SYNOPSIS

Project Management is an essential engineering capability, a discipline that has been practiced with engineering for thousands of years. As time progresses so to does the complexity of projects, within in an environment of rising cost, greater risk and let's not forget the ever-demanding clients. In response to the changing complexity of the project environment a number of project management standards are being drawn on to facilitate greater control and success.

One such standard is PRINCE2® (Projects in Controlled Environments version 2). PRINCE2 has been adopted by tens of thousands of organizations, with well over a million people certified world-wide. Today it is recognized as a well proven and internationally recognized project management method. So why is PRINCE2 been seen by many project management practitioners as de-facto best practice?

This presentation will explore the common challenges of project management and how PRINCE2 accommodates these challenges. Part of PRINCE2's success is its clarity around project roles, processes and its adaptability to projects of different types and sizes. Our presentation will also provide insight into trending topics in the field of project management including 'agile' project management and what it may mean in an engineering context.
