varies according to the level of courts such as High Court or Court of Appeal.

7.1.12 Ir. Lee Weng Onn (F08103) then expressed that it is not right to say that, 'IEM is fighting over nothing' as raised by Ir. Gary Lim.

Ir. Lee further explained the need for the "Engr." title. He added that the Graduate Members were very proud to use the title and the title had been a great pride among Graduate Members. He added that the title has encouraged the recruitment of many Graduate Members.

7.1.13 Ir. Tengku Salehudin bin Tengku Bakar (M12504) expressed his concern on the cost implication if the Council or Excomm decided to pursue with legal action later on, if the final outcome is negative. He added that IEM members may want to have a say on this matter, as the cost may not be a small amount.

Ir. Lee Weng Onn then explained that the Council had approved RM100,000 budget and if this amount were to be divided by 40,000 members, it would only cost each member RM 2.50.





- 7.1.14 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) disagreed with the comment that the cost incurred by each member is only a small amount. He was of the opinion that the matter should be weighed as to whether it was worthwhile to spend the money on the "Engr." title. He felt that due consideration should be made whether the legal cost is justified. He suggested that the budget allocated be used for other purposes such for the repayment of IEM building loan.
- 7.1.15 Y.Bhg Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01619) pointed out that the proposed resolution by Ir. Gary Lim was that IEM should not take legal proceeding as this involved IEM members' money to fight for a title that IEM do not have an exclusive ownership. He added that Ir. Gary Lim's resolution however, does not stop IEM from taking any other actions with regard to the "Engr." title such as appealing to the higher authority. He clarified that the concern of Ir. Gary Lim was that legal proceeding may cost IEM money which will eventually be borned by IEM members.
- 7.1.16 Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) expressed that he initially was against the idea of fighting for the "Engr." title. However he changed his stand after seeing the proud reaction of parents when their children are able to use the title "Engr.". He saw that there was perception of value from the engineering graduates to use the title. Thus, the idea of using the "Engr." title should be continued and pursued.
 - He further added that the Minister who is also a lawyer had promised to look at the matter and thus, IEM would have to wait for the decision. There would still be room for appeal if the decision by the Minister of Works is not favourable. There were other approaches beside legal proceeding such as negotiating with BEM for them to allow IEM to continue using the title.
- 7.1.17 Ir. Lee Weng Onn (F08103) reiterated and informed that with the budget approved of RM100,000, the members are only paying RM2.50 per person. He felt that this amount is small compared to the pride of the Institution which is priceless.
- 7.1.18 Ir. Ng Yong Kong (M05043) commented that he had arrived late when the Council decided on the matter. In his opinion, IEM should wait for the decision from the AG's Office before proceeding further. IEM should try to solve the issue without any cost implication. Similar to other members who had given their views, his opinion was that the budget allocated should be used for the building fund.
- 7.1.19 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) expressed and proposed for those who would like to continue pursuing with legal actions, the cost should be borne by themselves, not by IEM.
- 7.1.20 Ir. Lee Choy Hin (F05271) commented that the discussion thus far had delved on the issue of money. He felt that IEM need to advise members on what is the approach and whether the title is significant enough to proceed with legal action. The members should take into account the legal costs in deciding on this issue. As all other views had been discussed, he proposed that members at the AGM should take a vote whether IEM should proceed with legal action instead of further debating on the matter.
- 7.1.21 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) pointed that such an important resolution should be properly put into the Agenda. He felt that to have impromptu resolutions and voting was not proper. He added that if necessary, then IEM need to call for a Special General Meeting (SGM). The members should be given time to deliberate whether they are agreeable to the decision. He proposed that this resolution should be discussed and reconsidered.
- 7.1.22 Ir. Gary Lim reiterated that he had submitted his resolution on time before the deadline on 1st April 2016.
- 7.1.23 The President responded that the AGM had heard all the views from the members and as explained earlier, the IEM Council at its meeting on 21st March 2016 had agreed to abide by the Minister's decision until the outcome from the AG's office before deciding on the next course of action. On IEM's part, necessary administrative measures would need to be taken.

He also reiterated that the Council felt it was too premature for any legal action until a decision by the AG's office. He added that the AG also might not make a decision but request for both parties to send their legal representative to present their case. The Council will decide on what to do when this happens. He added that the members have to be rational and to trust the Council.

The President then requested members to vote on whether to accept the resolution from Ir. Gary Lim.

- 7.1.24 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) reiterated and expressed that he was not in favour and disagreed if the decision was to be taken or decided on that day. He still felt that the resolution should be written fully as an item on the Agenda. He further commented that it does not mean that those who had attended the AGM have the right to make decisions. He felt that by right, it should be via referendum in order to allow all members to vote and have a say. It cannot be decided only by members at this AGM.
- 7.1.25 Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) commented that the whole issue was about interpretation. BEM was interpreting Clause 7 (aa) (ii) of the REA, that by using "Engr." it may reasonably be construed to imply that the person is a Professional Engineer. However, the Council disagreed with this interpretation.

He explained that if a Graduate Member use the title "Engr." it must be used in conjunction with the post-nominal of "Grad. IEM" for members who are not Professional Engineers. He added that IEM was not trying to deceive the public, but to give the right status to enhance the engineer's profession. Members were reminded that IEM was not trying to challenge BEM's decision, but only asking the court for an interpretation.

He added that the Council had already decided to wait for the decision from the AG's office before making any decision and members need to wait and trust the wisdom of the Council.

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The proposal is only to obtain a 'Declaratory Order' from the court which may or may not be in IEM's favour. If it is not favourable, the Council would decide again.

Nevertheless, since there was already a resolution, the only way to solve and decide this resolution was for IEM to convene a Special General Meeting (SGM).

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong then proposed for a Special General Meeting (SGM) to be held to discuss this resolution. He added that for this Special General Meeting (SGM), a proper notice should be circulated to members.

- 7.1.26 The President then requested for a seconder as there was a motion for IEM to convene a Special General Meeting (SGM).

 The President requested for members to decide whether to vote or to proceed with the Special General Meeting (SGM).
- 7.1.27 Y.Bhg Datuk Ir. Rosaline Ganendra (F06033) pointed out that the matter was an agenda item and as such, the AGM should not vote to convene a Special General Meeting (SGM). She reiterated that there was already a written resolution with proper proposer and seconder and proper notice had been given. Proper procedures had been followed.

She was of the opinion that the AGM should continue with the vote on whether to proceed or not with the legal proceeding. She added that in accordance with the Constitution and Bylaws, there is no choice but to vote. Should there by members who were not agreeable with the result from the AG's office later, they could requisite for a Special General Meeting (SGM).

- 7.1.28 Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong disagreed with the comment from Y.Bhg Datuk Ir. Rosaline Ganendra that proper notice had been given. He informed that although Ir. Gary Lim had submitted his resolution, the majority of the members were not aware of the contents of the resolutions.
- 7.1.29 Y.Bhg Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon. F01619) commented that the resolutions were submitted before the deadline but the Secretary had failed to circulate to the members.

He added that for the Special General Meeting (SGM), the notice should be circulated to the Corporate Members at least twenty-one (21) days before such meeting. He then referred to the Constitution, page 30, item 7.8 as below:

Special General Meeting

- 7.8 The notice for the Special General Meeting shall be circulated to the Corporate Membership at least twenty-one (21) days before such meeting. Such notice shall specify the general nature of the matters to be brought before and the resolutions (if any) to be moved at such meeting and none other than that business shall be transacted at that meeting.
- 7.1.30 The President then referred to the Constitution, page 30, item 7.6 as below;

Annual General Meeting

7.6 The business of the Annual General Meeting shall include the presentation of the Report of Council of the transactions of the past year and the audited financial statements of account, the declaration of the results of the ballots for the election of Officers of The Institution, the election of the internal auditors, the appointment of external auditors, the installation of the President and the consideration of any other business as provided for in these Bylaws.

The President informed that, as pointed out by Y.Bhg Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon. F01619), there was an administrative issue as the Secretary had failed to circulate the resolution to the members.

At this juncture, there was some disagreement from some members from the floor.

7.1.32 The Deputy President informed the AGM that he is fully supportive of the decision by the members to vote, but there is a clause in the Constitution, page 30, item 7.5 which stated

Annual General Meeting

7.5 The notice for Annual General Meeting shall be circulated to the general membership at least four (4) weeks before the Annual General Meeting.

The Deputy President further informed that the resolution was received on 31 March 2016, which was less than four (4) weeks before the Annual General Meeting. Thus, the resolution could not be presented as an agenda item under item 5. The members had accepted it as item for discussion but not many members are aware of the resolution.


He felt that for the sake of the members at large, the best way was to convene a Special General Meeting (SGM). It was proposed that both resolutions tabled by Ir. Gary Lim be discussed at the Special General Meeting (SGM). The proposed date was three (3) months from the date of the AGM.

He added that before the Special General Meeting (SGM) can be convened, IEM would not take any legal action on the "Engr." issue.

The Deputy President sought consensus from the members for the proposal and proposed for a vote by 'show of hand'.







In Favour - 228 members Objection - 43 members Abstain - 26 members

With the above voting result, the AGM therefore agreed to convene a Special General Meeting (SGM). The date of the Special General Meeting (SGM) was to be determined by the Council.

7.2 2. Resolution No. 2 - proposer: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)

"Excomm and Council of IEM proceed to wind up IEM Academy Sdn Bhd"

His contention – "IEM A was set up to conduct accredited courses as I was told in the Council meeting, this had NOT materialized and yet the EXIT strategy not executed. Instead IEM TC gave up some of the courses to IEM A, hence IEM A showed an excellent profit from conducting training courses".

As decided by the above voting, the resolution would be discussed at the coming Special General Meeting (SGM).

7.2 3. Letter from Member – Mr. Chan Foo Ching – G08133

His issue is the "usage of non-compliant products in the Fire Protection Industry".

The President informed that IEM had written to Mr Chan Foo Ching to invite him to IEM Fire Advisory Board (FAB) meeting for further details and clarifications on the issue that he has raised, before any further action is taken.

The President then asked Mr Chan Foo Ching, whether he agreed to the proposal. The proposal was accepted by Mr Chan Foo Ching and he would wait for an invitation from the IEM Fire Advisory Board (FAB).

8.0 AMENDMENT TO IEM CONSTITUTION

- 8.1 The President presented the proposed amendments to the Constitution as printed on page 6 of the Annual Report. The members at the AGM were informed that the proposed amendments had been circulated to the general members via email and by post.
- 8.1.1 Article 5.1 Amend Constitution to allow
 - (k) 5 seats for Graduate Members in Council with voting rights.
 - (I) 1 seat for Women Engineers in Council with voting rights

The President explained that for the item (k), there are currently 9,430 Graduate Members and 179 Companions in IEM – nearly equal in number with Corporate Members. The intention is to give them exposure and training as future leaders of IEM. He informed that the YES were given the responsibility to organise a number of IEM activities which is not confined to their section such as Engineers Week and E-Run.

While for item (I), the AGM was informed that the population of Women Engineers in IEM excluding students is 3,269. More than 7,000 of the Student Members – future engineers, are women. He informed that the role of women is gaining importance and the agencies or organisations are answering the call by the Prime Minister to allocate 30% of posts for women.

The President that proposed for voting by 'show of hand' for Article 5.1, items (k & 1).

8.1.1.1 Ir. Tan Keng Lock (M03784) raised the question – "if the Graduate Members currently do not have voting rights as general members, why should they have voting rights in the Council which would affect the Council voting".

The Deputy President responded and explained that he did a study on the membership, IEM currently has more non Corporate Members compared to Corporate Members (approximately 3:1). For the non Corporate Members, the Graduate Members and Companions is approximately10,000 which is equivalent to 23% of total IEM membership. Giving them (5) seats would allow them to be more active in IEM activities as many of the activities were co-organised and assisted by the graduates who are not MIEM. To qualify as IEM Graduate Member, an engineering graduate must go through an application and evaluation process to ensure that he has graduated with an accredited engineering degree under the Washington Accord. He added that some of engineers do not work with conventional engineering discipline company which require them to be a Professional Engineer.

Furthermore, there was concern that the number of Corporate Members had been rather stagnant for the last 10 years. The cost has been increasing and if this were to continue for long term, then IEM will not be sustainable. Thus, if graduates are not given more opportunity for them to participate in IEM, they would join other outside organisations where they could have more active role. To be selected for the five (5) seats, these candidates have to go through the YES selection in order for them to come into the Council.





This amendment should be considered as a long term project for IEM for a sustainable future. With only five (5) seats, they would not a big impact on Council's decision as Council Members consisted of sixty four (64) members. He highlighted the importance of Graduate Members to participate actively and be appreciated as IEM member. As for Women Engineer, the reason for the extra seat was for them to take part actively.

8.1.1.2 Ir. Gan Thian Eng (M04904), questioned why the amendments were not circulated to the members and that it should have been done before the AGM.

The President explained that the circulation to members would only be made once the amendments of the constitution was approved by the AGM. This provision was stipulated in the IEM Constitution.

- 8.1.1.3 Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) commented that IEM's Constitution had indicated that there are two (2) categories of membership; the Corporate Members and Non-Corporate Members. The proposal presented was for amendment to the Constitution. He would nevertheless, like the Council to re-think on the proposed amendments. He was not against having more graduates in the Council. He added that if the graduates were given voting rights, then they should also have the right to hold office which would contradict the IEM Constitution.
- 8.1.1.4 Ir. P.E. Chong (F01214) concurred with the comment by Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin. If a member does not posses voting right, then the member cannot serve in the Council. The provision should be same in all areas in the Constitution, otherwise the Constitution would not be consistent. He also agreed that the proposed amendments be re-checked against other areas of the Constitution.
- 8.1.1.5 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon asked whether the five (5) seats referring to YES Graduates that were to be elected or those that were already holding office.

The President explained that the five (5) seats were allocated for the graduates who were already holding office. The seats would be taken by the YES's Chairman, Secretary and another three (3) elected members.

- 8.1.1.6 The President then requested Ir. Lai Sze Ching, Chairman of the Special Constitution Committee to respond to the query whether there were any areas in the Constitution that indicated non Corporate Members do not have voting rights. The proposal should not contravene the Constitution since only Corporate Members have the right to vote and to be elected to the Council.
 - Ir. Lai Sze Ching responded that voting right was not allowed for non Corporate Members in the Constitution. It can be amended in the Constitution without touching the other areas.
 - Ir. P.E. Chong disagreed as the amendments should not proceed as a member cannot have voting rights in the Council when there were no provision on voting rights for graduates in the Constitution.
- 8.1.1.7 Ir. Yim Ho Wa (F08247) agreed to the amendments to be studied again because if voting rights were given to Graduate Members as Council Members, then the Graduate Members may be considered as Corporate Members.

Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) raised the question on the condition in the selection of numbers of seats. He felt that there should also be justification on these proposed amendments.

The President noted all comments and explained that the numbers were decided based on the composition of the Council and also taking into consideration the number of Graduate Members currently more than the number of Corporate Members.

The President proposed for the amendments be deferred for further in-depth study by the Council and to re-look at the need for other amendments elsewhere in the Constitution.

- 8.1.2 Article 5.2 Amend Constitution for
 - (a) the President and Deputy President to hold office for one term of two sessions
 - (e) the term of office for the Graduate and Women Engineer representatives

The President explained that item (a) was to to allow more time for the President and Deputy President to accomplish what they plan. One "Session" mean the period between two (2) consecutive Annual General Meetings. Thus, for this proposed amendment, the one term of two sessions mean "for two (2) years".

Amendments in item (e) is to accommodate item (k) and (l) proposed above.

8.1.2.1 Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) reiterated that the proposal has been considered previously. The reason for one session for the President was for the Council to be able to go back in case the President was not able to handle the position and is pushing the Council to a wrong direction. They have to get a fresh mandate from the Council and not from the members.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon informed that nowadays most associations are practicing two terms as one term was too short for the President to accomplish much.





- 8.1.2.2 In responding to the comment by Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019), the President explained that the proposed Constitution amendment has a provision created in the Bylaws for such scenario. It is under the 'Impreachment' of President.
 - Ir. Lai Sze Ching informed that the Bylaws would be amended simultaneously, but not presented at this AGM. In the proposed Bylaw amendment, it would be stated that the President could be removed anytime by a requisition for Vote of No Confidence by 10% of the total number of Council Members. The vote would be only by a simple majority.
- 8.1.2.3 The Deputy President explained further that there is a 'President Elect'. After serving for one session of two years, the President has to step down for the Deputy President to take the Presidenct post. But, he could stand for the President's post as long as Council allowed.
- 8.1.2.4 Since there were quite a number of comments on the proposed amendments, the President suggested that all the proposed amendments to the Constitution would be deferred and further study and fine tuning by the Council before it is tabled at the coming AGM again.

9.0 ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ELECTION RESULTS FOR COUNCIL 2016/2017 SESSION

The President invited the Election Officer, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon to announce the results of the election for the session 2016/2017.

9.1 President

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon informed the AGM that in accordance with Section 5.2 of the IEM Bylaws, Ir. Tan Yean Chin, being the President-elect, shall assume the office of President for session 2016/2017 upon completion of the term of office of the incumbent President, Y.Bhg. Dato Ir. Lim Chow Hock.

9.2 **Deputy President**

The AGM was informed that for the office of Deputy President, two (2) valid nominations were received. A total of 64 ballot papers were sent out to all current Council members. At the close of balloting on 28 December 2015, a total of 49 ballot papers were received. (No spoilt votes).

After the votes were counted, the candidate who received the higher number of votes was Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi. Thus, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi was elected to the office of Deputy President for the session 2016/2017.

9.3 Vice Presidents, Hon Secretary, Hon Treasurer and Others

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon then informed the AGM that the following offices required balloting:

- Vice President (three (3) vacancies)
- Honorary Secretary (one (1) vacancy)
- Honorary Treasurer (one (1) vacancy)
- Council Members Chemical Representative (one (1) vacancy)
- Council Members Ordinary Representatives (ten (10) vacancies)

9.4 Office of Council Member – Other Disciplines Representative (One (1) vacancy for 3 sessions, 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and 2018/2019)

One nomination was received for this office. As the candidate's discipline did not qualify under this category, the nomination was disqualified. Therefore, there was no nominee for this office. The IEM Council at its 400th meeting held on 18 January 2016 decided to nominate Ir. Roznan bin Abdul Hamid as the candidate for this office under Bylaws Section 5.11. Thus, Ir. Roznan bin Abdul Hamid was duly elected unopposed to the office of Council Member – Other Disciplines Representative for the sessions, 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and 2018/2019.

9.5 Office of Vice President (Three (3) vacancies for 2 sessions 2015/2016 and 2016/2017)

The AGM was informed that measures were taken to get the ballot papers sent out to members for the offices which required balloting i.e. Vice Presidents, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and Ordinary Council members. A total of 9,776 ballot papers were sent and delivered to Corporate Members. The Ballot Box at the IEM Secretariat was sealed on 1 April 2016 at 12.00 noon. A total of 1,712 ballot papers were received at the IEM when the Ballot Box was opened thereafter at 2.30pm on the same day. After checking and verification of ballot papers, counting of votes were carried out to determine the successful candidates.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon further informed the AGM that there were six (6) nominations received for the three (3) vacancies. The following three (3) candidates with the highest number of votes were duly elected to the office of Vice President for the sessions 2016/2017 and 2017/2018:

- i) Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin
- ii) Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Norlida bt Buniyamin
- iii) Ir. Ellias bin Saidin





9.6 Office of Honorary Secretary (One (1) vacancy for session 2016/2017)

There were two (2) nominations received for the one (1) vacancy. The candidate Ir. Yam Teong Sian received the higher number of votes and was duly elected to the office of Honorary Secretary for the session 2016/2017.

9.7 Office of Honorary Treasurer (One (1) vacancy for session 2016/2017)

The AGM was informed that there were two (2) nominations received for the one (1) vacancy. The candidate Dr. Wang Hong Kok received the higher votes and was duly elected to the office of Honorary Treasurer for the session 2016/2017.

9.8 Council Members - Ordinary Representatives (Ten (10) vacancies for 3 sessions, 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and 2018/2019)

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon proceeded to report that there were sixteen (16) nominations received. Balloting was necessary and the following ten (10) candidates with the highest number of votes were duly elected to the office of Council Members – Ordinary Representative for the sessions 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and 2018/2019:

- 9.9 The AGM noted that the Election process took about three (3) months and the total cost was RM22,733.83 (balloting document and postage) excluding IEM staff cost.
- 9.10 The AGM was also informed that a total of 9,776 ballot papers were mailed out. It was further noted that only 18% returned which was an increase compared to the previous year. Some 82% of the members still did not return their ballot papers to record their votes for the candidates nominated to represent their interests on the IEM Council.
- 9.11 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon then thanked the Scrutineers, Ir. Ishak bin Abdul Rahman, Ir. Prof. Dr. Zainal Abidin bin Ahmad, Ir. Prof. Dr. Siti Hawa Hamzah, Ir. Mohd Ali Yusoff and Ir. S. Kukanesan for their valuable assistance and support and also thanked the Secretariat for their full cooperation.

The President thanked for YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon for his presentation and also the Scrutineers and the IEM Secretariat for their assistance and support.

10.0 PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

The Executive Director, Ir. Wong Chee Fui then invited the President to present the following awards:

10.1 IEM Technical Paper Award for Corporate Membership

Ir. Tan Sri Hj Yusoff Prize

There were two categories for the Ir. Tan Sri Hj. Yusoff prize; one was for Civil and the award was presented to *Ir. How Yoke Teng* with the paper entitled "*Impact of Building Information Modelling (BIM)* on the Engineering Profession", whereas for the General Category, *Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Leong Wai Yie* received the award for her paper entitled "*Recognise Women in Health Technology: Globalize Our Values and Contributions*".

10.2 Women Engineer Award 2015

Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Norlida Bt.Buniyamin was conferred the IEM Woman Engineer Award. The AGM was further informed that Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Norlida Bt. Buniyamin was currently a Fellow and Council Member of IEM. She is attached to UiTM as Associate Professor at the Faculty of Electrical Engineering. She is also the Head and Founder of the Engineering Education-Research Group (EnTER). She has received numerous awards, such as UiTM Excellent Service Award 2007, Best Sports Official Award 2011/2012, Wilayah Persekutuan and numerous Best Technical Paper Awards.

1.0 UCAPAN ALUAN OLEH YANG DI PERTUA

1.1 Yang DiPertua, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock mengucapkan terima kasih dan mengalu-alukan kehadiran ahli ke Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan yang ke-57. Beliau kemudian memaklumkan bahawa tiga bilik yang berbeza akan digunakan untuk Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan, iaitu Auditorium Tan Sri Prof Chin Fung Kee di Tingkat 3, yang akan menjadi ruang utama, Bilik Kuliah C & S / TUS di tingkat 2 dan akhir sekali Auditorium Malakoff di tingkat bawah.

Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan bahawa persidangan video akan diadakan di kedua-dua bilik di tingkat bawah dan tingkat dua masing-masing (Auditorium Malakoff dan bilik kuliah C & S / TUSTD.)

Yang DiPertua juga memberitahu bahawa kakitangan Sekretariat akan ditempatkan di setiap bilik untuk membantu ahli-ahli semasa Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan dijalankan. Yang DiPertua kemudiannya meminta ahli-ahli untuk memberikan nama dan nombor keahlian semasa sesi soal jawab untuk tujuan rekod.

MAT kemudiannya dimaklumkan berkenaan aktiviti-aktiviti yang berlaku pada sesi 2016/2017.

1.2 Pemergian Bekas Yang Dipertua

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Bekas Yang DiPertua, Ir. Chiam Teong Tee (Ir. T. T. Chiam), telah meninggal dunia pada 30 Januari 2016. Yang DiPertua meminta semua ahli untuk bertafakur selama seminit sebagai tanda hormat.

1.3 Logo Baru IEM

Yang DiPertua memperkenalkan logo baru IEM dengan huruf IEM disebelah lambang IEM bersama dengan slogan baru "Mengantarabangsakan Mobiliti Jurutera". Hasrat penambahbaikan logo tersebut adalah untuk menjadikan lambang IEM lebih mudah dikenali.

1.4 Menandatangani Memorandum Persefahaman (MoU)

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa IEM telah pun menandatangani dua (2) MoU dengan institusi kejuruteraan luar negara, iaitu dengan Institusi Jurutera, Bangladesh dan Institusi Jurutera, India.

Enam (6) lagi MoU telah ditandatangani dengan Universiti dan Institusi Pengajian Tinggi, menjadikan jumlah Memorandum Persefahaman (MoU) yang ditandatangani dengan Institusi Pengajian Tinggi (IPT) sebanyak enam belas (16). MoU yang telah ditandatangani dalam sesi ini termasuk Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM), Universiti Teknologi Malaysia (UTM), Taylors Universiti, Politeknik Sultan Hj. Ahmad Shah (POLISAS), Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM) dan Universiti Malaya (UM).

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa IEM juga telah menandatangani MoU dengan Majlis Perbandaran Hang Tuah Jaya (MPHTJ) untuk menjalankan aktiviti bersama seperti program kesedaran awam dan membantu majlis tempatan dalam menyediakan perkhidmatan kejuruteraan yang lebih baik bagi kemudahan orang awam.

Di sektor korporat pula, IEM juga telah memulakan perkongsian dengan industri untuk menambahkan keahlian. MoU pertama dengan industri telah ditandatangani dengan MMC Corporation Berhad (MMC). MoU tersebut akan membuka jalan bagi IEM untuk menganjurkan sesi bengkel bagi meningkatkan kecekapan para jurutera MMC untuk menjadi ahli MIEM / P.E. selain menjalin kerjasama dengan MMC dalam bidang kepentingan bersama.

1.5 Penglibatan Aktif dengan Badan Kerajaan dan Pihak Berkuasa Tempatan

Yang DiPertua melaporkan bahawa IEM kini melibatkan diri secara aktif dengan agensi awam lain demi menjalin kerjasama dengan pelbagai jabatan mengenai isu-isu yang berkaitan dengan kejuruteraan termasuk MATRADE, MITI, SIRIM, Standards Malaysia, CIDB, CREAM, DOSH, DBKL, Suruhanjaya Tenaga, KPKT dan sebagainya. Cawangan-cawangan IEM juga aktif dalam majlis dan pihak berkuasa tempatan masing-masing sebagai ahli Jawatankuasa pelbagai Majlis Negeri dan Jawatankuasa Khas Negeri.

IEM juga terus berhubang rapat dengan badan profesional yang lain.





1.6 Interaksi and Liputan Media

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa IEM terus aktif dalam menyediakan kenyataan akhbar mengenai pelbagai isu kejuruteraan dan perkara-perkara yang melibatkan kepentingan negara. Sebanyak sebelas (11) kenyataan akhbar telah dikeluarkan dan 26 keratan akhbar telah diterbitkan dalam media dan kesemuanya telahpun dimuatnaik di laman web IEM.

1.7 Persidangan dan Aktiviti

IEM telah menganjurkan CAFEO33 di Pulau Pinang pada 23-26 November 2015. IEM Cawangan Pulau Pinang telah dilantik untuk menjadi tuan rumah persidangan itu bagi pihak IEM. Cawangan tersebut menunjukkan prestasi memberangsangkan dalam penganjuran persidangan tersebut yang juga termasuk mesyuarat Lembaga Pengelola AFEO, Wanita dan program Jurutera Muda, jamuan makan malam dan lawatan teknikal. Persidangan ini telah dirasmikan oleh Tun Dato' Seri Utama (Dr.) Haji Abdul Rahman bin Haji Abbas, Tuan Yang Terutama Pulau Pinang dan dihadiri oleh lebih daripada 1200 orang peserta. Yang DiPertua juga mengucapkan tahniah kepada Pengerusi Penganjur, Ir. Paul Phor kerana kejayaan menganjurkan persidangan tersebut.

IEM juga telah menganjurkan tiga persidangan utama dan 154 ceramah petang, 77 kursus, bengkel dan seminar serta 48 lawatan teknikal pada sesi yang lalu.

1.8 Keahlian

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa keahlian IEM telah meningkat daripada 36,000 (dilaporkan pada MAT 2015) kepada 40,118 pada Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ini.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan tahniah kepada Jawatankuasa Kecil Menggiatkan Keahlian Dan Bimbingan Kerjaya yang diketuai oleh Ir. Dr Cheong Thiam Fook diatas peningkatan yang amat ketara dalam keahlian.

Usaha yang giat telah diberi oleh Jawatankuasa Kecil tersebut dalam membuat persiapan ke arah mencapai 100,000 ahli menjelang tahun 2020. Yang DiPertua memberi penghargaan atas usaha yang tidak henti-henti daripada keseluruhan Jawatankuasa yang terlibat dan juga Sekretariat di atas pencapaian ini.

1.9 Tabung Bangunan IEM

Yang DiPertua juga merayu kepada ahli-ahli untuk terus menyumbang kepada Tabung Bangunan IEM. MAT dimaklumkan bahawa baki pinjaman bank buat masa ini masih tinggal lebih kurang RM3juta.

2.0 PENGESAHAN MINIT MESYUARAT AGUNG TAHUNAN KE-56 YANG DIADAKAN PADA 16 APRIL 2015

2.1 Yang DiPertua kemudiannya menjemput ahli yang hadir untuk membuat semakan minit Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan seperti yang telah dicetak di muka surat 67-77 dalam Laporan Tahunan serta versi Bahasa Malaysia dari muka surat 82 hingga 94.

Memandangkan tidak ada kesilapan yang nyata dalam minit tersebut, Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086) mencadangkan minit Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-56 yang diadakan pada 16 April 2015 disahkan. Usul itu disokong oleh Ir. Jayaseelam Nadrajah (F14445).

3.0 PERKARA-PERKARA BERBANGKIT

Yang DiPertua meneruskan dengan perkara berbangkit dan memberikan penjelasan mengenai perkara-perkara berikut:

Mukasurat 70 - 4.15.3

KPI untuk Bahagian Teknikal

Yang Dipertua melaporkan bahawa di bawah KPI untuk Bahagian Teknikal, Jawatankuasa Tetap Aktiviti kini mempunyai agenda untuk memantau prestasi semua Bahagian Teknikal. Pada tahun 2015, semua Bahagian Teknikal telah menunjukkan prestasi yang baik dan telah mencapai sebahagian besar daripada sasaran mereka.

4.0 LAPORAN TAHUNAN BAGI SESSI 2015/2016

Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput Setiausaha Kehormat, Ir. Yam Teong Sian untuk membentangkan pelbagai aktiviti dan acara yang dianjurkan pada 2015.





4.1 Majlis dan Jawatankuasa Kerja

Bagi sesi 2015/2016, sebanyak lima mesyuarat (5) Majlis telah diadakan. Majlis mesyuarat tersebut membincangkan perkaraperkara yang berkaitan dengan dasar-dasar IEM dalam membuat keputusan atas perkara-perkara yang berkaitan dengan operasi Institusi. Jawatankuasa Kerja pula telah mengadakan sebanyak tiga belas (13) mesyuarat untuk sesi 2015/2016. Peranan Jawatankuasa Kerja adalah untuk melaksanakan keputusan-keputusan Majlis.

4.2 Keahlian

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa bagi tahun 2015, sebanyak 11,708 calon telah diluluskan untuk kemasukan / pemilihan / pemindahan ke pelbagai gred. Daripada bilangan ahli baru, sebanyak 9,231 adalah ahli siswa. Walau bagaimanapun, 4,403 ahli masih belum menjelaskan yuran keahlian mereka dan berkemungkinan keahlian mereka akan dibatalkan pada akhir tahun.

MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa terdapat perkembangan yang kukuh dalam keahlian sejak Jawatankuasa Tetap Kemasukan dan Latihan Praktikal (APT) memulakan kempen penggiatan keahlian dalam usaha pengambilan keahlian baru.

Di samping itu, dimaklumkan bahawa disiplin Kejuruteraan Awam mempunyai bilangan ahli-ahli tertinggi sebanyak 13,790 diikuti oleh Mekanikal (9973), Elektrik (6414), Elektronik (3743) dan Kimia (2742).

Di samping itu, MAT dimaklumkan bahawa jurusan Kejuruteraan Awam mempunyai jumlah ahli tertinggi dengan 13.867 ahli.

4.3 Daftar Antarabangsa

Bagi tahun 2015, 17 orang ahli telah didaftarkan sebagai Jurutera ASEAN (ASEAN Eng) dan 23 telah diluluskan untuk Jurutera ASEAN Bersekutu (AAE) manakala 35 telah diluluskan untuk APEC / Pendaftaran Jurutera Antarabangsa (IntPE).

4.4 Peperiksaan dan Kelayakan

MAT seterusnya dimaklumkan bahawa bagi sesi 2015/2016, sejumlah 571 telah memohon untuk menduduki Temuduga Profesional (PI). Jumlah calon yang gagal PI adalah 106 menjadikan peratusan kadar kegagalan 18.5%.

MAT telah mengambil maklum bahawa Proses PI yang dipertingkatkan akan dilaksanakan secara percubaan pada tahun 2016. Jawatankuasa Kecil telah mengadakan empat (4) bengkel latihan dan pensijilan di Ibu Pejabat pada tahun 2015. Bengkel yang sama juga akan dijalankan di semua Cawangan IEM dalam tahun 2016.

Peperiksaan Siswazah IEM / BEM telah dijalankan untuk kali terakhir pada bulan Oktober 2015 dan berkuatkuasa tahun 2016, peperiksaan yang bermula pada bulan Mei 1978 tidak akan diteruskan lagi.

4.5 Maklumat dan Penerbitan

Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa sebanyak dua belas (12) isu bulletin IEM "Jurutera" telah diterbitkan pada tahun 2015. Bilangan mukasurat telahpun ditambah bagi menyediakan lebih banyak ruang untuk berita dan maklumat. Satu (1) isu Journal juga telah diterbitkan pada tahun 2015.

Tiga (3) artikel mengenai Sejarah IEM berkenaan pembelian Wisma IEM telah diterbitkan dalam buletin Jurutera pada tahun 2015. Setiausaha Kehormat merakamkan penghargaan kepada YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon diatas usaha beliau dalam menyemak rekod-rekod IEM untuk menghasilkan artikel tersebut.

4.6 Perpustakaan IEM

MAT menyatakan bahawa Perpustakaan IEM kini mempunyai koleksi 6,711 judul buku bercetak yang meliputi pelbagai disiplin. Sejak pengenalan e-Book pada tahun 2014, IEM mempunyai koleksi lebih daripada 110 tajuk. Semua ahli digalakkan untuk mengaplikasikan penggunaan eBooks yang boleh diakses dari laman web IEM. Koleksi buku-buku baru akan diumumkan dari masa ke semasa melalui Buletin dan juga laman web IEM.

4.7 Aktiviti

Setiausaha Kehormat menekankan bahawa penganjuran aktiviti sentiasa diberi keutamaan oleh IEM untuk ahli-ahli terutamanya untuk membantu mereka dalam memenuhi keperluan CPD BEM. Kira-kira 300 ceramah, lawatan dan kursus telah dilaksanakan sepanjang sesi ini, begitu juga dengan penganjuran beberapa persidangan antarabangsa, pertandingan dan acara sosial.

Beberapa acara utama yang telah dianjurkan termasuk CAFEO 33, WE Summit 2015, Persidangan Elektrik IEM-IET, Pertandingan Chem-e-Car Malaysia ke-11 dan Pesta Karier Pembinaan CIDB-IEM.





4.8 Aktiviti Akan Datang

MAT mengambil maklum senarai aktiviti-aktiviti yang akan dianjurkan seperti Majlis Makan Malam dan Anugerah yang ke-57 di Sunway Resort Hotel & Spa, Hari Keluarga IEM 2016 pada 18 Mei 2016 di Persada Plus, Pameran ASEAN M & E dari 23-25 Mei 2016, SEAGC 2016 di Dorsett Grand Subang dari 31 Mei - 3 Jun 2016, Kejohanan Golf IEM pada bulan Jun 2016, Minggu Kejuruteraan IEM dari 14-21 Ogos 2016, E-Run pada 14 Ogos 2016 dan Kongres Asia dalam Mekanik Bendalir dari 21-24 November 2016 di Kuching, Sarawak

4.9 Anugerah Kecemerlangan Yang Dipertua

Setiausaha Kehormat kemudian mengumumkan keputusan Anugerah Kecemerlangan Yang DiPertua seperti berikut:

Tempat Ketiga Seksyen Jurutera Wanita

Paling Meningkat Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Terowong dan Ruang Bawah Tanah

4.10 Borang Kontrak IEM

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa proses pengenalan Borang Kontrak IEM telah pun dijalankan bagi dua edisi semakan Borang Kontrak IEM iaitu: -

- (i) IEM.CE 2011 IEM Form of Contract for Civil Engineering Works (Edisi Kedua, Julai 2011); dan
- (ii) IEM.ME 2012 IEM Form of Contract for Mechanical and Electrical Engineering Works (Edisi Kedua, 2012)

4.11 Lembaga Penasihat Kebakaran (Jawatankuasa Tetap Amalan Profesional)

Setiausaha Kehormat melaporkan bahawa Lembaga Penasihat Kebakaran (FAB) telah mengumpul maklumat pekeliling dan garis panduan terkini yang dikeluarkan oleh Pihak-pihak Berkuasa Tempatan seperti BOMBA. Usaha ini adalah, salah satu perkhidmatan yang diberi kepada ahli-ahli bagi menyampaikan maklumat terkini yang boleh dilayari di Laman Web IEM. Maklumat terdapat di bawah "Penerbitan" carian " Bidang Kuasa (AHJ)".

4.12 Program Pertalian Dan Diskaun Korporat

Satu perjanjian baru telah ditandatangani dengan CIMB untuk menggantikan Program Afiniti yang IEM miliki dari Direct Access. Ahli-ahli digalakkan untuk menggunakan perkhidmatan tersebut kerana ia akan membawa manfaat kepada IEM.

IEM juga telah mendapat Diskaun Korporat dari PJ Hilton, Armada Hotel, MPH Book Stores dan juga BP Lab untuk ujian pemeriksaan kesihatan.

4.13 Pasukan Bantuan Bencana

Setiausaha Kehormat melaporkan juga bahawa IEM akan membentuk Pasukan Bantuan Bencana yang boleh digerakkan untuk membantu mangsa-mangsa bencana. Dua puluh (20) orang ahli telah dipilih untuk menerima latihan dari MERCY dan RedR.

4.14 Memorandum Persefahaman

MoU yang telah ditandatangani dalam sesi 2015/2016 dengan Badan-Badan Profesional, Majlis Tempatan dan IPT adalah seperti berikut:

- i) Institusi Jurutera, Bangladesh ditandatangani pada 31 Januari 2015
- ii) Institusi Jurutera, India ditandatangani pada 14 Jun 2015
- iii) Majlis Perbandaran Hang Tuah Jaya (MPHTJ) ditandatangani pada 28 April 2015

4.15 Cawangan-cawangan IEM

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa:

IEM Cawangan Pulau Pinang telah berjaya menganjurkan CAFEO33 dengan penyertaan lebih daripada 1000 orang.

IEM Cawangan Selatan sungguh aktif dalam merekrut siswa-siswi dan berjaya mendaftar lebih daripada 2,000 orang pelajar dalam tahun 2015.

Pusat Latihan IEM Sabah di Taman Perindustrian Kota Kinabalu telah dibuka secara rasmi pada bulan Jun 2016. IEM Cawangan Sabah juga telah menganjurkan Larian Jurutera IEM dengan memecah rekod penyertaan seramai 2,000 orang pelari.

IEM Cawangan Sarawak juga bergiat aktif dengan lebih daripada 800 tetamu menghadiri Majlis Makan Malam Tahunan mereka. Majlis Makan Malam Tahunan IEM Cawangan Miri yang diadakan pada 5 Mac 2016 telah mendapat perhatian dan liputan meluas oleh media termasuk TV1 RTM.

Cawangan-cawangan lain juga telah berusaha sebaik mungkin dengan menganjurkan ceramah teknikal, lawatan dan kursus untuk manfaat ahli-ahli mereka.

Memandangkan tiada terdapat sebarang komen atau soalan dari para ahli yg hadir, Ir. Dr. Ooi Teik Aun (Hon.F01249) mencadangkan bahawa Laporan Tahunan disahkan. Usul itu disokong oleh YBhg. Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019).

5.0 AKAUN BAGI TAHUN BERAKHIR 31 DISEMBER 2015

- 5.1 Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput Bendahari Kehormat, Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin untuk membentangkan penyata kewangan, Institusi Jurutera Malaysia dari tempoh 1 Januari 2015 hingga 31 Disember 2015
- 5.2 Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa penyata kewangan terdiri daripada dua (2) set akaun di mana ruang yang ditandakan dengan "Institusi" merujuk kepada prestasi kewangan IEM (ibu pejabat) dan tidak termasuk kedudukan kewangan cawangan-cawangan IEM. MAT memaklumkan bahawa penyata-penyata kewangan cawangan-cawangan IEM akan difailkan dengan Lembaga Hasil Dalam Negeri (LHDN) Negeri masing-masing.

Beliau juga memaklumkan bahawa ruang yang ditandakan dengan "Kumpulan" merujuk kepada akaun gabungan bagi kedua-dua IEM (ibu pejabat) dan IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd.

Ruang di mana jumlah yang dipaparkan di bawah "Institusi" ditinggalkan kosong manakala di bawah "Kumpulan" terdapat angka, merupakan jumlah pembayaran / penerimaan di antara IEM dan IEM TC yang telah dilupuskan semasa pengabungan.

- 5.3 Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan bahawa pada keseluruhannya, Institusi mendapat lebihan sebanyak RM493,872 pada tahun 2015 berbanding RM901,929 pada tahun 2014. Beliau juga memaklumkan bahawa lebihan RM900,000 pada tahun 2014 adalah disebabkan pembayaran dividen oleh IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd sebanyak RM500,000.
- 5.4 Yuran tahunan adalah sebanyak RM3,446,637 pada 2015 berbanding RM3,513,348 pada tahun 2014. Ini menunjukkan penurunan sebanyak 2%.

Tunggakan Yuran Tahunan bagi 2015 adalah sebanyak RM577,058 berbanding RM702,445 pada tahun 2014 manakala kutipan Yuran Tahunan bagi tahun 2015 telah meningkat kepada RM2,869,579 berbanding RM2,812,903 bagi tahun 2014. Ini menunjukkan peningkatan sebanyak 2%.

- 5.5 MAT selanjutnya dimaklumkan bahawa jumlah pendapatan bagi 2015 meningkat sebanyak 1.4% kepada RM6,226,839 berbanding RM6,139,098.00 pada 2014. MAT turut maklum bahawa penyumbang utama adalah yuran tahunan 55.4%, diikuti oleh pendapatan sewa 28.9%, komisen kad kredit 1.3%, dividen 1.6% dan pendapatan daripada Bahagian Teknikal 5.1%.
- 5.6 Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan bahawa jumlah perbelanjaan bagi 2015 meningkat sebanyak RM5,732,967 berbanding RM5,237,169 pada tahun 2014 dengan peningkatan sebanyak 9.5%.
- 5.7 Peningkatan dalam perbelanjaan terdiri daripada Emolumen Peribadi meningkat 11.5% dan Perbelanjaan Pentadbiran yang meningkat sebanyak 28.4%.
 - Peningkatan dalam perbelanjaan pentadbiran adalah disebabkan oleh peningkatan dalam pembayaran percetakan, alat tulis serta perbelanjaan pos. Penambahan bilangan keahlian pula menjadi punca peningkatan perbelanjaan pos.
- 5.8 Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Bendahari Kehormat diatas laporan Penyata Kewangan tersebut. Beliau juga memberitahu MAT bahawa Penyata Kewangan telah dicetak di muka surat 178 hingga 198. Yang DiPertua kemudiannya menjemput ahli-ahli untuk mengemukakan sebarang soalan/komen.





5.10 Sesi Soalan - Akaun

5.10.1. Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (M08898) meminta penjelasan daripada Bendahari Kehormat tentang perbelanjaan yang digunakan untuk bangunan sebanyak RM838.477.

Namun terdapat komen daripada ahli lain bahawa Ir. Gary Lim sebagai ahli Majlis sepatutnya mengemukakan persoalan tersebut lebih awal semasa Mesyuarat Majlis dan bukan semasa Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan. Ir. Gary Lim mengulas bahawa angka-angka tersebut tidak dibentangkan semasa Mesyuarat Majlis.

Pertanyaan tersebut disuarakan semula oleh Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218).

Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan bahawa angka dan akaun yang sama telah dibentangkan di Mesyuarat Majlis pada 21 Mac 2016 dan jumlah yang ditunjukkan termasuk faedah yang dibayar untuk pinjaman yang diambil, susutnilai Wisma IEM serta penyelenggaraan bangunan dan lain-lain perbelanjaan sampingan.

5.10.2 Ir. CMM Aboobucker (M13942) meminta penjelasan mengenai Analisis Perbelanjaan tahun 2015 yang menunjukkan perbelanjaan penyelengaran bangunan berkurangan sebanyak 9.7%, samada ianya disebabkan oleh susutnilai bangunan tersebut.

Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan bahawa jumlah yang dipaparkan merujuk kepada pengurangan dalam perbelanjaan penyelenggaraan bangunan.

- 5.10.3 YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) menyatakan terdapat kesilapan pada halaman 178 di mana terdapat ulangan dalam perenggan enam dan tujuh. MAT mengambil maklum kesilapan atas ulangan tersebut.
- 5.10.4 YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) seterusnya menegaskan bahawa jumlah keseluruhan yuran tahunan yang sepatutnya diterima sebanyak RM3,446,637, berdasarkan kutipan yuran tahunan yang dijangka, tetapi terdapat tunggakan berjumlah RM577,058 pada akhir tahun. Beliau menyuarakan kebimbangan terhadap jumlah yang amat tinggi yang tidak dapat dikutip oleh pihak IEM.

Bendahari Kehormat mengucapkan terima kasih kepada YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah di atas keperihatinan beliau. Beliau kemudian memaklumkan kepada MAT yang dua peringatan telah dihantar setiap tahun sebagai peringatan kepada ahli untuk membayar yuran tahunan mereka. Sekretariat juga telah membuat panggilan telefon kepada ahli-ahli yang belum membuat pembayaran yuran tahunan untuk mengingatkan mereka supaya menjelaskan tunggakan tersebut. Setiap tahun perkara ini dilakukan bagi merapatkan jurang antara jumlah yang diterima dan jumlah yang dikutip.

5.10.5 Memandangkan terdapat perbelanjaan yang berulang setiap tahun untuk menaik taraf dan menyelenggara bangunan, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) mencadangkan supaya IEM mempertimbang penubuhan satu dana "sinking fund".

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa buat masa ini IEM tidak mempunyai dana untuk tujuan tersebut tetapi cadangan itu akan dibentangkan di Majlis untuk perbincangan selanjutnya.

5.10.6 Ir. Awangku Hidup bin Awangku Hosain (F03053) mencadangkan supaya IEM mempertimbangkan untuk menganjurkan Anugerah Kecemerlangan Yang DiPertua kepada cawangan-cawangan IEM. Beliau menegaskan bahawa cawangan-cawangan IEM terlalu bergantung sepenuhnya kepada subsidi yang dibayar oleh pihak Ibu Pejabat. Pertandingan seperti ini, pada pendapat beliau akan menggalakkan cawangan-cawangan IEM supaya lebih aktif dan seterusnya menjana pendapatan yang lebih.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Ir. Awangku Hidup bin Awangku Hosain di atas cadangan tersebut dan memaklumkan bahawa usul tersebut akan dipertimbangkan oleh Jawatankuasa Kerja.

5.10.7 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) mempersoalkan tentang Analisis Perbelanjaan pada tahun 2015 di bawah item Kos Kewangan yang telah menunjukkan penurunan sebanyak 68.5%. Beliau merujuk kepada persoalan perbelanjaan ke atas bangunan kira-kira RM1 juta dan meminta dinyatakan pecahan butiran kos tersebut.

Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan bahawa pengurangan dalam kos kewangan sebanyak 68.5% adalah disebabkan oleh pengurangan bayaran faedah bank memandangkan pembayaran balik yang telah dibuat IEM ke atas pinjaman bank.

Akauntan seterusnya menjelaskan dengan merujuk kepada halaman 187 (perkara ke-9 - pinjaman) di mana baki pinjaman telah dikurangkan (turun) dari RM5,958,590 pada tahun 2014 kepada RM3,220.260 pada tahun 2015. Ini telah menyebabkan penurunan sebanyak 68.5% dalam kos kewangan.

5.10.8 Oleh kerana tiada soalan lain dari ahli-ahli, Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (F01922) mencadangkan Penyata Akaun bagi IEM bagi tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2015 disahkan. Usul itu disokong oleh Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086). MAT menerima dan mengesahkan Penyata Kewangan tersebut.





6.0 PENYATA KEWANGAN DANA PENDIDIKAN - 31 DISEMBER 2015

- 6.1 Bendahari Kehormat kemudian melaporkan mengenai Penyata Kewangan Tabung Pendidikan bagi tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2015 daripada halaman 199 hingga halaman 205.
- 6.2 MAT memaklumkan bahawa derma yang diterima adalah berjumlah RM54,757 pada tahun 2015 berbanding RM33,213 pada tahun 2014. Faedah Deposit Tetap yang diperolehi berjumlah RM37,087 berbanding RM34,525 pada tahun 2014.

Bendahari Kehormat mengucapkan terima kasih kepada semua ahli kerana kesudian mereka membuat sumbangan pada tahun 2015.

Dari segi perbelanjaan, Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan bahawa biasiswa yang diberikan pada 2015 berjumlah RM40,500. Beliau juga memaklumkan bahawa perbelanjaan lain adalah subsidi untuk penganjuran ceramah berjumlah RM37,364, Persidangan Luar Negara RM30,932 dan Subsidi Bahagian Pelajar sebanyak RM 3,500.

- 6.3 Bendahari Kehormat merumuskan laporan Tabung Pendidikan dengan memaklumkan bahawa terdapat defisit sebanyak RM29,379 pada prestasi keseluruhan bagi tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2015. Oleh kerana Tabung Pendidikan adalah dana yang dikecualikan cukai, akaun terpaksa mematuhi peraturan Lembaga Hasil Dalam Negeri (LHDN) di mana sekurang-kurangnya 50% daripada sumbangan yang diterima pada tahun sebelumnya perlu dibelanjakan untuk objektif dana tersebut. Keperluan tersebut telah pun dipatuhi pada 2015.
- 6.4 Yang DiPetua kemudian mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Bendahari Kehormat di atas laporan Dana Pendidikan dan menjemput para ahli megemukakan soalan berkenaan laporan Bendahari Kehormat. Memandangkan tiada sebarang komen yang diutarakan, Ir. Tan Koh Yon (M11075) mencadangkan supaya Akaun Dana Pendidikan diterima. Usul itu disokong oleh Ir. Jagathisen a/I Siva Perumal (M05107). MAT sebulat suara menerima Akaun Dana Pendidikan.

7.0 PERBINCANGAN ISU BERTULIS DARIPADA AHLI YANG TELAH MENGHANTAR NOTIS BERTULIS.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa IEM telah menerima tiga (3) resolusi dari ahli-ahli untuk dibentangkan pada Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-57. Resolusi-resolusi tersebut seperti berikut:-

- 7.1 1. Resolusi No. 1 pencadang: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)
 - "Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis IEM mematuhi arahan daripada Lembaga Jurutera, Malaysia untuk tidak menggunakan Engr. dan tidak mengambil tindakan undang-undang untuk mencabar Lembaga Jurutera, Malaysia atas arahan mengenai penggunaan Engr."
- 7.1.1 Yang DiPertua kemudiannya memberikan penjelasan ringkas mengenai latar belakang isu "Engr." MAT dimaklumkan bahawa isu "Engr." adalah perkara yang lama. IEM telah memohon campur tangan dari YB Menteri Kerja Raya, di mana YB Menteri telah mengatur satu dialog antara IEM dan BEM. Daripada dialog tersebut, YB Menteri Kerja Raya membuat kesimpulan supaya perkara itu dirujuk kepada Pejabat Peguam Negara untuk pandangan mengenai tafsiran Akta Pendaftaran Jurutera yang berkaitan dengan isu ini.

Majlis IEM di mesyuaratnya pada 21 Mac 2016 telah bersetuju untuk mematuhi keputusan YB Menteri untuk membawa isu ini kepada pejabat Peguam Negara bagi mendapat pandangan mereka sebelum tindakan selanjutnya diambil.

Lanjutan daripada nasihat YB Menteri Kerja Raya, IEM melalui keputusan Mesyuarat Majlis, telah mengeluarkan suatu pekeliling kepada semua ahli pada 26 Mac 2016, melalui edaran email dan juga paparan dimuka depan laman web IEM supaya berhenti menggunakan "Engr." sementara menunggu keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara. Surat pekeliling telah dihantar bersama-sama dengan Jurutera bulan April 2016. Yang DiPertua mengulangi bahawa IEM telahpun mengambil tindakan-tindakan pentadbiran yang sewajarnya.

Walau bagaimanapun, IEM menerima resolusi dari Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa untuk IEM mematuhi arahan dari Menteri Kerja Raya dan pada masa yang sama tidak mengambil apa-apa tindakan undang-undang mengenai isu tersebut.

- 7.1.2 Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa untuk membentangkan resolusi beliau sebelum dibincangkan dalam Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan.
- 7.1.3 Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086) menyatakan bahawa tidak betul untuk Ir. Gary Lim membentangkan resolusi semasa Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan kerana beliau adalah sebahagian dari ahli Majlis dan beliau perlu akur dengan keputusan yang dibuat oleh Majlis. Isu itu telahpun dibincangkan dalam Mesyuarat Majlis pada bulan Mac dan keputusan Majlis telah pun ditetapkan.

Yang DiPertua namun telah memberi kebenaran untuk Ir. Gary Lim meneruskan pembentangan resolusi beliau, setelah mendapat persetujuan semasa MAT.





7.1.4 Ir. Gary Lim memaklumkan bahawa IEM berfungsi atas dasar konsensus, maka apabila ahli mengundi untuk sesuatu isu tertentu dan cadangan tersebut tidak diterima maka beliau mempunyai hak sebagai ahli IEM untuk pendapatnya didengari oleh ahli-ahli lain. Beliau kemudian memaklumkan MAT bahawa isu tersebut melibatkan tindakan undang-undang dan kos undang-undang boleh mencecah sehingga RM500,000. Proses undang-undang dengan Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia (BEM) akan mengambil masa, kewangan dan sumber. Beliau menyatakan bahawa proses itu akan melibatkan kos undang-undang, yang secara tidak langsung melibatkan ahli-hli IEM disebabkan dana IEM adalah milik ahli-ahlinya.

Beliau meminta direkodkan bahawa Jawatankuasa Kerja IEM telah mencadangkan "untuk menggunakan semua proses undang-undang untuk mendapat pengesahan samada IEM boleh atau tidak boleh menggunakan" Engr.". Bagaimanapun, semasa mesyuarat Majlis yang berikutnya, isu ini telah dibincangkan dan undian telah dibuat dan keputusan Majlis adalah "IEM akan menunggu keputusan dari Pejabat Peguam Negara dan kemudian akan membincangkan tindakan yang akan diambil selanjutnya".

Beliau juga menjelaskan bahawa sekiranya Majlis tidak membuat keputusannya, maka Jawatankuasa Kerja akan meneruskan tindakan untuk menggunakan semua proses undang-undang dan peruntukan dana untuk tindakan undang-undang tersebut akan dipergunakan.

7.1.5 Ir. Gary Lim mengulangi penjelasan beliau dengan menegaskan bahawa IEM tidak mempunyai hak pemilikan terhadap "Engr." dan juga tidak boleh mendaftar untuk memiliki hak ke atas "Engr" tersebut.

Beliau juga memaklumkan MAT bahawa terdapat kes seorang yang bukan ahli IEM yang menggunakan gelaran "Engr" dan kemudian ditukar kepada "Eng." Perkara ini boleh menimbulkan kekeliruan kepada orang ramai.

- 7.1.6 Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa Majlis telah mengikuti arahan Menteri Kerja Raya untuk menunggu keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara. Ahli yang hadir kemudiannya dijemput untuk memberi pandangan mereka.
- 7.1.7 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) mengulas bahawa kenyataan dari Ir. Gary Lim mungkin kurang tepat kerana ia telah memberi gambaran bahawa Ahli Majlis dan Ahli Jawatankuasa Kerja mempunyai sikap tidak bertanggungjawab.

Beliau menambah bahawa Perlembagaan membenarkan Jawatankuasa Kerja untuk bertindak bagi pihak Majlis di masa antara mesyuarat Majlis. Majlis boleh membincangkan dan membatalkan apa-apa keputusan Jawatankuasa Kerja, di mana perlu. Beliau menegaskan bahawa cara operasi Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis amat berbeza dari pemahaman Ir. Gary Lim.

Beliau juga mengulas bahawa ahli IEM adalah profesional dan isu tersebut perlu diselesaikan secara profesional dan bukannya berandaian bahawa akan terdapat sekumpulan orang-orang yang akan menentang resolusi tersebut.

7.1.8 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) menyuarakan kebimbangan di atas slaid yang menyatakan bahawa "Majlis bersetuju untuk mematuhi arahan Menteri Kerja Raya untuk tidak menggunakan Engr. sehingga menerima keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara sebelum membuat keputusan mengenai tindakan seterusnya yang akan diambil". Beliau bertanyakan tindakan yang akan dilakukan seterusnya.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa Majlis masih belum membuat sebarang keputusan untuk tindakan seterusnya dan ianya akan bergantung kepada keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara. Tindakan yang akan dipilih berkemungkinan adalah menerima keputusan Pejabat Peguam Negara atau membuat rayuan jika keputusan tidak memihak kepada IEM. Bagaimanapun, beliau memaklumkan bahawa Majlis belum membuat sebarang keputusan mengenai perkara itu lagi.

- 7.1.9 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) menegaskan bahawa sekiranya Majlis memutuskan untuk meneruskan dengan tindakan undangundang, kemungkinan ahli-ahli tidak akan mengetahui keputusan Majlis tersebut. Beliau menambah bahawa perbelanjaan yang tinggi akan digunakan jika tindakan undang-undang diambil dan berpendapat bahawa adalah lebih baik jika peruntukan tersebut digunapakai untuk Dana Bangunan.
- 7.1.10 Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) memberi penjelasan mengenai kos undang-undang seperti yang dibentangkan oleh Ir. Gary Lim sebelum ini.
 - Ir. Lai memaklumkan bahawa jika IEM bercadang untuk meneruskan tindakan undang-undang, ia akan melibatkan "declaratory" atau "court order" atas pentaksiran Akta. Kos undang-undang tersebut tidak akan melebihi RM40,000 dan Majlis telahpun meluluskan peruntukan sebanyak RM100,000. Belum ada lagi perbincangan samada isu ini akan dibawa ke mahkamah tinggi ataupun sebaliknya.
- 7.1.11 Ir. Chong Pick Eng (P.E Chong) (HonF01214) memaklumkan bahawa beliau adalah seorang peguam yang berkelayakan dan ingin menjelaskan tentang tindakan undang-undang yang disuarakan oleh Ir. Gary Lim.
 - Ir. P.E Chong menjelaskan bahawa tindakan undang-undang yang dicadangkan oleh IEM adalah untuk memohon "Declaratory Order", yang merupakan keputusan "ex parte". Keputusan "ex parte" akan dibuat oleh pihak hakim tanpa kehadiran manamana pihak. Oleh itu, "Declaratory Order" adalah pendekatan tanpa konfrontasi.

"Declaratory Order" adalah satu pendekatan untuk mendapatkan tafsiran Akta daripada mahkamah sebelum IEM membuat sebarang keputusan samada untuk meneruskan atau tidak dengan tindakan seterusnya.

Tindakan undang-undang melibatkan mahkamah pada pelbagai peringkat dengan hakim yang berbeza hierarkinya. Beliau juga menjelaskan bahawa andaian Ir. Gary Lim dengan jumlah sebanyak RM 500,000 adalah tidak wajar kerana kos tindakan undang-undang berbeza mengikut tahap mahkamah seperti Mahkamah Tinggi atau Mahkamah Rayuan.





- 7.1.12 Ir. Lee Weng Onn (F08103) berpendapat bahawa isu yang diketengahkan oleh Ir. Gary Lim yang "IEM berjuang tanpa manfaat" adalah tidak tepat.
 - Ir. Lee seterusnya menjelaskan keperluan penggunaan gelaran "Engr.". Beliau memaklumkan bahawa Ahli Siswazah IEM sangat berbangga dengan penggunaan gelaran tersebut dan gelaran itu juga disanjung tinggi di kalangan Ahli Siswazah dan merupakan salah satu faktor penggalakan para siswazah untuk menjadi ahli IEM.
- 7.1.13 Ir. Tengku Salehudin bin Tengku Bakar (M12504) melahirkan kebimbangan mengenai implikasi kos yang terpaksa ditanggung jika Majlis atau Jawatankuasa Kerja memutuskan untuk mengikut saluran undang-undang dan keputusan tidak berpihak pada IEM. Beliau menambah mungkin ahli-ahli IEM ingin menyuarakan pendapat tentang perkara ini kerana ia melibatkan jumlah kos yang tinggi.
 - Ir. Lee Weng Onn kemudian menjelaskan bahawa Majlis telah meluluskan bajet RM100,000 dan jika jumlah ini dibahagikan dengan 40,000 ahli, ia cuma melibatkan kos sebanyak RM2.50 setiap ahli.
- 7.1.14 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) tidak bersetuju dengan komen bahawa kos yang ditanggung oleh setiap ahli adalah hanya sedikit sahaja. Beliau berpendapat bahawa perkara itu perlu dipertimbangkan sama ada ia berbaloi untuk membelanjakan wang pada gelaran "Engr." tersebut. Beliau berpendapat bahawa pertimbangan yang sewajarnya perlu dibuat samada kos guaman adalah wajar ataupun tidak. Beliau mencadangkan bahawa bajet yang diperuntukkan adalah lebih wajar digunakan untuk tujuan lain seperti untuk pembayaran pinjaman pembelian bangunan IEM.
- 7.1.15 YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01619) menegaskan bahawa resolusi yang dicadangkan oleh Ir. Gary Lim supaya IEM tidak patut mengambil tindakan undang-undang kerana ini melibatkan wang ahli IEM sekadar untuk memperjuangkan gelaran "Engr." yang mana gelaran tersebut bukanlah milik eksklusif IEM. Tambahnya lagi, resolusi Ir. Gary Lim tidak memaksa IEM berhenti daripada mengambil apa-apa tindakan lain berkenaan dengan gelaran "Engr." itu, seperti merayu kepada pihak berkuasa yang lebih tinggi. Beliau menjelaskan bahawa kebimbangan Ir. Gary Lim adalah kos yang terpaksa ditanggung jika mengambil prosiding undang-undang yang melibatkan wang IEM, dan akan membebankan ahli-ahli IEM pada keseluruhannya.
- 7.1.16 YBhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) menyatakan bahawa beliau pada asalnya memang menentang idea mempertahankan gelaran "Engr." Walau bagaimanapun beliau telah mengubah pendiriannya selepas melihat reaksi kebanggaan ibu bapa apabila anak-anak mereka dapat menggunakan gelaran "Engr." itu. Beliau telah melihat sendiri persepsi yang amat bernilai bagi graduan jurutera untuk menggunakan gelaran tersebut. Oleh itu, idea menggunakan gelaran "Engr." perlu diteruskan dan dilaksanakan.
 - Beliau turut menambah bahawa YB Menteri, yang juga seorang peguam telah berjanji untuk membantu mengenai hal ini dan IEM perlu menunggu keputusan beliau. Masih terdapat cara lain untuk membuat rayuan jika keputusan Menteri Kerja Raya tidak menggalakkan yakni pendekatan selain prosiding undang-undang adalah mengadakan perundingan dengan BEM untuk IEM terus menggunakan gelaran tersebut
- 7.1.17 Ir. Lee Weng Onn (F08103) mengulangi dan memaklumkan bahawa dengan bajet yang diluluskan RM100,000, ahli-ahli hanya membayar RM2.50 seorang. Beliau berpendapat bahawa jumlah ini adalah kecil jika dibandingkan dengan kebanggaan Institusi yang tidak ternilai harganya.
- 7.1.18 Ir. Ng Yong Kong (M05043) mengulas bahawa beliau telah lewat sampai iaitu selepas Majlis selesai membuat keputusan. Pada pendapat beliau, IEM perlu menunggu keputusan daripada Pejabat Peguam Negara sebelum meneruskan ke prosiding seterusnya. IEM harus cuba untuk menyelesaikan masalah ini tanpa membabitkan implikasi kos. Pendapat beliau adalah sama dengan ahli-ahli lain yang telah memberikan pandangan sebelum beliau, bahawa bajet yang diperuntukkan harus digunakan untuk dana bangunan.
- 7.1.19 Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) menyatakan serta mencadangkan supaya ahli yang ingin terus mengunakan tindakan undangundang patut menanggung segala kos perbelanjaan itu secara sendiri dan bukan oleh IEM.
- 7.1.20 Ir. Lee Choy Hin (F05271) mengulas bahawa perbincangan setakat ini masih mengenai isu wang. Pada pendapat beliau IEM perlu memberi pencerahan kepada ahli-ahli samada pendekatan yang diambil adalah penting untuk meneruskan tindakan undang-undang. Ahli-ahli perlu mengambil kira kos undang-undang dalam membuat keputusan mengenai isu ini. Seperti yang sedia maklum semua pandangan telahpun diperdengarkan maka beliau mencadangkan supaya ahli-ahli MAT membuat pengundian samada IEM perlu meneruskan dengan tindakan undang-undang atau sebaliknya dan tidak membahaskan isu ini lagi.
- 7.1.21 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) menegaskan bahawa resolusi seperti ini perlu dimasukkan ke dalam "agenda". Beliau merasakan bahawa resolusi spontan untuk terus mengundi adalah tidak wajar dan jika perlu, IEM patut mengadakan satu Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM) dimana ahli-ahli perlu diberi masa untuk membincangkan samada mereka bersetuju dengan keputusan yang dibuat ataupun sebaliknya. Beliau mencadangkan resolusi ini perlu dibincangkan dan dipertimbangkan semula.
- 7.1.22 Ir. Gary Lim menegaskan bahawa beliau telah menghantar resolusi sebelum tarikh akhir pada 1 April 2016.





7.1.23 Yang DiPertua menjawab bahawa MAT telah mendengar semua pandangan daripada ahli-ahli dan seperti yang dijelaskan sebelum ini, Majlis IEM dalam mesyuaratnya pada 21 Mac 2016 telah bersetuju untuk mematuhi nasihat Menteri untuk menunggu sehingga menerima keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara sebelum memutuskan tindakan seterusnya. IEM telahpun mengambil langkah-langkah yang sewajarnya dari segi pentadbiran.

Beliau mengulangi bahawa Majlis berasa terlalu awal untuk tindakan undang-undang diambil sebelum menerima keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara. Beliau berkata Peguam Negara juga mungkin tidak dapat membuat sebarang keputusan, dan akan meminta kedua-dua pihak untuk menghantar wakil mereka untuk membentangkan kes tersebut. Majlis akan membuat keputusan mengenai apa yang perlu dilakukan dan meminta ahli bersikap rasional dan mempercayai tindakan Majlis.

Yang DiPertua kemudiannya meminta ahli, mengundi samada menerima resolusi dari Ir. Gary Lim.

- 7.1.24 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) mengulangi dan menyatakan bahawa beliau tidak bersetuju jika keputusan dibuat pada hari itu. Beliau merasakan bahawa ketetapan itu hendaklah ditulis sepenuhnya sebagai satu perkara di dalam "agenda". Beliau juga mengulas bahawa ahli-ahli yang menghadiri MAT tidak mempunyai hak sepenuhnya untuk membuat keputusan, cara yang sebenarnya adalah dengan membuat pungutan suara dari semua ahli-ahli dan bukan dari sebahagian ahli yang hadir MAT sahaja.
- 7.1.25 Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) mengulas bahawa keseluruhan isu adalah mengenai tafsiran. BEM menterjemahkan Fasal 7 (aa) (ii) daripada REA bahawa dengan penggunaan "Engr." ia akan disalahertikan bahawa orang itu ialah seorang Jurutera Profesional. Walau bagaimanapun, Majlis tidak bersetuju dengan tafsiran tersebut.

Beliau menjelaskan bahawa jika seorang Ahli Siswazah menggunakan gelaran "Engr." ia mesti digunakan bersama dengan akhiran "Grad.IEM" untuk mereka yang bukan Jurutera Profesional. Beliau berkata bahawa IEM bukan bertujuan untuk mengelirukan orang ramai, tetapi untuk memberi hak yang sewajarnya untuk peningkatan profesion jurutera. Para ahli juga diingatkan bahawa IEM tidak akan cuba untuk mencabar keputusan BEM, tetapi hanya meminta mahkamah untuk memberi tafsiran yang sewajarnya.

Beliau menambah bahawa Majlis telah memutuskan untuk menunggu keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara sebelum membuat apa-apa keputusan dan ahli perlu menunggu dan yakin terhadap kebijaksanaan Majlis.

Cadangan ini hanya untuk mendapatkan 'Declaratory Order' dari mahkamah yang mungkin akan atau tidak berpihak kepada IEM. Jika ia tidak menyebelahi IEM, Majlis akan membuat keputusan lagi.

Walau bagaimanapun, kerana adanya penerimaan resolusi, maka satu-satunya cara untuk menyelesaikan dan memutuskan resolusi ini adalah melalui Mesyuarat Agung Khas (MAK).

- Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong kemudiannya mencadangkan untuk mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung Khas (MAK) bagi membincangkan resolusi ini. Beliau berkata bahawa untuk Mesyuarat Agung Khas ini (MAK), suatu notis mesyuarat yang memenuhi garispanduan perlu diedarkan kepada ahli-ahli.
- 7.1.26 Yang DiPertua kemudian meminta sokongan untuk usul IEM mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung Khas (MAK). Yang DiPertua meminta ahli-ahli untuk membuat keputusan samada untuk mengundi atau untuk meneruskan Mesyuarat Agung Khas (MAK).
- 7.1.27 YBhg. Datuk Ir. Rosaline Ganendra (F06033) menegaskan bahawa perkara itu merupakan perkara agenda, oleh itu, MAT tidak harus mengundi untuk mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM). Beliau mengulangi bahawa resolusi bertulis telah dihantar dengan adanya pencadang dan penyokong serta notis sewajarnya telah pun dikeluarkan. Garispanduan yang betul telah juga dipatuhi.

Beliau berpendapat bahawa MAT perlu terus membuat pengundian samada untuk meneruskan atau tidak dengan prosiding undang-undang. Beliau berkata bahawa mengikut Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang Kecil, tidak ada pilihan lain selain dari membuat pengundian. Sekiranya ada ahli yang tidak bersetuju atas keputusan dari pejabat Peguam Negara, mereka boleh meminta untuk mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM).

- 7.1.28 Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong tidak bersetuju dengan komen daripada YBhg. Datuk Ir. Rosaline Ganendra yang menyatakan bahawa notis sewajarnya telah diberi. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa walaupun Ir. Gary Lim telah mengemukakan resolusi beliau, majoriti ahli-ahli tidak menyedari kandungan resolusi tersebut.
- 7.1.29 YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon. F01619) mengulas bahawa resolusi telah diserahkan sebelum tarikh akhir tetapi Setiausaha gagal mengedarkan kepada para ahli.

Beliau berkata bagi Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM), notis pemberitahuan mestilah diedarkan kepada Keahlian Korporat sekurang-kurangnya dua puluh satu (21) hari sebelum mesyuarat diadakan. Beliau merujuk kepada Perlembagaan, halaman 30, perkara 7.8 seperti di bawah;

Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM)

7.8 Notis bagi Mesyuarat Agung Khas hendaklah diedarkan kepada Keahlian Korporat sekurang-kurangnya dua puluh satu (21) hari sebelum mesyuarat. Notis itu hendaklah menyatakan secara am jenis perkara yang akan diperbincangkan dan resolusi (jika ada) yang akan dibawa pada mesyuarat itu dan tiada perkara lain yang akan dilaksanakan semasa mesyuarat tersebut.





7.1.30 Yang DiPertua kemudian merujuk kepada Perlembagaan, halaman 30, perkara 7.6 seperti berikut:

Mesyuarat Agong Tahunan

7.6 Bisnes Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan adalah pembentangan Laporan dari Majlis berkenaan prestasi/aktiviti tahun sebelumnya, penyata kewangan yang telah diaudit, pengisytiharan keputusan undi bagi pemilihan Pegawai-pegawai Institusi, pemilihan juruaudit dalaman, pelantikan juruaudit luar, upacara perlantikan Yang diPertua dan pertimbangan lain-lain hal yang termaktub di dalam peraturan pertubuhan ini.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa, seperti yang ditegaskan oleh YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon. F01619), terjadinya isu pentadbiran kerana kegagalan pihak Setiausaha untuk mengedarkan resolusi tersebut kepada ahli-ahli.

Pada ketika ini, terdapat beberapa terdapat percanggahan pendapat dari beberapa ahli-ahli yang hadir.

7.1.32 Timbalan Yang DiPertua memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa beliau menyokong sepenuhnya keputusan dari ahli-ahli untuk membuat pengundian, tetapi terdapat klausa dalam Perlembagaan, halaman 30, perkara 7.5 yang menyatakan : -

Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan

7.5 Notis Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan akan diedarkan kepada semua ahli-ahli sekurang-kurangnya empat (4) minggu sebelum Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua terus memaklumkan bahawa resolusi tersebut diterima pada 31 Mac 2016, iaitu kurang daripada empat (4) minggu sebelum tarikh Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan. Oleh yang demikian, resolusi itu tidak dapat dibentangkan sebagai agenda di bawah perkara 5. Ahli telah menerimanya sebagai perkara untuk dibincangkan tetapi tidak ramai ahli mengetahui resolusi tersebut.

Beliau merasakan bahawa demi kesemua ahli-ahli Institusi, cara terbaik adalah untuk mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM). Beliau mencadangkan supaya kedua-dua resolusi yang dikemukakan oleh Ir. Gary Lim dibincangkan di Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM). Tarikh yang dicadangkan adalah tiga (3) bulan dari tarikh Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan.

Beliau menambah bahawa sebelum Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM) diadakan, IEM tidak akan mengambil apa-apa tindakan undang-undang berkenaan isu "Engr.".

Timbalan Yang DiPertua meminta kesepakatan daripada ahli-ahli diatas cadangan tersebut dengan membuat pengundian "mengangkat tangan" dari ahli-ahli.

7.1.33 Cadangan untuk para ahli mengundi secara 'mengangkat tangan' untuk mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung Khas diterima. Hasil pengundian adalah seperti berikut:

Menyokong - 228Ahli Membantah - 43 Ahli Berkecuali - 26 Ahli

Dengan keputusan undian seperti di atas, maka MAT bersetuju untuk mengadakan Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM). Tarikh Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM) akan ditentukan oleh Majlis.

7.2 2. Resolusi No. 2 - pencadang: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898

"Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis IEM memutuskan untuk membubarkan IEM Academy Sdn Bhd"

Hujah beliau - IEM A telah ditubuhkan untuk mengendalikan kursus pentauliahan sepertimana yang diberitahu dalam mesyuarat Majlis, tetapi kesemuanya TIDAK menjadi kenyataan dan strategi KELUAR itu tidak dilaksanakan. Sebaliknya IEM TC menyerahkan beberapa tugasan kursus latihan kepada IEM A, oleh itu IEM A menunjukkan keuntungan yang sangat baik dalam menjalankan kursus latihan tersebut.

Seperti keputusan undian di atas maka resolusi ini juga akan dibincangkan pada Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM).

7.3 3. Surat dari Ahli – Mr. Chan Foo Ching – G08133

Isu beliau adalah "penggunaan produk yang tidak memenuhi syarat dalam "Industri Perlindungan Kebakaran".

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa IEM telah menghubungi Mr. Chan Foo Ching untuk menjemput beliau ke mesyuarat Lembaga Penasihat Kebakaran (FAB) untuk maklumat lanjut dan penjelasan mengenai isu yang dibangkitkan, sebelum tindakan selanjutnya diambil.

Yang DiPertua kemudianya bertanya kepada Mr. Chan Foo Ching, samada beliau bersetuju dengan cadangan tersebut. Mr. Chan Foo Ching telah bersetuju untuk menerima pelawaan itu dan beliau akan menunggu jemputan daripada Lembaga Penasihat Kebakaran IEM (FAB).

8.0 PINDAAN PERLEMBAGAAN IEM

- 8.1 Yang DiPertua membentangkan pindaan Perlembagaan yang dicadangkan seperti di halaman 6 Laporan Tahunan. Ahli-ahli di Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan diberitahu bahawa cadangan pindaan telah diedarkan kepada semua ahli-ahli melalui e-mel dan melalui pos.
- 8.1.1 Perkara 5.1 Pinda Perlembagaan untuk membenarkan
 - (k) 5 kerusi untuk Ahli Siswazah di dalam Majlis dengan hak mengundi.
 - (1) 1 kerusi untuk Jurutera Wanita di dalam Majlis dengan hak mengundi

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa bagi perkara (k), kini terdapat 9,430 Ahli Siswazah dan 179 Ahli "Companion" di IEM - hampir menyamai bilangan Ahli Korporat. Tujuannya adalah untuk memberi pendedahan dan latihan kepada mereka sebagai pemimpin masa depan IEM. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa YES telah diberi tanggungjawab untuk menganjurkan beberapa aktiviti IEM yang tidak terhad kepada bahagian mereka, seperti penganjuran Minggu Jurutera dan Larian Jurutera.

Manakala bagi perkara (I), MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Jurutera Wanita dalam IEM tidak termasuk pelajar berjumlah 3,269. Lebih daripada 7,000 Ahli Siswa - jurutera masa depan, adalah wanita. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa peranan wanita kini menjadi semakin penting dan agensi-agensi atau organisasi menyahut seruan Perdana Menteri untuk memperuntukkan 30% jawatan untuk wanita.

Manakala bagi item (I), MAT memaklumkan bahawa Jurutera Wanita dalam IEM tidak termasuk pelajar adalah 3,269. Lebih 7,000 Ahli Pelajar - jurutera masa depan, adalah wanita. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa peranan wanita kini menjadi semakin penting, beliau menyeru agensi-agensi atau organisasi menyahut seruan Perdana Menteri untuk memperuntukkan 30% jawatan untuk wanita.

Yang DiPertua mencadangkan untuk mengundi secara 'mengangkat tangan' untuk Perkara 5.1, item (k & 1).

8.1.1.1 Ir. Tan Keng Lock (M03784) membangkitkan persoalan - "jika Ahli Siswazah pada masa ini tidak mempunyai hak untuk mengundi sebagai ahli umum, mengapa mereka harus mempunyai hak mengundi dalam Majlis yang akan mempunyai kesan ke atas pengundian Majlis".

Timbalan Yang DiPertua memberi penjelasan bahawa beliau telah membuat kajian mengenai keahlian IEM dan setakat ini IEM mempunyai Ahli Korporat yang lebih ramai, berbanding Ahli Bukan Korporat (lebih kurang 3:1). Bagi Ahli Bukan Korporat, Ahli Siswazah dan Companion adalah lebih kurang 10,000 yang bersamaan dengan 23% daripada jumlah ahli IEM. Memberikan mereka (5) kerusi akan membolehkan mereka menjadi lebih aktif dalam aktiviti IEM kerana banyak aktiviti yang telah dianjurkan dengan bantuan dari Siswazah yang bukan MIEM. Untuk melayakkan diri sebagai Ahli Siswazah IEM, seorang graduan kejuruteraan perlu melalui proses permohonan dan penilaian untuk memastikan bahawa mereka telah lulus dengan ijazah kejuruteraan yang diiktiraf di bawah Washington Accord. Tambahnya lagi, ramai jurutera-jurutera tidak berkerja dengan syarikat yang mengamalkan bidang kejuruteraan konvensional di mana mereka perlu menjadi Jurutera Profesional.

Tambahan pula, terdapat kebimbangan bahawa bilangan Ahli Korporat telah agak kurang berkembang sejak 10 tahun yang lalu. Kos semakin meningkat dan jika ini berterusan untuk jangka masa panjang, maka IEM tidak akan dapat dikekalkan. Oleh itu, jika graduan tidak diberi lebih peluang, untuk mereka mengambil bahagian dalam IEM, kemungkinan mereka akan menyertai organisasi luar yang lain di mana mereka diberi peranan yang lebih aktif. Pemilihan untuk calon-calon ke Majlis sebanyak lima (5) kerusi tersebut akan dilakukan oleh pihak YES.

Pindaan ini boleh dianggap sebagai satu projek jangka panjang IEM, demi masa depan yang mampan. Dengan hanya lima (5) kerusi, tidak akan memberi impak besar kepada keputusan Majlis kerana Ahli Majlis terdiri daripada enam puluh empat (64) orang ahli. Beliau menekankan kepentingan Ahli Siswazah untuk mengambil bahagian secara aktif dan dihargai sebagai ahli IEM. Bagi Jurutera Wanita pula, pemberian kerusi tambahan adalah untuk mereka mengambil bahagian secara lebih aktif.

8.1.1.2 Ir. Gan Thian Eng (M04904), mempersoalkan mengapa pindaan tidak diedarkan kepada ahli-ahli yang sepatutnya dilakukan sebelum AGM.

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa pengedaran untuk ahli hanya akan dilakukan setelah pindaan perlembagaan diluluskan oleh Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan. Peruntukan ini telah ditetapkan dalam Perlembagaan IEM.

- 8.1.1.3 YBhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) mengulas bahawa Perlembagaan IEM ini telah menetapkan dua (2) kategori keahlian; Ahli Korporat dan Ahli Bukan Korporat. Cadangan yang dikemukakan adalah untuk pindaan Perlembagaan. Dia meminta Majlis untuk berfikir semula mengenai pindaan yang dicadangkan. Beliau tidak menentang cadangan lebih ramai graduan dalam Majlis tetapi jika graduan diberi hak untuk mengundi, maka mereka harus juga mempunyai hak untuk memegang jawatan yang mana akan bercanggah dengan Perlembagaan IEM.
- 8.1.1.4 Ir. P.E. Chong (F01214) bersetuju dengan komen dari YBhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin. Jika seseorang ahli tidak memiliki hak mengundi, maka ahli itu tidak berhak pula untuk berkhidmat di Majlis. Peruntukan mestilah sama di semua bahagian di dalam Perlembagaan, jika tidak, Perlembagaan tidak konsisten. Beliau juga bersetuju bahawa pindaan yang dicadangkan diperiksa semula untuk bahagian-bahagian lain di dalam Perlembagaan.





8.1.1.5 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon bertanya samada lima (5) kerusi merujuk kepada Graduan YES yang bakal dipilih atau mereka yang sudah memegang jawatan.

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa lima (5) kerusi itu diperuntukkan bagi graduan yang telah memegang jawatan. Jawatan-jawatan tersebut akan dipegang oleh Pengerusi YES, Setiausaha dan tiga yang lain (3) akan dipilih oleh ahli YES.

- 8.1.1.6 Yang DiPertua kemudiannya meminta Ir. Lai Sze Ching, Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Perlembagaan Khas untuk menjawab pertanyaan samada terdapat kenyataan di dalam Perlembagaan yang menunjukkan bahawa Ahli Bukan Korporat tidak mempunyai hak mengundi. Cadangan pindaan tidak boleh melanggar Perlembagaan kerana hanya Ahli Korporat sahaja mempunyai hak untuk mengundi dan dipilih menjadi ahli Mailis.
 - Ir. Lai Sze Ching menjawab bahawa kelayakan mengundi di dalam Perlembagaan menyatakan bahawa Ahli Bukan Korporat tidak dibenarkan mengundi. Ia boleh dipinda di dalam Perlembagaan tanpa menyentuh bahagian lain.
 - Ir. P.E. Chong tidak bersetuju kerana pindaan tidak boleh diteruskan kerana seseorang ahli Siswazah tidak boleh diberi hak mengundi dalam Majlis jika tidak terdapat peruntukan di dalam Perlembagaan untuk para graduan diberi hak mengundi.
- 8.1.1.7 Ir. Yim Ho Wa (F08247) bersetuju bahawa pindaan tersebut harus dikaji semula kerana jika hak mengundi telah diberikan kepada Ahli Siswazah sebagai Ahli Majlis, maka Ahli Siswazah boleh dianggap sebagai Ahli Korporat

YBhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) mempersoalkan tentang syarat dalam peruntukan bilangan kerusi. Beliau merasakan bahawa pindaan yang dicadangkan perlu ada justifikasi.

Yang DiPertua mengambil maklum semua komen dan menjelaskan bahawa jumlah itu diputuskan berdasarkan keanggotaan Majlis dan juga mengambil kira bilangan Ahli Siswazah kini yang melebihi bilangan Ahli Korporat.

Yang DiPertua mencadangkan supaya pindaan ditangguhkan, bagi memberi peluang kepada Majlis membuat kajian yang lebih mendalam dan melihat semula keperluan di atas pindaan di bahagian lain di dalam Perlembagaan.

- 8.1.2 Perkara 5.2 Pinda Perlembagaan untuk
 - (a) Yang DiPertua dan Timbalan Yang DiPertua memegang jawatan untuk satu tempoh selama dua sesi
 - (e) Tempoh jawatan bagi Siswazah dan wakil Jurutera Wanita

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa perkara (a) adalah untuk memberi peluang kepada Yang DiPertua dan Timbalan Yang DiPertua mencapai apa yang mereka rancangkan. Satu "Sesi" bermaksud tempoh di antara dua (2) Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan yang berturutan. Oleh itu, pindaan yang dicadangkan adalah satu jangka masa dua sesi bermaksud "untuk dua (2) tahun".

Pindaan dalam perkara (e) adalah untuk mengambilkira perkara (k) dan (l) yang dicadangkan sebelum ini.

- 8.1.2.1 YBhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019) mengulangi komen bahawa cadangan tersebut pernah dipertimbangkan sebelum ini. Peruntukan jangkamasa satu sesi untuk jawatan Yang DiPertua adalah bertujuan untuk Majlis membuat perhitungan sekiranya Yang DiPertua memimpin Majlis ke arah yang salah atau tidak mampu melaksanakan tugasnya. Yang DiPertua memerlukan mandat daripada Majlis dan bukannya ahli-ahli.
 - YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon memaklumkan bahawa kini kebanyakan persatuan mengamalkan tempoh dua tahun kerana tempoh setahun terlalu pendek untuk Yang DiPertua mencapai matlamat mereka.
- 8.1.2.2 Dalam menjawab komen daripada YBhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee bin Laidin (Hon.F01019), Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa dalam mengusulkan cadangan pindaan Perlembagaan tersebut, peruntukan juga akan di masukkan ke dalam Undang-Undang Kecil untuk menghadapi senario yang sedemikian. Ia adalah di bawah 'Pemecatan' Yang DiPertua.
 - Ir. Lai Sze Ching memaklumkan bahawa Undang-Undang Kecil akan dipinda secara serentak, tetapi tidak dibentangkan di Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ini. Dalam pindaan Undang-Undang Kecil, terdapat peruntukan di mana Yang DiPertua boleh dilucutkan jawatannya bila-bila masa atas satu permintaan "Undi Tidak Yakin" oleh 10% daripada jumlah bilangan Ahli Majlis. Undian hanya memerlukan majoriti.
- 8.1.2.3 Timbalan Yang DiPertua menjelaskan selanjutnya bahawa ada "Yang DiPertua Terpilih". Selepas berkhidmat satu sesi selama dua tahun, Yang DiPertua perlu bersara bagi memberi laluan kepada Timbalan Yang DiPertua untuk memegang jawatan Yang DiPertua. Tetapi, beliau masih boleh bertanding jawatan Yang DiPertua selagi dibenarkan oleh Majlis.
- 8.1.2.4 Oleh kerana terdapat banyak komen mengenai pindaan tersebut, Yang DiPertua mencadangkan supaya semua cadangan pindaan Perlembagaan ditangguhkan sehingga kajian lanjut dapat diambil dan diperkemaskan oleh pihak Majlis sebelum dibentangkan di Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan yang akan datang lagi.





9.0 PENGUMUMAN KEPUTUSAN PEMILIHAN MAJLIS SESI 2016/2017

Yang DiPertua menjemput Pegawai Pemilihan, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon untuk mengumumkan keputusan pemilihan bagi sesi 2016/2017.

9.1 Yang DiPertua

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa mengikut Seksyen 5.2 daripada Undang-Undang Kecil IEM, Ir. Tan Yean Chin, Yang DiPertua Terpilih, akan memegang jawatan Yang DiPertua bagi sesi 2016/2017 dengan tamatnya tempoh jawatan Yang DiPertua yang disandang oleh YBhg. Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock.

9.2 Timbalan Yang DiPertua

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa bagi jawatan Timbalan Yang DiPertua, dua (2) pencalonan sah telah diterima. Sebanyak 64 kertas undi telah dihantar kepada semua ahli Majlis. Pada tarikh tutup pengundian pada 28 Disember 2015, sebanyak 49 kertas undi telah diterima. (Tiada undi rosak).

Selepas pengiraan undi, calon yang menerima jumlah undian tertinggi adalah Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi. Oleh itu, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi dipilih ke jawatan Timbalan Yang DiPertua bagi sesi 2016/2017.

9.3 Naib Yang DiPertua, Setiausaha Kehormat, Bendahari Kehormat dan lain-lain

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon kemudian memaklumkan MAT bahawa jawatan yang berikut memerlukan pengundian:

- Naib Yang DiPertua (empat (4) kekosongan)
- Setiausaha Kehormat (satu (1) kekosongan)
- Bendahari Kehormat (satu (1) kekosongan)
- Ahli Majlis Wakil Kimia (satu (1) kekosongan)
- Ahli Majlis Wakil Biasa (sepuluh (10) kekosongan)

9.4 Jawatan Ahli Majlis – Perwakilan Lain-lain Disiplin (Satu (1) kekosongan untuk 3 sesi, 2016/2017, 2017/2018 dan 2018/2019)

Satu pencalonan telah diterima untuk jawatan ini. Oleh kerana disiplin calon tersebut tidak layak di bawah kategori ini, pencalonan tersebut telah dibatalkan dan oleh itu, tiada calon untuk jawatan ini. Majlis IEM pada mesyuarat ke 400 yang diadakan pada 18 Januari 2016 memutuskan untuk mencalonkan Ir. Roznan bin Abdul Hamid sebagai calon untuk jawatan ini di bawah Undang-undang Kecil Seksyen 5.11. Oleh itu, Ir. Roznan bin Abdul Hamid telah dipilih secara sah untuk jawatan Ahli Majlis – mewakili lain-lain Disiplin bagi sesi 2016/2017, 2017/2018 dan 2018/2019.

9.5 Jawatan Naib Yang DiPertua (Empat (4) Kekosongan untuk 2 sesi 2015/2016 dan 2016/2017)

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa langkah-langkah telah diambil untuk menghantar kertas undi kepada ahli-ahli untuk pengundian bagi jawatan Naib Yang DiPertua, Setiausaha Kehormat, Bendahari Kehormat dan ahli-ahli Majlis Biasa. Sebanyak 9,776 kertas undi telah dihantar kepada Ahli Korporat. Peti Undi di IEM Sekretariat telah ditutup pada 1 April 2016 jam 12.00 tengah hari. Sebanyak 1,712 kertas undi telah diterima di IEM apabila Peti Undi itu dibuka pada jam 2.30 petang pada hari yang sama. Selepas pemeriksaan dan pengesahan kertas undi dilakukan, pengiraan undi dijalankan untuk menentukan calon yang berjaya.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon seterusnya memaklumkan MAT bahawa enam (6) pencalonan telah diterima bagi tiga (3) kekosongan. Tiga (3) calon-calon berikut dengan bilangan undi tertinggi telah dipilih dan disahkan untuk jawatan Naib Yang DiPertua untuk sesi 2016/2017 dan 2017/2018:

- i) Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin
- ii) Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Norlida bt Buniyamin
- iii) Ir. Ellias bin Saidin

9.6 Jawatan Setiausaha Kehormat (Satu (1) kekosongan untuk sesi 2016/2017)

Dua (2) pencalonan telah diterima bagi satu (1) kekosongan tersebut. Calon Ir. Yam Teong Sian menerima jumlah undi tertinggi dan dilantik untuk jawatan Setiausaha Kehormat bagi sesi 2016/2017.

9.7 Jawatan Bendahari Kehormat (Satu (1) kekosongan untuk sesi 2016/2017)

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa dua (2) pencalonan diterima bagi satu (1) kekosongan tersebut. Salah seorang calon, Dr. Wang Hong Kok telah menerima undi yang lebih tinggi dan telah terpilih ke jawatan Bendahari Kehormat bagi sesi 2016/2017.





9.8 Ahli Majlis - Wakil Biasa (Sepuluh (10) Kekosongan untuk 3 sesi, 2016/2017, 2017/2018 dan 2018/2019

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon seterusnya melaporkan bahawa terdapat enam belas (16) pencalonan yang diterima untuk jawatan ini. Pengundian dilakukan dan sepuluh (10) calon yang mempunyai jumlah undi tertinggi dan disahkan untuk jawatan Ahli Majlis - Wakil Biasa untuk sesi 2016/2017, 2017/2018 dan 2018/2019 adalah:

- 9.9 MAT mengambil maklum bahawa proses Pemilihan telah mengambil masa tiga (3) bulan dan jumlah kos adalah RM22,733.83 (dokumen pengundian dan bayaran pos) tidak termasuk kos kakitangan IEM.

MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA HELD ON 8 OCTOBER AT TAN SRI PROF. CHIN FUNG KEE AUDITORIUM, **WISMA IEM, PETALING JAYA AT 9.00 AM**

MEMBERS PRESENT - AS PER APPENDIX A

OPENING REMARKS BY THE PRESIDENT 1.0

The President, Ir. Tan Yean Chin thanked and welcomed members present at the Special General Meeting (SGM). He 1.1 then informed that three different rooms were being used for the SGM, namely the Tan Sri Prof Chin Fung Kee Auditorium located on the 3rd Floor, which would be the main room, the C&S/TUS Lecture Room on the 2nd floor and lastly the Malakoff Auditorium on the ground floor.

The President further informed that video conferencing would be held in the two rooms on the ground floor and second floor respectively (Malakoff Auditorium and C&S/TUSTD Lecture room).

The President also mentioned that Secretariat staff were stationed in each of the rooms to assist members during the SGM. The President then requested members to provide their names and membership numbers during the Q&A session for record purposes.

1.2 Background of the SGM

The President informed the SGM that Council at the last meeting had decided that "IEM is to stop using "Engr." pending the AG Chamber's decision and then deliberate on the next course of action to be taken. The "Engr." is also to be dropped in the new issues of the IEM Jurutera Bulletin. In addition IEM is to issue 'a special circular' to all members informing them of the move to stop using "Engr.". The circular informing members of this matter was issued on 7 April 2016.

It was further informed that at the 56th Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on 16 April 2016, two resolutions were presented as follows:

Resolution No. 1 – proposer: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)

"Excomm and Council of IEM to abide by the directive from Board of Engineers, Malaysia not to use Engr. and not to take legal proceedings to challenge the Board of Engineers, Malaysia's directive on the use of Engr."

Resolution No. 2 - proposer: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)

"Excomm and Council of IEM proceed to wind-up IEM Academy Sdn Bhd"

The AGM after due discussion had agreed that a Special General Meeting (SGM) be called to vote on the resolutions. At the subsequent Excomm meeting after the AGM, Excomm decided to schedule the SGM within three months fixing the date on 19 July 2016.

On 4 May 2016, the Honorary Secretary received an email from the proponent of the resolution informing that he wished to withdraw the two resolutions. Excomm at its subsequent meeting held on 9 May decided that the SGM was approved by the Annual General Meeting and as such, it should proceed.

Nevertheless, Section 7.7 of the IEM Bylaws provides that "The Council may at any time call a Special General Meeting of Corporate Members for a specific purpose relating to the direction and management of the concerns of The Institution."

Upon deliberation, Council agreed for the SGM to be held. The draft notice as well as papers accompanying the notice was circulated to Council accordingly.

The President informed that by the closing date for submitting comments with regard to the two resolutions on 2 September 2016, IEM received two responses:

YBhg. Tan Sri Ir. Dr Teo Chiang Kok While the Resolution calls to abide ("respect") the Minister's views, this resolution should have a Moratorium of, say 2 years? Otherwise, this is an open route for AG/

Ministry/BEM to delay eternally.

Ir.Jayaseelan Nadarajah

(F14445)

'3. Voting by Corporate Members present at the SGM with show of the coloured card given to them during registration on Resolution 1'.

This is to avoid any ambiguity that may arise between Corporate and other categories

of membership.

The President tabled Resolution 1 and invited comments from the floor. A time frame of 30 minutes would be given before the SGM would be called to cast their votes.





1.3 Matters Discussed

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) asked for the names of the Proposer and Seconder of both Resolutions, and commented they should come forward to explain the reason for the Resolutions.

The President informed that the Proposer was Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898), with Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) as his Seconder. He reiterated that the two resolutions were received at the 56th AGM held on 16th April 2016, as a result of which the SGM was called. However an email was received from the Proposer informing that he now wished to withdraw the two resolutions.

The Excomm and Council upon deliberation decided that the SGM should be convened as directed by the AGM. This is because once the Resolution was passed by a vote in AGM; it will no longer be under the control of the Proposer. Hence the Resolution needs to be tabled in the SGM notwithstanding the fact that neither Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa nor Ir. Ung Ah Hock were there to present their case.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) expressed that there is no point in proceeding with the voting as both the Proposer and Seconder were not present, unless Council had agreed to take ownership of the Resolutions.

The President reiterated that the AGM had indeed taken ownership of the Resolutions and consequently Council had dutifully carried out the instructions of the AGM to convene the SGM, as governed by the IEM Constitution and Bylaws.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) expressed that since the proponent had withdrawn the resolution, there was no point for the SGM to proceed with voting. Nevertheless he felt that the SGM could proceed with a normal discussion. He also queried why it took too long a time in calling the SGM given that the Resolutions were withdrawn in May 2016. He also felt that the Proposer and Seconder ought to be present to present their case.

In reply to the comments, the President referred to Clause 7.8 under Special General Meeting on page 30 of the IEM Bylaws which reads:

Special General Meeting

7.8 The notice for the Special General Meeting shall be circulated to the Corporate Membership at least twenty-one (21) days before such meeting. Such notice shall specify the general nature of the matters to be brought before and the resolutions (if any) to be moved at such meeting and none other than that business shall be transacted at that meeting.

The President stated that once the machinery was moved i.e. the SGM was called for, it must be convened according to requirement stated in the IEM Constitution and Bylaws. He further stated that members who disagree with the Resolutions are welcome to vote "Against".

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691)) agreed with the interpretation by the President. He explained that there was an administrative issue at the AGM as the Secretary had failed to circulate the resolutions to the members beforehand. Hence for the sake of the members at large, the best way was to convene the SGM to discuss and vote on both resolutions tabled by Ir. Gary Lim.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) supports the view of Y.Bhg Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) for the SGM to proceed, given that there is no provision for the Resolutions to be withdrawn.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) reiterated his view that there was no point for the SGM to proceed with voting as the proponent had withdrawn the resolutions. He suggested for the SGM to proceed with a normal discussion instead.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) supported Y.Bhg Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon's (Hon.F00015) view. He also felt that no member should raise a Resolution only to retract it later, thus incurring cost of time and money. He expressed that action should be taken against such member under the Code of Conduct.

Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690) informed that prior to receiving his Professional Engineer status he had written several articles for the Jurutera Bulletin. Although he had not used the title "Engr." in submitting his articles then, the title "Engr." was used in the published Jurutera. In April this year he received a letter from the Board of Engineers Malaysia reproving him for "contravening the Registration of Engineers Act 1967 (revised 2015)" by using the title "Engr.". He expressed his disappointment that IEM was unable to assist him with the letter citing that his matter with BEM was on personal basis. For that reason, he hoped that the voting process would continue so that moving forward other engineers will not have to face similar hardships.

2.0 RESOLUTION NO. 1

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) hoped that the SGM will not confuse the issue in that Resolution No 1 called for firstly:

"Excomm and Council of IEM to abide by the directive from Board of Engineers, Malaysia not to use Engr."

and secondly:

"Not to take legal proceedings to challenge the Board of Engineers, Malaysia's directive on the use of Engr."





He stated that as far as he could recall, BEM had never given a directive for IEM not to use the title "Engr.", and the use of the title is by the individual and not IEM. As there is no such directive, the SGM should vote against Resolution No. 1 as it is on a matter which does not exist.

Ir. Loo Wen Siang (M05655) expressed that the members must be informed on the potential cost of the legal proceedings which he heard could reach RM500,000. He cautioned that the Institution need to be mindful of the cost bearing in mind that IEM still owes a substantial amount to the Bank.

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) stated that IEM needed to recognise its members' concern about the cost should IEM decide to pursue with legal proceedings against BEM. Thus IEM Council needed to think very carefully before taking on the legal challenge. Nevertheless, even though members were to vote against Resolution No. 1, it would not automatically entail that IEM would undertake legal proceedings against BEM, as Council would first need to deliberate on the issues and take responsibility when proposing the next course of action with regard to the potential cost involved.

Deputy President Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) was of the opinion that the legal proceedings would probably entail a High Court judicial review. He informed of a case where a Judicial review was held against a Bar Council decision where the High Court decided based on four elements namely "illegality", "irrationality", "procedural impropriety" and "proportionality".

With regard to IEM, he was of the opinion that the probable cost to undertake the legal proceedings would be less than RM100,000, thus the figure of RM500,000 quoted by the member was untrue. He strongly felt that justice must be sought for the Graduate Members, and asked members not to forget that of the total membership of IEM, more than half are Graduate Members, and thus IEM should fight for their right to use the title "Engr.".

Ir. Prof. Dr Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin (F20286) expressed that although BEM had not directly sent the instruction to IEM not to use the title "Engr." as the letters were directed to individuals and universities; it does not mean that IEM should use the title "Engr.".

Ir. Lalchand A/L Gulabrai (M17881) felt that the question of cost should not be the binding factor. If legislative and professional requirements warrant it, cost could be a secondary issue. As a regulator BEM has given a directive to the Universities to which they have complied, as otherwise they would be taken to task. He felt that it was unfortunate that in IEM's documents, the title "Engr." was used although the authors themselves may not have necessarily used it.

He further stated that the SGM should deliberate and vote on the Resolutions as directed by the AGM notwithstanding the fact that the Resolutions have been withdrawn by the Proposer, so as to observe the due process.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) informed the meeting that Ir. Oon Chee Kheng, an IEM member and practicing lawyer had agreed to take up the legal case for IEM free of charge.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) was of the opinion that IEM should not stinge on the legal costs as its reputation is at stake. He expressed that the repercussions on IEM could be great if members decide to sue IEM as they are not able to use the title "Engr.". He also stated that IEM should engage the right lawyer to handle the case.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828) stated that should the SGM vote for Resolution No. 1, it would close any opportunity for IEM to fight for the right to use the title "Engr." via legal means even if there are grounds to do so. On the other hand if the SGM voted against Resolution No. 1, it does not necessarily mean that legal action would definitely be taken, as this would still be subject to the decision of the Council and AGM after due process is taken. Thus, members must not deny IEM the chance to contest for the right to use the title "Engr.".

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) felt that the SGM is "putting the cart before the horse" as IEM is still waiting for the Attorney-General's chambers to revert with their interpretation on the usage of "Engr.", which can swing either way in IEM's favour or not. Therefore it is too premature for the SGM to vote on whether to follow BEM's directive at this point of time. The problem arose because of the difference of interpretation by IEM and BEM which would need a third party to decide. He gave the examples of cases for mediation and arbitration.

Deputy President Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) explained that as BEM had given the directive as a public body, IEM would need to seek a decision of the High Court to quash the directive. This is done by applying for an originating summons (OS) for a judicial review. Hence the matter cannot be resolved through mediation or arbitration.

Dr. Wang Hong Kok (F02364) was of the opinion that since a quorum was already present, the SGM should proceed with voting as directed by the AGM.

Ir. Mah Way Sheng (M30694) introduced himself as a Past Chairman of the Young Engineers Section (YES) and informed that he was one of the many YES members who had previously received the warning letter from BEM. He stated that the majority of YES members believe that this matter could be resolved if IEM and BEM worked together to find a solution. He called for the SGM to vote wisely in the interest of the YES members, as the latter are themselves unable to vote on this matter even though this issue directly affects them. He stated that YES members are indeed proud to use the "Engr." and even carried the title on their namecards prior to BEM's directive.





Ir. Ragbir Singh Dhillon (M08217) stated that he was moved by what was stated by Ir. Mah Way Sheng (M30694) and Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690). The Corporate Members needed to deliver a strong message to uphold the "Engr." for the sake of the YES members who will eventually succeed them as professional engineers lest "they become lawyers or entrepreneurs" (sic) instead. He therefore proposed for the discussion to be concluded and for the SGM to proceed with voting.

Tuan Haji Ir. Mohd Ali Yusoff (01974) seconded the proposal for the SGM to proceed with voting.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) agreed with Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) that the matter is on the issue of interpretation. Thus, he urged that the SGM should vote against Resolution No.1. He readily volunteered to raise the funds to enable IEM to pursue with the legal proceedings if needed.

The President proceeded with the pre-voting closing remarks for Resolution No. 1. Among others he reminded the SGM that

- there are 105 Corporate Members present at the SGM, who would decide on the future of IEM and its 10,000 Graduate Members and their entitlement to use the Engr.
- if the SGM votes "Yes" to Resolution No.1, it would signify that IEM had conceded that it is in the wrong. As a professional and learned society, IEM should uphold the truth and not be subservient.
- 3. as the matter is on interpretation, who better to interpret on the usage of "Engr." but the Courts. IEM should not deny itself the right to pursue justice through the avenue of legal proceedings.
- 4. if IEM decided to go for legal proceedings, the legal costs would be paid via a fund which would be raised for that purpose as pledged by YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) and would not be paid using the members' subscriptions.

The SGM thereupon voted as follows:

Resolution No .1 was therefore rejected.

3.0 RESOLUTION NO. 2

The SGM proceeded to discuss Resolution No.2 – proposer: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)

"Excomm and Council of IEM proceed to wind-up IEM Academy Sdn Bhd"

Rationale for the Resolution:

- Because IEM Academy Sdn Bhd (IEMASB) is not seen to be generating any profit.

The President informed that the IEMASB is a business arm of IEM created as an alternative source of income as IEM could not depend solely on members' subscriptions to support institutional functions. This arrangement is similar to other overseas institutions such as the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE). He informed that IEMASB had been consistently earning over RM100,000 per annum. Further, the IEMASB was operated solely by volunteers assisted by one salaried staff.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) believed it would be ridiculous to wind up a company for not generating income in its first few years, as in any normal practice it would require some time to turn a company around to make a profit.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) enquired whether IEM Training Centre (IEMTC) still provided training to SME Corporation Malaysia whereby eligible companies could claim 70% of the registration fees as a rebate from SME Corporation Malaysia, as was stated in the Special General Meeting Paper No 2016-7-2. It was clarified that the arrangement with SME Corporation Malaysia may have lapsed but the statement was correct at the time of printing.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) further agreed with the statement by YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon. F00015) and expressed that there would be many opportunities for IEMASB to provide training. He also proposed for the appointment of a full-time salaried Business Development Manager for IEMASB.

Honorary Secretary Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05612) agreed with the views expressed by YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) and YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) that the Resolutions raised were a non-issue. He however reminded the SGM that IEM has the constitution to abide by and as the two Resolutions had already been raised, the IEM Council and AGM had responded accordingly by going through the democratic process. Therefore the IEM members attending the SGM should be proud that they were present to carry the process through.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828) stated that many members were unaware of the existence of the IEMASB and IEMTC as the business arms of IEM which could provide an avenue for members especially senior engineers to share their expertise with younger members by becoming lecturers at IEMASB and IEMTC.







YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) stated that from a business viewpoint it was not prudent to have two businesses that appear to compete against each other. However, Resolution No. 2 was not tabled for this reason but because IEMASB was not seen to be making a profit. He stated that if IEM proceeded to wind-up IEMASB, it would lose the accrued losses which are tax credit for future profits. Hence he was of the opinion that IEMASB should not be wound-up, as it would not be a good business decision.

Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086) informed that IEMASB was initially founded with the aspiration that it would attain the status of a university one day. Further, it would be illogical to expect a company to be making a profit in its early stages.

Ir. Prof. Dr Ruslan Hassan (F03541) clarified that IEMASB and IEMTC do not compete against each other but rather complement each other. IEMASB takes care of structured training such as competency and certification training programmes to professionals and sub-professionals in their respective areas in order to enable them to be registered to practice.

Ir. Ong Ching Loon (F11938) informed that IEMASB and IEMTC are distinct from each other as IEMTC organises conferences, seminars and courses whereas IEMASB would provide structured competency courses. However to obtain recognition and accreditation for the competency courses from the relevant organisations, the process would take some time. Therefore in its inception years IEMASB would have needed to conduct other types courses to generate income before embarking fully on the structured competency courses.

Deputy President Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) informed that besides the revenue from the courses, there was also revenue obtained from the web banner. He informed that a revenue of RM54,000 was generated for 2016 and this is expected to increase in future as the potential for web banner sales is currently still under-utilised. IEMASB is being run prudently at a cost of RM10,000 per month of which RM5,000 was set aside for staff overheads and RM5,000 for web portal rental. From a business point of view, it is worthwhile to keep IEMASB as it will plough in more revenue in the days to come.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) expressed that IEM should target IEMASB to become a university.

In reply to his enquiry, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) was informed that the composition of the Board of Directors for IEMTC and IEMASB differ.

Ir. Ellias Saidin (F10100) was of the opinion that in the long run it would be worthwhile to merge IEMTC and IEMASB into one entity.

Ir. Shahul Ikram bin Adnan (M10375) informed that as of February 2016, the Board of Engineers Malaysia has dispensed with the requirement for Graduate Engineers to compile 90 PDP points. This would be a setback to the IEMTC whereby there would be less demand for the courses. He also commented that should any of the companies be making a loss, they should not be wound up but be kept dormant. The IEM President replied that with the recent restructuring of the Board of Directors of IEMTC and IEMASB, both companies will be closely monitored so as to be more viable.

Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690) queried whether IEMASB is equipped to issue postgraduate degrees as stated in SGM Paper 2016-7-2. The President clarified that IEMASB would focus on them as part of its business plans. As a learned society with over 40,000 members, IEM has the potential strength that can be fully explored to embark on this vision.

Honorary Secretary Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05612) likened voting to wind-up IEMASB as "killing the goose that lays the golden egg" as there is tremendous potential in training as highlighted by Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828). He urged members who are interested to serve in the IEMTC and IEMASB to come forward, so as to make the organisations greater.

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) expressed that IEMASB could be in a twinning programme with other Universities at par with Sunway College, SEGI College, LimKokWing University or even better than them. However IEMASB has first to gear up towards this end in line with the vision of the founders when it was initially set up.

Deputy President Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) concurred with YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691). To address the comment by Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690) he stated that mandatory courses only account for 20% of the total revenue obtained by IEMTC. Therefore the impact from withdrawal of mandatory courses is quite negligible. However the profit margin from running training courses is tremendous, whereby the net profit is upwards of 30%.

Ir. Al-Khairi bin Mohd Daud (M14670) stated that most general members are unfamiliar with the workings of IEMASB and are thus unsure why it needed to be wound up. He also queried that since Resolution No 2 has already been withdrawn why would the SGM need to vote on it further. He urged that members be given more information about IEMASB so that they can better support it.

Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai (F18343) expressed that in light of the 100,000 engineering graduates being produced every year, IEMASB would need to focus on competency programmes for engineering graduates. Therefore he felt that IEMASB must not be wound up, on the contrary it must be upgraded so that it would eventually become a university.

Ir. Yap Soon Hoe (F04086) felt that IEMASB should not be wound up as IEM already has the facilities with Wisma IEM. He hoped that IEMASB would eventually become a university as what was envisioned by its founders.





The President gave a closing remark that by agreeing to wind-up IEMASB, members would be "killing the goose that lays the golden egg". He urged members to vote against Resolution No.2 as he is confident that IEMASB would turn around with a profit and eventually become a leading engineering college or university that members would be proud of.

The SGM thereupon voted as follows:

Resolution No .2 was therefore rejected.

4.0 OTHER MATTERS

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) recommended that in future if a person wished to put up a Resolution, he or she must have grounds to support his resolution, failing which it should be rejected by Council or AGM.

With reference to the remark by Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690) that IEM was unable to assist him with the letter from BEM, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) expressed strongly that IEM must stand behind all its Graduate Members that have used the "Engr." title.

5.0 ADJOURNMENT OF THE SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

The President declared the Special General Meeting adjourned at 11.40 a.m. and thanked the members for their presence as it showed a strong commitment to IEM as a whole.

AHLI-AHLI YANG HADIR - SEPERTI DI LAMPIRAN A

UCAPAN ALUAN OLEH YANG DI PERTUA 1.0

Yang DiPertua, Ir. Tan Yean Chin mengucapkan terima kasih dan mengalu-alukan ahli-ahli yang hadir di Mesyuarat Agung 1.1 Khas (MAK). Beliau kemudian memaklumkan bahawa tiga bilik yang berbeza telah digunakan untuk MAK iaitu Auditorium Tan Sri Prof Chin Fung Kee di Tingkat 3, yang akan menjadi bilik mesyuarat utama, Bilik Kuliah C & S / TUS di tingkat 2 dan akhir sekali di Auditorium Malakoff di tingkat bawah.

Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan bahawa persidangan video akan diadakan di kedua-dua bilik di tingkat bawah dan tingkat dua masing-masing (Auditorium Malakoff dan bilik Kuliah C & S / TUSTD)

MAK terus dimaklumkan bahawa kakitangan Sekretariat ditempatkan di setiap bilik untuk membantu ahli-ahli sepanjang masa MAK. Yang DiPertua kemudiannya meminta ahli-ahli untuk memberikan nama dan nombor keahlian semasa sesi soal jawab untuk tujuan rekod.

1.2 Latar belakang MAK

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan kepada MAK bahawa Majlis pada mesyuarat yang lepas telah membuat keputusan bahawa "IEM tidak akan menggunakan "Engr." sementara menunggu keputusan dari pihak Peguam Negara dan kemudian perbincangan akan diadakan tentang tindakan yang akan diambil seterusnya. Gelaran Engr. juga akan digugurkan dalam isu-isu terkini majalah Jurutera IEM. Di samping itu IEM akan mengeluarkan 'risalah' kepada semua ahli untuk memaklumkan mengenai keputusan untuk tidak menggunakan gelaran "Engr." Risalah tersebut telahpun dikeluarkan untuk maklumat ahliahli pada 7 April 2016.

MAK terus dimaklumkan bahawa dua resolusi seperti berikut telah dibentangkan pada Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-56 (MAT) yang diadakan pada 16 April 2016.

Resolusi No. 1 - pencadang: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)

"Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis IEM akan mematuhi arahan daripada Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia dengan tidak menggunakan Engr. dan tidak akan mengambil sebarang tindakan undang-undang untuk mencabar Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia atas arahan penggunaan Engr.

Resolusi No. 2 - pencadang: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)

"Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis IEM ambil tindakan untuk membubarkan IEM Academy Sdn Bhd"

MAT selepas perbincangan bersetuju bahawa Mesyuarat Agung Khas (MAK) akan dilangsungkan untuk membuat pengundian ke atas resolusi-resolusi tersebut. Pada mesyuaratnya selepas MAT, Jawatankuasa Kerja telah bersetuju bahawa MAK akan diadakan dalam tempoh tiga bulan dan menetapkan tarikh pada 19 Julai 2016.

Walaubagaimanapun pada 4 Mei 2016, Setiausaha Kehormat telah menerima e-mel dari pencadang resolusi memaklumkan bahawa beliau ingin menarik balik dua resolusi tersebut. Jawatankuasa Kerja pada mesyuarat berikutnya pada 9 Mei 2016 memutuskan bahawa MAK telah diluluskan oleh Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan, maka ia perlu diteruskan.

Walaubagaimanapun, Seksyen 7.7 Undang-Undang Kecil IEM memperuntukkan bahawa "Majlis boleh pada bila-bila masa menganjurkan Mesyuarat Agung Khas di kalangan ahli korporat untuk tujuan tertentu yang berkaitan dengan hala tuju dan pengurusan Institusi."

Setelah perbincangan dibuat, Majlis bersetuju untuk mengadakan MAK. Draf notis beserta kertas-kertas pembentangan telah diedarkan kepada Majlis untuk tindakan sewajarnya.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa sehingga tarikh tutup pada 2 September 2016, dua komen telah diterima berdasarkan maklumbalas terhadap dua resolusi tersebut:

(Dist.M13434)

YBhg. Tan Sri Ir. Dr Teo Chiang Kok Walaupun resolusi itu menyeru supaya mematuhi pandangan Menteri, resolusi tersebut harus mempunyai jangkamasa penangguhan, contohnya 2 tahun? Jika tidak, ini adalah satu peluang bagi Peguam Negara/ Kementerian/ BEM untuk melenggahkan isu ini selama-lamanya.

Ir. Jayaseelan Nadarajah (F14445)

Pengundian patut dilakukan oleh ahli Korporat yang hadir pada MAK dengan menunjukkan kad berwarna yang diberikan kepada mereka semasa pendaftaran bagi Resolusi 1.

Ini adalah untuk mengelakkan kekeliruan yang mungkin timbul antara kategori korporat dan lain-lain kategori.







Yang DiPertua kemudiannya membentangkan Resolusi 1 dan menjemput komen daripada ahli-ahli yang hadir. Tempoh masa 30 minit akan diberikan sebelum MAK memulakan pengundian.

1.3 Perkara-perkara yang dibincangkan

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) meminta nama-nama Pencadang dan Penyokong bagi kedua-dua Resolusi tersebut and mencadangkan bahawa mereka harus tampil untuk menjelaskan sebab-sebab Resolusi tersebut diutarakan.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa Pencadang adalah Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898), dengan Ir. Ung Ah Hock (M12218) sebagai Penyokong. Beliau mengulangi bahawa dua resolusi tersebut telah diterima pada Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-56 yang diadakan pada 16 April 2016 dan menyebabkan MAK diadakan. Walau bagaimanapun e-mel telah diterima daripada Pencadang memaklumkan bahawa beliau kini ingin menarik balik dua resolusi tersebut.

Bagaimanapun, Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis telah berbincang dan memutuskan bahawa MAK perlu diadakan seperti yang diarahkan oleh Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan. Ini adalah kerana apabila Resolusi itu telah diluluskan dengan undian dalam Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan; ia tidak lagi berada di bawah kawalan Pencadang. Oleh itu, Resolusi tersebut perlu dibentangkan di MAK walaupun pada hakikatnya Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa dan Ir. Ong Ah Hock tidak hadir untuk membentangkan kes tersebut.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) seterusnya menyatakan bahawa tiada makna untuk pengundian tersebut diteruskan memandangkan kedua-dua Pencadang dan Penyokong tidak hadir, melainkan jika Majlis telah bersetuju untuk mengambilalih milik Resolusi tersebut.

Yang DiPertua mengulangi bahawa MAT telah mengambilalih milik Resolusi tersebut dan seterusnya Majlis telah mengikut arahan MAT untuk mengadakan MAK, sebagaimana yang termaktub dalam Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang Kecil IEM.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) menyatakan bahawa memandangkan pencadang telah menarik balik resolusi tersebut, tidak ada gunanya untuk MAK meneruskan pengundian. Walau bagaimanapun beliau berpendapat bahawa MAK patut diteruskan dengan mengadakan sesi perbincangan yang biasa. Beliau juga mempersoalkan kenapa ia mengambil masa terlalu lama untuk MAK diadakan padahal Resolusi telah ditarik balik pada bulan Mei 2016. Beliau juga rasa bahawa Pencadang dan Penyokong patut hadir untuk membentangkan resolusi mereka.

Untuk menjawab komen-komen terebut, Yang DiPertua merujuk kepada Fasal 7.8 berkenaan Mesyuarat Agung Khas pada muka surat 30, Undang-Undang Kecil IEM yang menyatakan:

Mesyuarat Agung Khas (MAK)

7.8 Notis bagi Mesyuarat Agung Khas itu hendaklah diedarkan kepada Ahli Korporat sekurang-kurangnya dua puluh satu (21) hari sebelum mesyuarat tersebut. Notis itu hendaklah menyatakan secara am jenis perkara yang akan dibentangkan dan resolusi (jika ada) yang akan diusulkan pada mesyuarat itu dan urusan-urusan selain daripada itu tidak boleh dibincangkankan semasa mesyuarat tersebut.

Yang DiPertua menyatakan bahawa sebaik sahaja jentera penggerak telah bermula iaitu MAK telah dipanggil, ia mestilah diadakan mengikut ketetapan yang termaktub di dalam Undang-Undang Kecil IEM. Beliau juga menyatakan bahawa ahli-ahli yang tidak bersetuju dengan Resolusi tersebut dialu-alukan untuk memberikan undian "Menentang" usul itu.

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691)) bersetuju dengan tafsiran oleh Yang DiPertua. Beliau menjelaskan bahawa terdapat isu pentadbiran di Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan, di mana pihak Setiausaha telah gagal untuk mengedar resolusi kepada ahli-ahli terlebih dahulu sebelum MAT. Oleh itu, demi ahli-ahli Institusi, cara terbaik adalah untuk mengadakan MAK bagi membincangkan dan membuat undian ke atas kedua-dua resolusi yang dibentangkan oleh Ir. Gary Lim.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) menyokong pandangan YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) untuk MAK diteruskan, memandangkan tidak ada peruntukan bagi Resolusi yang telah ditarik balik.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) mengulangi pandangannya bahawa tidak ada gunanya untuk MAK dan undian diteruskan kerana pencadang telah menarik balik resolusi. Beliau mencadangkan supaya MAK diteruskan dengan perbincangan biasa.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) menyokong pandangan YBhg. Dato' Ir. (Hon.F00015) Pang Leong Hoon. Beliau juga berpendapat bahawa tidak perlu untuk membangkitkan Resolusi yang telah ditarik balik kerana ia akan menanggung kos, masa dan wang. Beliau menyatakan bahawa tindakan perlu diambil terhadap ahli tersebut mengikut Kod Etika IEM.







Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690) memaklumkan bahawa sebelum menerima status Jurutera Profesional, beliau telah menulis beberapa artikel untuk majalah Jurutera. Beliau menegaskan bahawa gelaran "Engr." tidak pernah digunakan dalam artikel-artikel tersebut tetapi pihak IEM telah menambahkan gelaran "Engr." tersebut pada nama beliau. Pada bulan April tahun ini, beliau telah menerima surat dari Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia menyatakan bahawa beliau telah "melanggar Akta Pendaftaran Jurutera 1967 (disemak 2015)" kerana mengguna gelaran "Engr.". Beliau juga melahirkan rasa kecewa kerana IEM tidak dapat membantunya dengan alasan bahawa ini adalah urusan peribadi beliau dengan pihak BEM. Atas sebab itu, beliau berharap proses pengundian diterus supaya di masa hadapan tidak ada lagi jurutera lain yang akan menghadapi kesukaran yang sama.

2.0 RESOLUSI NO. 1

YBhg. Dato 'Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) berharap MAK tidak akan terkeliru dengan isu dalam Resolusi No. 1 iaitu :

"Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis IEM akan mematuhi arahan daripada Lembaga Jurutera, Malaysia untuk tidak menggunakan Engr."

dan yang kedua:

"Tidak akan mengambil tindakan undang-undang untuk mencabar Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia mengenai penggunaan Engr."

Beliau menyatakan bahawa setakat mana yang beliau ingat, BEM tidak pernah memberikan arahan untuk IEM tidak menggunakan gelaran "Engr." dan penggunaan gelaran tersebut adalah oleh individu dan bukan IEM. Oleh kerana tiada arahan tersebut, MAK perlu mengundi menentang Resolusi No. 1 kerana ia adalah perkara yang tidak wujud.

Ir. Loo Wen Siang (M05655) menyatakan bahawa ahli-ahli perlu diberi penjelasan tentang kos prosiding undang-undang yang beliau mendapat tahu mungkin mencecah RM500,000. Beliau mengingatkan bahawa Institusi perlu menanggung kos tersebut dalam masa di mana IEM masih mempunyai hutang sejumlah yang besar kepada bank.

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) menyatakan bahawa IEM perlu memahami kebimbangan ahli-ahli tentang kos yang perlu ditanggung sebelum membuat keputusan untuk meneruskan dengan prosiding undang-undang terhadap BEM. Oleh itu, Majlis IEM perlu berfikir dengan berhati-hati sebelum mengambil tindakan undang-undang. Walaupun ahli-ahli telah mengundi menentang Resolusi No. 1, ia tidak bermakna secara automatik yang IEM akan meneruskan dengan prosiding undang-undang terhadap BEM, kerana Majlis perlu mengupas dengan lebih mendalam tentang isu ini serta tanggungjawab yang dipikul dengan mengambil kira kos yang mungkin terlibat.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) berpendapat bahawa prosiding undang-undang yang mungkin akan melibatkan semakan kehakiman Mahkamah Tinggi. Beliau memaklumkan mengenai kes di mana semakan kehakiman telah diadakan terhadap keputusan Majlis Peguam di mana Mahkamah Tinggi memutuskan berdasarkan empat elemen iaitu "menyalahi undang-undang", "tidak rasional", "kejanggalan" dan "kekadaran".

Beliau berpendapat bahawa anggaran kos yang terbabit untuk mengambil tindakan undang-undang adalah kurang daripada RM100,000, oleh itu, jumlah RM500,000 yang dinyatakan oleh ahli tersebut adalah tidak tepat. Beliau merasakan bahawa keadilan mesti didapatkan bagi pihak ahli-ahli siswazah, dan beliau mengingatkan semua ahli bahawa lebih daripada separuh ahli IEM adalah ahli siswazah, dan dengan itu IEM perlu berjuang untuk mendapat hak mereka untuk menggunakan gelaran "Engr." .

Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin (F20286) menyatakan bahawa walaupun BEM hanya menghantar arahan melarang penggunaan "Engr." kepada individu serta universiti dan bukan kepada IEM tidak bermakna yang IEM boleh menggunakan gelaran "Engr.".

Ir. Lalchand A / L Gulabrai (M17881) berpendapat bahawa persoalan kos tidak harus menjadi faktor pengikat. Jika peruntukan perundangan dan profesional sememangnya diperlukan, kos yang terbabit bukanlah isu utama. Sebagai pengawal selia, BEM telah memberikan arahan kepada universiti-universiti yang perlu dipatuhi, supaya tidak dikenakan tindakan. Beliau berpendapat bahawa malangnya gelaran "Engr." telah digunapakai dalam dokumen-dokumen IEM walaupun pengarang itu sendiri tidak menggunakannya.

Beliau juga menyatakan bahawa MAK perlu membincangkan dan mengundi Resolusi seperti yang diarahkan oleh MAT walaupun pada hakikatnya Resolusi tersebut telah ditarik balik oleh Pencadang, demi meneruskan proses yang ditetapkan.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) memaklumkan kepada mesyuarat bahawa Ir. Oon Kheng Chee, seorang peguam yang juga ahli IEM telah bersetuju untuk mengambil kes undang-undang bagi pihak IEM secara percuma.





YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) bagaimanapun berpendapat bahawa IEM tidak patut terlalu berkira tentang kos guaman kerana ini adalah berkenaan reputasi IEM. Beliau berpendapat bahawa isu ini boleh membawa kesan yang amat besar kepada IEM sekiranya para ahli memutuskan untuk menyaman IEM kerana mereka tidak dapat menggunakan gelaran "Engr.". Beliau juga menyatakan bahawa IEM perlu melantik seorang peguam yang wajar bagi mengendalikan kes itu.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828) menyatakan bahawa jika MAK mengundi untuk menyokong Resolusi No. 1, ia akan menutup sebarang peluang bagi IEM untuk berjuang menuntut hak menggunakan gelaran "Engr." melalui cara undang-undang walaupun terdapat alasan yang baik untuk berbuat demikian. Sebaliknya jika MAT mengundi menentang Resolusi No. 1, ia tidak bermakna bahawa tindakan undang-undang pasti diambil, kerana ini masih tertakluk kepada keputusan Majlis dan Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan selepas proses diambil. Oleh itu, ahli-ahli tidak harus menafikan peluang IEM untuk berjuang bagi hak penggunaan gelaran "Engr."

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) merasakan bahawa tindakan MAK adalah seperti "dulu bajak daripada jawi" kerana IEM masih menunggu taksiran Pejabat Peguam Negara mengenai penggunaan "Engr." yang mungkin juga memihak kepada IEM atau sebaliknya. Oleh itu, adalah terlalu awal untuk MAK membuat pengundian sama ada patut menurut arahan BEM buat masa ini. Beliau menyatakan bahawa masalah timbul kerana perbezaan tafsiran oleh IEM dan BEM yang akan memerlukan pihak ketiga untuk membuat keputusan contohnya kes-kes pengantaraan dan timbangtara.

Timbalan Yang DiPertu,a Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) menjelaskan bahawa pihak BEM telah memberi arahan sebagai sebuah badan awam, oleh itu, IEM perlu mendapatkan keputusan Mahkamah Tinggi untuk membatalkan arahan tersebut. Ini boleh dilakukan dengan memohon saman pemula (OS) bagi semakan kehakiman. Oleh sebab itu, perkara ini tidak boleh diselesaikan melalui mediasi atau penimbangtaraan.

Dr. Wang Hong Kok (F02364) berpendapat, bahawa memandangkan kuorum sudah mencukupi, MAK perlu meneruskan dengan pengundian seperti yang diarahkan oleh Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan.

Ir. Mah Way Sheng (M30694) memperkenalkan dirinya sebagai Bekas Pengerusi Seksyen Jurutera Muda (YES) dan memaklumkan bahawa dia adalah salah seorang daripada ramai ahli YES yang sebelum ini telah menerima surat amaran daripada BEM. Beliau menyatakan bahawa majoriti ahli YES percaya perkara ini boleh diselesaikan jika IEM dan BEM bekerja bersama-sama untuk mencari penyelesaian. Beliau menyeru supaya MAK mengundi dengan bijaksana demi kepentingan ahli-ahli YES, disebabkan mereka tidak ada hak mengundi mengenai perkara ini walaupun isu ini secara langsung memberi kesan kepada mereka. Beliau menyatakan bahawa ahli-ahli YES amat berbangga untuk menggunakan gelaran "Engr." dan juga membawa gelaran pada kad nama mereka sebelum menerima arahan BEM.

Ir. Ragbir Singh Dhillon (M08217) menyatakan bahawa beliau tersentuh dengan pernyataan oleh Ir. Mah Way Sheng (M30694) dan Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690). Ahli-ahli korporat perlu menyampaikan mesej yang kuat untuk menegakkan gelaran "Engr." demi ahli YES yang akhirnya akan berjaya sebagai seorang jurutera profesional supaya jangan nanti "mereka menjadi peguam atau usahawan". Oleh itu, beliau mencadangkan supaya kesimpulan dibuat untuk MAK meneruskan pengundian.

Tuan Haji Ir. Mohd Ali Yusoff (01974) mengesahkan cadangan untuk MAK meneruskan pengundian.

YBhg Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) bersetuju dengan pandangan Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) bahawa perkara ini adalah mengenai isu tafsiran. Oleh itu, beliau menggesa bahawa MAK perlu mengundi menentang Resolusi No.1. Beliau sedia menawarkan diri untuk mengumpul dana bagi membolehkan IEM meneruskan dengan tindakan undang-undang jika perlu.

Yang DiPertua meneruskan dengan ucapan penutup untuk pengundian ke atas Resolusi No. 1. Antara lain, beliau mengingatkan MAK adalah:-

- terdapat 105 ahli-ahli korporat yang hadir di MAK, yang akan membuat keputusan mengenai masa depan 10,000 ahliahli siswazah IEM dan hak mereka untuk menggunakan Engr.
- 2. jika MAK mengundi "Ya" kepada Resolusi No.1, ia akan menandakan bahawa IEM telah mengaku bersalah. Sebagai persatuan profesional dan terpelajar, IEM perlu menegakkan kebenaran dan tidak tunduk kepada arahan.
- kerana isu tersebut adalah sekadar tafsiran tentang penggunaan "Engr" dari Mahkamah. IEM tidak boleh menafikan hak sendiri untuk meneruskan keadilan melalui saluran prosiding undang-undang.
- 4. jika IEM membuat keputusan untuk menggunakan saluran prosiding perundangan, kos guaman akan dibayar melalui dana yang telah dijanjikan oleh YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (Hon.F03975) dan tidak akan dibayar menggunakan kutipan yuran tahunan ahli.

MAK dengan itu telah mengundi seperti berikut:

Dengan keputusan tersebut, Resolusi No 1. telah ditolak oleh MAK.





3.0 RESOLUSI NO. 2

MAK diteruskan dengan perbincangan berkenaan Resolusi No.2 - pencadang: Ir. Gary Lim Eng Hwa (F08898)

"Jawatankuasa Kerja dan Majlis IEM ambil tindakan untuk menamatkan IEM Academy Sdn Bhd"

Rasional untuk Resolusi:

- Kerana keupayaan IEM Academy Sdn Bhd (IEMASB) untuk meraih keuntungan tidak dapat dilihat.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa IEMASB adalah cabang perniagaan IEM yang ditubuhkan sebagai sumber pendapatan alternatif supaya IEM tidak terlalu bergantung semata-mata kepada yuran ahli bagi membiayai fungsi institusi. Perkara yang sama juga telah dilakukan oleh institusi-institusi luar negara yang lain seperti Institusi Jurutera Elektrik dan Elektronik (IEEE) dan Institusi Jurutera Awam (ICE). Beliau memaklumkan bahawa IEMASB secara konsisten telah memperolehi pendapatan sebanyak RM100,000 setahun dengan operasi yang bergantung kepada bantuan secara sukarela oleh sebilangan ahli IEM bersama dengan hanya seorang kakitangan bergaji. Walaupun buat masa ini, IEMASB tidak dapat menjana keuntungan, penamatan operasi syarikat itu akan menutup peluang menjana pendapatan pada masa akan datang.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) berpendapat bahawa penutupan sesebuah syarikat kerana tidak menjana pendapatan dalam beberapa tahun pertama penubuhannya adalah tidak wajar. Dia menegaskan bahawa seperti dalam mana-mana amalan biasa, syarikat itu memerlukan sedikit masa untuk meraih keuntungan.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) bertanya sama ada Pusat Latihan IEM (IEMTC) masih menyediakan latihan kepada SME Corporation Malaysia di mana syarikat yang layak boleh menuntut 70% daripada yuran pendaftaran sebagai rebat daripada SME Corporation Malaysia, sebagaimana yang telah dinyatakan di dalam Mesyuarat Agung Khas kertas No. 2016/07/02. Penjelasan diberi bahawa perjanjian dengan SME Corporation Malaysia mungkin telah luput tetapi kenyataan itu adalah betul pada masa kertas tersebut dicetak.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) juga bersetuju dengan komen dari YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon. F00015) bahawa akan terdapat banyak peluang untuk IEMASB menjalankan latihan. Beliau juga mencadangkan supaya seorang Pengurus Pembangunan Perniagaan sepenuh masa dan bergaji dilantik untuk IEMASB.

Setiausaha Kehormat Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05612) bersetuju dengan pandangan yang dinyatakan oleh YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) dan YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) bahawa Resolusi yang dibangkitkan bukan lagi satu isu. Beliau bagaimanapun mengingatkan MAK yang IEM mempunyai perlembagaan untuk dipatuhi dan dua Resolusi telah pun dibangkitkan yang mana pihak Majlis IEM dan MAT telah memberi maklum balas sewajarnya melalui proses demokrasi. Oleh itu, ahli-ahli IEM yang menghadiri MAK harus berbangga kerana mereka datang untuk menyertai proses tersebut.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828) menyatakan bahawa ramai ahli tidak menyedari kewujudan IEMASB dan IEMTC sebagai cabang perniagaan IEM yang boleh memberi peluang kepada ahli jurutera yang berpengalaman terutamanya untuk berkongsi kepakaran mereka dengan ahli-ahli yang lebih muda sebagai pensyarah di IEMASB dan IEMTC.

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) menyatakan bahawa dari sudut pandangan perniagaan adalah tidak bijak untuk memiliki dua buah perniagaan yang bersaing antara satu sama lain. Bagaimanapun, Resolusi No. 2 dibentangkan kerana keupayaan IEMASB meraih keuntungan tidak dapat dilihat dan bukannya disebabkan persaingan antara dua perniagaan yang dimiliki oleh IEM. Beliau menyatakan bahawa jika IEM terus menamatkan IEMASB, ia akan kehilangan kerugian terakru dari kredit cukai bagi keuntungan masa depan. Oleh itu beliau berpendapat bahawa IEMASB tidak patut ditamatkan kerana itu bukanlah keputusan perniagaan yang bijak.

Ir. Yap Hoon Hoe (F04086) memaklumkan bahawa IEMASB pada mulanya ditubuhkan dengan hasrat untuk mencapai status sebagai sebuah universiti satu hari nanti. Oleh itu, adalah tidak logik untuk menjangkakan syarikat ini akan mendapat keuntungan pada peringkat awal penubuhannya.

Ir. Prof. Dr Ruslan Hassan (F03541) menjelaskan bahawa IEMASB dan IEMTC tidak bersaing antara satu sama lain tetapi saling melengkapi. IEMASB sepatutnya menjalankan latihan berstruktur seperti program kecekapan dan latihan pensijilan kepada profesional dan sub-profesional dalam bidang masing-masing bagi membolehkan mereka mendaftar untuk pengamalan.

Ir. Ong Ching Loon (F11938) memaklumkan bahawa IEMASB dan IEMTC adalah berbeza antara satu sama lain kerana IEMTC menganjurkan persidangan, seminar dan kursus manakala IEMASB akan menyediakan kursus kemahiran berstruktur. Walau bagaimanapun untuk mendapatkan pengiktirafan dan akreditasi bagi kursus kompetensi dari organisasi yang berkaitan, proses ini akan mengambil sedikit masa. Oleh itu pada awal penubuhannya, IEMASB perlu menjalankan kursus jenis lain untuk menjana pendapatan sebelum memulakan sepenuhnya kursus kecekapan berstruktur.





Timbalan Yang DiPertua Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) memaklumkan bahawa selain hasil perolehan daripada kursus yang dikendalikan, terdapat juga hasil yang diperolehi daripada iklan laman web. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa pendapatan sebanyak RM54,000 telah diperolehi untuk tahun 2016 dan ini dijangka meningkat pada masa akan datang kerana potensi untuk jualan iklan laman web kini masih kurang digunakan. IEMASB telah diuruskan secara berhemah dengan kos sebanyak RM10,000 sebulan di mana RM5,000 diperuntukkan untuk perbelanjaan kakitangan dan RM5,000 untuk sewa laman web. Dari sudut pandangan perniagaan, ia adalah berbaloi untuk mengekalkan IEMASB kerana ia akan memberi lebih banyak keuntungan pada masa akan datang.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (Hon.F00015) menyatakan bahawa IEM perlu berusaha ke arah menjadikan IEMASB sebuah universiti.

Sebagai jawapan kepada pertanyaan dari YBhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276), MAK dimaklumkan bahawa komposisi Lembaga Pengarah untuk IEMTC dan IEMASB adalah berbeza.

- Ir. Ellias Saidin (F10100) berpendapat bahawa dalam jangka panjang adalah berbaloi jika IEMTC dan IEMASB bergabung menjadi satu entiti.
- Ir. Shahul Ikram bin Adnan (M10375) memaklumkan bahawa sehingga Februari 2016 Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia telah mengenepikan keperluan untuk Jurutera Siswazah mengutip 90 jam PDP. Ini akan menjadi halangan kepada IEMTC untuk mendapat penyertaan kursus. Beliau juga mengulas bahawa kebiasaannya jika sesebuah syarikat mengalami kerugian, ianya tidak akan ditamatkan tetapi akan disimpan sebagai tidak aktif. Yang DiPertua IEM menjawab bahawa dengan penstrukturan semula Lembaga Pengarah IEMTC dan IEMASB baru-baru ini, kedua-dua syarikat akan dipantau dengan rapi supaya menjadi lebih berdaya maju.
- Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690) menyoal sama ada IEMASB dilengkapi untuk mengeluarkan ijazah lanjutan seperti yang dinyatakan dalam Kertas MAK 2016/07/02. Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa IEMASB akan memberi tumpuan kepada perkara ini sebagai sebahagian daripada rancangan perniagaannya. Sebagai institusi terpelajar yang disertai oleh lebih 40,000 orang ahli, IEM mempunyai kekuatan potensi yang boleh diterokai sepenuhnya untuk melaksanakan visi ini.

Setiausaha Kehormat Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05612) menyamakan pengundian untuk menamatkan IEMASB sebagai "membunuh angsa yang menetaskan telur emas" kerana terdapat potensi yang amat besar dalam latihan seperti yang dinyatakan oleh Ir. Choo Kok Beng (Hon.F02828). Beliau menggesa ahli-ahli yang berminat untuk berkhidmat dalam IEMTC dan IEMASB untuk tampil ke hadapan, untuk menjadikan organisasi itu lebih hebat.

YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691) menyarankan bahawa IEMASB boleh menawarkan program berkembar dengan universiti lain setanding dengan Sunway College, Kolej SEGI, Universiti Lim Kok Wing atau lebih baik daripada mereka. Walau bagaimanapun IEMASB perlu bersedia ke arah ini selaras dengan wawasan pengasas yang menubuhkannya.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi (F09917) bersetuju dengan YBhg. Dato' Paduka Ir. Prof (Dr) Hj. Keizrul bin Abdullah (Hon.F01691). Sebagai menjawab komen dari Ir. Fadhli Shazlan bin Abdul Rahman (M58690), beliau menyatakan bahawa kursus mandatori BEM hanya menyumbangkan 20% daripada jumlah pendapatan yang diperolehi oleh IEMTC. - Ir. Al-Khairi bin Mohd Daud (M14670) menyatakan bahawa kebanyakan ahli umum tidak biasa dengan cara kerja IEMASB dan dengan itu tidak pasti mengapa ia perlu ditamatkan. Beliau juga bertanyakan mengapa MAK perlu membuat pengundian memandangkan Resolusi No. 2 telah ditarik balik. Beliau menggesa ahli-ahli diberi penerangan yang lebih lanjut mengenai IEMASB supaya mereka boleh menberi sokongan yang baik.
- Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai (F18343) menyatakan bahawa berdasarkan daripada 100,000 graduan kejuruteraan yang dihasilkan dari university setiap tahun, IEMASB perlu memberi tumpuan kepada program kecekapan bagi graduan kejuruteraan. Oleh itu, beliau berpendapat bahawa IEMASB tidak harus ditamatkan, sebaliknya ia perlu dipertingkatkan supaya akhirnya akan menjadi sebuah universiti.
- Ir. Yap Hoon Hoe (F04086) merasakan bahawa IEMASB tidak patut ditamatkan kerana IEM telahpun mempunyai kemudahan di Wisma IEM. Beliau berharap IEMASB akhirnya akan menjadi sebuah universiti seperti apa yang dibayangkan oleh pengasasnya.

Yang DiPertua memberi kenyataan menutup bahawa dengan penamatan IEMASB, ahli-ahli akan "membunuh angsa yang menetaskan telur emas". Beliau menggesa ahli-ahli untuk mengundi menentang Resolusi No.2 kerana beliau yakin IEMASB akan pulih dengan keuntungan dan akhirnya menjadi sebuah kolej kejuruteraan terkemuka atau universiti yang menjadi kebanggaan ahli-ahli.



3 THE COUNCIL AND THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 3.1 Five Council and thirteen monthly Executive Committee (Excomm) meetings were held during the session to look into the management of the properties and affairs of the Institution.
- 3.2 I wish to thank all members of the Council, Executive Committee, Standing Committees, Technical Divisions, Sub Committees, Ad Hoc Committees and other Committees for their participation, contribution and support in the activities of the institution in the furtherance of its objective to promote the science and profession of engineering in the spirit of a learned society.
- 3.3 I must also express a vote of thanks to the various members who may not have served on the above Committees, but voluntarily served as IEM representatives to the various government bodies and organisations.

4 STANDING COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

4.1 The role of the Standing Committee chaired by the Deputy President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi is to conduct the financial management of the properties and affairs of the IEM. Regular meetings were held every 3rd Saturday of the month.

4.2 Main Sources of Income

4.2.1 Annual Subscription

Financing of the operating expenditure of the Institution continue to depend largely on the collection of members' annual subscriptions. However for the year 2016, income from annual subscriptions dropped to 59.7% of the total income compared to 68% in 2015.

In accordance with the Bylaws, reminders to members on their annual subscription payments were sent out by the Institution. For the year 2016, 90% of the members had settled their subscriptions by the end of the year. IEM wish to thank all members who had promptly settled their subscriptions.

As at the end of the financial year 2016, 3,041 members are in arrears of subscription for 2016. The total outstanding collection for the year amounted to RM341,989. IEM would like to appeal to these members to settle the arrears as soon as possible.

4.2.2 Rental

Maktab Koperasi Malaysia continues to rent 80% of Wisma IEM with rental of RM98,010 per month. The tenancy is due to expire in July 2017. The rental income derived is used to finance the term loan taken for the purchase of the building. The ground floor of Bangunan Ingenieur is rented out to Pizza Hut at a monthly rental of RM 16,907. Pizza Hut's tenancy was renewed in November 2016 for another three years.





4.2.3 Activities Income

The IEM Technical Divisions organised numerous activities such as courses, seminars, workshops etc for the benefit for members' professional development as well as generate some income for the Institution. Income generated contributes to the improvement of facilities as well as services of the Institution. In 2016, three major events were organized which had contributed tremendously to the improved performance of the Institution in 2016. The three events were the Southeast Asia Geotechnical Conference, the 15th Asian Congress of Fluid Mechanics and the DSM-IEM Electrotechnical Symposium.

4.3 Administrative Expenses

In order to control expenses and at the same time, provide adequate services to members, the Standing Committee implements strict but effective budgetary control measures. Various costs saving measures were implemented to ensure that operating costs are controlled within the available funds of the Institution.

4.4 Sub Committee on Human Resources

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Yam Teong Sian looked into the recruitment and deployment of staff for the Secretariat. Meetings were regularly held to deal with matters relating to Human Resource of Secretariat. As at 31 December 2016, the Secretariat's staff strength is 40 the same strength for the last two years.

4.5 Sub Committee on IEM Infrastructure

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Treasurer, Dr. Wang Hong Kok continued to monitor the maintenance and renovation of Bangunan Ingenieur and Wisma IEM. The function of the Sub Committee also covered managing the usage of the meeting rooms, security system of IEM, fire protection, electrical installations, ICT computerisation and network, general facilities, etc. The Sub Committee is currently looking into improving the facilities at Wisma IEM in terms of available space and conduciveness for IEM activities.

The upgrading of the Bangunan Ingenieur exterior will be completed in the first quarter of 2017 with the exterior of the building being repainted and the front entrance upgraded to enhance the image of the Institution.

5 STANDING COMMITTEE ON ADMISSIONS AND PRACTICAL TRAINING

- 5.1 The new Chairperson for the Standing Committee, Ir. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Norlida binti Buniyamin continued the Standing Committee's role in scrutinising applications for candidates applying for election/admission/transfer to the various grades of membership. This Standing Committee also worked closely with the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualifications in organising talks on Route to MIEM/PE as well as career talks.

5.3 Sub-Committee on Membership Applications Board (MAB)

The Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Pan Wang Fook continued its role of vetting and assessing the applications for the various grades of membership of the Institution.







5.3.1 Processing of AER, AAE and IPEA/APEC International Engineer Register Applications

The Membership Applications Board's role was to also vet applications from the members for the IPEA/APEC International Registers, ASEAN Engineer and Associate ASEAN Engineer. The following is the breakdown of applications for these Registers:

- 26 approved for International Engineer (IPEA/APEC)
- · 39 approved for ASEAN Engineer (AE)
- 74 approved for Associate ASEAN Engineer (AAE)

5.4 Sub-Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions

Ir. Fam Yew Hin was appointed as the new Chairman for the Sub Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions for the session. The Sub Committee had conducted membership drive talks/events at various international and local engineering related organizations, Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) as well as government agencies. Two organizations namely MMC and Brunsfield have entered into Organisation Partnership Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with IEM. Several other reputable companies are currently in advanced discussions to establish the same arrangement. The objective of such partnership is to provide an effective platform for IEM and its partners to collaborate and contribute constructively to the advancement of the engineering society. In addition, such partnership will also assist IEM in its membership drive and towards achieving its 100K members target by 2020.

The Technical Divisions and the IEM Branches had also contributed towards the success of the membership drive events by organizing talks and other activities. Approximately 90 membership drive events/talks were conducted for 2016.

The Sub Committee had a brainstorming session together with the "Train the Speakers" programme in July 2016. The objective of the brainstorming session was to establish an effective plan to increase the Institution's membership. Among others, this would include promoting Organisation partnership, encouraging more technologists and technicians to join as Incorporated and Associate Members respectively, collaborating with other sub-committees and technical divisions in establishing more activities that benefits the members at large. In addition, the Sub Committee also came up with a standard presentation material for the speakers to present membership drive talks.

5.5 Sub Committee on IEM Log Book Training Scheme

The responsibility of the Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Prof. Dr. Wong Hin Yong was to review and confirm that the work and practical experience training progress as annually submitted by the Graduate Members (mentee) and to ensure the reports had been in conformance to the requirement and guidelines of the IEM's Log Book Training Scheme. A total of 211 log books were reviewed and confirmed in year 2016.

The Sub Committee had organized two workshops for Mentors which was held in March 2016 and November 2016. The workshop for Mentees was held in May 2016.

The Sub Committee had also organized a workshop for the IEM Branches. The workshop was held together with the 2nd Mentors Workshop at IEM HQ on 5 November 2016. A total of nine representatives from the Branches attended the workshop.

This idea on 'train the trainer' would be more effective as the invited representative could train the members at their Branches to be Mentors.

5.6 **IEM Training Board**

The IEM Training Board chaired by Ir. Li Thang Fai continued to deal mainly on the approval of the training programmes in relation to the requirement of BEM's Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for Professional Engineers and Professional Development Programme (PDP) for Graduate Engineers.

The main task of the Training Board is to evaluate the training programmes organised by IEM's various Committees and Branches. In addition, the Training Board was also responsible for the approval of CPD hours for other training providers. Apart from assessing the submission of the training programmes, the Training Board also conducted audits on the selected programmes for verifying conformity.

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5.7 Special Committee on Structured Training

The Special Committee on Structured Training chaired by Ir. Mohd. Radzi Salleh had started the first Structured Training programme under the Search Committee for the Electrical Engineering discipline. The first 24-Day Electrical Design Engineering course commenced on 6 August 2016. The course was expected to complete in February 2017. The Special Committee is in the midst of ensuring that the other two courses; Fire Protection System and IEM-STPD Chemical Engineering course would commence in the first quarter of 2017. The main objective of the Structured Training programme was to assist the graduate engineers who lacked design experience to gain the relevant experience to enable them to be eligible to sit for the Professional Interview.

6. STANDING COMMITTEE ON EXAMINATIONS AND QUALIFICATIONS

6.1 Ir. Lee Boon Chong continued to chair this Standing Committee for the second session. The main responsibility of this Standing Committee was to regulate the professional interviews as well as working closely with the EAC on the accreditation of the engineering degree programmes.

6.2 Professional Interview Board

Ir. Tu Yong Eng continued as Chairman of the PI Board for the second term for session 2015/2016. The task of the PI Board was to co-ordinate the professional interviews held at the Head Office and the IEM Branches. In addition, the PI Board also recommended the PI results to the Standing Committee for approval. The PI Board conducted five (5) Professional Interview workshops for the year 2016 for the Graduate Members as well as for the Interviewers on the enhanced PI process.

The participants were briefed on the procedures and guidelines and submission of reports for the professional interview. The PI Board had also started the enhanced PI process of which experienced and trained Interviewers had been appointed to interview the Graduate Members based on their competencies. The enhanced PI process was based on the UK IET competency model.

6.2.1 Professional Interviews

IEM received a total of 72 applications for the Professional Assessment Examination (PAE) from the Board of Engineers, Malaysia (BEM) in 2016. Fifty-six (56) candidates passed the PAE and fourteen (14) failed. Meanwhile, there are two (2) candidates waiting for result.

6.3 IEM Accreditation Board

Ir. Dr. Zainal Abidin Ahmad continued to chair the IEM Accreditation Board for session 2016/2017. The task of the IEM Accreditation Board was to assist the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC) to evaluate local engineering degree programmes offered by both private and public Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs).

6.4 Board of Examiners

The Board of Examiners was chaired by Dato' Lt. Gen (B) Ir. Ismail bin Samion. The Board of Examiners had been entrusted to conduct the Fundamentals of Engineering Examinations (FEE) for the final year engineering students as well as the fresh graduate engineers.

The responsibility of the members is to go through the existing set of questions for five (5) engineering disciplines. The Board of Examiners would be organizing a workshop to review the FEE questions as the current set of questions were found to be irrelevant to the respective engineering disciplines. Hence, the workshop would be to revamp the existing FEE questions. The workshop was expected to be held in 2017.

6.6 Ad Hoc Committee on the Review of the PI Process

Ir. Lee Boon Chong continued to chair the Ad Hoc Committee which completed their task in May 2016. The enhanced PI process adopted from the UK Standards for Professional Engineer Competence (UK-SPEC) was implemented on trial since April 2016. The Ad Hoc Committee had conducted six (6) IEM PI Training and Certification workshops for the Interviewers on the enhanced PI process as well as seven (7) workshops for potential candidates for the Professional Interview. The Enhanced PI Process will be officially implemented in July 2018.





7 STANDING COMMITTEE ON INFORMATION AND PUBLICATIONS

7.1 For Session 2016/2017, the Standing Committee was chaired by Ir. Prof. Dr Ruslan Hassan. The Standing Committee is responsible for the publication of the IEM monthly Jurutera bulletin, the IEM Journal, the IEM Directory, the website and the library. In the year under review, the Standing Committee met regularly on every 2nd Tuesday of the month.

7.2 Jurutera

The Chief Editor and Bulletin Editor for the session were Ir. Prof. Dr Ruslan Hassan and Ir. Mohd Khir Muhammad respectively. Twelve issues of the bulletin were published for the year 2016. The titles for the issues are:

7.5 IEM Website and Homepage

The Standing Committee continued to monitor and improve the webpage. Efforts were made to make the website more user-friendly and to update the members with useful announcements. For the session, the Committee also embarked on the initiative to post recorded videos of talks conducted at IEM HQ on the website for the benefit of IEM members. Members can log in and view available videos of the talks at their own free time.

7.6 Sub-Committee on Documentation and Recording of IEM Historical Events

Ir. Choo Kok Beng was appointed to chair the Documentation and Recording of IEM Historical events. The Committee continued to focus on the work of recording IEM historical records.

The Committee will continue to document relevant IEM Historical events for the current year which the Committee plans to archive for later uploads onto the IEM Website.

7.7 Library

The Sub Committee on Library chaired by Ir. CMM Aboobucker met 9 times for the year 2016.

The present collection of books consists of approximately 6,834 printed physical book titles covering a variety of disciplines. Apart from engineering topics, there are books on other general topics which may be of interest to the engineering fraternity, e.g. health, food and autobiographies.

The IEM Library also has collection of 153 e-book titles comprising engineering topics in various disciplines Members can access these e-books from their work places or homes even from East Malaysia. Apart from technical books, on-line Journals could be accessed too.

All new book collections either physical or e-books are announced regularly through the IEM Portal under the heading of Publications and Library. Announcement is also made during IEM events and TV display screen at Bangunan Ingenieur.

Members who wish to borrow books can reserve them through the IEM Portal. Members are also encouraged to submit recommendations of new titles either physical or e-books using the special format available in the IEM Portal.

The Sub Committee planned for series of seminars / workshops / talks throughout the year. Up to date, there were two (2) completed seminars, two (2) completed workshops and two (2) completed talks which details were captured in the Summary Sheets of Activities for Year 2016 of the Annual Report.

9.3.3 Collaboration in Conducting Courses on Alternative Dispute Resolution for Practitioners 2016

The 2-Day Course on Alternative Dispute Resolution for Practitioners, jointly organized by IEM, MIArb, RISM and PAM was successfully held on 2 & 3 March 2016 at Wisma IEM.

9.3.4 Joint Visit between Seniors Special Interest Group (SSIG) and the Sub-Committee to the KLRCA

The visit which was co-organised by the Seniors Special Interest Group (SSIG) and DARP Sub Committee was successfully held on 27th October 2016 (Thurs) at 2.30pm – 5.00pm. 27 members attended the visit.

9.4 The Fire Advisory Board (FAB) on Fire Protection Services

Ir. Thin Choon Chai continued his Chairmanship for another term for the session 2016-2017. The scope and main objectives of this Advisory Board are as follows:

- i. To study the technical issues related to fire protection with the aim to disseminate information to members with the latest regulations, circulars from Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia as well as to focus on the fire safety aspects by organizing various activities, open forum and dialogue to provide awareness to members as well as architects
- Since 2013, the Advisory Board targets to train its committee members and young graduates in fire safety aspects via various
- iii. To review, co-ordinate and formulate policies as well as to advise on all aspects on fire engineering
- iv. To provide awareness and trainings as one of the advisory roles on fire industries.
- v. To foster closer rapport with local authorities such as SIRIM Berhad, BOMBA and KPKT.
- vi. To look into the representation of IEM in public and statutory authorities and other relevant organisations involved on fire activities.

9.5 The Disaster Risk Reduction Advisory Board (DRRAB)

Ir. Loo Chee Kin was appointed as the Chairman of the Disaster Risk Reduction Advisory Board (DRRAB) for the session 2016-2017. The 1st Advisory Board meeting was held on 29th January 2016.

9.5.1 The scope and main objectives of this Advisory Board are as follows:

- This Advisory Board's function is to focus on the disaster preparedness, mitigation and planning for a community scale
 or larger. The type of disaster includes; natural, catastrophic fire, biological and chemical disasters.
- 2. The Advisory Board will advise on mitigation of, prepare for, respond to, and recover from large-scale disasters. This will include drafting standards and procedures, education, high level advocacy and consultation to ensure that the preparedness and best practices of national disaster recovery work.
- 3. The Advisory Board will be the focal point of technical expertise on disaster preparedness within IEM.
- Topics involves: Floods, Haze and Wild Fires, Landslides and Rockslides, Earthquake, Coastal Erosion, Land Subsidence, Tsunami, Catastrophic Chemical Release**, etc.
 - * these are taken as large catastrophic events. Smaller fires or chemical control measures would be under the purview of other committees (Fire Advisory Board and/or Technical Divisions i.e. Chemical Engineering Technical Division).

9.6 Sub Committee on Standards Writing (SWO)

Ir. Hj. Mohd Radzi Salleh was appointed to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee for 2016-2017 to consolidate progress reports from the relevant Technical Divisions which had formed Technical Committees and/or Working Groups for standards writing.

IEM was informed by SIRIM Berhad through a letter that SIRIM Berhad will be the new secretariat for "Jawatankuasa Pembangunan Standard". Therefore, all future code writing and TCs will be handled by SIRIM Berhad, and no longer IEM. Nevertheless, IEM will continue to provide expert opinion through representation to various SIRIM Technical Committees and Working Groups.

9.7 Sub Committee on Street, Drainage & Building Act 1974 (Act 133) & Uniform Building Bylaws (Revised) 1984

Ir. Yim Hon Wa continued to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee to provide IEM's views and input to the Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government via representation to the Working Group Committees on relevant matters.

9.8 IEM Arbitrator Appointment / ADR Advisory Board

The Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Lai Sze Ching continued its function of nominating/appointing arbitrators for parties in dispute. There were three (3) new case files opened in 2016.

9.9 Sub Committee on Screening of Complaints and Queries

Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon continued to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee to screen complaints made against members on grounds of ethics, unfair dismissal, professional misconducts, unethical practice of Professional Engineers and other issues.

The Sub Committee will determine whether such complaints warrant a need to set up disciplinary Adhoc Committee to hear such cases. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon was assisted by Dato' Paduka Ir. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah in screening such complaints received. During the 2016-2017 session, there were many complaints against IEM Members received and one (1) concerning the IEM Branch.

9.10 Sub Committee on Legislation Affecting Engineering Profession

Ir. Lai Sze Ching continued his service to provide regular updates and information on the following legislations and how such legislations would impact the engineering profession:

- Review of the Registration of Engineers Act 1967 (Rev 2007)
- Construction Industry Payment and Adjudication Act (CIPAA) 2012
- Technologists and Technicians Act 2015 (Act 768)

9.11 Outside Bodies Representation (OBR)

The Committee chaired by Ir. Lai Sze Ching continues to appoint representatives to attend and participate by maintaining and establishing close rapporteur and participate at various government agencies in meetings with various outside bodies between IEM with Local Authorities and Government sector.

The Secretariat reports and refers all incoming invitations made by external parties to the IEM President assisted by the PPC Chairman, IEM Honorary Secretary and IEM Executive Director to appoint and identify IEM representatives to attend external meetings and events whilst, the PPC Secretariat handles the necessary administrative works.

Currently, more than 100 members from IEM Excomm, Council and the respective Standing Committees, Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups (SIG), Young Engineers Section (YES) and Branch representatives represent IEM in more than 150 technical committees, working groups, opening ceremonies, dinner, events, dialogue and meetings at various local governments, agencies, institutions, and universities.

All representatives who attended the external meetings are required to produce a copy of the Outside Bodies Representation (OBR) report form within a week from the meeting date. All incoming reports will be tabled at the monthly meeting of the Standing Committee on Professional Practice, Technical Divisions and thereafter will be reported to the President or Excomm if there are any matters that require further deliberation or decision.





10 STANDING COMMITTEE ON WELFARE AND SERVICE MATTERS

10.1 Under the Chairmanship of Vice President, Ir. Ellias Saidin, this Standing Committee held its monthly meetings on every 3rd Tuesday of the month to discuss, review, recommend, approve and implement issues or matters pertaining to the welfare of IEM members. Activities such as the IEM Family Day and IEM Engineering Week were successfully organised during the session. Other welfare activities, which can benefit members of the Institution, were also planned and organised.

10.2 IEM Benevolent Fund

A total of RM 31,495.34 was contributed by members for the session 2016/2017. IEM would like to record its appreciation to the members for their kind support and generosity. The balance available in the fund as at December 2016 is RM436,221.92.

10.3 Jurutera Wargamas (JWS) and Exempted Members

The scheme specially designed for members who are senior citizens or disabled was aimed at reducing the annual subscription for these members to an affordable amount. The affected members would need to pay 25% of the annual subscription fee with the balance to be settled from the IEM Benevolent Fund Account. For the year 2016, RM5,161 was contributed by the Benevolent Fund to subsidise the annual subscriptions for the 29 members approved under the scheme.

10.4 Members Retrenchment Benefit

This scheme allows engineers who are retrenched and unemployed to be considered for a waiver in payment of the annual subscription fees, up to a maximum of 5 years. There were no applicants in 2016.

10.5 Employment Survey

The Standing Committee continued to study and will conduct the employment survey to obtain information pertaining to the employment, remuneration and issues such as job satisfaction concerning the profession. The survey report for 2014 was published in the Jurutera in March 2016.

10.6 IEM Advertisement

10.6.1 IEM Job Advertisement

This is a job vacancy advertisement programme. The programme provides job vacancy advertisements through the IEM Website to its members and non-members who are looking for engineers on a full time/contract or on part time basis to fill job vacancies in their respective companies. The 'Job Vacancy Advertisement Form' and 'Its Terms and Conditions' are available at the IEM website. Job seekers can search for their desired employment in the IEM Website under 'Job Gallery' section for the latest job vacancy advertisements. No charges are imposed for the job vacancy advertisement.

10.6.2 IEM Advertisement for Products and Services

This is a service that is provided to IEM members as well as companies involved with the supply of products and services related to the engineering profession. With a nominal fee, members could introduce their products and services to fellow engineers by putting up advertisements in IEM website. It is being managed by IEM Academy Sdn Bhd.

10.7 **IEM Family Day 2016**

IEM Family Day is an event that members look forward to every year. It serves as an avenue for networking among senior and young engineers and helpful for IEM Council members to obtain feedback on IEM activities. It also promotes further advancement for engineers besides fostering closer rapport between members. The IEM Family Day 2016 was held on 8 May 2016 at Persada PLUS, Petaling Jaya, Selangor and attracted more than 600 participants comprising IEM Council members, IEM members and their families. SPM/STPM/A-Level award recipients were all invited to this function. Certificates of achievement and cash were given to the children of IEM members who achieved outstanding results in their SPM, STPM and A-Level. This year a total of 38 SPM & 17 A-Level students were rewarded. There were more than 10 types of challenging and fun games for children and adults. These include fun tele-match games, giant bubbles, and fishing competition. IEM hired a caterer to set up food stalls serving local and western favourites and many other delicious foods.





10.9 IEM Engineering Week 2016 (IEM EW2016)

The Standing Committee organised the 20th IEM Engineering Week 2016 (EW2016) with the theme "Amazing Engineering" from 14 - 20 August 2016. EW2016 was organised to introduce and promote the engineering profession to the general public. A one week programme was arranged and focused on the following:-

- To promote Engineering Profession to the public in conjunction with the IEM Engineering Week 2016.
- To promote Engineering to the general public to encourage students to pursue Engineering as a profession.

The highlight of the IEM EW2016 was the Opening Ceremony in conjunction with IEM Engineer's Run 2016 held in University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur with more than 1000 runners participating.

EW2016 also organise the IEM-SIEMENS Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Competition where 16 secondary schools from Klang Valley participated.

Both opening and closing ceremony of EW2016 were officiated by YB Datuk Prof. Dr. Abu Bakar Bin Mohamad Diah, Deputy Minister of MOSTI with the presence of IEM President, Ir. Tan Yean Chin.

10.10 Insurance Matters

Several insurance schemes were arranged with insurance companies for members. Some of which were with AON Brokers Malaysia Sdn Bhd on Professional Indemnity Insurance, Zurich Insurance on Life and General Insurance and ING Insurance Berhad on Group Critical Cover Scheme.

10.11 Affinity Programmes

IEM continue to collaborate with CIMB on the affinity credit card programme which would benefit IEM where 0.1% of the amount spent by members using the card would be contributed to IEM. Other benefits also include payment of IEM annual subscriptions via direct debit from the card. IEM members are encouraged to apply or convert their existing card to the CIMB AFFINITY CARD as the 0.1% contribution is a substantial income to IEM.

10.12 Community Service Responsibility

IEM Relief Team

The Standing Committee had set up a disaster response team Sub Committee known as the Sub Committee on IEM RELIEF which focus on setting up and selecting a disaster relief team to represent IEM and be deployed to any disaster affected areas within the country. Selected candidates would be sent to attend a training programme organised by MERCY and REDR to enhance the understanding of the principles of humanitarian and disaster management to build their skills relating to personal and team management. Three IEM members had attended intensive training by REDR Malaysia and another three had attended a course organised by MERCY Malaysia. IEM Relief Team also conducted a talk on humanitarian to share their experience with the members who may be interested to participate in voluntary missions.

10.13 IEM Business Club

The IEM Business Club had been set up to provide a platform for business networking, explore the potential of fellow engineers helping each other through business referrals to enhance and improve business income. Business referrals via friends and business colleagues had proven to be a powerful and effective marketing tool for effective business development. This Sub Committee will also be inviting corporate leaders and industry captains to present a series of talk in IEM.

10.14 Other Benefit Projects

The Committee continues to negotiate with vendors and merchants to look into joint collaborations for the benefit of IEM members. The Committee had managed to obtain corporate rates from several hotels in Klang Valley. The Committee is also negotiating for corporate discounts with several health providers as well as global automobile manufacturer for members to enjoy the benefits and special packages offered. Details of available benefits can be obtained from IEM Secretariat.

The Committee will continue to implement more activities for the welfare of members as well as providing excellent services to the members.

11 STANDING COMMITTEE ON CORPORATE AFFAIRS

- 11.1 The Standing Committee continues to oversee various initiatives to improve the image of IEM and position IEM as the premier engineering institution in Malaysia and the ASEAN region. This Standing Committee also handles the co-ordination of the international involvement of IEM and monitors the activities of the various IEM foreign initiatives.
- 11.2 Ir. Ong Ching Loon took over the Chairmanship from Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr. Andy Seo Kian Haw and continues to look into means of improving the image of the Institution in the eyes of its members and general public.

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11.3 ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisations (AFEO) Secretariat

The AFEO Secretariat is currently based at the IEM Penthouse of Bangunan Ingenieur, Petaling Jaya. The IEM continues to host the AFE Secretariat with the objective to help AFEO perform its duties and responsibilities as well as to function effectively and efficiently. IEM therefore continues as the Secretariat and Treasurer for AFEO with IEM Vice President cum Chairman of Standing Committee of Corporate Affairs, Ir. Ong Ching Loon as the Secretary-General for the 2016/2017 session.

The AFEO Board of Governors held its15th Mid-term meeting from 24-26 May 2016 at Hilton Hanoi Opera Hotel, Hanoi, Vietnam hosted by Vietnam Union of Science and Technology (VUSTA). The event included the working group meetings and technical visits. Later in the year, Philippines Technological Council (PTC) hosted the 34th AFEO Governing Board meeting at the Citystate Asturias Hotel, in Puerto Princesa, Palawan, Philippines on 23 November 2016, during the 34th Conference on ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisations themed "ASEAN Community: Engineering Shining Through" which was held from 22 – 24 November 2016.

Besides the Governing Board meeting, the Woman Groups – WE-AFEO and the Young Engineers – YEAFEO also organised their respective Board meetings and activities.

The Governing Board endorsed a list of Honorary conferment and outstanding achievement awards at the closing event.

The Chairmanship of the AFEO Board was handed over to Engineering Institute of Thailand under the King's Patronage (EIT) who will consequently host CAFEO-35 in 2017 in Bangkok, Thailand from 16-19 November 2017. The Institution of Engineers, Singapore (IES) will host the mid-term AFEO Governing Board Meeting in Singapore from 16-18 July 2017.

11.4 ASEAN Engineering Register (AER)

(fka ASEAN Engineers Register)

IEM hosts the Secretariat of the ASEAN Engineering Register (AER). The ASEAN Engineering Register Executive Committee remains based at IEM and continued to organise activities for the Register. Ir. Ellias Saidin was appointed AER Head Commissioner and chaired monthly meetings to look into the affairs of the AER membership for the 10 countries. The Exco members were appointed as Ambassadors to each of the member organisations for purpose of liaison and reporting work at the Exco meetings.

In line with the objective of the AER which is to facilitate the mobility and professional practice of the engineering team within the ASEAN, the AER Executive Committee and AFEO Governing Board continued the task of establishing a framework of mutual recognition qualifications amongst the ASEAN member countries whereby AER members who wish to practice outside their home country may carry with them an approved and recognised professional qualification. The AER is maintained as a platform to safeguard and promote the professional interests of engineers, engineering technologists, technicians and related associates. The quality and standing of the AER members are continuously being upheld through the setting, monitoring and reviewing of standards by the AFEO Governing Board.

The membership of AER has expanded to include new grade of membership indicated as follows:

- c. ASEAN Technicians (AT)

11.5 AER National Monitoring Committee (NMC)

IEM Vice President, Ir. Dr Norlida binti Buniyamin was appointed as Chairman of National Monitoring Committee of the AER for Malaysia. The main role of the AER NMC in IEM is to process applications for IEM members and the Technological Association of Malaysia (TAM) members applying to be registered as AER. The Committee also arranged for AER certificates and medallions presentation to successful applicants from IEM and TAM. TAM will process application for the AER for the Engineering Technologists and Technicians. On 26 August 2016, the AE/AAE and APEC/IPEA Certificate Presentation Ceremony was arranged prior to a talk on Working Abroad presented by Ir. Eddie Ng Teng Soon at the Auditorium Prof. Tan Sri Chin Fung Kee, 3rd Floor, Wisma IEM which was attended by 25 members.







11.6 Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation and International Professional Engineers Agreement (APEC/IPEA)

The Registration and Administrative Committee of the National Monitoring Committee (NMC) of APEC/IPE Economy in Malaysia is set up at IEM chaired by Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (IEM Past President). IEM is also represented by Ir. Ong Ching Loon (Vice President of IEM) at the NMC. There are also two representatives each from the Association of Consulting Engineers, Malaysia (ACEM) and the Board of Engineers, Malaysia (BEM) serving in the NMC.

The processing of applications from IEM members for these Registers is under the purview of the Standing Committee on Qualifications and Admissions, chaired by Vice President. The Membership Application Board chaired by Ir. Pan Wang Fook would vet and process all applications and forward the submissions to the Standing Committee for approval. To date, a total of 527 members have registered for both the Registers.

A 1-day BEM/IEM Training for International Engineering Alliance Reviews delivered by Mr. Basil Wakelin was held on 30 May 2016 at Wisma IEM and attended by 28 newly registered members. A follow up on this, the IEM Secretariat supported by FEIAP Secretariat contacted some of the participants for a briefing session conducted by Past President, Dato Ir Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik on 12 August 2016 at 5.30pm on Accreditation of Engineering Education Programme. IEM had identified some of the participants for possibility of training them to be mentors and reviewers for their accreditation work.

From 29 May – 3 June 2016, IEM was represented by the Vice President, Ir. Lee Boon Chong and Immediate Past President, Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock, at the International Engineering Alliance Meeting (IEAM 2016) hosted by the Board of Engineers Malaysia (BEM) at Royal Chulan Hotel, Kuala Lumpur. IEM had been successfully re- accredited and had its signatory status renewed in the Asia Pacific Engineering Council (APEC) and International Professional Engineers Agreement (IPEA) for another six years.

11.7 Federation of Engineering Institutions of Asia and the Pacific (FEIAP) [previously known as the Federation of Engineering Institutions of South East Asia and the Pacific (FEISEAP)]

IEM handed over the Chairmanship of FEIAP to the Chinese Institute of Engineers, Chinese Taipei (CIE) at the 23rd General Assembly held on 7 July 2015 in Taipei, Taiwan in conjunction with the 3rd FEIAP Convention. The current FEIAP President is Dr John C Li from CIE with Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (IEM's representative) as the Immediate Past President.

The General Assembly cum meetings for 2016 was held in Perth, Australia from 6-9 July 2016 hosted by Engineers Australia.

The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia continues to host the permanent Secretariat of FEIAP with IEM President, Ir. Tan Yean Chin as the Secretary General.

11.8 Federation of Engineering Institutions of Islamic Countries (FEIIC)

IEM Vice President, Ir. Prof Dr Ruslan Hassan is the IEM President's representative to the Federation of Engineering Institutions of Islamic Countries (FEIIC) where he currently serves as a Council Member.

IEM's FEIIC National Monitoring Committee was formed as a sub-committee of the Corporate Affairs Standing Committee to monitor and coordinate activities organised between IEM and FEIIC. Ir. Prof Dr Ruslan Hassan was appointed the Chairman of this sub-committee.

The 30th FEIIC Executive Council Meeting and 2nd FEIIC EQAPS Makkah & Madinah Accords Workshop which were held at the Fairmont Hotel, Makkah on 18 &19 December.

FEIIC has embarked on an Engineering Accreditation System for the Middle East. The Accord called the "Makkah Accord" and "Madinah Accord" would look into accreditation of engineering degrees in the Islamic countries. The "Makkah Accord" is similar to "Sydney Accord", while the "Madinah Accord" is similar to "Washington Accord". For Malaysia, the Makkah Accord was signed by Ir. Ruslan Hassan on behalf of the IEM President.

Additionally FEIIC together with Universiti Putra Malaysia and Universiti Teknologi Malaysia jointly organised the World Research & Innovation Convention on Engineering & Technology (WRICET2016) in Langkawi, Kedah, from 24-25 October 2016.

11.9 World Federation of Engineering Organisations (WFEO)

Eng. Jorge Spitalnik continues as the President of WFEO with Dr Marlene Kanga of EA as the President-Elect. The WFEO Executive Council meeting was held in Lima, Peru from 3-9 December 2016. The next General Assembly will be held in Rome, Italy end of 2017 and IEM would be represented by the President and the Hon Secretary.



16.13.8 Graduate Affairs Portfolio



- 17.1.2 The Technical Division held its 30th Annual General Meeting in conjunction with a Pre-AGM Talk on "Code Compliant Design and Performance based Design Smoke Control System - What Are Their Differences?", presented by Ir. Tan Chew on 13th August 2016.
 - Sixty-seven (67) members attended the 30th AGM, while seventy-five (75) members attended the Pre-AGM Talk, At the 30th AGM, Ms Sofia Johari was elected as the Secretary / Treasurer and Ir. Wong Chu Loong as the Advisor for the term.
- 17.1.3 The Division continued to play an active role in maintaining a leading role in promoting closer interaction and co-operation amongst the various professional groups such as governmental agencies, professional bodies, academic institutions and universities by serving as Committee members in these organisations.
- 17.1.4 The Committee members were also involved in various activities related to the division like drafting of Malaysia Standard with SIRIM, as IEM representative in CIDB and in various government agencies.
- 17.1.5 The Division as in the past continued with the close rapport with MASHRAE, the local counterpart of American Society of Heating, Refrigeration and Air-Conditioning Engineering, US in organising joint activities for members of both organisations and also collaborated with other companies in organizing talks for its members. 2016 has been a successful and active year for the Technical Division.
- 17.1.6 The Division will continue to play an effective role in organising activities for members in the building services interest. The activities organised by the Division were summarised in the summary sheet of this Annual Report.





17.2 Chemical Engineering Technical Division (CETD)

17.2.1 Ir. Dr Lee Tin Sin took over the chairmanship from Ir. Thayananthan Balakrishnan for the session 2016/2017 at the 30th Annual General Meeting held on 1st October 2016. Ir. Mohamad Anwar bin Ahmad was elected as the Deputy Chairman of the Division for the session. The position of Chairman and Deputy Chairman was elected at the 191st meeting of the Division held on 24th September 2016.

The AGM was attended by 50 members. Throughout Session 2015/2016, the division was active in organising various activities for its members.

- 17.2.2 Regular monthly committee meetings were held to plan for various activities. The activities of the technical division are given in the summary sheet.
- 17.2.3 The Division continued to organize the Malaysian Chem-E-Car Competition. On 8th and 9th April 2016, the 11th Malaysia Chem-E-Car Competition was held at Universiti Teknologi Malaysia with 252 participants forming 63 teams. The competition consisted of two categories, i.e. model car competition and poster competition. The winning team in the poster competition was "SPEKTRONICS" from Institute Teknologi Sepuluh Nopember, Indonesia while GRANDIOSE from Monash University Malaysia won the model car competition.

The competition had provided good exposure as well as created tremendous interest in various institutions of higher learning (IHLs) with a number of them stepping forward to indicate interest to host the next competition. The Division is looking at ways to improve the competition in the future.

- 17.2.4 IEM Chemical Engineering Design Competition 2015/201615 was organised for the fourth time by CETD, and had attracted a number of teams from institutions of higher learning nationwide. Eight teams were successfully shortlisted and participated in the Final Poster Presentation held on 28th May at Heriot-Watt University, Putrajaya. This annual event was granted sponsorship of RM 20,000 from Invensys, a process simulation company.
- 17.2.5 CETD also organised the 1st Junior Chem-E-car Competition 2016 together with Sekolah Kebangsaan Presint 18 (1) Putrajaya on 8th and 9th November 2016 at Perbadanan Putrajaya. The competition which aims to challenge students of primary schools to design and construct a small-sized car that is fabricated from reusable/recyclable items such as ice-cream sticks, bottle caps and straws was held for the first time in Malaysia. The event was held successfully with participation from 23 teams including 2 teams from the Australia International School.

17.3 Civil and Structural Engineering Technical Division (CSETD)

- 17.3.1 Under provision 3.2 and 3.3 of the Rules, at the 254th Civil and Structural Engineering Technical Division (CSETD) Committee meeting held on 21st June 2016, Ir. Dr. Ng Soon Ching was unanimously elected as the new Chairman and Ir. Chong Chee Meng as the Deputy Chairman for the session 2016/2017. The meeting also unanimously agreed to appoint Ir. Hooi Wing Chuen as the Advisor for the new term.
- 17.3.2 The Technical Division held its 30th Annual General Meeting was held on 23rd July 2016 in conjunction with a Pre-AGM Talk on two topics namely "BEM Guideline on the Role and Responsibility of Professional Engineers for Temporary Works during Construction" by Ir. Tan Yean Chin and "MS 1462 Metal Scaffolding Mandatory under CIDB Act 520 (Amendments 2011)" by Ir. Lee Kee Bau.

The drafting work is ongoing for the Malaysian National Annex for Eurocode 8: Design of structures for earthquake resistance Part 1: General rules, seismic action and rules for Building.

The Draft had undergone public comment stage between 1 February to 15 April 2016. The National Consultation with various NGOs and Government Agencies was also held on 28 June 2016 in Shah Alam. The draft is currently being finalized under supervision of DSM and MOSTI, after the Sabah Stakeholders Meeting in Kota Kinabalu on 28 November 2016 chaired by YB Minister of MOSTI.



 - En. Mohd Elmi Bin Anas & Ir. Shafie Bin Mohamed presented a Pre-AGM Talk on "Latest ST Updates on Electricity Supply Act & Regulation & Route to ST Competent Engineer & Service Engineer" In conjunction with the AGM and this talk was attended by 145 members.
- 17.4.3 The EETD Committee members actively represent IEM at numerous meetings such as Working Groups, Technical Committee meetings organised by outside organisations, government and professional bodies sector such as Suruhanjaya Tenaga (ST), SIRIM Berhad, TEEAM, trainings and others.
- 17.4.4 The Division continues to organise various activities to the members such as 18 visits, 32 talks, 11 seminar/courses, 1 Symposium, 1 Competition and 2 Forums. Details of the activities organised were captured and highlighted in the summary sheets of this Annual Report 2016.
- 17.4.5 Dialogues have been organized for the first time with TEEAM, ST, TNB, Energy Institute Malaysia and IEEE.
- 17.4.6 The AFEO Energy Tour which gathered engineers and professionals from ASEAN countries was organized for the first time.

- 17.4.8 EETD has submitted/published 65 activity reports and articles at JURUTERA (Online or printed)
- 17.4.9 The IEM-Standards Malaysia Electrotechnical Symposium & Exhibition 2016 organised by EETD has managed to attract a total of 800 participants as well as gathering keynote speakers and guests from key electrical engineering bodies such as IEC, ST, Standards Malaysia and TNB.


17.6 Geotechnical Engineering Technical Division (GETD)

- 17.6.2 The Technical Division held its regular monthly meetings on every second Monday of the month to discuss matters pertaining to geotechnical engineering practices.
- 17.6.3 As at 13trh June 2016, the membership of the Geotechnical Engineering Technical Division had increased from 1,076 members to 1,227 members.

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- 17.6.5 The Committee held a total of 12 monthly meetings to plan, discuss and co-ordinate the implementation of the various activities during the session. The meetings were held at the Bangunan Ingenieur, Petaling Jaya, Selangor.
- 17.6.6 For the year 2016, the Division position is at 4th Pacing for the IEM Presidential Award of Excellence. The Division managed to achieve top score in organizing technical talks and seminars.

 The Division will continue to invite prominent speakers to share their knowledge with the members.

- 17.7.1 At the 243rd Committee meeting held on 19th October 2016, the Committee Members present elected Ir. Richard Wong Chuen Fun and A/Prof. Ir. Dr. Khoo Hooi Ling as Chairman and Deputy Chairman respectively for session 2016/2017.
- 17.7.2 The Division held its 25th Annual General Meeting on 5th November 2016. A total of 70 members attended the AGM. Prior to that, 93 members attended the Talk On "Road Safety Audit (RSA) & traffic Management Plan (TMP) During Construction.
- 17.7.3 The Division continues to organise various activities to the members such as 2 visits, 5 talks, 3 seminar/course and 1 International Conference. Details of the activities organised were captured and highlighted in the summary sheets of this Annual Report 2016.
- 17.7.4 The Division continues its IEM Outdoors activities with 2 hiking trip to Hiking Trail to Lubuk Hantu and Hiking e to RAF B-24 Liberator (KL654R) Aircraft Crash Area Gunung Telapak Buruk for the year 2016.







HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

- 1. The 2016 fiscal Statement of Accounts and the Balance Sheet of the Institution are as presented. The accounts are maintained by the Standing Committee on Finance to which the Hon. Treasurer is the Secretary.
- 2. The accounts presented refer to the financial performance of IEM and do not include the financial position of the IEM Branches who file their financial statements with the IRB of the respective States.
- 3. The total income for year 2016 is RM6,005,611 which is RM963,395 higher than that of year 2015. The total income included RM544,686 being net income from Institutional services, RM599,924 net income from rental and RM301,856 dividend received from IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd.
- 4. This improvement is due partially to additional dividend received from IEM Training Centre. The normal dividend received each year was RM100,000. In addition, the Institution had made considerable surplus from activities organized in 2016 namely the Southeast Asian Geotechnical Conference held from 31st May to 2nd June 2016 which contributed a share of surplus amounting to RM260,921, IEM's 56th annual dinner contributed RM91,477 as well as income from Technical Division's activities contributing RM604,628.
- 5. The main source of income continue to be annual subscriptions which amounted to RM3,440,942 for 2016.
- 6. The total expenditure of the Institution was RM4,470,160, which was RM78,185 lower than that of year 2015. The main operating expenditure items were personnel emoluments RM2,508,251, administrative expenses RM1,209,311, finance cost (term loan interest) RM202,236 and Branch Subsidies RM458,570.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2016

1. Basis of preparation

(a) Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of the Institution of Engineers, Malaysia ("hereinafter referred to as the "Institution") have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standards ("MPERS") and the rules of the Institution.

The financial statements of the Institution have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise indicated in the significant accounting policies below.

The financial statements of the Institution for the financial year ended 31 December 2016 prepared in accordance with MPERS and Section 35 Transition to the MPERS has been applied, being the first year of adoption.

The Institution has however not consolidated the results and financial position of its subsidiaries as disclosed in Note 4 to the financial statements in accordance with the requirements of Section 9 *Consolidated and Separate Financial Statements* of MPERS as the financial statements of the subsidiaries have not been audited at the date of preparation of these financial statements. The financial statements of the subsidiaries will be represented separately to the Council upon completion of their audit.

The transition to MPERS does not have financial impact to the financial statements of the Institution.

(b) Functional and Presentation Currency

These financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is the Institution's functional currency. All financial information is presented in RM and has been rounded to the nearest RM except when otherwise stated.

(c) Significant accounting judgments, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the Institution's financial statements requires the Council to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income, expenditure, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities at the reporting date. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that could require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in the future.

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of the reporting period, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next reporting period are set out below:

Useful lives of property, plant and equipment

The Institution regularly reviews the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment based on factors such as business plan and strategies, expected level of usage and future technological developments. Future results of operations could be materially affected by changes in these estimates brought about by changes in the factors mentioned above. A reduction in the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment would increase the recorded depreciation and decrease the value of property, plant and equipment.

Impairment of loans and receivables

The Institution assesses at end of each reporting period whether there is any objective evidence that a receivable is impaired. To determine whether there is objective evidence of impairment, the Institution considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments.

Where there is objective evidence of impairment, the amount and timing of future cash flows are estimated based on historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics.

Income taxes

Judgement is involved in determining the provision for income taxes. There are certain transactions and computations for which the ultimate tax determination is uncertain during the ordinary course of business.

The Institution recognises liabilities for expected tax issues based on estimates of whether additional taxes will be due. Where the final tax outcome of these matters is different from the amounts that were initially recognised, such differences will impact the income tax and deferred tax provisions in the period in which such determination is made.



2. Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The policy of recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with Note 2 (i).

(i) Recognition and measurement

Cost includes purchase price for purchased assets, any other costs directly attributable in bringing the asset to its present location and condition for its intended use, cost of replacing component parts of the assets, and the present value of the expected cost for the decommissioning of the assets after their use. The cost of self-constructed assets also includes the cost of materials and direct labour. Borrowing cost and all other repair and maintenance costs are recognised in profit or loss as incurred.

The cost of property, plant and equipment recognised as a result of a business combination is based on fair value at acquisition date. The fair value of property is the estimated amount for which a property could be exchanged on the date of valuation between a willing buyer and a willing seller in an arm's length transaction after proper marketing wherein the parties had each acted knowledgeably, prudently and without compulsion. The fair value of other items of plant and equipment is based on the quoted market prices for similar items.

When significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Gains or losses arising on the disposal of property, plant and equipment are determined as the difference between the disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the assets and are recognised in profit or loss.

(ii) Subsequent costs

The cost of replacing part of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the carrying amount of the item if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the part will flow to the Institution and its cost can be measured reliably. The costs of the day-to-day servicing of property, plant and equipment are recognised in the profit or loss as incurred. Investment property whose fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort is measured on the cost model.

(iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is recognised in the profit or loss on straight line basis to write off the cost or valuation of each asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life. Freehold land is not depreciated. Leased assets are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Property, plant and equipment under construction are not depreciated until the assets are ready for its intended use.

Property, plant and equipment are depreciated based on the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Freehold buildings	2%
Leasehold land and buildings	2%
Furniture and fittings	5% - 20%
Office equipments	10% - 20%
Library books	10%
Building renovation	5%
Lift	10%
Library software	10%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed at each reporting period end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the property, plant and equipment.

(b) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities, including derivative instruments, are recognised on the statements of financial position when, and only when, the Institution become a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recognised at the transaction price plus transaction costs if they are not measured at fair value through profit or loss unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction. Financial assets and financial liabilities that constitute a financing transaction are measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument. Transaction costs for financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in profit or loss in period in which they are incurred.







The Institution classify their financial assets and financial liabilities into the following categories:

(i) Financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value with any gains or losses arising from changes in the fair values recognised in profit or loss in the period in which the changes arise. If the fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort, the financial assets is subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

(ii) Other financial assets and other financial liabilities measured at amortised cost

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Financial assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the financial assets and financial liabilities are derecognised or impaired, and through the amortisation process.

A financial asset or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset has expired or has been settled, or control of the asset is not retained or the Institution has transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership. On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the carrying amount and the sum of consideration received, including any newly created rights and obligations, is recognised in profit or loss.

A financial liability or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as a derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability, and the difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in profit or loss.

(c) Subscription in arrears

Subscription in arrears of one year and more and where, in the opinion of the Council, are no longer recoverable from its members are written off to the Statement of Income and Expenditure.

(d) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, balances and deposits with banks and highly liquid investments which have an insignificant risk of changes in fair value with original maturities of three months or less, and are used by the Institution in the management of their short-term commitments. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents are presented net of bank overdrafts and pledged deposits.

(e) Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the statements of financial position if, and only if, there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

(f) Capital reserve fund

Fund raised from members for the purchase of property, plant and equipment are capitalised as Capital Reserve Fund.

(g) Library fund

Enrolment fee received from corporate members for library membership of the Institution and donation received from members or non-members for capital expenditure of the library are capitalised as Library Fund.

(h) Building fund

Funds and donations received from members for the purchase of Wisma IEM are capitalised in Building Fund. A separate bank account has been kept for the fund.

(i) Impairment of assets

(i) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of non-financial assets (except for inventories, amount due from contract customers, deferred tax assets, and investment property measured at fair value) are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or cash-generating units. For the purpose of goodwill impairment testing, cash-generating units to which goodwill has been allocated are aggregated so that the level at which impairment testing is performed reflects the lowest level at which goodwill is monitored for internal reporting purposes. The goodwill acquired in a business combination, for the purpose of impairment testing, is allocated to a cash-generating unit or a group of cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and its value-in-use. In assessing value-in-use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset or cash-generating unit.

An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or cash-generating unit exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which such impairment loss is recognised directly against any revaluation surplus for the asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same asset. Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) and then to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) on a pro rata basis.

An impairment loss in respect of goodwill is not reversed. In respect of other assets, impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at the end of each reporting period for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognised. The reversal is limited so that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its recoverable amount, nor exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, had no impairment loss been recognised for asset in prior years. Such reversal is recognised in the profit or loss unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase.

(ii) Financial assets

All financial assets, other than those categorised as fair value through profit or loss, investments in subsidiary companies, associates and joint ventures are assessed at each reporting date whether there is any objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events having an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the asset.

To determine whether there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets has been incurred, The Education Fund considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments. For certain categories of financial assets, such as trade receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are subsequently assessed for impairment on a collective basis based on similar risk characteristics. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Institution's past experience of collecting payments, an increase in the number of delayed payments in the portfolio past the average credit period and observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with defaults on receivables.

If any such evidence exists, the amount of impairment loss is measured as the difference between the assets' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows (excluding future expected credit losses that have not yet been incurred) discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The carrying amount of the asset is reduced through the use of an allowance account and the amount of impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss. Receivables together with the associated allowance are written off when there is no realistic prospect of future recovery.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised in profit or loss, the impairment loss is reversed, to the extent that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not been recognised at the date the impairment is reversed. The amount of reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

(j) Revenue

Member's subscription fee

Member's subscription fee is payable annually at the beginning of the financial year. Only that subscription which is attributable to the current financial year is recognised as income. Subscription relating to periods beyond the current financial year is taken up in the statements of financial position as subscription in advance under current liabilities. Subscription is payable in full irrespective of the date of resignation of members during the financial year.

Advertisement in Buletin/Journal

Advertisement income receivable for the placement of advertisement in bulletin/journal published by the Institution is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

Rental income

Rental income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

Credit cards commission

Credit cards commission from the banks are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised on accruals basis using the effective interest method.

Dividend income

Dividend income is recognised when the right to received payment is established.

(k) Employee benefits

(i) Short term employee benefits

Wages, salaries, bonuses and social security contributions are recognised as an expense in the reporting period in which the associated services are rendered by employees of the Institution. Short term accumulating compensated absences such as paid annual leave are recognised when services are rendered by employees that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences. Short term non-accumulating compensated absences such as sick and medical leave are recognised when the absences occur.

The expected cost of accumulating compensated absences is measured as additional amount expected to be paid as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the end of the reporting period.

(ii) Defined contribution plans

As required by law, companies in Malaysia contribute to the state pension scheme, the Employee Provident Fund ("EPF"). Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the profit or loss as incurred. Once the contributions have been paid, the Institution has no further payment obligations.

(I) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred. Borrowing costs consist of interest and other costs that the Institution incurred in connection with the borrowing of funds.

(m) Income taxes

Tax expense in income and expenditure comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax and deferred tax is recognised in income and expenditure.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the financial year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is recognised using the liability method for all temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the statement of financial position and their tax bases. Deferred tax is not recognised for the temporary differences arising from the initial recognition of goodwill, the initial recognition of assets and liabilities in a transaction which is not a business combination and that affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to the temporary differences when they reverse, based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

A deferred tax asset is recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2016

1. Basis of preparation

(a) Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of The Education Fund of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia ("the Fund") have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standards ("MPERS") and the rules of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia.

The financial statements of the Fund have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise indicated in the significant accounting policies below.

In the previous years, the financial statements of the Fund were prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards. These are the Fund's first financial statements prepared in accordance with MPERS and Section 35 Transition to the MPERS has been applied.

In October 2015, the MASB issued amendments to MPERS that are effective for financial statements beginning on or after 1 January 2017, with early application permitted. The Company has opted to apply the amendments for the current year ended 31 December 2016 early.

The transition to MPERS does not have financial impact to the financial statement of the Fund.

(b) Functional and Presentation Currency

These financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is the Fund's functional currency. All financial information is presented in RM and has been rounded to the nearest RM except when otherwise stated.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Revenue

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised on accruals basis using the effective interest method.

Donation received

Donation is recognised in the statement of income and expenditure on cash receipt basis.

(b) Income taxes

Tax expense in income and expenditure comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax and deferred tax is recognised in income and expenditure.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the financial year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is recognised using the liability method for all temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the statement of financial position and their tax bases. Deferred tax is not recognised for the temporary differences arising from the initial recognition of goodwill, the initial recognition of assets and liabilities in a transaction which is not a business combination and that affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to the temporary differences when they reverse, based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

A deferred tax asset is recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of a deferred tax asset is reviewed, and is reduced to the extent that it is no longer probably that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow the benefit of a part or all of that deferred tax asset to be utilised. Any such reduction will be reversed to the extent that it becomes probably that sufficient taxable profit will be available.

A current or deferred tax is recognised as income and expense in profit or loss for the period, except to the extent that the tax arises from items recognised outside profit or loss. For an income or expense item recognised in other comprehensive income, the current or deferred tax expense or tax income is recognised in other comprehensive income. For items recognised directly in equity, the related tax effect is also recognised directly in equity.





(c) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The policy of recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with Note 2 (g).

(i) Recognition and measurement

Cost includes purchase price for purchased assets, any other costs directly attributable in bringing the asset to its present location and condition for its intended use, cost of replacing component parts of the assets, and the present value of the expected cost for the decommissioning of the assets after their use. The cost of self-constructed assets also includes the cost of materials and direct labour. Borrowing cost and all other repair and maintenance costs are recognised in profit or loss as incurred.

The cost of property, plant and equipment recognised as a result of a business combination is based on fair value at acquisition date. The fair value of property is the estimated amount for which a property could be exchanged on the date of valuation between a willing buyer and a willing seller in an arm's length transaction after proper marketing wherein the parties had each acted knowledgeably, prudently and without compulsion. The fair value of other items of plant and equipment is based on the quoted market prices for similar items.

When significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Gains or losses arising on the disposal of property, plant and equipment are determined as the difference between the disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the assets and are recognised in profit or loss.

(ii) Subsequent costs

The cost of replacing part of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the carrying amount of the item if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the part will flow to The Education Fund and its cost can be measured reliably. The costs of the day-to-day servicing of property, plant and equipment are recognised in the profit or loss as incurred. Investment property whose fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort is measured on the cost model.

(iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is recognised in the profit or loss on straight line basis to write off the cost or valuation of each asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life.

Property, plant and equipment are depreciated based on the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Office equipment 10% Furniture and fittings 10% Computers 40%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed at each reporting period end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the property, plant and equipment.

(d) Intangible assets

(i) Intangible assets acquired separately

The initial cost of a separate acquired intangible asset includes its purchase price and any directly attributable cost of preparing the asset for its intended use. Subsequent to initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses. Amortisation is recognised in the profit or loss on straight line basis to write off the cost of each intangible asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life from the date it is available for use.

Software are amortised based on the estimated useful lives of 5 years.

The estimated useful lives and amortisation methods are reviewed at the end of each reporting date, with the effect of any changes in estimate being accounted for on a prospective basis.

(ii) Derecognition of intangible assets

An intangible asset is derecognised on disposal, or when no future economic benefits are expected from use or disposal. Gains or losses arising from derecognition of an intangible asset, measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset, are recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised.

See accounting policy Note 2(g) to the financial statements on impairment of non-financial assets for intangible assets.



(e) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities, including derivative instruments, are recognised on the statements of financial position when, and only when, The Education Fund become a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recognised at the transaction price plus transaction costs if they are not measured at fair value through profit or loss unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction. Financial assets and financial liabilities that constitute a financing transaction are measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument. Transaction costs for financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in profit or loss in period in which they are incurred.

The Fund classifies their financial assets and financial liabilities into the following categories:

(i) Financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value with any gains or losses arising from changes in the fair values recognised in profit or loss in the period in which the changes arise. If the fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort, the financial assets is subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

(ii) Other financial assets and other financial liabilities measured at amortised cost

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Financial assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the financial assets and financial liabilities are derecognised or impaired, and through the amortisation process.

A financial asset or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset has expired or has been settled, or control of the asset is not retained or the Fund have transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership. On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the carrying amount and the sum of consideration received, including any newly created rights and obligations, is recognised in profit or loss.

A financial liability or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as a derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability, and the difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in profit or loss.

(f) Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the statements of financial position if, and only if, there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

(g) Impairment of assets

(i) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of non-financial assets (except for inventories, amount due from contract customers, deferred tax assets, and investment property measured at fair value) are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or cash-generating units. For the purpose of goodwill impairment testing, cash-generating units to which goodwill has been allocated are aggregated so that the level at which impairment testing is performed reflects the lowest level at which goodwill is monitored for internal reporting purposes. The goodwill acquired in a business combination, for the purpose of impairment testing, is allocated to a cash-generating unit or a group of cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and its value-in-use. In assessing value-in-use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset or cash-generating unit.





An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or cash-generating unit exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which such impairment loss is recognised directly against any revaluation surplus for the asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same asset. Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) and then to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) on a pro rata basis.

An impairment loss in respect of goodwill is not reversed. In respect of other assets, impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at the end of each reporting period for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognised. The reversal is limited so that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its recoverable amount, nor exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, had no impairment loss been recognised for asset in prior years. Such reversal is recognised in the profit or loss unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase.

(ii) Financial assets

All financial assets, other than those categorised as fair value through profit or loss, investments in subsidiary companies, associates and joint ventures are assessed at each reporting date whether there is any objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events having an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the asset.

To determine whether there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets has been incurred, the Fund considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments. For certain categories of financial assets, such as trade receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are subsequently assessed for impairment on a collective basis based on similar risk characteristics. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Fund's past experience of collecting payments, an increase in the number of delayed payments in the portfolio past the average credit period and observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with defaults on receivables.

If any such evidence exists, the amount of impairment loss is measured as the difference between the assets' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows (excluding future expected credit losses that have not yet been incurred) discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The carrying amount of the asset is reduced through the use of an allowance account and the amount of impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss. Receivables together with the associated allowance are written off when there is no realistic prospect of future recovery.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised in profit or loss, the impairment loss is reversed, to the extent that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not been recognised at the date the impairment is reversed. The amount of reversal is recognised in profit or loss.

(h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, balances and deposits with banks and highly liquid investments which have an insignificant risk of changes in fair value with original maturities of three months or less, and are used by the Fund in the management of their short-term commitments. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents are presented net of bank overdrafts and pledged deposits.

3. Tax expense

The Fund is an approved fund under Section 44(6) of the Income Tax Act 1967 ("the Act"). More than 50% of the total income received by the Fund in the preceding year has been spent during the current year. Hence, the total income for the Year Assessment 2016 is exempted from tax under Paragraph 13(a) of Schedule 6 of the Act.
