# IMPACT OF COVID19 AND MCO/CMCO TO THE EMPLOYER AND EMPLOYEE – WHAT TO EXPECT AND WHAT TO DO?

#### Standing Committee on Professional Practice (PPC)

**SYNOPSIS**: Following the global outbreak and the recent spike in COVID-19 cases in Malaysia, the Malaysian government announced a Movement Control Order ("MCO") on 16 March 2020 as a measure to curb the outbreak. This Order lasted for two weeks, starting from 18 March 2020 to 31 March 2020 and was further extended to end on 12 May 2020. The Government thereafter issued another Conditional Movement Control Order ("CMCO") on 3 May 2020 and the MCMO was further extended to 9 June 2020.

With the extended period of restriction on movement of people, the businesses, both big and small, are seriously affected. In this webinar, we will discuss the options available to the Employer and Employee in order to overcome this challenge. Issues to be discussed include:

- 1. Can the Employer implement cost cutting measures, in the context of the Employment law, to retrench or lay off the Employee or to implement salary cut?
- 2. Can the Employer insist the Employee to take unpaid leaves during this period?
- 3. What are the strategies implemented by the government to overcome this problem?
- 4. The effectiveness of the Economic Stimulus Package and additional measures of Economic Stimulus Package.
- 5. Online business what are the laws that need to be observed?
