



SYNOPSIS

The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) (Amendment) Act 2018 has been passed in Parliament and gazetted on 4th May 2018. The main thrust of this Act is to introduce a new far-reaching corporate liability provision into the MACC Act. The Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission will enforce the new provision effective from June 2020.

The MACC (Amendment) Act 2018 introduces a new Section 17A into the MACC Act. This section provides that "a commercial organisation commits an offence if any person associated with the commercial organisation commits a corrupt act in order to obtain or retain business or advantage for the commercial organisation". Hence, IEM is organising the webinar to allow the members to understand what would be the potential impacts on engineering industries and companies due to the introduction of the act, and how can engineers applying the code of ethics in order to compliment the act.
