

Article 4.4 Economic Activities

- (h) Ordinary Council Members of whom there shall be not less than twenty (20) nor more than fifty (50), as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- (i) One (1) representative from each Branch of The Institution.
- (j) Not more than three (3) Corporate Members appointed by the Council on the nomination of the President for a term of one (1) session. An appointed member may be re-appointed, but shall not serve in this capacity for more than two (2) consecutive sessions.
- (k) Five (5) Companion or Graduate Members, as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- (I) One (1) woman Member as prescribed in the Bylaws.

The Members of the Council shall, subject to Article 5.2, be chosen from amongst Corporate Members of The Institution, and shall comprise:-

- (a) The President,
- (b) The Deputy President,
- (c) The Immediate Past President,
- (d) All Past Presidents who are invited by the Council and have expressed their willingness to serve,
- (e) The Vice Presidents of whom there shall be not less than two (2) nor more than ten (10), as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- f) The Honorary Secretary,
- (g) The Honorary Treasurer,
- (h) Ordinary Council Members of whom there shall be not less than twenty (20) nor more than fifty (50), as prescribed in the Bylaws,
 - One (1) representative from each Branch of The Institution.
- (j) Not more than three (3) Corporate Members appointed by the Council on the nomination of the President for a term of one (1) session. An appointed member may be re-appointed, but shall not serve in this capacity for more than two (2) consecutive sessions.
- k) Five (5) Companion Senior Graduate Members or Graduate Members, as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- (I) One (1) woman Member as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- (m) One (1) Engineering Technologist Member, as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- (n) One (1) Engineering Technician Member, as prescribed in the Bylaws.



AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

Article 5.2

- (b) A Vice President shall hold office for a term of two (2) sessions and may be re-elected but may not hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- (b) (a) The Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall hold office for a term of one (1) session. They may be re-elected, but may not hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- (b) A Vice President shall hold office for a term of two (2) sessions and may be re-elected but may not hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
 - (a) The Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall hold office for a term of one (1) session. They may be re-elected, but may not hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- (e) (b) A Council Member shall hold office....
- (c) The Chairman of each Branch of the Institution....
- (Note spacing and alignment)

Article 5.4

The Vice Presidents, the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer and Council Members except those under Article 5.1 (k) and 5.1(l), shall be elected from amongst the Corporate Members by secret ballot in the manner as prescribed in this Constitution and the Bylaws and Regulations made thereunder.

The Members of the Council under Article 5.1 (k) and 5.1(l), shall be appointed in the manner as prescribed in the Bylaws.

The Vice Presidents, the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer and Council Members except those under Article 5.1 (k), and 5.1(l), 5.1(m) and 5.1(n), shall be elected from amongst the Corporate Members by secret ballot in the manner as prescribed in this Constitution and the Bylaws and Regulations made thereunder.

The Members of the Council under Article 5.1 (k), and 5.1(l), 5.1(m) and 5.1(n), shall be appointed in the manner as prescribed in the Bylaws.

Article 5.7

Deputy President: The Deputy President shall be elected by the Council from amongst the Corporate Members of the Council.

The Deputy President shall be elected by only the Corporate Members of the Council from amongst the Corporate Members of the Council who are or had served as Vice President.

Article 5.11

To insert a new paragraph after the first paragraph

For the purpose of this Article, "Officer" means a member of the Council or Executive Committee or the Standing Committee.

Article 5.14

Branch Committee

- (i) The Committee of a Branch shall comprise of:
 - (a) The Chairman
 - (b) Two (2) Vice Chairmen
 - (c) The Honorary Secretary
 - (d) The Honorary Treasurer
 - (e) The Immediate Past Chairman
 - (f) Not less than Four (4) and not more than eight (8) Ordinary Committee Members
 - (g) One (1) Representative of the Graduate and Student Section of the Branch
 - (h) One (1) Companion or Graduate Member appointed by the Branch Committee

 - One (1) Engineering Technician Member appointed by the Branch Committee



MINUTES OF 60TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA HELD ON 20 APRIL 2019 AT MALAKOFF AUDITORIUM, GROUND FLOOR, WISMA IEM, PETALING JAYA AT 9.00 AM

MEMBERS PRESENT - AS PER APPENDIX A

1.0 OPENING ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT

1.1 The President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi thanked and wished a happy birthday to the members present for the 60th AGM. He welcomed all the immediate and past Presidents, the IEM Branch Chairmen as well as the members present in all the three (3) different rooms for attending the AGM. He further informed that the three (3) different rooms were being used for the AGM, namely the Tan Sri Prof Ir. Chin Fung Kee Auditorium located on the 3rd Floor, the C&S/TUS Lecture Room on the 2nd floor and lastly the Malakoff Auditorium on the ground floor, which was the main room for the AG.

The President further informed that video conferencing would be held in the two (2) rooms on the third floor and second floor respectively (*Tan Sri Prof Ir. Chin Fung Kee Auditorium and C&S/TUSTD Lecture room*). The President also informed that Secretariat staff were stationed in each of the rooms to assist members during the AGM especially on posing questions as well as confirming the minutes of the last AGM. The President also reminded that Members who wish to raise questions must be Corporate Members and they should provide their name and membership number during the Question and Answer (Q&A) sessions for record purposes. The President then proceeded to present the overall report/updates on IEM for session 2018/2019.

1.2 Updates on IEM for Session 2018/2019

The President informed that the current standing of the IEM membership have exceeded more than 50K with the exact figure of 50,281 members comprising of the various grades. He further informed that the membership had surpassed 50% of the 100K figure initiated by the past president, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong for the year 2020.

The AGM was also informed that IEM had recently signed quite a number of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Tunku Abdul Rahman University College (TAR UC) on 7 May 2018, SEGi University on 1 June 2018, the Iraqi Engineers Union on 12 July 2018 and Manipal University on 8 August 2018. In addition to this, IEM had also signed MoUs with the China Association of Science and Technology on 22 November 2018 in Xian, China and with a few of the local Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) namely, Universiti Perlis Malaysia (UniMAP) on 26 October 2018 in Kangar, Perlis in the presence of His Highness, Raja Muda Perlis and MAHSA University on 22 December 2018.

The President further informed the AGM that IEM had conducted visits and attended dialogues with the various Ministries such as Malaysia International Trade Industry (MITI) and KeTTHA, Secretary General, Datuk Seri Ir. Dr Zaini Ujang on 1 June 2018, a courtesy visit to Ir. Yeo Bee Yin, Minister of Energy, Science Technology and Environment Change on 3 August 2018. IEM also received a courtesy visit from Dr Rishi Gupta, Chairman of International Affairs Committee, Canadian Society for Civil Engineering on 28 August 2018.

The AGM was also informed that on 26 October, IEM paid a visit to the CIDB Chairman, Y.Bhg Tan Sri Dr Ir Ahmad Tajuddin Ali on 26 October 2018 and on 29 October 2018, IEM visited Yang Amat Berhormat (YAB) Tun Dr. Mahathir Mohamad, the honorable Prime Minister of Malaysia. IEM also received courtesy visits from the Nigerian Society of Engineers on 19 November 2018 and from the Chinese Institute of Electronics on 12 December 2018.

Other courtesy visits to the government bodies/offices included the Dewan Bandaraya Kota Kinabalu (DBKK), Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI), Chief Minister of Penang's office, Ministry of Works, Ministry of Primary Industries, Ministry of Youth and Sports. The President also visited all the twelve (12) IEM Branches.

Meetings and dialogue sessions with other foreign professional bodies included National Association Engineers of Timor Leste (ANETL), Engineers Australia and American Society of Civil Engineer (ASCE). On 5 July 2018, the IEM paid a courtesy visit to Menteri Besar of Perak, YAB Tuan Ahmad Faizal bin Dato' Azumu and on 13 June 2018 IEM visited the Perak State Perak State Exco namely YB Dato' Seri Ir Haji Mohammad Nizar Jamaludin, YB Tuan Tan Kar Hing and YB Tuan Paul Yong Choo Kiong.

The President further briefed the AGM that IEM participated in the following international events and meetings that took place during the session 2018/2019:

- 26th FEIAP General Assembly (GA) from 11 14 July 2018 in Perak, Ipoh. The Menteri Besar of Perak represented by Perak State Exco Dato' Seri Ir. Mohammad Nizar Jamaluddin officiated the opening of the FEIAP GA and presented the Keynote Lecture.
- 2nd International Conference on Women in Science, Engineering and Technology
- WISET 2018 was held from 17-19 July 2018 at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre and officiated by Y.B. Puan Hannah Yeoh, Deputy Minister of Women, Family and Community Development on behalf of the Deputy Prime Minister
- IEM Family Day was held at Persada PLUS on Sunday 29 July 2018





- The IEM Engineers Run was successfully held on 12 August 2018 at Stadium Universiti Putra Malaysia, attended by over 1,000 participants
- The IEM STEM Competition and the closing ceremony of the IEM Engineering Week 2018 was held on 18 August 2018 at Monash University Malaysia, Petaling Jaya
- CAFEO 36 was held from 12 14 November 2018, Singapore. Conferment of AFEO Distinguished Honorary Patron 2018 to YAB Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, Prime Minister of Malaysia was held on 13 November 2018, Singapore

With regards to media engagement, IEM continued to produce press statements and articles for the session 2018/2019.

2.0 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF 59th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 21 APRIL 2018

The President invited members present to go through the minutes of the previous AGM which was printed on pages 73 until page 83. The AGM was also requested to go through the attendance list from pages 84 to 87 and also the Bahasa Malaysia version which was on pages 88 to 98.

Ir. Peter Han Seng Kong (F13421) informed that there was an error in item 4.5 (page 75) of the minutes. He further informed the AGM that he was not the Chairman for the Sub Committee on Log Book. Ir. Abdul Razak bin Yakob was the Chairman.

Ir. Gan Tian Eng (M04904) pointed out that his title as per the Attendance List in page 85 should be stated as "Ir." and not "Mr." He commented that there were a quite a number of members whose titles were "Mr." instead of "Ir.". President informed that the necessary amendments would be made on the titles.

Ir. Mohamed Ali bin Yusoff (F01974) informed that his name was not in the Attendance List but he attended the last AGM. The President agreed that the amendment would be made on the Member's attendance.

As there were no further errors highlighted in the minutes, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) proposed that the minutes of the 59th Annual General Meeting held on 21 April 2018 be confirmed and adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Dr Lee Yun Fook (F38707).

2.1 Confirmation of Minutes of the Special General Meeting held on 14 October 2017

The President then invited members present to go through the minutes of the previous Special General Meeting from pages 101 to 102 and the Bahasa Malaysia version which was on pages 103 to 104.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) raised the question for item 1.4.2 of the Special General Meeting minutes whether Article 4.3 was approved. He commented that the way it was written indicated that it was not approved. He further informed that the suggestion he made at the said meeting with the added phrase "....which are in line with the objective of the Institution" was actually not approved whereas the original proposal was approved by the Registrar of Societies (ROS). Hence, the President agreed that the following should be amended accordingly:

"Voting was carried out on the original proposal and the results were as follows":

Since there were no further amendments/errors highlighted in the minutes, Ir. Razmahwata bin Mohamad Razalli (F17029) proposed that the minutes of the Special General Meeting held on 14 October 2017 be confirmed and adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Ho Choon Kwang (M17178).

3.0 MATTERS ARISING

The President went through and provided clarifications on the following items:

59th Annual General Meeting held on 21 April 2018

Page 76 - 4.19.1

Simplifying Process for Membership

The AGM was informed that steps had been taken to simplify the process and the submission of forms. It was noted that the increase of membership for the grade of Senior Member was still rather low with only four (4) applications received.

With regard to the change of name for the grade of Companion, the AGM was informed that the proposal would be discussed under Amendments to Constitution.

In relation to the leakage of membership, IEM had looked to various means of retaining members - one of them was to provide better benefits. A number of merchant discounts had been obtained for IEM members. To further provide benefit for Student Members, IEM had implemented action to send employment opportunities direct to Student/Members who fit the requirements listed by the employers.





IEM was also working with Talentcorp where they channel employment opportunities available to IEM for onward transmission to members. The Standing Committee on Admissions and Practical Training (APT) was also working on making Graduate Membership more meaningful by introducing the E-Mentoring (currently in the process of implementation).

In addition to the above, the Logbook scheme rebranded as the Engineering Competency Development was being improved to provide better guide/assistance to the Graduate Members. There was also an award given to the Mentors to encourage more members to come forward to volunteer as Mentors.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) raised some comments on item 4.19.1 especially on Senior Member on reducing the subscription from RM210.00 to RM155.00 and simplifying the process to make it automatic. He felt that not much had been done to address these issues. Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) cited the one of the requirements as stipulated in the IEM Constitutions and Bylaws for Senior Member was that the Member must have at least ten (10) years' experience or fifteen (15) years' experience and with three (3) years as MIEM.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) felt that the figure for this membership grade was low due to mainly on the subscription which was high and also the submission of the Senior member application form. Hence, he suggested that Council to look into this matter again that is to reduce the subscription to be the same as MIEM and also to have the processing of the application done automatically.

He felt that if nothing were to be done, there would not be any member applying for this grade of Senior especially for those who were qualified for this grade.

With regard to the grade of Companion, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) informed the AGM that he was agreeable that the name would be changed to Senior Graduate Member. However, he appealed that this membership could also be processed automatically. He also informed that Graduate members with requirement of eight (8) years' experience could be automatically be transferred to this grade (Senior Grad Member). He hoped that Council could look into this matter.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) further queried on the IEM membership. He cited that last year's figure was 46,555 and this year just it reached to 50,000. However, he further explained that should the figure of 21,000 for student members were to be removed, the remaining figure was the actual number of engineers in IEM's membership.

The AGM was further informed that the number of Graduate Engineers registered with BEM was approximately 116,708 compared to IEM Graduate members of 9584, which was 8.2 %. He further explained that the total number of engineers from 2015 - 2019 (minus the student membership figures) was 20,752 (for 2015), 19,864 (for 2016), 21,280 (for 2017), 21,872 (for 2018) and 21,448 for 2019 which was even lower compared to 2018. Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) commented that basically IEM's membership in terms of engineers had never increased or grown for the last five (5) years. He felt that this was considered a serious matter and the IEM Council and Excomm should look into increasing IEM's membership especially for the engineers.

The President then thanked Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) for his comments and suggestions. The President mentioned where MIEM was concerned, there was an increase of 800 plus members (from 10,230 to 11,048). With reference to Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong concerns, the President explained that the figure of 116,708 of Graduate Engineers registered with BEM was mainly from the bulk registrations done by BEM at the universities. It was noted that the certain amount was given to the university for the next five (5) years to produce the best engineers. The President further explained that although IEM might not be able to follow what BEM had done, IEM had introduced book prize awards as well as providing scholarships for the graduating students. Hence, the President felt that the bulk registration by BEM had affected IEM's graduate membership recruitment. The President also informed that IEM had done an extra initiative whereby in the event there was a signing ceremony of the MoU with the university, IEM would set up registration booths to register the graduating students who would then be transferred to Graduate members.

On the issue concerning the reduction of the subscription fee of the Senior Member, the President agreed that there should be a more easier process for the upgrade to the said membership grade and would look into it.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) pointed out that registration with the Board of Engineers, Malaysia (BEM) was a statutory requirement for all the graduate engineers to be employed as engineers. Whereas IEM being a professional learned society, it was not compulsory to apply for graduate membership. Secondly, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) stressed that registration with BEM was a one-time payment.

However, for IEM, there was a need to pay the annual subscription. YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) felt that this could be one of the reasons why IEM is not being able to get number for Graduate membership.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) hoped that IEM's effort in getting engineering students to apply would eventually increase the Graduate membership once they graduate and in return IEM should ensure to provide more activities and benefits for these group of members.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) further informed the AGM that it was IEM that started the bulk registration and not BEM. IEM then had signed many Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) with the universities. In return, IEM introduced the title "Engr." specially for the Graduate Members. However, the BEM followed suit.





Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah @ Lim Teik Keat (HF01691) suggested that the President should withdraw the amount he mentioned on BEM providing certain amount of funds to the universities. The President agreed to do

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock (HF02531) praised the effort of Council to increase membership although he felt that the Graduate membership did not increase much for the past few years. Nevertheless, he agreed with YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) suggestion that there was a need to capture the graduating students during their graduation so that they would eventually upgrade to Graduate members. This would then increase the graduate membership.

Ir. Mohd Radzi Salleh (F20112) agreed that there was not much increase in the Graduate and Corporate members. Hence, he suggested that there was a need to know why most of the engineers were reluctant to join IEM as members although IEM had implemented the loyalty cards for the members and other initiatives. He stressed that IEM needs to address this issue on the drop-out and find solutions on how to retain them.

Ir. Pick Eng Chong (HF01214) also agreed with Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong's (HF05128) comments that there was not much changes on the number of Graduate members in the IEM membership. He suggested that the new Council could look into introducing a mechanism that could increase the number of graduate members.

4.0 ANNUAL REPORT FOR SESSION 2018/2019

The President then invited the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad to present the various activities and events organised in 2018 which was printed on pages 105 to 108 of the Annual Report. The Honorary Secretary further informed the AGM on the respective headings/items of the following pages:

4.1 Council and Excomm

For the session 2018/2019, a total of five (5) Council meetings were held. The Council at their meetings discussed matters related to management of properties and affairs of the Institution. Excomm had thirteen (13) meetings for session 2018/2019 and the role of Excomm was to implement and carry out the decisions of the Council.

4.2 Day-to-Day Running of the Institution

Excomm continued to be assisted by eight (8) Standing Committees in the day-to-day operations. Each of the Standing Committees is chaired by a Vice President with the Finance Committee being chaired by the Deputy President.

4.3 Membership

The Honorary Secretary further informed that the total membership was 50,281. The AGM noted that up to 31 December 2018, a total of 7,263 candidates were approved for admission/election/transfer to the various grades. However, 2,617 members were in arrears of membership and needed to be suspended. Out of the new members recruited, 4,563 were students.

In terms of breakdown of membership by grades, the Honorary Secretary informed that Student membership had the most percentage that is 55% followed by Corporate Members (24%), Graduate (19%), Companion (1%) and the other grades (0.4%).

With regards to the breakdown in membership by discipline, Civil had the highest number (15,891) followed by Mechanical (12,270), Electrical (7,895), Chemical (3,270) and other disciplines (9,286).

4.4 International Registers

For the international registers and affiliations, it was recorded that for the year 2018, 24 members had signed up as ASEAN Engineers (ASEAN Eng), and 16 were approved for the Associate ASEAN Engineers (AAE) while 32 were approved for IPEA/ APEC International Engineer Registers (IntPE).

4.5 Examinations and Qualifications – Professional Interview

AGM noted that for session 2018/2019, a total of 1265 applied to sit for the Professional Interview (PI). A total of 755 candidates have passed which made up rate of 83.5%. The number of candidates who failed the PI was 210 which made up a failure rate of 16.5%. A total of 223 candidates were still waiting for their results.

4.6 IEM Publication

The Honorary Secretary informed the AGM that twelve (12) issues of the "Jurutera" - IEM Bulletin had been published in 2018. It was further reported that one (1) issue of the Journal was published in 2018. The AGM was further informed that IEM was looking into electronic copy of the Bulletin instead of the hard copy - not only as a cost control measure but also to be more environmental friendly.





4.7 Upcoming Events

The Honorary Secretary further informed on the upcoming events as follows:

- 60th IEM Annual Dinner, Sunway Resort Hotel & Spa on 20 April 2019
- IEM Family Day 2019 on 14 July 2019
- IEM Engineers Run 2019 on 4 August 2019
- IEM Engineering Week 2019 from 4 10 August 2019
- IEM STEM Competition 2019 on 28 August 2019

4.9 Affinity Programme and Corporate Discounts

The Honorary Secretary informed that as part of IEM's efforts to provide more benefits for IEM members, a number of merchants have been signed up to provide discounts to IEM members on various categories such as automobiles (BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Volvo, Audi, Proton, etc.), hotels, healthcare, restaurants and sportswear. The members who have yet to collect their Loyalty Cards were requested to do so at the IEM Secretariat.

The AGM was further informed that there were other benefits in placed for members such as:

- Job Gallery that allows members to upload their resume into the Resume Bank. This is when the employers send in the
 vacancy information to IEM, it would be sent by email blast to the suitable members.
- · companies who had signed MoUs with IEM are able to send vacancy advertisements for posting on the IEM website
- · working with Talentcorp who directs employers who were seeking to employ engineers to IEM

4.10 Memorandum of Understanding (MoU)

The Honorary Secretary informed the AGM that IEM had signed three (3) Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with foreign professional bodies and nine (9) with the Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) for the year 2018.

4.11 IEM Branches - Events and Visits

The AGM was informed that the Miri Branch purchased a new premise in 2018. It was also noted that the IEM Perak Branch hosted the FEIAP General Assembly 2018. The AGM was also informed that the President had visited the twelve (12) IEM Branches for the session 2018/2019.

The Honorary Secretary then conveyed his appreciation to the IEM Secretariat their support and services for the Institution.

4.12 Questions Session - Annual Reports

The President then thanked the Honorary Secretary and proceeded to invite questions from the floor at the Malakoff, the Chin Fung Kee Auditorium and the 2nd floor.

4.12.1 Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) requested to refer to page 110 under item 5.4. He praised the Sub Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions for their endless effort in increasing membership that included having a session with the Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs), having roadshows and membership drive recruitment exercises, initiating Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the IHLs as well as with organisations. In view of this, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) congratulated the Sub Committee.

He then suggested that the issue on Graduate membership should be a permanent item in the Agenda of the relevant Committees mainly the Standing Committee, the Executive Committee (Excomm) and the Council. This was to ensure that this particular issue be discussed thoroughly so as to assist the Sub Committee to increase Graduate membership.

Ir. Prof Dr Norlida Buniyamin (F13746) explained that the Standing Committee on Welfare and Service Matter had assisted on engaging merchants for the loyalty card as one of the latest part of the latest benefit introduced for the members. She pointed out that there were various factors that could lead to the decrease of Graduate members. Nevertheless, the Standing Committee on Admissions and Practical Training (APT) would continue to assist the Sub Committee to recruit members. The President also informed that he had been visiting the government agencies and hoped that for the next twelve (12) months he would do his best to engage engineers from the government and private sector to join IEM. The President then thanked Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) for raising his concerns on this issue.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (HF02828) commented that the most important question to ponder was how much IEM would be able to give its members. He further informed that IEM should change its direction as well as the members' way of thinking.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (HF00015) informed that IEM should be more proactive and vigorously promote IEM membership to the government agencies as well as the private sectors of the engineering field. The President agreed that IEM needs to raise its image in the engineering fraternity.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) sought explanation on page 125 on the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws. He queried on the manner/process on how the decisions or proposals were made and thereafter presented to the Standing Committee on Professional Practice.

The President further explained that the recommendations made by the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws would be presented to Excomm for comments and thereafter to Council for approval/endorsement. Should there be any comments by Council, the issue would be reverted to Excomm and thereafter to the Special Committee for their onward action.

However, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) further queried on the number of meetings held and the composition of the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws. He commented on page 26 of the Annual Report, that there was only one (1) person serving in the Special Committee and questioned whether there were more members.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) further explained that he was the only person serving in the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws and his task was to amend the IEM Constitutions and Bylaws should there be any request for amendments by the Excomm or the Council. Should there be any amendments, the Special Committee comprising of Ir. Lai Sze Ching would recommend to Excomm. It was noted that Excomm would further deliberate before proceeding to present to Council for approval.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Lee Yee Cheong (DHF00220) further informed the AGM that the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws had been a one (1) man Committee since the time of the late Academician Tan Sri Ir. (Dr) J. G. Daniel. However, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Lee Yee Cheong (DHF00220) explained that there were times that the Special Committee had more members but it would depend on issue for discussion. He commented that members from the AGM or the Council should query on the process instead of the Past President who would have known the process.

Ir. Pick Eng Chong (HF01214) further commented that during his time, the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws had more members who had legal experience or background as Excomm did not have the time to deliberate on legal matters. Hence, he felt that this issue would need to look into.

President then explained that Excomm had deliberated on issues concerning the amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws as recommended by the Special Committee and thereby have eventually presented to Council for further comments.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) responded to YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Lee Yee Cheong's (DHF00220) on his statement that Past Presidents should know the process better. He further commented that the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws was considered an important Committee as any changes made to the constitution would affect the direction of the Institution. The AGM was further informed when the Special Committee was chaired by the late Academician Tan Sri Ir. (Dr) J. G. Daniel, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon also served in the said Committee. Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) further explained that during his tenure as President from the year 2011 - 2013, Ir. Pick Eng Chong had five (5) to six (6) members serving in the Special Committee. Hence, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) suggested that there should be more members serving in the Special Committee rather than just one (1) person that had been operating for the past four (4) years. President took note of his suggestion.

Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin (F11712) pointed out that it would be up to the AGM to decide whether to accept or reject the IEM Constitution and Bylaws that had been drafted by the Special Committee. Nevertheless, he also agreed that there should be more than one (1) member serving in the Special Committee in order to have more views/inputs.

Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) informed the AGM that he was the member of the Special Committee on Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws chaired by the late Academician Tan Sri Ir. (Dr) J. G. Daniel and thereafter by YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon. However, he further informed that he never received any letter stating that he was no longer in the Special Committee. President suggested that Ir. C.M. Aboobucker (M13942) could be invited again to serve in the Special Committee Amendments to Constitution and Bylaws. On separate issue, Ir. C.M. Aboobucker (M01394) queried on page 106 on the engineering discipline - "Fuel" as there were two (2) Fellows and the other on "General" and "Others" on page 107. He sought clarification on the classification of the mentioned engineering disciplines.

The President explained that the classification was tied with the BEM. Nevertheless, President agreed to obtain more detailed information on the mentioned engineering disciplines.

Since there were no further comments or questions from the floor, Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin (F11712) proposed that the Annual Report be adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Wong Chee Fui (F20903).





5.0 ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

- The President then invited the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai to present the financial statements for The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia for the period 1st January 2018 to 31st December 2018. Ir. Dr Tan Chee Fai further informed the AGM that the accounts presented would be from pages 164 to 191.
- 5.2 The Honorary Treasurer informed the AGM that the financial statements presented comprised of two sets of accounts. It was noted the figures did not include the financial position of the IEM Branches. The AGM was further informed that the Branches would file their own set of financial statements with the IRB of their respective States. The Honorary Treasurer further informed that the columns denoted by "Group" referred to the consolidated accounts of the IEM Headquarters, IEM Training Centre and IEM Academy Sdn Bhd.

The Honorary Treasurer further explained that there were some columns where there were figures under "Institutions" but blank under "Group" due to the figures being payment/receipt between IEM, IEM Training Centre (TC) and IEM Academy Sdn Bhd (ASB) which were eliminated on consolidation.

- 5.3 The Honorary Treasurer reported that the total income for 2018 was approximately RM5,113,070. It was further reported that the memberships' subscription was the biggest amount with 65% of the total income for IEM, followed by the rental income of 12.4% and thereafter the institutional services which was 8.8%. The Honorary Treasurer further reported that the total income was higher in 2018 compared to 2017 due to the sales of the IEM Penang Branch property, the dividend from IEM TC and also the rental income from Wisma IEM.
- 5.4 The Annual Subscriptions collection for the year 2018 had increased to 4.2% compared to 2017. The Honorary Treasurer further reported that the rental income has dropped 45%, interest income which decreased to 43%, credit card commission increased to 1.4%, income from institutional services increased to 26%, Secretariat services increased to 48% and the income from Technical Division increased to 22%.
- 5.5 The Honorary Treasurer further informed that the total expenses for 2018 was RM6,081,431, an increase of 7.8% compared to 2017 which was RM5,640,271. The increase was mainly from the personal emoluments which was 3.7%, whereas the administrative expenses decreased by 2.5%, Branch subsidies decreased by 10%, depreciation of equipment increased by 8%, building maintenance cost increased by 24%, subscription fees written off was increased by 61%.
- 5.6 The Honorary Treasurer further reported that the main contributors to the total expenses items were personnel emoluments with 46% whereas the administrative expenses was 21%, the building maintenance cost was about 20%. The overall performance as compared to 2017 was a deficit amounting to RM1,068,817 for 2018.
- 5.7 The AGM was also informed that the comparative performance for the last two (2) years showed that there was surplus of RM1,823,390 for 2017. However, for the year 2018, there was a deficit of RM1,068,817. It was reported that the rental for Wisma IEM for 2017 from MKM was RM588K but for 2018, only the rental of RM90,000 was collected. If this is taken into consideration, then operation surplus/(deficit) would be RM978,817.

It was also noted that the dividend from IEMTC for 2017 was a deficit of RM489,289 whereas there was none for the year 2018. Overall difference on the last two (2) years was RM288,300.

5.8 The Honorary Treasurer then informed the comparison on the budget for the two years; 2017 and 2018. It was reported that in 2017 it was anticipated that IEM would be in deficit due to the loss of the rental for the 2018 projected budget. Hence, as budgeted the deficit was RM503,014. However, the actual budget was RM1,608,817.

As for depreciation, there was RM550,000 for 2018 budget whereas the actual was RM660,204. As for the subscription the projected budget was RM400,000 but for the actual figure was RM274,455.

As such, the total budgeted income was RM5,877,745 whereas the actual was RM5,113,070. The AGM was informed that the total expenses budgeted was RM6,380,760 whereas the actual was RM6,081,431.

5.9 The AGM was informed that the actual cash flow for 2018 was a deficit of RM356,547 whereas budgeted for 2019 was RM300,393. With regards to the total collection, it was RM6,254,579 and projected for 2019 was RM5,772,097. Hence, for actual 2018 was a deficit of RM300,393 whereas projected this year (2019) was RM222,901.

The Honorary Treasurer then thanked the Task Force on Annual Fee Collection although the Committee was not listed in the Annual Report. It was noted that the Task Force rendered their assistance liaising with the Branches.

The Honorary Treasurer also thanked the Sub Committee on Infrastructure as well as the Secretariat for putting effort on improving the maintenance of the IEM Building and Wisma IEM.

The President thanked the Honorary Treasurer for his report and proceeded to invite questions from the floor.





5.10 Questions Session - Accounts

5.10.1 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) requested the AGM to refer to page 165 on the "Trade and non-Trade Receivables" under the Current Asset heading.

He commented that figure 8 was not clear. He also commented the same for "Trade and non-Trade Payables" under the heading Liabilities with figure 16. Hence, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) sought explanation on the mentioned figures as he pointed that there was a Task Force formed and yet the receivables on both sides were still high.

The Deputy President then explained that under the heading for "Institution" the figure was approximately RM1.5 million whereas under the heading for "Group", the figure was RM4.0 million. He further explained that this was due to the income from the World Tunelling Conference 2020 (WTC2020) event. It was noted that for the WTC2020 event the invoice was issued approximately RM4 million and the collection received was about RM1.8 million. The AGM was further informed that the IEM was able to secure an important event via the IEM TC. Hence, the Deputy President further explained that this was fundamentally the result of the increase of revenue via the invoicing and the collection to be received for the WTC2020 event. The Honorary Treasurer further reiterated that the presentation was for the "Institution" and not the "Group" account.

5.10.2 Ir. Ng Yen Yee (M33777) suggested that one way IEM could increase the revenue was by working with JKR to have competency training programmes for the site personnel especially in the civil discipline. This would be similar to what the Energy Commission and ILSAS was currently doing by conducting competency training programmes for the charge-man and wire-man. It was further suggested that the programme could be part of a regulatory requirement and be certified.

The President then continued to explain on the deficit of RM1,068 million. He further explained in per page 165 that for the year 2018, the income component was RM3.38 million which was RM58,000 less than 2017 (approximately 1.7%). As for the expenditure component on page 166, there was an increase of RM101,000 (3.7%) under the personal emolument as compared to 2017.

The President agreed that this was unavoidable due to the increase on the cost of living and as such, the salary of the staff had to be increased. However, the President pointed out that the administrative expenses were less compared to 2017. In conclusion, the President informed the AGM to not look at the figure of RM1.068 million as this was part of the accounting system. The Institution's actual deficit was RM200,000 and it was mainly from the personal emolument and the members' subscription in arrears. Nevertheless, the President informed that steps were being taken to address this issue.

- 5.10.3 Ir. Selva Sukanthiran a/I Karuppaiah (M10437) queried on the 50% drop in the training and registration fees. He further commented that in 2017 the figure was RM2.4 million but it drop drastically to RM1.2 million in 2018. The President explained that the Member was looking under the "Group" which was the IEM TC and Academy Sdn Bhd and not IEM. Ir. Selva Sukanthiran a/I Karuppaiah (M10437) further queried that since IEM TC and Academy Sdn Bhd were subsidiaries of IEM, it was not supposed to be in the accounts. The President explained that it was the basic requirement by "Suruhanjaya Syarikat Malaysia (SSM)" to include a consolidated account.
- 5.10.4 Ir. Ng Yen Yee (M33777) also reiterated with her suggestion the IEM could closely work with JKR to conduct a competency training for the civil general workers which also included foreigners to increase the Institution's income. President thanked Ir. Ng Yen Yee's concern and would look into her suggestion.

Ir. Prof. Dr Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin (F20286) responded to the query on behalf of Ir. Gopal Narian Kutty (the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Activities) that the Civil and Structural Engineering Technical Division with the assistance from Ir. Gopal Narian Kutty who is from JKR were looking into working closely with JKR to conduct training programmes for the civil engineers.

As there were no further questions from the floor, Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (M01922) proposed the adoption of the Financial Statements for IEM for the year ended 31 December 2018. The motion was seconded by Ir. Dr Ng Soon Ching (M30662). The AGM then adopted the Financial Statement.

6.0 EDUCATION FUND FINANCIAL STATEMENT - 31 DECEMBER 2018

- 6.1 The Honorary Treasurer then continued to report on the Financial Statements of the Education Fund for the year ending 31 December 2018 from page 195 to page 204.
- 6.2 The AGM was informed that donations received amounted to RM49,810 in 2018 compared to RM227,036 in 2017. The Fixed Deposit Interest earned amounted to RM43,234 compared to RM38,132 in 2017.
- 6.3 On the expenditure side, the Honorary Treasurer reported that the scholarship given out in 2018 was RM34,000, He further informed that other expenses such as overseas conferences included RM34,896 and for the Student Section Subsidy was RM10,000 and other expenses was at RM923. For scholarships under the Mr. Koon Yew Yin Scholarship, interviews was held in 2019 for new scholarship recipients.
- 6.4 The Honorary Treasurer further reported that for the overall performance, there was a surplus of RM60,198 in 2018 compared to a surplus of RM178,633 in 2017.





6.5 For the overall Financial Statements of 2018, there was a decrease of 2.5% (RM1,633,216 which included fixed deposits, cash and cash equivalents) compared to RM1,673,611 in 2017.

As for the Accumulated Fund, there was an increase of 2.4% which amounted to RM2,564,909 in the year 2018 compared to RM2.504.711 in 2017.

Since there were no questions from the floor, Ir. Wong Chee Fui (F20903) proposed the adoption of the Education Fund financial statement for the year ended 31 December 2018 and the motion was supported by Ir. Gan Tian Eng (M04904). The AGM then adopted the Education Fund financial statement.

7.0 DISCUSSION ON WRITTEN ISSUES RECEIVED FROM MEMBERS

The AGM was informed that there was a letter dated 26 March 2019 submitted by Ir. Yap Soon Hoe concerning a complaint against the President. As such, the President handed over the chair to the Deputy President. However, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) suggested that there was a need to refer to the IEM Constitution and Bylaws on who should be the chair for this case. It was noted that the AGM had to elect someone from the floor to chair this particular case. Hence, President requested the AGM to propose a member to chair this item.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) proposed Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) to chair this item and the motion was seconded by Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128).

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) informed that the "Complainant" would need to state and explain his complaint and the "Respondent" would be allowed to respond to the complaint. However, the AGM was informed that the Complainant was currently overseas and there was no representative to represent him. Since the Complainant was not present, the AGM was informed that this case either had to be dismissed or be discussed in a separate meeting.

However, Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) explained that the letter was discussed at one of the Excomm meetings. However, since if it was a complaint against a member, it had to be forwarded to the Standing Committee on Professional Practice (PPC) to take up the case rather than to be discussed at the AGM.

Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (F01922) mentioned that since the Complainant was not present, hence this issue should not be discussed and be dismissed. Ir. Awangku Hidup Awangku Hosain (F03053) also agreed with the suggestion by Ir. Yong Kee Chiang that this case would need to be presented at the PPC.

The Honorary Secretary explained to the AGM that the letter dated 26 March 2019 (as projected on the screen) was the third one submitted by the Complainant. It was noted that the similar issues were discussed both at Excomm and Council and Excomm had replied to the Complainant dated 28 August 2018 and 13 December 2018. However, it was noted that Complainant was not satisfied with IEM's replies and he decided to write in a third letter.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah further informed that this issue should not have been presented at the AGM as it was not related to the running of the Institution. He commented whether it was a complaint against an individual/member or the Office Bearer and according to the IEM Constitution, it should be presented to the Excomm for an investigation to be made. Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah further explained that should there be any element of misconduct, the IEM Constitution allowed for an Ad-Hoc Committee to look into the complaint.

Without knowing the content of the letter dated 21 June 2018, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah raised the question whether the complaint was against the Office Bearer of the Institution or was it against an individual member. YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) further commented that since the Complainant was not available to present his case at the AGM, he proposed that this issue be referred back to Council for further discussion as per the IEM Constitution.

However, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah interjected that when the agenda of the AGM was sent to the members, it had an item which offered any members to raise any written issues for discussion at the AGM. It was also commented that it was the responsibility of the Honorary Secretary to check whether the letter was related to the business of the Institution. In addition, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah further commented that if this issue was a complaint made against a member or an Office Bearer, it should not be discussed at the AGM. Moreover, the letter dated 26 March 2019 stated that the entirety of his letter to be deliberated at the AGM.

The Honorary Secretary further explained that there were three (3) issues concerning this case; firstly was the President's travel expenses to the IEM Branches; secondly was the President's travel to London to attend the IEA Meeting in London; and thirdly was on general matters concerning the visits by the President to the ministries and the Prime Minister whether it benefited the Institution.

However, Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) further commented that the complaint was not on Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi as an individual but on his position as a President of the Institution.

Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (F01922) reiterated his proposal that this issue should not be discussed and be removed from the agenda immediately. He further commented that this was basically a complaint from one member who did not like the way the President conducted his mode of operation and it was more of a personal matter.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (HF00015) felt there was a need to make a decision whether this issue should be discussed at the AGM since it was stated in the agenda.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah further explained that had the complaint been made against Excomm, then Excomm should appoint an independent body.

The Deputy President further clarified that the complaint was made against an individual per se. With regards to the three (3) issues stated in the letter and as pointed out by the Honorary Secretary, the Deputy President requested the wisdom of the AGM whether the complaint was on a personal matter or against the Institution or the Council or the Excomm per se. Hence, he felt that the AGM should make a decision.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) suggested that Excomm should not make any comments as this issue had been discussed at the Excomm meetings. Hence, he further suggested that it would be up to the AGM to make a decision. He further pointed out that anything that been done for the Institution should not be considered as a personal matter. Hence, there was a need to separate the issue; either personal or for the Institution.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (HF03975) suggested that the complaint be referred to the Council and not at the AGM. Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin (F11712) provided his view that Excomm consists of IEM members and as such all members including the Excomm have equal rights.

Nevertheless, he commented that since the Complainant was not present, he supported the notion that this issue be presented at the Council for further deliberation instead of this AGM.

Ir. William Ho Choo Kwang (M17178) also suggested that the AGM was not an appropriate forum to discuss this issue and it should be reverted to Council. Ir. Lt. Kol Mohd Hazani bin Shafie (F16292) also supported the suggestion that Council should deliberate on this issue and not the AGM.

Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05613) informed that this issue was more on a certain amount of misunderstanding. Nevertheless, he felt that every member had the right to voice out their views and he agreed with the suggestion from Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin and Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (HF03975) that this matter be discussed further at Council.

Ir. Gunasagaran Kristnan (M08216) commented that this issue had been ongoing since a year ago and the complaint was mainly on President's running of the Institution. Moreover, IEM had replied to the Complainant's complaints. Hence, he felt that it was not necessary to discuss this issue at the AGM.

Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin (HF01019) felt that since the Complainant was not present, it was not necessary for the AGM to discuss on this issue be it now or in the future should there be such a situation. Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin (HF01019) also supported the notion that this issue be reverted to Council.

Ir. John Cheah Kam Loong (F01186) also supported the comments/suggestions made by the past Presidents that this issue should be presented to Council and not at the AGM.

Ir. Mohd Radzi bin Salleh (F20112) also felt and commented that this issue should not be discussed at the AGM due to firstly, the Complainant was not present and secondly, the subject should have been thoroughly discussed before presenting at the AGM.


Ir. Tu Yong Eng (M15448) commented that the issue started in June 2017 and it had been almost a year and hope that Excomm and Council should come up with a conclusion on this issue.

After hearing the comments and opinions of the AGM, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah felt that this issue had to be done by the rule of law. He further reiterated whether the complaint was made either against a member or an Office Bearer of which the IEM Constitution allowed for a process to take place. Moreover, this issue was not related to the business of the AGM and had been mistakenly included into the Agenda of the AGM.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah further explained that whether it was a case against an individual member or against the Office Bearer in running of the Institution. The Excomm would need to report to Council and thereafter present at the next AGM.

The President then thanked Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah for chairing the session on the complaint made by one of the members against the President.





8.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

President informed the AGM to go through the pages 6 to 15 on the amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws. The President then pointed out the amendments in the various articles as stated in the said mentioned pages:

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) commented whether the President would be presenting the amendments in total or article by article on the amendments as if in total, the whole amendments would then be rejected should there be no consensus made. As such, the President posed to the floor on this matter and the AGM agreed to go through the amendments article by article.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

Article 2.2

The AGM agreed that the word "to add" be removed in the proposed amendments section.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) sought clarification on the item "(ed) Engineering Technician Graduate Members" whether this category would mean that "Technician" was considered as graduates.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) informed the AGM that this category was debated at Excomm. However, there was no suitable word and hence the word decided was "technician". Moreover, it was noted that there was no definition that a graduate must be a degree holder.

Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin (HF01019) commented that there were more appropriate words to be used such as "certified and qualified technician" which had been used by Malaysia Board of Technology (MBOT). Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin further explained that one who had been graduated was called as "qualified" whereas one who becomes a professional technician would be called as "certified". Hence, Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin suggested that IEM could adopt the same terms.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) commented that for item (d) "Senior Graduate Members", there was a capital letter for each word and these words should be defined somewhere as per legal definition. He further cited that for the word "Graduate Members" which should have a same status as Graduate Members of IEM as the said word had been defined.

He further informed that there would be confusion on the term "Engineering Technologist Members" as the person should possess a degree equivalent to "Graduate Members". He felt that it would not be appropriate to have the same words at two (2) different grades (Graduate Member and Engineering Technologist Member).

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) pointed out that the membership grades had been defined on page 9 of the Annual Report.

However, Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) further explained that when there was a capital letter on the word "Graduate", it would be defined whereas "Engineering Technologist Members" was considered as a phrase.

Nevertheless, Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) informed the AGM that the definition of the mentioned grades had been explicitly defined in page 6 of the Annual Report that is 2.15A onward.

Ir. Shum Keng Yan (M14287) suggested that articles 2.2, 2.4, 2.5 would be automatically valid if the AGM could start looking from the bottom of the amendments. He further suggested that it would be advisable to go through the interpretations for clarity purpose and thereafter follow through on the membership grades for approval.

Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin (HF01019) further reiterated on the subject of the membership grade "Engineering Technician Graduate Member" as it may raise confusion that whether the technician is a graduate. Y.Bhg further explained on the perception that unless a person holds a degree, he/she was not a graduate. Y.Bhg commented that in the case of a "Engineering Technician Graduate Member" it was clearly stated that he/she is a graduate and had a degree.

However, for the technician, he/she holds a diploma and not a degree and hence there was a need to differentiate the two grades. The AGM was further informed that in practice, a diploma holder was not a graduate and this had been accepted. According to the MBOT Act, it was clearly defined that a technician is certified and not a graduate.

Ir. Shum Keng Yan (M14287) suggested that the AGM should go through the whole agenda and decide on the articles that needed to be approved in principle. In cases where there were further improvements to be made especially on the certified or qualified issues, he further suggested that a Working Group be formed. In this way, the AGM could continue to proceed and discuss on other matters in the agenda.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (HF03975) informed the AGM that the IEM Constitution had no definition stated but there was interpretation. He further informed that there was no interpretation on the term "Graduate" but there was one on the word "Member" with the capital "M". President then pointed out item 10.10 (ARTICLE X - Interpretation) from the IEM Constitution.





YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) proposed to second the proposal from Ir. Shum Keng Yan (M14287) that AGM should approve in principle on the amendments. With regards to the detailed improvement, he suggested that a Committee be formed to look into the definition or interpretation upon considering the MBOT and the Registration of Engineers Acts.

Article 2.4

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) commented on deleting the title "Engr" in the proposed amendment.

He questioned whether anything had been done or discussed on the use of the title "Engr" before deleting the said word. He further explained that once the word "Engr." had been deleted, it would mean that the subject on the usage of the title "Engr." considered as closed for good.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) expressed his unhappiness on removing the title "Engr." from the proposed amendment. He further explained that the title was first introduced during the Presidency of Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin where a Committee was formed to come up with a proper working paper on the usage of the title "Engr." And thereafter it went through Excomm, Council as well as having a Special Council meeting to discuss on this issue. Hence, he felt that it was not proper to just remove the said title without preparing a proper working paper.

President then explained that in January 2016, there was a meeting with the then President, Y.Bhg Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock and the former Minister of Works, YB Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof. It was noted that at the meeting it was agreed that the issue be forwarded to the Attorney General's Chamber for a decision. It was noted that BEM had issued a letter to IEM to suspend the usage of the title "Engr." to the Graduate members. Subsequently, BEM had written a letter of reprimand to the members whose names were listed in the Jurutera with the title "Engr."

President further explained that recently he and his delegation met with the Minister of Works, YB Datuk Baru Bian and proposed that the good office of the Minister to request for a decision from the Attorney General's Chamber as this issue had been pending for quite a long time.

With regard to the comments made by Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong, the President informed that twenty (20) of IEM members received a "show cause letter" from BEM on the usage of the title "Engr." The President further explained that the Graduate members could still use the title based on the Constitution. However, they would need to cushion that part of the legal area. Hence, it was suggested that the title "Engr." be removed temporary from the Constitution until a decision has been made from the Attorney General's Chamber.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) further explained that should the title "Engr." be removed from the Constitution, IEM had no rights. Although, it was pointed out that the Graduate members could use the title based on the Constitution, it wold contravene the REA. Hence, the Graduate members were advised to not use the title until a decision is made by the Attorney General's Chamber.

Y.Bhg Dato' Lim Chow Hock (HF02531) informed the AGM that during his tenure as a President, the Minister of Works at that time, assured that the suspension of the title "Engr." would be temporarily. As such, Y.Bhg Dato' Lim Chow Hock also agreed with the suggestion from Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah to not remove the title "Engr." in the Constitution and to wait until the decision from the Attorney General's Chamber had been sought.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) also agreed with the suggestions from Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah and Y.Bhg Dato' Lim Chow Hock that the title "Engr." should remain in the Constitution. He further informed that it was not a correct procedure to strike off the statement without proper deliberation or discussion.

YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) commented that although the usage of the title "Engr." would be against the Act of Parliament as well as being objected by some other parties, he stressed that the IEM's Constitution had been in due process being approved by the members in general and also the Registrar of Society (ROS).

Hence, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) further commented that it was not illegal. Nevertheless, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik agreed with Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah as well as the past presidents to maintain the "Engr." in the Constitution. He further suggested that the President and his new delegation could meet with the new Attorney General and put forward IEM's case on the usage of the title "Engr."

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (HF02828) also pointed out that this issue was not discussed at the Council meetings. However, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) interjected to state this issue had been discussed at Council but not properly deliberated.

Due to the limited time the AGM had, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) suggested to agree in principle Article 2.2. As for Article 2.4, the removal of the title "Engr." was not agreed upon. In addition, it was also suggested that where there was a need to amend the wordings and this would be presented to Council to form a Committee to look into whether it should be in line with the MBOT and REA Acts. This would also be related to the agreements/mobility of Engineering Technologist and Engineering Technicians.





YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik also stressed the fact that should the amendments be delayed for another year, IEM would not be able to represent Malaysia to sign the agreements. Hence, he further informed the AGM to expedite the voting session.

Hence, the AGM agreed in principle Article 2.2 of which the non-Corporate Members would consist of 13 grades but whether the technicians were qualified or certified, there was a need to ensure the norms were adhered to. A voting was done and the results were as follows:

The motion was carried.

Article 2.4

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) proposed to also replace the word "Companion" with "Senior Graduate Member". The AGM was informed that there was a motion to delete the proposed last five (5) lines including to remove "Engr" and the results were as follows:

Malakoff - 10 2nd floor - 14 3rd floor - 13 Total - 37

The AGM took a vote on the motion to retain the title "Engr." and the overall result was as follows:

Hence, the motion was not carried.

Article 2.5

As agreed earlier, Article 2.2 and this Article 2.5 were related and agreed in principle. As such, the AGM agreed to forward to Council on the actual wordings for the necessary action to be taken. Hence, there would not be any voting to be done.

Article 2.14

There was no voting done as it was related to the wordings and would be presented to Council for the necessary actions to be taken.

Article 4.1 and Article 4.2

The AGM took a vote on these two Articles as it was on the classification of fees for the various membership grades. The results were as follows:

With regards to the inclusion of the four (4) new grades and the terminology would be presented to Council.

Article 4.2.1

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah explained to the AGM that for this Article, it was divided into two (2) parts; one was the change of the words from Companion to Senior Graduate Member and the other was on the fees for Engineering Technologist and Engineering Technician. There was a query that the fee for the Engineering Technician was RM155.00 which was the same as a Graduate Member.





As such, there was a proposal that the said membership grade should not be charged. However, the AGM agreed that there should be a fee but the quantum or the rate should be forwarded to Council for deliberation. Hence, a vote was taken on the motion to charge a fee and the results were as follows:

The motion was carried.

Article 5.1

The AGM agreed in principle Article 5.1. However, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) suggested for the Council to re-look at the word "Members" as per the Constitution it was stated as on Corporate Members. He further referred to Clause 2.3 of the Constitution that states:

Clause 2.3

"Only Corporate Members have the right to vote, to requisition meetings and to be elected to the Council. Non- Corporate Members can be appointed to Council".

He further explained that the mentioned Clause 2.3 may not be in line with Article 5.1 as it states that members with capital letter "M" were eligible to vote. Hence, YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik pointed out that there was a need to thoroughly check on whether the grades as listed in the proposed amendments for Article 2.2 were eligible to vote in Council. Hence, he felt that the Sub Committee on Amendments to the Constitution would have to thoroughly go through to ensure that these grades were eligible to vote to suit Article 5.1.

Ir. Wong Chee Fui (F20903) also supported YBhg. Academician Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik's suggestion to thoroughly check the Constitution to ensure there was consistency in the proposed amendments in Article 2.2 and Article 5.1. As such, the President agreed that the terminology or the wording would be presented to Council for discussion.

Article 5.2

The AGM agreed that amendments were purely administrative in manner. However, Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) commented that there was a need to look at the whole Constitution in general.

At this juncture, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah suggested that the agenda for this item, i.e. Agenda 6 be changed to Agenda 13 as he felt that most of the members were leaving and there might not be any quorum. He felt that the amendments should have done via a Special General Meeting (SGM) and thereafter to convene after the AGM.

In view of this, the Deputy President sought the consent of the AGM to go through other Agendas first so as to follow the rule of law. Hence, the proposal was seconded by Ir. Choo Kok Beng and the motion was carried.

9.0 ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ELECTION RESULTS FOR COUNCIL 2019/2020 SESSION

The President then invited the Election Officer, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon to announce the results of the election for the session 2019/2020.

9.1 President and Deputy President

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon informed the AGM that in accordance with Section 5.2 of the IEM Bylaws Section 5.13 the current President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi, continued his second term in the office of the being the Preside while Ir. Ong Chiong Loon continues in the office of the Deputy President 2019/2020.

9.2 Vice Presidents, Hon Secretary, Hon Treasurer and Others

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon then informed the AGM on the following offices required balloting:

9.2.1 Office of Council Member – Representative of Other Disciplines (One (1) vacancy for 3 sessions, 2019/2020, 2020/2021, 2021/2022)

The AGM was informed that there were two (2) nominations were received for this office.

However, one of the candidates was not eligible under this category as he was registered in the IEM database in Civil discipline. Thus, the remaining candidate was Ir. Bhuvendhraa Rudrusamy was duly elected unopposed to the office of Council Member – Representative of Other Discipline for the sessions 2019/2020, 2020/2021 and 2012/2022.





- 9.3 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon then informed the AGM that the following offices required balloting:
 - · Vice Presidents with 8 candidates
 - Honorary Secretary with 2 candidates
 - Honorary Treasurer with 2 candidates
 - · Council Members Ordinary Representatives with 25 candidates

9.3.1 Office of Vice President (Three (3) vacancies for 2 sessions 2018/2019 and 2019/2020)

The AGM was informed that measures were taken to get the ballot papers sent out to members for the offices which required balloting i.e. for Vice Presidents, Honorary Secretary, Honorary Treasurer and Ordinary Council members. A total of 11,542 ballot papers were sent and delivered to Corporate Members. The Ballot Box at the IEM Secretariat was sealed on 6 Apirl 2019 at 10.100am. A total of 1,711 ballot papers were received at the IEM when the Ballot Box was opened thereafter a 10.15am. After checking and verification of ballot papers, counting of votes were carried at 10.50am out to determine the successful candidates.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon further informed the AGM that there were eight (8) nominations received for the four (4) vacancies. The following four (4) candidates with the highest number of votes were duly elected to the office of Vice President for the sessions 2019/2020 and 2020/2021:

The President thanked YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon for rending his services and support for being for conducting the election process.

ARTICLE VI - MANAGEMENT

Article 6.10

Y.Bhg Academician Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) suggested that Council should re-look into the amendment as he felt that there should be flexibility. He further referred to the statement ("Note-this is to synchronise with 6.19 of Bylaws) which he commented was with the Executive Committee and was not related with the Council. Hence, Y.Bhg Academician Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik suggested not to amended so as to allow flexibility. In the event there was a need to change the figure it would be easier to amend in the Bylaws rather than the Constitution. Hence, the AGM unanimously agreed to retain the number twenty four (24) instead of nineteen (19).

Article 10.9

The AGM accepted the amendments in principle.

Bylaw - SECTION II Qualifications for Membership

The AGM agreed that this item would be approved by Council.

However, Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) queried on the rationale of deleting ".....who shall be normally appointed for a term of three (3) sessions, with one third (1/3) of them retiring at the end of each session." of Bylaws 6.3 – The Standing Committee on Admissions and Practical Training. He further commented that if the wordings had been removed it would be perpetual in nature.

Y.Bhg Academician Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) also felt that the word "shall normally" should be retained. This was to ensure that there would be new members appointed. He further commented that should the wordings be removed, it would indicate that there would not be any opportunity to bring in new members.

Y.Bhg. Datuk Paduka Ir. (Dr.) Hj Keizrul bin Abdullah (HF01691) also commented that all these years the members would be re-appointed after one (1) year, and as such it was not perpetual. Nevertheless, Y.Bhg Academician Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) proposed that Council to re-look and approve to retain the Bylaws 6.30 until 6.42.

The AGM agreed with the proposal.

17.0 ANY OTHER BUSINESS (AOB)

The President invited the AGM to raise any issues for discussion.

17.1 Ir. John Cheah Kam Loong (F01186) informed the AGM that he was the Chairman of the Ad-Hoc Committee on Dengue Control of the IEM Southern Branch. According to Ir. John Cheah, the State of Selangor had the most cases of dengue incidences with over 3000 cases. He proposed that the good office of the President could inform the rest of the IEM Branches to set up an Ad-Hoc Committee on Dengue Control. It was also suggested that the IEM Branches could work together with the government agencies to assist in searching and destroying the dengue breeding areas. President agreed to raise this issue at the next pre-dialogue session.





18.0 PRESIDENTIAL ADDRESS FOR THE SESSION 2019/2020

18.1 The Emcee then invited the President to present the Presidential Address 2019 entitled "ENGINEERING THE NATION".

19.0 ADJOURNMENT OF 60TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING 2019

19.1 The President informed that the attendance for this AGM was 444, one of the highest in IEM history. The President then thanked the Organising Committee as well as the Chairman Ir. Gopal Narian Kutty for their relentless effort of selling a total of 138 tables for the Annual Dinner.

The President then declared the 60th Annual General Meeting adjourned at 1.45 pm and he thanked the members for their presence. The President then reminded the members that the Annual Dinner 2019 would be held at the Grand Ballroom, Sunway Resort Hotel and Spa. He also thanked those who have purchased seats in support for the annual dinner.

1.0 KATA-KATA ALUAN OLEH YANG DIPERTUA

1.1 Yang DiPertua, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi mengucapkan terima kasih dan mengalu-alukan kehadiran para ahli ke Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan yang ke-60. Beliau juga mengalu-alukan kehadiran para Bekas Yang DiPertua dan Pengerusi-pengerusi cawangan-cawangan IEM. Beliau kemudian memaklumkan bahawa tiga bilik yang berbeza adalah digunakan untuk Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan, iaitu Auditorium Malakoff di tingkat bawah yang akan menjadi ruang utama, Bilik Kuliah C & S / TUS bertempat di tingkat 2 dan akhir sekali Auditorium Tan Sri Prof Chin Fung Kee yang terletak di tingkat 3.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa persidangan video akan diadakan di kedua-dua bilik di tingkat dua dan tingkat tiga (Auditorium Tan Sri Prof Ir. Chin Fung Kee dan bilik kuliah C & S / TUSTD). Yang DiPertua juga memberitahu bahawa Urusetia akan ditempatkan di setiap bilik untuk membantu ahli-ahli semasa Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan (MAT) berlangsung. Yang DiPertua kemudiannya meminta ahli-ahli untuk memberitahu nama dan nombor keahlian semasa sesi soal jawab untuk tujuan rekod.

MAT kemudiannya dimaklumkan berkenaan perkara-perkara penting yang telah berlaku dalam sesi 2018/2019.

1.2 Peristiwa Penting Sesi 2019/2020

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa bilangan keahlian IEM kini telah melebihi 50,000 iaitu seramai 50,281 dari pelbagai gred keahlian. Angka ini bagaimanapun telah mencapai 50% dari sasaran 100,000 menjelang tahun 2020 seperti yang diberikan oleh Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong Bekas Yang di-Pertua IEM.

IEM baru-baru ini telah menandatangani Memorandum Persefahaman (MOU) dengan beberapa institusi pengajian tinggi dan pertubuhan. Antaranya adalah Kolej Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (TAR UC) pada 7 Mei 2018, Universiti SEGi pada 1 Jun 2018, "Iraqi Engineers Union" pada 12 Julai 2018, Universiti Manipal pada 8 Ogos 2018 dan Universiti MAHSA pada 22 Disember 2018. Selain dari itu, IEM juga telah menandatangani MOU bersama China Association of Science and Technology (CAST) pada 22 November 2018 di Xian, China dan beberapa Institusi Pengajian Tinggi Awam (IPTA) tempatan termasuk Universiti Malaysia Perlis (UniMAP) pada 26 Oktober 2018 di Kangar, Perlis yang disaksikan oleh Yang Teramat Mulia Raja Muda Perlis.

Yang DiPertua seterusnya memaklumkan MAT bahawa IEM juga telah membuat beberapa kunjungan hormat serta dialog dengan pelbagai Kementerian seperti kunjungan hormat ke pejabat Datuk Seri Ir. Dr Zaini Ujang, Ketua Setiausaha Kementerian Tenaga, Teknologi Hijau dan Air (KeTTHA) pada 1 Jun 2018 dan YB Puan Yeo Bee Yin, Menteri Tenaga, Sains, Teknologi, Alam Sekitar dan Perubahan Iklim (MESTECC) pada 3 Ogos 2018. IEM telah menerima lawatan dari Dr Rishi Gupta, Pengerusi Hal Ehwal Antarabangsa bagi "Canadian Society", Kejuruteraan Awam pada 28 Ogos 2018. Di samping itu, "Nigerian Society of Engineers" telah melawat IEM pada 19 November 2018 dan "Chinese Institute of Electronics" pada 12 Disember 2018.

MAT turut dimaklumkan bahawa IEM telah melawat pejabat Pengerusi CIDB, Y.Bhg Tan Sri Dr Ir. Ahmad Tajuddin Ali pada 26 Oktober 2018. Kunjungan hormat juga telah dianjurkan ke Pejabat Perdana Menteri, Yang Amat Berhormat Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad pada 29 Oktober 2018.

Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan MAT bahawa IEM telah mengambil bahagian dalam aktiviti-aktiviti dan mesyuarat-mesyuarat antarabangsa sepanjang sesi 2018/2019 seperti berikut:

- Mesyuarat Agong FEIAP yang ke-26 dari 11 14 Julai 2018 di Ipoh, Perak.
- Persidangan Antarabangsa "Women in Science, Engineering and Technology "yang ke-2, (WiSET 2018) telah dianjurkan pada 17-19 Julai 2018 di Pusat Konvensyen Kuala Lumpur
- Hari Keluarga IEM telah diadakan di Persada PLUS pada hari Ahad 29 Julai 2018
- Larian Jurutera IEM telah dianjurkan dengan jayanya pada 12 Ogos 2018 di Stadium Universiti Putra Malaysia. Larian tersebut telah disertai oleh lebih daripada 1,000 orang peserta
- Pertandingan STEM IEM serta Upacara Penutup Minggu Kejuruteraan IEM telah dianjurkan pada 18 Ogos 2018 bertempat di Monash University Malaysia, Petaling Jaya
- CAFEO 36 telah dianjurkan dari 12 14 November 2018 di Singapura dengan penganugerahan "AFEO Distinguished Honorary Patron 2018" kepada YAB Tun Dr Mahathir Mohamad, Perdana Menteri Malaysia pada 13 November 2018 di Singapura





2.0 PENGESAHAN MINIT MESYUARAT AGUNG TAHUNAN KE-50 YANG DIADAKAN PADA 21 APRIL 2018

Yang DiPertua menjemput para ahli yang hadir untuk menyemak minit mesyuarat agung tahun lepas dari muka surat 73 hingga 83 serta senarai kehadiran ahli dari muka surat 84 hingga 87. Terjemahan minit tersebut dalam Bahasa Malaysia telah dicetak dari muka surat 88 hingga 98.

- Ir. Peter Han Seng Kong (F13421) memaklumkan bahawa terdapat kesilapan pada perkara 4.5 (muka surat 75). MAT dimaklumkan bahawa beliau bukan pengerusi Jawatankuasa Kecil Buku Log. Pengerusi sebenarnya adalah Ir. Abdul Razak bin Yakob.
- Ir. Gan Tian Eng (M04904) meminta MAT ke Senarai Kehadiran Ahli pada muka surat 85 di mana beberapa orang ahli IEM diberi gelaran "MR." dan bukannya "Ir.". Yang DiPertua mengambil maklum perkara tersebut dan membalas bahawa pembetulan akan dibuat.
- Ir. Mohamed Ali bin Yusoff (F01974) memaklumkan bahawa nama beliau tiada dalam senarai kehadiran tersebut walaupun beliau menghadiri mesyuarat agung tahun lepas. Yang DiPertua mengatakan bahawa pembetulan akan dibuat.

Memandangkan tidak ada kesilapan lain dalam minit tersebut, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) mencadangkan minit Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-59 yang diadakan pada 21 April 2018 disahkan. Usul itu disokong oleh Ir. Dr Lee Yun Fook (F38707).

3.0 PERKARA-PERKARA BERBANGKIT

Yang DiPertua meneruskan dengan perkara berbangkit dan memberikan penjelasan mengenai perkara-perkara berikut:

Perkata 4.19.1 - muka surat 76

Permudahan Proses Keahlian

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa langkah-langkah sedang diambil untuk mempermudahkan proses serta penyerahan borang permohonan. MAT juga mendapati penambahan ahli bagi gred "Companion" masih sangat rendah dengan hanya empat (4) permohonan sepanjang tahun 2018/2019.

Perubahan nama bagi gred "Companion" akan dibincang bersama-sama cadangan pindaan Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang Pertubuhan.

Berkenaan kehilangan para ahli, MAT dimaklumkan bahawa IEM telah mengkaji pelbagai cara untuk mengekalkan keahlian di mana salah satunya adalah menyediakan lebih banyak manfaat kepada para ahli. Beberapa diskaun dari pelbagai pembekal perkhidmatan telah diperolehi untuk para ahli IEM. Sebagai salah satu cara membantu Ahli Siswa, IEM juga telah melaksanakan program di mana peluang pekerjaan dihantar melalui emel terus kepada ahli yang memenuhi syarat pengiklan jawatan kosong.

IEM juga bekerjasama dengan Talentcorp yang akan menghantar iklan-iklan jawatan kosong dari bidang kejuruteraan ke IEM untuk dipanjangkan kepada para ahli IEM. Jawatankuasa Kerja Kemasukan dan Latihan Praktik juga dalam proses menjadikan gred keahlian lebih bermakna dengan "E-Mentoring" (kini dalam proses implementasi).

Di samping itu, Skim Buku Log IEM yang diberi nama baharu iaitu "Engineering Competency Development" kini dalam proses penambahbaikan demi memberi bantuan / bimbingan yang lebih baik kepada para Ahli Siswazah. Satu anugerah baru juga telah diperkenalkan untuk para "Mentor" sebagai galakan kepada para Ahli Korporat untuk tampil dan memberikan khidmat nasihat sebagai Mentor.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) telah memberi komen berkenaan perkara 4.19.1 berkenaan "Ahli Senior" di mana beliau mencadangkan supaya yuran dikurangkan dari RM210 kepada RM155 dan juga mempermudahkan proses permohonan dengan menjadikannya pemindahan secara automatik. Beliau berpendapat bahawa usaha memperkembangkan gred ini tidak mencukupi. Beliau juga mengingatkan MAT bahawa syarat Ahli Senior yang dinyatakan dalam Perlembagaan IEM adalah sekurang-kurangnya sepuluh (10) tahun sebagai Ahli atau limabelas (15) tahun pengalaman selepas tiga (3) tahun sebagai Ahli.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) berpendapat bahawa keahlian gred ini adalah rendah kerana yuran keahlian yang agak tinggi dan keperluan mengemukakan borong permohonan. Beliau kemudiannya mencadangkan supaya pihak Majlis IEM mengkaji perkara ini sekali lagi dari segi pengurangan yuran kepada kadar yang sama dengan gred Ahli dan proses pemindahan secara automatik.

Beliau berpendapat bahawa jika tidak ada sebarang tindakan, bilangan ahli gred ini tidak akan bertambah.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) juga bersetuju dengan penukaran nama gred "Companion" kepada "Senior Graduate Member" tetapi berpendapat bahawa permohonan sepatutnya secara automatik. Beliau berpendapat bahawa selagi seseorang ahli Siswazah memenuhi syarat lapan (8) tahun pengalaman selepas bergraduasi, pemindahan ke gred "Senior Graduate Member" sepatutnya adalah secara automatik.





Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) seterusnya menyoal berkenaan keahlian IEM. Beliau memaklumkan MAT bahawa keahlian tahun lepas adalah seramai 46,555 dan tahun ini, bilangan hanya dapat mencapai 50,000. Beliau juga mengingatkan MAT bahawa lebih kurang 21,000 adalah terdiri daripada ahli Siswazah dan jika bilangan ini dikeluarkan daripada jumlah tersebut, maka bakinya merupakan bilangan keahlian yang terdiri daripada para jurutera berdaftar.

MAT seterusnya mengambil maklum bahawa bilangan jurutera siswazah yang berdaftar dengan Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia (LJM) berjumlah lebih kurang 116,708 berbanding bilangan ahli Siswazah IEM seramai 9,584 iaitu hanya 8.2% daripada jumlah yang berdaftar dengan LJM. Beliau seterusnya menjelaskan analisis tentang keahlian IEM dari tahun 2015 sehingga 2019 (*tidak termasuk gred Siswazah*) adalah 20,752 (2015), 19,864 (2016), 21,280 (2017), 21,872 (2018) dan 21,448 (2019). Beliau mengatakan bahawa bilangan ahli jurutera tahun 2019 adalah kurang daripada tahun 2018 yang menunjukkan sebenarnya bilangan keahlian IEM tidak bertambah dalam lima tahun yang terdekat ini. Beliau menegaskan bahawa perkara ini patut diberi perhatian serius oleh pihak Majlis IEM.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Ir. Vincent Chen di atas analisis terperinci yang telah diberikan. Walaupun mengakui analisis Ir. Vincent Chen dari segi keseluruhan bilangan keahlian IEM, Yang DiPertua menegaskan bahawa bilangan Ahli Korporat IEM telah bertambah seramai lebih kurang 800 iaitu dari 10,230 ke 11,048. Berkenaan bilangan Jurutera Siswazah yang berdaftar dengan LJM seramai 116,708, Yang di-Pertua menjelaskan bahawa bilangan ini adalah daripada pendaftaran beramai-ramai di atas persefahaman antara LJM dengan universiti-universiti awam. Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan bahawa LJM mengeluarkan satu peruntukan kepada pihak universiti untuk membayar yuran pendaftaran para graduan sebagai Jurutera Siswazah dengan LJM. Oleh yang demikian, IEM sememangnya tidak dapat menandingi LJM disebabkan kekurangan IEM dari segi kewangan. Namun begitu IEM mempunyai skim-skim lain seperti anugerah buku dan biasiswa-biasiswa. Selain dari itu, dalam peruntukkan MOU yang telah ditandangani, IEM diberi peluang untuk membuat pameran untuk menggalakkan pelajar-pelajar yang bakal bergraduasi untuk menjadi ahli IEM.

Isu berkenaan pengurangan yuran langganan untuk Ahli Senior, Yang DiPertua bersetuju bahawa terdapat mekanisme untuk memudahkan proses untuk kenaikan ke gred tersebut dan berjanji untuk membawa isu untuk perbincangan dalam mesyuarat Mailis.

YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) berkata pendaftaran dengan Lembaga Jurutera Malaysia (LJM) adalah wajib mengikut undang-undang di mana semua siswazah kejuruteraan perlu berdaftar dengan LJM jika ingin bekerja sebagai Jurutera. IEM merupakan "professional learned society" di mana ia tidak mewajibkan para siswazah untuk mendaftar sebagai ahli. YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Chuah seterusnya memaklumkan MAT bahawa LMJ hanya memerlukan satu kali bayaran yuran sahaja berbanding yuran tahunan IEM dan ini merupakan penyebab utama kekurangan bilangan ahli Siswazah IEM berbanding Jurutera Siswazah LJM.

Namun, YBhg. Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) berharap IEM dapat memainkan peranan yang lebih agresif untuk merekrut pelajar kejuruteraan untuk menjadi ahli IEM dan seterusnya dapat menggalakkan mereka untuk memindahkan gred ke ahli Siswazah selepas mereka bergraduasi. Kemudiannya IEM perlu menyediakan lebih banyak aktiviti dan faedah untuk mengekalkan keahlian golongan ini.

Beliau seterusnya memaklumkan MAT bahawa IEM yang sebenarnya telah memulakan perdaftaran ahli SIswazah secara beramai-ramai dan bukannya LJM. Ini adalah kerana IEM telah menandatangani banyak Memorandum Persefahaman (MOU) dengan universiti-universiti tempatan. Ini adalah berikutan pengenalan gelaran "Engr." untuk ahli Siswazah dan langkah ini telah dicontohi oleh LJM.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock (HF02531) memuji usaha Ahli Majlis untuk meningkatkan keahlian IEM walaupun Y.Bhg. Dato' berpendapat keahlian untuk ahli Siswazah tidak menunjukkan peningkatatn untuk beberapa tahun kebelakangan ini. Y.Bhg. Dato' juga bersetuju dengan saranan dari YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) untuk mengambil peluang ketika majlis graduasi berlangsung untuk menarik minat para Siswazah mendaftar sebagai ahli seterusnya mampu meningkatkan jumlah keahlian.

Ir. Mohd Radzi Salleh (F20112) turut bersetuju bahawa tiada peningkatan ketara untuk ahli Siswazah dan juga ahli Korporat kebelakangan ini. Justeru beliau berpendapat ia merupakan satu keperluan untuk IEM mengetahui sebab mengapa para Jurutera tidak berminat untuk menjadi ahli walau pun pelbagai usaha telah dilakukan seperti memperkenakan "Loyalty Card" dan beberapa inisiatif yang lain. Beliau menekankan IEM perlu mengambil berat akan isu ini dan berusaha untuk mencari jalan penyelesaian.

Ir. Pick Eng Chong (HF01214) juga turut bersetuju dengan saranan Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong's (HF05128) bahawa tiada banyak peningkatan jumlah keahlian untuk ahli Siswazah. Beliau menyarankan agar ahli Majlis yang baharu memperkenalkan mekanisma terkini untuk meningkatkan jumlah ahli Siswazah.

4.0 LAPORAN TAHUNAN SESI 2018/2019

Yang DiPertua seterusnya menjemput Setiausaha Kehormat, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad untuk membentangkan aktiviti dan acara yang telah dianjurkan pada tahun 2018 seperti yang tertera di mukasurat 105 hingga 108 di dalam Laporan Tahunan. Setiausaha Kehormat selanjutnya memaklumkan MAT mengenai tajuk / butiran masing-masing di halaman berikut:





4.1 Majlis dan Jawatankuasa Eksekutif

Untuk sesi 2018/2019, lima (5) mesyuarat Majlis telah dijalankan. Mesyuarat Majlis telah berbincang isu yang berkenaan dengan harta dan urusan Instituisi. Sebanyak tiga belas (13) mesyuarat Jawatankuasa Eksekutif telah dijalankan pada sesi 2018/2019. Peranan Jawatankuasa Eksekutif adalah untuk melaksanakan keputusan yang telah diputuskan oleh Majlis.

4.2 Urusan Harian Institusi

Lapan (8) Jawatankuasa Tetap telah membantu operasi harian di IEM. Setiap Jawatankuasa Tetap dipengerusikan oleh Naib Yang di-Pertua kecuali Jawatankuasa Kewangan yang dipengerusikan oleh Timbalan Yang Di-Pertua.

4.3 Keahlian

Setiausaha Kehormat melaporkan jumlah keahlian adalah seramai 50,281. MAT menyatakan bahawa sehingga 31 Disember 2018, sejumlah 7,263 calon diluluskan untuk kemasukan / pemilihan / pemindahan ke pelbagai gred. Bagaimanapun, 2,617 ahli telah digantung keahlian mereka. Daripada ahli baharu yang direkrut, 4,563 adalah pelajar.

Dari segi pecahan keahlian oleh gred, Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan bahawa keahlian Pelajar mempunyai peratus yang paling tinggi iaitu 55% diikuti oleh Ahli Korporat (24%), Siswazah (19%), "Companion" (1%) dan gred lain (0.4 %).

Berhubung dengan pecahan keahlian oleh disiplin pula, Awam mempunyai bilangan tertinggi (15,891) diikuti oleh Mekanikal (12,270), Elektrikal (7,895), Kimia (3,270) dan disiplin lain (9,286).

4.4 Pendaftaran Antarabangsa

Bagi pendaftaran dan gabungan antarabangsa, dicatatkan bahawa bagi tahun 2018, 24 ahli telah mendaftar sebagai Jurutera ASEAN (ASEAN Eng), dan 16 telah diluluskan untuk Jurutera Bersekutu ASEAN (AAE) manakala 32 telah diluluskan untuk IPEA / APEC Pendaftar Jurutera Antarabangsa (IntPE).

4.5 Peperiksaan dan Kelayakan - Temuduga Profesional

MAT melaporkan untuk sesi 2018/2019, sejumlah 1265 calon telah menduduki Temuduga Profesional (PI). Sejumlah 755 calon telah lulus iaitu seramai 83.5%. Bilangan calon yang gagal PI adalah 210 iaitu seramai 16.5%. Sejumlah 223 calon masih menunggu keputusan mereka.

4.6 Penerbitan IEM

Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa dua belas (12) terbitan "Jurutera" - Buletin IEM telah diterbitkan pada 2018. Beliau melaporkan satu (1) terbitan jurnal telah diterbitkan pada tahun 2018. MAT dimaklumkan lagi bahawa IEM cuba untuk menggalakkan Buletin elektronik berbanding dengan cara konversional – bukan hanya untuk mengurangkan kos tetapi juga untuk menjadi lebih mesra alam sekitar.

4.7 Peristiwa Akan Datang

Setiausaha Kehormat selanjutnya memaklumkan mengenai peristiwa yang akan datang seperti berikut:

- Majlis Makan Tahunan ke 60 Tahun, Sunway Resort Hotel & Spa pada 20 April 2019
- Hari Keluarga IEM 2019 pada 14 Julai 2019
- Larian Jurutera IEM 2019 pada 4 Ogost 2019
- Minggu Kejuruteraan 2019 dari 4 10 Ogos 2019
- Pertandingan IEM STEM 2019 pada 28 Ogos 2019

4.8 Anugerah Kecemerlangan Yang DiPertua (PAOE)

Setiausaha Kehormat kemudian mengumumkan keputusan Anugerah Kecemerlangan Yang DiPertua 2018 adalah seperti berikut:

Pemenang Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Elektrik
Tempat Kedua Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Geoteknik

Tempat Ketiga Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Awam dan Struktur
Tempat Keempat Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Perkhidmatan Bangunan

Tempat Kelima Bahagian Jurutera Wanita

Bahagian Yang Menunjukkan Peningkatan Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Pertanian dan Makanan





4.9 Program "Affinity" dan Diskaun Korporat

Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan sebahagian dari usaha IEM adalah untuk memberi lebih banyak manfaat kepada ahli IEM, beberapa peniaga telah mendaftar untuk memberikan diskaun kepada ahli IEM dalam pelbagai kategori seperti kereta (BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Volvo, Audi, Proton, dan lain-lain), hotel, penjagaan kesihatan, restoran dan sukan. Ahli yang masih belum memungut Kad Kesetiaan mereka diminta berbuat demikian melalui Urusetia IEM.

MAT selanjutnya dimaklumkan bahawa terdapat faedah lain yang ditempatkan untuk ahli seperti:

- Galeri Kerja yang membolehkan ahli memuat naik resume mereka ke Bank Resume. Majikan boleh menghantar maklumat kekosongan ke IEM dan ia akan dihantar melalui e-mel kepada ahli yang sesuai.
- Syarikat-syarikat yang telah menandatangani MOU dengan IEM boleh menghantar iklan kekosongan untuk diposkan di laman web IEM
- Bekerjasama dengan Talentcorp majikan yang ingin menggunakan jurutera IEM boleh berbuat demikian.

4.10 Memorandum Persefahaman (MOU)

Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa IEM telah menandatangani tiga (3) Memorandum Persefahaman (MOU) dengan badan professional asing dan sembilan (9) dengan Institusi Pengajian Tinggi (IHL) pada tahun 2018.

4.11 Cawangan IEM - Acara dan Lawatan

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Cawangan Miri telah membeli premis baru pada tahun 2018. Beliau juga menyatakan bahawa Cawangan Perak menjadi tuan rumah Perhimpunan Agung FEIAP2018. MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa Yang DiPertua telah melawat dua belas (12) Cawangan IEM untuk sesi 2018/2019.

Setiausaha Kehormat kemudian menyampaikan penghargaannya kepada Urusetia IEM di atas sokongan dan perkhidmatan mereka untuk Institusi.

4.12 Sesi Soalan - Laporan Tahunan

Yang DiPertua kemudian mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Setiausaha Kehormat dan terus membuka sesi soalan dari Auditorium Malakoff, Auditorium Chin Fung Kee dan juga di tingkat 2.

4.12.1. Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) meminta merujuk kepada muka surat 110 di bawah perkara 5.4. Beliau memuji Jawatankuasa Kecil menggiatkan keahlian dan bimbingan kerjaya dalam usaha mereka meningkatkan keahlian termasuk mengadakan sesi dengan Institusi Pengajian Tinggi (IHL), mengadakan jelajah dan pengambilan ahli serta Memorandum Persefahaman (MOU) dengan IHL serta organisasi. Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) mengucapkan tahniah kepada Jawatankuasa Kecil ini.

Beliau kemudian mencadangkan supaya isu keahlian Siswazah merupakan isu yang kekal dalam Agenda Jawatankuasa yang berkaitan terutamanya Jawatankuasa Tetap, Jawatankuasa Eksekutif dan Majlis. Ini adalah untuk memastikan isu ini dibincangkan dengan teliti supaya dapat membantu Jawatankuasa Kecil meningkatkan keahlian Siswazah.

Ir. Prof Dr Norlida Buniyamin (F13746) menjelaskan bahawa Jawatankuasa Tetap Kebajikan dan Hal Ehwal Perkhidmatan (WEL) telah melibatkan para peniaga untuk turut serta di dalam "Loyalty Card" dan ia merupakan salah satu faedah terbaharu yang diperkenalkan untuk para ahli.

Beliau menegaskan bahawa terdapat pelbagai faktor yang boleh membawa kepada penurunan ahli Siswazah. Walau bagaimanapun, Jawatankuasa Tetap Kemasukan dan Latihan Praktikal (APT) akan terus membantu Jawatankuasa Kecil untuk menambah ahli baharu. Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan bahawa beliau berusaha untuk menggalakkan Jurutera dari sektor kerajaan dan swasta untuk menjadi ahli IEM. Beliau telah melawat agensi-agensi kerajaan dan berharap usaha selama dua belas (12) bulan yang akan datang akan membuahkan hasil. Yang DiPertua kemudian mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (Hon.F05128) kerana menimbulkan kebimbangannya mengenai isu ini.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (HF02828) mengulas bahawa persoalan yang paling penting untuk difikirkan ialah sejauh mana IEM dapat memberi faedah kepada para ahli. Beliau juga menambah bahawa IEM harus mengubah arah dan berfikir cara pemikiran seorang ahli.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (HF00015) memaklumkan bahawa IEM harus lebih bersikap proaktif dan berusaha untuk mempromosikan keahlian IEM kepada agensi-agensi kerajaan serta sektor swasta dalam bidang kejuruteraan. Yang DiPertua bersetuju bahawa IEM perlu menaikkan imejnya dalam komuniti kejuruteraan.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) ingin mengetahui penjelasan pada muka surat 125 mengenai Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang. Beliau bertanya tentang cara / proses bagaimana keputusan atau cadangan dibuat dan kemudiannya dibentangkan kepada Jawatankuasa Tetap Amalan Profesional.





Yang DiPertua selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa cadangan-cadangan yang dibuat oleh Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang akan dibentangkan kepada Jawatankuasa Eksekutif untuk sebarang cadangan dan seterusnya kepada Majlis untuk tujuan kelulusan / pengesahan. Sekiranya terdapat sebarang cadangan oleh Majlis, isu tersebut akan dikembalikan semula kepada Jawatankuasa Eksekutif dan selepas itu kepada Jawatankuasa Khas untuk tindakan seterusnya.

Walau bagaimanapun, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) selanjutnya menyoal jumlah mesyuarat yang diadakan dan komposisi Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang. Beliau mengulas di muka surat 26 Laporan Tahunan, bahawa hanya terdapat satu (1) orang yang berkhidmat di dalam Jawatankuasa Khas dan mempersoalkan sama ada terdapat lebih ramai ahli atau tidak.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa dia adalah satu-satunya ahli yang berkhidmat di dalam Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang dan tugasnya adalah untuk meminda Perlembagaan IEM dan Undang-Undang Kecil sekiranya ada permintaan untuk pindaan oleh Jawatankuasa Eksekutif atau Majlis. Sekiranya terdapat sebarang pindaan, Jawatankuasa Khas yang terdiri daripada Ir. Lai Sze Ching akan mengesyorkan kepada Jawatankuasa Eksekutif. Jawatankuasa Eksekutif akan membincangkan perkara tersebut sebelum dibentangkan kepada Majlis untuk tujuan kelulusan.

YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Lee Yee Cheong (DHF00220) selanjutnya memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang hanya mempunyai satu (1) ahli Jawatankuasa sejak zaman mendiang Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Ir. (Dr) J. G. Daniel. Walau bagaimanapun, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' menjelaskan bahawa terdapat beberapa tahun Jawatankuasa Khas mempunyai lebih ramai ahli tetapi ia bergantung kepada isu perbincangan. Beliau mengulas bahawa ahli-ahli MAT atau Majlis yang sepatutnya membuat pertanyaan dan bukannya bekas Yang di-Pertua yang sepatutnya lebih mengetahui mengenai proses tersebut.

Ir. Pick Eng Chong (HF01214) seterusnya mengulas bahawa pada masa itu, Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang mempunyai lebih ramai ahli yang mempunyai pengalaman atau latar belakang undang-undang kerana Jawatankuasa Eksekutif tidak mempunyai masa untuk membincangkan perkara-perkara perundangan. Oleh itu, beliau berpendapatn bahawa isu ini perlu lebih diteliti.

Yang DiPertua kemudian menjelaskan bahawa Jawatankuasa Eksekutif telah membincangkan isu-isu mengenai pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang seperti yang disyorkan oleh Jawatankuasa Khas dan akan dibentangkan kepada Majlis untuk sebarang cadangan.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) kemudian membalas kepada YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Lee Yee Cheong (DHF00220) atas kenyataannya bahawa Bekas Yang DiPertua seharusnya lebih mengetahui dengan baik proses tersebut. Beliau seterusnya mengulas bahawa Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang telah dianggap sebagai Jawatankuasa penting kerana apa-apa perubahan yang dibuat kepada perlembagaan akan menjejaskan arah tuju Institusi. MAT dimaklumkan lagi apabila Jawatankuasa Khas dipengerusikan oleh mendiang Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Ir. (Dr) J. G. Daniel, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon juga berkhidmat di dalam Jawatankuasa tersebut. Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa selama beliau berkhidmat sebagai Yang DiPertua dari tahun 2011 hingga 2013, Ir. Pick Eng Chong mempunyai lima (5) hingga enam (6) orang ahli yang berkhidmat dalam Jawatankuasa Khas. Oleh itu, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) mencadangkan agar lebih ramai ahli yang berkhidmat di Jawatankuasa Khas dan bukannya hanya satu (1) selama empat (4) tahun kebelakangan ini. Yang DiPertua bersetuju untuk mengambil kira cadangan tersebut.

Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin (F11712) menegaskan bahawa terpulang kepada MAT sama ada untuk menerima atau menolak Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang Kecil IEM yang telah digubal oleh Jawatankuasa Khas. Walau bagaimanapun, beliau juga bersetuju sekiranya terdapat lebih daripada satu (1) ahli yang berkhidmat di dalam Jawatankuasa Khas maka lebih banyak pandangan akan dapat dihasilkan.

Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) memaklumkan MAT bahawa beliau adalah ahli Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang yang dipengerusikan oleh mendiang Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Ir. (Dr) J. G. Daniel dan seterusnya oleh YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon. Walau bagaimanapun, beliau selanjutnya memaklumkan bahawa beliau tidak pernah menerima apa-apa surat yang menyatakan bahawa beliau tidak lagi berada dalam Jawatankuasa Khas. Yang di-Pertua mencadangkan bahawa Ir. C.M. Aboobucker (M13942) boleh dijemput sekali lagi untuk berkhidmat di dalam Jawatankuasa Khas Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang. Pada isu berasingan, Ir. C.M. Aboobucker (M01394) turut mempersoalkan muka surat 106 mengenai disiplin kejuruteraan - "Bahan api" kerana terdapat dua (2) "Fellows" dan lain adalah "Umum" dan "Lain-lain" pada muka surat 107. Beliau meminta penjelasan mengenai klasifikasi disiplin kejuruteraan yang disebutkan.

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa klasifikasi itu terikat dengan peraturan LJM. Walau bagaimanapun, Yang DiPertua bersetuju untuk mendapatkan maklumat yang lebih terperinci mengenai disiplin kejuruteraan yang dinyatakan.

Oleh kerana tidak ada cadangan atau soalan lanjut dari ahli, Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin (F11712) mencadangkan agar Laporan Tahunan tersebut diterima. Cadangan tersebut disokong oleh Ir. Wong Chee Fui (F20903).





5.0 AKAUN BAGI TAHUN BERAKHIR 31 DISEMBER 2018

- 5.1 Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput Bendahari Kehormat, Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai untuk membentangkan penyata kewangan bagi Institusi Jurutera Malaysia bagi tempoh 1 Januari 2018 hingga 31 Disember 2018. Ir. Dr Tan Chee Fai memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa akaun yang dibentangkan adalah dari muka surat 164 hingga 191.
- 5.2 Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa penyata kewangan yang dibentangkan terdiri daripada dua (2) set akaun. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa angka-angka itu tidak termasuk kedudukan kewangan Cawangan IEM. MAT selanjutnya dimaklumkan bahawa Cawangan IEM akan memfailkan set laporan kewangan mereka sendiri dengan LHDN di negeri masing-masing. Bendahari Kehormat selanjutnya memaklumkan bahawa ruang yang yang ditandakan dengan "Kumpulan" merujuk kepada akaun Ibu Pejabat IEM, Pusat Latihan IEM (IEMTC) dan IEM Academy Sdn. Bhd. (IEMAS)

Bendahari Kehormat selanjutnya menjelaskan terdapat beberapa ruang di bawah "Institusi" ditinggalkan kosong di bawah "Kumpulan" disebabkan angka-angka pembayaran / penerimaan di antara IEM, Pusat Latihan IEM (IEMTC) dan IEM Academy Sdn Bhd (IEMASB) telah dihapuskan semasa penyatuan.

- 5.3 Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan bahawa jumlah pendapatan tahun 2018 adalah kira-kira RM5,113,070. Dilaporkan lagi bahawa langganan keahlian adalah jumlah terbesar dengan 65% dari jumlah pendapatan, diikuti dengan pendapatan sewa sebanyak 12.4% dan kemudiannya perkhidmatan institusi sebanyak 8.8%. Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya melaporkan bahawa jumlah pendapatan adalah lebih tinggi pada tahun 2018 berbanding 2017 disebabkan oleh penjualan harta IEM Cawangan Penang, dividen dari IEMTC dan juga pendapatan sewa dari Wisma IEM.
- 5.4 Kutipan Langganan Tahunan untuk tahun 2018 telah meningkat kepada 4.2% berbanding tahun 2017. Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya melaporkan bahawa pendapatan sewa menurun sebanyak 45%, pendapatan faedah menurun hingga 43%, komisen kad kredit meningkat kepada 1.4%, pendapatan daripada institusi perkhidmatan meningkat kepada 26%, perkhidmatan Urusetia meningkat kepada 48% dan pendapatan dari Bahagian Teknikal meningkat kepada 22%.
- 5.5 Bendahari Kehormat selanjutnya melaporkan bahawa jumlah perbelanjaan untuk tahun 2018 adalah RM6,081,431 iaitu peningkatan sebanyak 7.8% berbanding 2017 iaitu RM5,640,271. Peningkatan ini adalah dari ganjaran kakitangan iaitu 3.7% manakala perbelanjaan pentadbiran menurun sebanyak 2.5%, subsidi Cawangan menurun sebanyak 10%, susut nilai peralatan meningkat 8%, kos penyelenggaraan bangunan meningkat sebanyak 24% dan yuran langganan dihapuskan adalah meningkat sebanyak 61%.
- 5.6 Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya melaporkan bahawa penyumbang utama kepada jumlah perbelanjaan adalah ganjaran kakitangan dengan jumlah 46% manakala perbelanjaan pentadbiran adalah 21%, kos penyelenggaraan bangunan sebanyak 20%. Prestasi keseluruhan berbanding tahun 2017 adalah defisit berjumlah RM1,068,817 untuk 2018.
- 5.7 MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa prestasi komparatif selama dua (2) tahun terakhir menunjukkan terdapat lebihan RM1,823,390 untuk 2017. Walau bagaimanapun, untuk tahun 2018, terdapat defisit sebanyak RM1,068,817. Dilaporkan bahawa sewa untuk Wisma IEM untuk 2017 dari MKM adalah RM588K tetapi untuk 2018, sewa hanya sebanyak RM90,000. Jika ini diambil kira, lebihan operasi / (defisit) adalah RM978,817.
 - Dikatakan juga bahawa dividen daripada IEMTC untuk tahun 2017 adalah defisit sebanyak RM489,289 manakala tiada untuk tahun 2018. Perbezaan keseluruhan dalam tempoh dua (2) tahun terakhir ialah RM288,300.
- 5.8 Bendahari Kehormat kemudian melaporkan perbandingan belanjawan selama dua tahun; 2017 dan 2018. Telah dilaporkan bahawa pada 2017, dijangkakan IEM akan mengalami defisit akibat kehilangan sewa dari anggaran belanjawan untuk 2018. Oleh yang demikian, seperti yang dianggarkan jumlah defisit ialah RM503,014. Walau bagaimanapun, belanjawan sebenar ialah RM1.608.817.
 - Bagi susut nilai, anggaran untuk 2018 adalah sebanyak RM550,000 manakala jumlah sebenarnya ialah RM660,204. Bagi belanjawan langgaran dianggarkan sebanyak RM400,000 tetapi bagi angka sebenar ialah RM274,455.
 - Oleh itu, jumlah pendapatan yang dianggarkan ialah RM5,877,745 berbanding jumlah sebenarnya ialah RM5,113,070. MAT telah dimaklumkan bahawa jumlah perbelanjaan yang dianggarkan ialah RM6,380,760 berbanding jumlah sebenarnya adalah RM6,081,43.
- MAT dimaklumkan bahawa aliran tunai sebenar untuk 2018 adalah defisit sebanyak RM356,547 manakala yang dianggarkan untuk 2019 ialah RM300,393. Berhubung dengan kutipan keseluruhan, ialah RM6,254,579 dan dijangka untuk 2019 ialah RM5,772,097. Oleh itu, untuk 2018 defisit adalah sebanyak RM300,393 manakala tahun ini (2019) dijangka adalah RM222,901.

Bendahari Kehormat mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Pasukan Petugas berkenaan dengan Kutipan Yuran Tahunan walaupun Jawatankuasa ini tidak disenaraikan di dalam Laporan Tahunan. Pasukan Petugas ini juga turut membantu Cawangan IEM yang lain.

Bendahari Kehormat turut mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Jawatankuasa Kecil - Infrastruktur dan Urusetia kerana berusaha meningkatkan penyelenggaraan Bangunan IEM dan Wisma IEM.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Bendahari Kehormat atas perbentangan penyata kewangan dan menjemput para ahli untuk mengajukan sebarang pertanyaan.





5.10 Sesi Soalan - Akaun

5.10.1 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) meminta MAT merujuk pada muka surat 165 mengenai "Penghutang Perdagangan dan Bukan Perdagangan" di bawah tajuk Aset Semasa.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) mengulas bahawa angka 8 tidak jelas. YBhg. Dato' turut mengulas "Pemiutang Perdagangan dan Bukan Perdagangan" di bawah tajuk Liabiliti dengan angka 16. Oleh itu, YBhg. Dato' meminta penjelasan mengenai angka-angka yang disebutkan itu kerana beliau berpendapat bahawa ada Pasukan Petugas yang dibentuk namun akaun penghutang masih tinggi.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua mnjelaskan di bawah tajuk "Institusi" angka tersebut adalah kira-kira RM1.5 juta manakala di bawah tajuk untuk "Kumpulan" adalah RM4.0 juta. Beliau seterusnya menjelaskan bahawa ini adalah disebabkan oleh pendapatan dari "World Tunelling Conference" 2020 (WTC2020). Beliau menjelaskan untuk acara WTC2020 invois telah dikeluarkan kira-kira RM4 juta dan kutipan yang diterima adalah kira-kira RM1.8 juta. MAT selanjutnya dimaklumkan bahawa IEM memperolehi beberapa acara penting yang akan dianjurkan oleh IEMTC. Timbalan Yang DiPertua selanjutnya menjelaskan pada dasarnya ia adalah hasil peningkatan dari pendapatan melalui invois dan pungutan yang akan diterima untuk acara WTC2020. Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya menegaskan bahawa perbentangan tersebuat adalah untuk "Institusi" dan bukannya "Kumpulan" akaun.

5.10.2 Ir. Ng Yen Yee (M33777) mencadangkan antara mekanisma untuk meningkatkan pendapatan adalah dengan bekerjasama dengan JKR dengan menganjurkan program latihan kecekapan untuk kakitangan mereka dalam disiplin sivil. Suruhanjaya Tenaga dan ILSAS telah menganjurkan program latihan kecekapan untuk "charge-man" and "wire-man". Dicadangkan juga supaya program itu menjadi sebahagian dari keperluan kawal selia dan diperakui.

Yang DiPertua kemudian menerangkan mengenai defisit sebanyak RM1,068 juta. Beliau seterusnya menerangkan pada muka surat 165 bagi tahun 2018, komponen pendapatan adalah RM3.38 juta iaitu RM58,000 kurang dari 2017 (kira-kira 1.7%). Bagi komponen perbelanjaan pada muka surat 166, terdapat peningkatan sebanyak RM101,000 (3.7%) di bawah ganjaran peribadi berbanding 2017.

Yang DiPertua bersetuju bahawa ia tidak dapat dielakkan kerana kenaikan kos sara hidup. Oleh itu gaji kakitangan perlu ditingkatkan. Bagaimanapun, beliau menegaskan bahawa perbelanjaan pentadbiran adalah kurang berbanding 2017. Kesimpulannya, beliau memaklumkan MAT supaya tidak melihat RM1.068 juta kerana ini adalah sebahagian dari sistem perakaunan. Defisit sebenar Institusi ialah sebanyak RM200,000 dan sebahagian besarnya dari ganjaran peribadi dan tunggakan langganan ahli. Walau bagaimanapun, beliau memberitahu beberapa langkah telah diambil untuk menangani isu ini.

- 5.10.3 Ir. Selva Sukanthiran a/I Karuppaiah (M10437) bertanya mengenai penurunan harga latihan dan pendaftaran sebanyak 50%. Beliau seterusnya mengulas bahawa pada tahun 2017 adalah RM2.4 juta tetapi pada tahun 2018 kejatuhan drastik kepada RM1.2 juta. Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa Ir. Selva Sukanthiran a/I Karuppaiah (M10437) merujuk pada "Kumpulan" iaitu IEMTC dan IEMAS bukannya IEM. Ir. Selva Sukanthiran a/I Karuppaiah (M10437) seterusnya menyoal bagaimana IEMTC dan IEMASB yang merupakan anak syarikat IEM boleh berada di dalam akaun. Yang DiPertua menjelaskan bahawa ia adalah syarat asas oleh "Suruhanjaya Syarikat Malaysia (SSM)" supaya akaun tersebut dimasukkan bersama.
- 5.10.4 Ir. Ng Yen Yee (M33777) juga mengulangi cadangannya agar IEM boleh bekerjasama dengan JKR dengan menganjurkan latihan kecekapan untuk pekerja awam termasuk warga asing untuk meningkatkan pendapatan Institusi. Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih dan akan meneliti cadangannya.

Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin (F20286) menjawab pertanyaan tersebut bagi pihak Ir. Gopal Narian Kutty (Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Tetap Aktiviti) bahawa Bahagian Teknik Kejuruteraan Awam dan Struktur dengan bantuan dari Ir. Gopal Narian Kutty yang merupakan kakitangan JKR sedang berusaha untuk berkerjasama bagi menjalankan program latihan untuk jurutera awam.

Memandangkan tiada lagi soalan berbangkit dari para ahli, Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (M01922) mencadangkan Penyata Kewangan untuk IEM bagi tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2018 diterima. Usul itu disokong oleh Ir. Dr Ng Soon Ching (M30662) dan MAT seterusnya menerima Laporan Kewangan tersebut.

6.0 LAPORAN KEWANGAN DANA PENDIDIKAN - 31 DISEMBER 2018

- 6.1 Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya membentangkan laporan kewangan untuk Dana Pendidikan bagi tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2018 dari muka surat 195 hingga muka surat 204.
- 6.2 MAT dimaklumkan bahawa sumbangan yang diterima berjumlah RM49,810 pada 2018 berbanding RM227,036 pada tahun 2017. Faedah Deposit Tetap yang diperoleh berjumlah RM43,234 berbanding RM38,132 pada tahun 2017.
- 6.3 Dari segi perbelanjaan, Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan bahawa biasiswa yang diberikan pada tahun 2018 adalah RM34,000, Beliau seterusnya memaklumkan bahawa perbelanjaan lain seperti persidangan luar negara termasuk RM34,896, Subsidi Bahagian Siswa adalah berjumlah RM10,000 manakala perbelanjaan lain adalah RM923. Untuk biasiswa di bawah Biasiswa En. Koon Yew Yin, temubual telah diadakan pada tahun 2019.





- 6.4 Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya melaporkan terdapat lebihan sebanyak RM60,198 pada tahun 2018 berbanding dengan lebihan sebanyak RM178,633 pada tahun 2017.
- 6.5 Bagi Penyata Kewangan keseluruhan 2018, terdapat penurunan sebanyak 2.5% (RM1,633,216 termasuk deposit tetap, tunai dan kesetaraan tunai) berbanding RM1,673,611 pada tahun 2017.

Bagi Dana Terkumpul, terdapat peningkatan sebanyak 2.4% yang berjumlah RM2,564,909 pada tahun 2018 berbanding RM2,504,711 pada tahun 2017.

Memandangkan tiada lagi soalan berbangkit dari para ahli, Ir. Wong Chee Fui (F20903) mencadangkan Laporan Kewangan Dana Pendidikan bagi tahun berakhir 2018 diterima dan usul ini disokong oleh Ir. Gan Tian Eng (M04904) dan MAT seterusnya menerima Laporan Kewangan Dana Pendidikan.

7.0 PERBINCANGAN ISU BERTULIS DARIPADA AHLI

MAT telah dimaklumkan bahawa terdapat surat bertarikh 26 Mac 2019 yang dikemukakan oleh Ir. Yap Soon Hoe mengenai aduan terhadap Yang DiPertua. Oleh itu, Yang DiPertua menyerahkan kepada Timbalan Yang DiPertua untuk mengetuai isu ini. Walau bagaimanapun, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) mencadangkan isu ini boleh dirujuk di bawah Perlembagaan dan Undang-Undang IEM siapa yang sepatutnya mengetuai isu ini. Adalah dimaklumkan bahawa MAT terpaksa memilih seorang ahli yang hadir dan Yang DiPertua meminta MAT untuk mencadangkan ahli untuk mempengerusikan perkara ini.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) mencadangkan Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) untuk mempengerusikan perkara ini dan usul itu disokong oleh Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128).

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) memaklumkan bahawa "Pengadu" perlu menyatakan dan menjelaskan aduannya. "Responden" juga dibenarkan untuk bertindak balas terhadap aduan tersebut. Walau bagaimanapun, MAT dimaklumkan bahawa pengadu sedang berada di luar negara dan tiada wakil untuk mewakilinya. Memandangkan pengadu tidak hadir, MAT dimaklumkan bahawa kes ini sama ada perlu diberhentikan atau dibincangkan dalam mesyuarat berasingan.

Walau bagaimanapun, Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) menjelaskan bahawa surat tersebut telah dibincangkan di mesyuarat Jawankuasa Eksekutif. Memandangkan ia adalah aduan terhadap ahli, ia perlu dikemukakan kepada Jawatankuasa Tetap Amalan Profesional (PPC) untuk mengambil kes tersebut dari ia dibincangkan di MAT.

Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (F01922) mengulas disebabkan pengadu tidak hadir, maka isu ini tidak boleh dibincangkan di MAT. Ir. Awangku Hidup Awangku Hosain (F03053) juga bersetuju dengan cadangan oleh Ir. Yong Kee Chiang bahawa kes ini perlu dibentangkan di PPC.

Setiausaha Kehormat menjelaskan kepada MAT bahawa surat bertarikh 26 Mac 2019 (seperti yang dipaparkan pada skrin) adalah surat yang ketiga yang dikemukakan oleh pengadu. Isu-isu yang sama telah dibincangkan di mesyuarat Jawatankuasa Eksekutif dan Majlis. Jawatankuasa Eksekutif dan Majlis telah menjawab kepada pengadu bertarikh 28 Ogos 2018 dan 13 Disember 2018. Walau bagaimanapun, adalah dinyatakan bahawa pengadu tidak berpuas hati dengan balasan tersebut dan beliau memutuskan untuk menulis lagi di dalam surat ketiga.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah memaklumkan bahawa isu ini tidak sepatutnya dibentangkan di MAT kerana ia tidak berkaitan dengan pelaksanaan Institusi. Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka turut mengulas sama ada ia adalah aduan terhadap individu / ahli atau Penjawat menurut Perlembagaan IEM, ia perlu dikemukakan kepada Jawatankuasa Eksekutif untuk siasatan dibuat. Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka turut menjelaskan bahawa sekiranya ada unsur salah laku, Perlembagaan IEM membenarkan Jawatankuasa Kecil untuk meneliti aduan tersebut.

Tanpa mengetahui isi surat bertarikh 21 Jun 2018, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah menimbulkan persoalan sama ada aduan itu bertentangan dengan Penjawat Institusi atau terhadap seorang individu. YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) seterusnya mengulas disebakan pengadu tidak dapat membentangkan kesnya di MAT, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato mencadangkan supaya isu ini dirujuk kembali kepada Majlis untuk perbincangan lanjut seperti termaktub di dalam Perlembagaan IEM.

Walau bagaimanapun, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah menjelaskan apabila agenda MAT dihantar kepada para ahli, terdapat item yang menawarkan mana-mana ahli untuk menyuarakan apa-apa isu bertulis untuk perbincangan di MAT. Ia juga adalah tanggungjawab Setiausaha Kehormat untuk memeriksa sama ada ia berkaitan dengan Institusi atau tidak. Selain itu, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka turut mengulas bahawa jika isu ini adalah aduan yang dibuat terhadap ahli atau Penjawat ia tidak sepatutnya dibincangkan di MAT. Selain itu, surat bertarikh 26 Mac 2019 turut menyatakan bahawa keseluruhan surat tersebut akan dibincangkan di MAT.

Setiausaha Kehormat selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa terdapat tiga (3) isu mengenai kes ini; pertama ialah perbelanjaan perjalanan Yang DiPertua ke Cawangan IEM; kedua adalah perjalanan Yang DiPertua ke London untuk menghadiri Mesyuarat IEA di London; dan ketiga adalah perkara-perkara umum mengenai kunjungan Yang DiPertua ke Kementerian dan Perdana Menteri sama ada ia memberi manfaat kepada Institusi.

MINIT MESYUARAT AGUNG TAHUNAN KE 60





Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) mengulas bahawa aduan itu bukan ditujukan kepada Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi sebagai individu tetapi pada kedudukannya selaku Yang DiPertua.

Ir. Yong Kee Chiang (F01922) mengulangi usulnya bahawa isu ini tidak perlu dibincangkan dan perlu dikeluarkan dari agenda dengan segera. Beliau seterusnya mengulas bahawa pada dasarnya ia merupakan satu aduan dari seorang ahli yang tidak menyukai cara Yang DiPertua melaksanakan urusan kerja tetapi ia adalah lebih bersifat peribadi.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon (HF00015) merasakan ada keperluan untuk membuat keputusan sama ada isu ini perlu dibincangkan di MAT kerana ia ada dinyatakan di dalam agenda.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa aduan telah dibuat terhadap Jawatankuasa Eksekutif, maka Jawatankuasa Eksekutif harus melantik sebuah badan bebas.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa aduan itu dibuat terhadap seseorang individu. Berhubung dengan tiga (3) perkara yang dinyatakan di dalam surat tersebut dan seperti yang ditunjukkan oleh Setiausaha Kehormat, beliau meminta MAT sama ada aduan itu adalah bersifat peribadi atau terhadap Institusi atau Majlis atau Jawatankuasa Eksekutif. Oleh yang demikian beliau merasakan bahawa MAT harus membuat keputusan.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) mencadangkan bahawa Jawatankuasa Eksekutif tidak sepatutnya membuat sebarang komen kerana isu ini telah dibincangkan di mesyuarat Jawatankuasa Eksekutif. Beliau juga mencadangkan agar keputusan diputuskan di MAT dan menegaskan bahawa apa-apa yang telah dilakukan untuk Institusi tidak boleh dianggap sebagai urusan peribadi. Oleh itu, perlu diputuskan sama ada ia urusan peribadi atau untuk Institusi.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (HF03975) mencadangkan bahawa aduan itu sepatutnya dirujuk kepada Majlis dan bukan di MAT. Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin (F11712) berpandangan bahawa Jawatankuasa Eksekutif terdiri daripada ahli-ahli IEM dan oleh itu semua ahli termasuk Jawatankuasa Eksekutif mempunyai hak yang sama.

Walau bagaimanapun, beliau bependapat disebabkan pengadu tidak hadir, beliau menyokong isu ini akan dibentangkan di Majlis untuk perbincangan lebih lanjut dan bukan di MAT.

- Ir. William Ho Choo Kwang (M17178) juga mencadangkan bahawa MAT bukan merupakan platform yang sesuai untuk membincangkan isu ini dan ia harus dikembalikan kepada Majlis. Ir. Lt. Kol Mohd Hazani bin Shafie (F16292) juga menyokong cadangan tersebut.
- Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05613) memaklumkan bahawa isu ini lebih kepada salah faham. Walau bagaimanapun, beliau merasakan bahawa setiap ahli mempunyai hak untuk menyuarakan pandangan mereka dan beliau bersetuju dengan cadangan dari Ir. Dr Tan Yean Chin dan Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (HF03975) bahawa perkara ini akan dibincangkan lebih lanjut di mesyuarat Majlis.
- Ir. Gunasagaran Kristnan (M08216) mengulas isu ini telah berlanjutan sejak setahun yang lalu dan aduan itu merupakan pelaksanaan Institusi oleh Yang DiPertua. IEM juga telah menjawab aduan pengadu dan beliau merasakan bahawa tidak perlu membincangkan isu ini di MAT.

Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin (HF01019) menegaskan disebabkan pengadu tidak hadir maka tidak perlu MAT untuk membincangkan isu ini pada masa ini atau pada masa akan datang. Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk juga menyokong tanggapan bahawa isu ini akan dibincangkan lebih lanjut di mesyuarat Majlis.

- Ir. John Cheah Kam Loong (F01186) juga menyokong komen / saranan yang dibuat oleh Yang DiPertua bahawa isu ini harus dikemukakan kepada Majlis dan bukan di MAT.
- Ir. Mohd Radzi bin Salleh (F20112) juga menyarankan bahawa isu ini tidak perlu dibincangkan di MAT kerana pertama, Pengadu tidak hadir dan kedua, perkara itu harus dibincangkan dengan teliti sebelum dibentangkan di MAT.
- Ir. Tu Yong Eng (M15448) juga mengulas isu itu bermula pada bulan Jun 2017 dan sudah hampir setahun dan berharap agar Jawatankuasa Eksekutif dan Majlis membuat kesimpulan mengenai isu ini.

Selepas mendengar pelbagai saranan dan pendapat, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah berpendapat isu ini perlu dilakukan berdasarkan kepada peraturan perundangan. Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka seterusnya menegaskan sama ada aduan dibuat terhadap ahli atau Penjawat Perlembagaan IEM membenarkan sesuatu proses itu berlaku. Selain itu, isu ini tidak berkaitan dengan urusan MAT dan telah berlaku kesilapan di dalam Agenda MAT.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah menjelaskan dengan lebih lanjut bahawa sama ada ia adalah kes terhadap seseorang individu atau terhadap Penjawat dalam menjalankan Institusi, Jawatankuasa Eksekutif perlu melaporkan kepada Majlis dan kemudian perlu membentangkannya pada MAT yang akan datang.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah kerana mempengerusikan sesi ini.



8.0 CADANGAN PINDAAN KEPADA PERLEMBAGAAN DAN UNDANG-UNDANG

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan MAT untuk merujuk muka surat 6 hingga 15 pada pindaan kepada Perlembagaan dan Undangundang. Beliau kemudian menegaskan pindaan dalam pelbagai artikel seperti yang dinyatakan di dalam muka surat tersebut:

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) mengulas sama ada Yang DiPertua akan membentangkan pindaan secara keseluruhan atau berdasarkan artikel. Sekiranya secara keseluruhan, semua pindaan akan ditolak seandainya tiada persetujuan dibuat. Oleh yang demikian, Yang DiPertua merujuk kepada para ahli mengenai perkara ini dan MAT bersetuju merujuk pada pindaan mengikut artikel.

ARTIKEL II KEAHLIAN

Artikel 2.2

MAT bersetuju bahawa perkataan "menambah" dikeluarkan dibahagian pindaan yang dicadangkan.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) meminta penjelasan mengenai perkara "(ed) Ahli Teknikal Juruteknik Keiuruteraan" sama ada kategori ini bermaksud "Juruteknik" akan dianggap sebagai siswazah.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) memberitahu MAT bahawa kategori ini telah dibahaskan di Jawatankuasa Eksekutif. Walau bagaimanapun, tidak ada istilah yang sesuai dan oleh itu perkataan yang diputuskan adalah "juruteknik". Didapati juga bahawa tidak ada definisi mengatakan seorang siswazah harus menjadi pemegang ijazah.

Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin (HF01019) mengulas bahawa terdapat perkataan yang lebih sesuai untuk digunakan seperti 'juruteknik bertauliah dan berkelayakan' seperti yang digunakan oleh Lembaga Teknologi Malaysia (MBOT). Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk juga menjelaskan bahawa seseorang yang telah lulus digelar sebagai 'berkelayakan' manakala seorang yang menjadi juruteknik profesional akan digelar sebagai 'diperakui'. Oleh itu, Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk mencadangkan IEM boleh menggunakan istilah yang sama.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) menyatakan untuk perkara (d) 'Ahli Siswazah Kanan', terdapat huruf besar untuk setiap perkataan dan perkataan ini harus ditakrifkan mengikut definisi undang-undang. Beliau juga memetik perkataan 'Ahli Siswazah' sepatutnya mempunyai status yang sama dengan Ahli Siswazah IEM sebagai kata yang telah ditakrif.

Beliau selanjutnya memaklumkan bahawa akan ada kekeliruan terhadap pengunaan istilah 'Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan' sebagai orang yang sepatutnya memiliki ijazah setara dengan 'Ahli Siswazah. Beliau merasakan bahawa tidak sesuai untuk mempunyai perkataan yang sama di dua (2) gred yang berbeza (Ahli Siswazah dan Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan).

YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) menegaskan bahawa gred keahlian telah ditakrifkan di muka surat 9 Laporan Tahunan.

Walau bagaimanapun, Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) menjelaskan bahawa apabila terdapat huruf besar pada perkataan 'Siswazah' yang ditakrifkan manakala 'Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan' dianggap sebagai satu frasa.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa definisi gred tersebut telah ditakrifkan secara jelas di muka surat 6 Laporan Tahunan iaitu 2.15A dan seterusnya.

Ir. Shum Keng Yan (M14287) mencadangkan bahawa artikel 2.2, 2.4, 2.5 akan sah secara automatik jika MAT boleh mencari permulaan setiap pindaan. Beliau seterusnya mencadangkan agar ia dapat diterjemahkan dengan lebih jelas melalui tafsiran dan kemudian mendapat kelulusan untuk setiap gred keahlian.

Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin (HF01019) merujuk kembali kepada subjek gred keahlian 'Ahli Siswazah Juruteknik Kejuruteraan' kerana ia mungkin menimbulkan kekeliruan sama ada juruteknik tersebut adalah seorang siswazah. Y.Bhg Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk menjelaskan mengenai persepsi jika seseorang tidak mempunyai ijazah, dia bukan seorang siswazah. Y.Bhg Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk juga berpendapat dalam hal 'Ahli Siswazah Juruteknik Kejuruteraan' jelas menyatakan bahawa beliau adalah siswazah yang mempunyai ijazah.

Walau bagaimanapun, untuk juruteknik yang mempunyai diploma dan tidak mempunyai ijazah, maka terdapat keperluan untuk membezakan dua gred tersebut. MAT selanjutnya dimaklumkan secara praktikalnya pemegang diploma telah diterima. Menurut Akta MBOT, ia jelas menyatakan bahawa juruteknik tersebut adalah sah.

Ir. Shum Keng Yan (M14287) mencadangkan bahawa MAT harus merujuk keseluruhan agenda dan memutuskan artikel yang perlu diluluskan. Dalam kes-kes dimana terdapat penambahbaikan lanjut yang dibuat terutamanya mengenai isu-isu yang sahih, beliau mencadangkan supaya Kumpulan Kerja dibentuk. Dengan cara ini, MAT boleh meneruskan perbincangan perkara-perkara lain di dalam agenda.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr Gue See Sew (HF03975) memaklumkan MAT bahawa Perlembagaan IEM tidak mempunyai definisi yang nyata tetapi mempunyai tafsiran. Y.Bhg. Dato' selanjutnya memberitahu bahawa tidak ada tafsiran mengenai istilah 'Siswazah' tetapi ada perkataan 'Ahli' dengan huruf besar 'A'. Yang DiPertua kemudian merujuk perkara 10.10 (ARTIKEL X - Tafsiran) dari Perlembagaan IEM.





YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) menyokong cadangan daripada Ir. Shum Keng Yan (M14287) bahawa MAT harus meluluskan prinsip pada pindaan tersebut. Berhubung dengan penambahbaikan, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof mencadangkan agar sebuah Jawatankuasa dibentuk untuk meneliti definisi atau interpretasi apabila mempertimbangkan usul dari MBOT dan Akta Pendaftaran Jurutera.

Artikel 2.4

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) menyarankan untuk menghapuskan gelaran "Engr." dalam pindaan yang dicadangkan.

Beliau mempersoalkan sama ada apakah tindakan yang telah dilakukan atau dibincangkan mengenai penggunaan gelaran "Engr." sebelum menghapuskan perkataan tersebut. Beliau seterusnya menjelaskan bahawa apabila perkataan "Engr." telah dihapuskan, ini bermakna subjek penggunaan tajuk "Engr." dianggap selesai.

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) menyuarakan ketidakpuasan hati untuk menghapuskan gelaran "Engr." dari pindaan yang dicadangkan. Beliau menjelaskan bahawa gelaran itu mula diperkenalkan semasa Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin menjadi Yang DiPertua. Sebuah Jawatankuasa ditubuhkan untuk menghasilkan kertas kerja yang baik mengenai penggunaan gelaran "Engr." Kemudian ia dibentangkan di Jawatankuasa Eksekutif, Majlis serta mengadakan mesyuarat Majlis Khas untuk membincangkan isu ini. Oleh itu, beliau merasakan bahawa tidak wajar untuk menghapuskan gelaran tersebut tanpa menyediakan kertas kerja yang sewajarnya.

Yang DiPertua kemudian menjelaskan pada Januari 2016, ada pertemuan diantara Yang DiPertua Y.Bhg Dato' Ir. Lim Chow Hock bersama bekas Menteri Kerja Raya, YB Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof. Telah dipersetujui pada mesyuarat tersebut agar perkara ini dibawa kepada Jabatan Peguam Negara untuk diputuskan. LJM juga telah mengeluarkan surat kepada IEM untuk menggantung penggunaan gelaran "Engr." kepada ahli Siswazah. LJM telah menulis surat teguran kepada ahli yang namanya disenaraikan dalam Jurutera dengan gelaran "Engr."

Yang DiPertua seterusnya menjelaskan beliau dan delegasinya ada bertemu dengan Menteri Kerja Raya, YB Baru Bian dan mencadangkan agar meminta keputusan daripada Jabatan Peguam Negara kerana isu ini telah lama tertangguh.

Berhubung dengan ulasan yang dibuat oleh Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong, Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa dua puluh (20) ahli IEM menerima "surat tunjuk sebab" dari LJM atas penggunaan gelaran "Engr." Yang DiPertua selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa ahli Siswazah masih boleh menggunakan gelaran tersebut berdasarkan Perlembagaan. Walau bagaimanapun, mereka perlu memastikan bahagian tersebut dilindungi dari sudut perundangan. Oleh itu, dicadangkan bahawa gelaran "Engr." dikeluarkan sementara dari Perlembagaan sehingga keputusan dibuat oleh Jabatan Peguam Negara.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) selanjutnya menjelaskan bahawa IEM tidak mempunyai hak mengeluarkan gelaran "Engr." dari Perlembagaan, Walau bagaimanapun, ahli Siswazah boleh menggunakan gelaran tersebut berdasarkan Perlembagaan namun dilihat ingkar oleh REA. Oleh itu, ahli Siswazah dinasihatkan agar tidak menggunakan gelaran tersebuat sehingga keputusan dibuat oleh Jabatan Peguam Negara.

Y.Bhg Dato' Lim Chow Hock (HF02531) memaklumkan MAT semasa beliau memegang jawatan sebagai Yang DiPertua, Menteri Kerja Raya pada ketika itu, memberi jaminan bahawa penggantungan gelaran "Engr." hanya buat seketika waktu sahaja. Oleh itu, Y.Bhg Dato' juga bersetuju dengan cadangan daripada Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah agar tidak menghapuskan gelaran "Engr." dalam Perlembagaan dan menunggu sehingga keputusan dari Jabatan Peguam Negara diperolehi.

Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) juga bersetuju dengan cadangan daripada Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah dan Y.Bhg Dato' Lim Chow Hock untuk mengekalkan gelaran "Engr." di dalam Perlembagaan. Beliau selanjutnya memaklumkan MAT bahawa ia bukan satu prosedur yang tepat untuk membatalkan kenyataan itu tanpa perbincangan yang sewajarnya.

YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) mengulas walaupun penggunaan gelaran "Engr." akan bertentangan dengan Akta Parlimen serta dibantah oleh beberapa pihak yang lain, beliau menegaskan bahawa Perlembagaan IEM telah diluluskan oleh ahli-ahli dan juga Pendaftar Pertubuhan (ROS).

Oleh itu, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) seterusnya mengulas ia tidak menyalahi undangundang walau bagaimanapun, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' bersetuju dengan Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah serta bekas Yang DiPertua untuk mengekalkan gelaran "Engr." dalam Perlembagaan. YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' juga mencadangkan Yang DiPertua dan delegasi baharu boleh bertemu dengan Peguam Negara dan mengemukakan kes IEM mengenai penggunaan gelaran "Engr." tersebut.

Ir. Choo Kok Beng (HF02828) juga menegaskan bahawa isu ini tidak dibincangkan di dalam mesyuarat Majlis. YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) menegaskan bahawa isu ini ada dibincangkan di Majlis tetapi tidak secara terperinci.

Disebabkan masa yang terhad, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) mencadangkan supaya ahli bersetuju dengan prinsip Artikel 2.2. Bagi Artikel 2.4, penyingkiran tajuk "Engr." adalah tidak dipersetujui. Di samping itu, juga dicadangkan jika terdapat keperluan untuk meminda sebarang perkataan ia perlu dikemukakan kepada Majlis untuk membentuk Jawatankuasa bagi melihat sama ada ia sepadan dengan Akta MBOT dan REA. Ini juga berkaitan dengan perjanjian / pergerakan Teknologi Teknikal dan Juruteknik Kejuruteraan.





YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik juga menekankan jika pindaan tersebut ditangguhkan untuk satu tahun lagi, IEM tidak dapat mewakili Malaysia untuk menandatangani perjanjian tersebut. Oleh itu, beliau memaklumkan kepada MAT untuk mempercepatkan sesi pengundian.

MAT bersetuju pada prinsip Artikel 2.2 untuk Ahli Bukan Korporat terdiri daripada 13 gred tetapi untuk juruteknik itu layak atau diperakui, terdapat keperluan untuk memastikan norma-norma dipatuhi. Pengundian telah dilakukan dan keputusannya adalah seperti berikut:

Artikel 2.4

Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong (HF05128) mencadangkan untuk menggantikan perkataan "Companion" dengan "Ahli Senior Siswazah". MAT dimaklumkan bahawa terdapat gerakan untuk menghapuskan lima (5) baris terakhir termasuk mengeluarkan "Engr." dan hasilnya adalah seperti berikut:

Pengundian telah dijalankan untuk mengekalkan gelaran "Engr." dan keputusan adalah seperti berikut:

Artikel 2.5

Artikel 2.2 dan Artikel 2.5 ini adalah berkaitan dan telah dipersetujui secara prinsip. Oleh itu, MAT bersetuju untuk mengemukakan kepada Majlis untuk tindakan yang perlu diambil dan tiada pengundian yang akan dilakukan.

Artikel 2.14

Tiada pengundian dilakukan kerana ia berkaitan dengan perkataan dan akan dikemukakan kepada Majlis untuk tindakan yang perlu diambil.

Artikel 4.1 and Artikel 4.2

Pengundian telah dilakukan untuk kedua-dua artikel berkenaan klasifikasi yuran untuk pelbagai gred keahlian. Keputusannya adalah seperti beriku:

Berhubung dengan kemasukan empat (4) gred baharu dan terminologi akan dibentangkan kepada Majlis.

Artikel 4.2.1

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah menjelaskan kepada MAT bahawa untuk Artikel ini, ia dibahagikan kepada dua (2) bahagian; satu adalah perubahan perkataan dari "Companion" kepada 'Ahli Siswazah Kanan' dan yang satu lagi berkenaan yuran untuk Teknologi Kejuruteraan dan Juruteknik Kejuruteraan. Terdapat persoalan bahawa yuran untuk Juruteknik Kejuruteraan adalah RM155.00 yang sama dengan Ahli Siswazah.





Oleh itu, ada cadangan bahawa gred keahlian tersebut tidak akan dikenakan yuran. Walau bagaimanapun, MAT bersetuju bahawa perlu ada bayaran kadar yuran dan ianya harus dikemukakan kepada Majlis untuk perbincangan. Undian telah diambil ke atas usul untuk mengenakan bayaran dan keputusannya adalah seperti berikut:

Artikel 5.1

MAT bersetuju pada Artikel 5.1. Walau bagaimanapun, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) mencadangkan agar Majlis mengkaji semula perkataan "Ahli" mengikut Perlembagaan yang dinyatakan sebagai Ahli Korporat. YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' selanjutnya merujuk kepada Klausa 2.3 Perlembagaan yang menyatakan:

Klausa 2.3

"Hanya Ahli Korporat yang berhak untuk mengundi, untuk menuntut mesyuarat dan dipilih ke Majlis. Manakala Ahli Bukan Korporat boleh dilantik ke Majlis ".

YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) seterusnya menjelaskan bahawa Klausa 2.3 yang disebutkan itu mungkin tidak selaras dengan Artikel 5.1 kerana ia menyatakan bahawa ahli dengan huruf besar "A" layak untuk mengundi. YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' juga menegaskan bahawa terdapat keperluan untuk memeriksa semula sama ada gred seperti yang disenaraikan dalam pindaan yang dicadangkan untuk Artikel 2.2 layak untuk mengundi di Majlis. Oleh itu, YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' merasakan bahawa Jawatankuasa Kecil Pindaan kepada Perlembagaan haruslah melihat dengan teliti bagi memastikan bahawa gred ini layak untuk mengundi mengikut Artikel 5.1.

Ir. Wong Chee Fui (F20903) turut menyokong cadangan YBhg. Ahli Akademik Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik untuk memeriksa dengan teliti Perlembagaan tersebut untuk memastikan terdapat konsistensi dalam pindaan yang dicadangkan dalam Artikel 2.2 dan Artikel 5.1. Yang DiPertua juga bersetuju bahawa istilah atau perkataan itu akan dibentangkan kepada Majlis untuk perbincangan.

Artikel 5.2

MAT bersetuju bahawa pindaan ini adalah mengenai cara pentadbiran. Walau bagaimanapun, Ir. Chong Pick Eng (HF01214) mengulas bahawa terdapat keperluan untuk melihat keseluruhan Perlembagaan secara umum.

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr) Keizrul Abdullah mencadangkan agenda untuk perkara ini, iaitu Agenda 6 ditukar kepada Agenda 13 kerana beliau berpendapat kebanyakan ahli telah keluar dewan dan mungkin korum tidak mencukupi. Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka merasakan bahawa pindaan tersebut sepatutnya dilakukan melalui Mesyuarat Agung Khas (SGM) dan kemudian itu akan diadakan selepas MAT.

Oleh yang demikian, Timbalan Yang DiPertua meminta persetujuan MAT untuk melihat agenda yang lain terlebih dahulu untuk mematuhi peraturan undang-undang. Cadangan itu disokong oleh Ir. Choo Kok Beng (HF02828).

9.0 PENGUMUMAN PEMILIHAN KEPUTUSAN SESI 2019/2020

Yang DiPertua menjemput Pegawai Pemilihan, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon untuk mengumumkan keputusan bagi sesi 2019/2020.

9.1 Yang DiPertua and Timbalan Yang DiPertua

Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon memaklumkan MAT bahawa mengikut Seksyen 5.2 dari Perundangan IEM Seksyen 5.13, Yang DiPertua semasa, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi akan meneruskan penggal kedua dalam jawatan sebagai Yang DiPertua sementara Ir. Ong Chiong Loon terus kekal sebagai Timbalan Yang DiPertua bagi sesi 2019/2020.

9.2. Naib Yang di-Pertua, Setiausaha Kehormat, Bendahari Kehormat dan lain-lain

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon mengumumkan keputusan percalonan dan pemilihan seperti berikut:





9.2.1 Jawatan Ahli Majlis - Wakil dari Disiplin Lain (Satu (1) kekeosongan untuk 3 sesi 2019/2020, 2020/2021, 2021/2022)

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa terdapat dua (2) pencalonan yang diterima untuk jawatan ini.

Walau bagaimanapun, salah seorang calon didapati tidak layak di bawah kategori ini kerana beliau didaftarkan dalam disiplin Awam di dalam pangkalan data IEM. Oleh itu, seorang lagi calon iaitu Ir. Bhuvendhraa Rudrusamy menang tanpa bertanding sebagai Ahli Majlis - Wakil Disiplin Lain untuk sesi 2019/2020, 2020/2021 dan 2012/2022.

9.3 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon kemudian memaklumkan kepada MAT bahawa jawatan berikut memerlukan pengundian:

Naib Timbalan Yang DiPertua - 8 calon
 Setiausaha Kehormat - 2 calon
 Bendahari Kehormat - 2 orang calon
 Ahli Majlis - Wakil Biasa - 25 orang calon

9.3.1 Jawatan Naib Yang DiPertua (Tiga (3) kekosongan untuk 2 sesi 2018/2019 dan 2019/2020)

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa langkah-langkah telah diambil untuk menghantar kertas undi yang kepada ahli-ahli untuk jawatan yang memerlukan pengundian iaitu untuk Naib Yang DiPertua, Setiausaha Kehormat, Bendahari Kehormat dan ahli-ahli Majlis Biasa. Sebanyak 11,542 kertas undi dihantar kepada Ahli Korporat. Kotak Undi di Pejabat Urusetia IEM telah dikunci pada 6 April 2019 pada pukul 10.10 pagi. Sejumlah 1,711 kertas undi diterima di IEM apabila peti undi dibuka selepas pukul 10.15 pagi. Selepas menyemak dan mengesahkan kertas undi, pengiraan undi dilakukan pada pukul 10.50 pagi untuk menentukan calon yang berjaya.

YBhg. Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon memaklumkan MAT bahawa terdapat lapan (8) pencalonan yang diterima untuk empat (4) kekosongan jawatan. Empat (4) calon yang mendapat undi tertinggi dipilih dengan jawatan Naib Yang DiPertua bagi sesi 2019/2020 dan 2020/2021:

- ii) Ir. Dr Tan Chee Fai

9.4 Jawatan Setiausaha Kehormat (Satu (1) kekosongan untuk sesi 2019/2020)

Terdapat dua (2) pencalonan yang diterima untuk satu kekosongan. Calon Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad mendapat jumlah undi yang lebih tinggi dan seterusnya dilantik ke jawatan Setiausaha Kehormat untuk sesi 2019/2020.

9.5 Jawatan Bendahari Kehormat (Satu (1) kekosongan untuk sesi 2019/2020)

MAT dimaklumkan terdapat tiga (3) percalonan diterima. Calon Ir. Chen Harn Shean menerima jumlah undi yang lebih tinggi dan seterusnya dilantik ke jawatan Bendahari Kehormat untuk sesi 2019/2020.

9.6 Jawatan Ahli Majlis - Wakil Biasa (Sepuluh (10) kekosongan untuk 3 sesi, 2019/2020, 2020/2021 and 2021/2022)

YBhg. Dato 'Ir. Pang Leong Hoon melaporkan terdapat dua puluh tujuh (27) pencalonan yang diterima dan sepuluh (10) calon berikut dengan bilangan undi tertinggi dipilih menjadi Ahli Majlis - Wakil Biasa (Sepuluh (10) kekosongan untuk tiga (3) sesi, 2019/2020, 2020/2021 dan 2021/2022):

- 9.7 MAT seterusnya dimaklumkan bahawa proses Pemilihan mengambil masa selama tiga (3) bulan dan jumlah kos ialah sebanyak RM28,380.40 (kertas undi dan pos). Ini tidak termasuk kos Urusetia IEM. 



3 THE COUNCIL AND THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 3.1 Five Council and thirteen monthly Executive Committee (Excomm) meetings were held during the session to look into the management of the properties and affairs of the Institution.
- 3.2 I wish to thank all members of the Council, Executive Committee, Standing Committees, Branches, Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups, Sections, Sub Committees, Ad Hoc Committees and other Committees for their participation, contribution and support in the activities of the institution in the furtherance of its objective to promote the science and profession of engineering in the spirit of a learned society.
- 3.3 I must also express a vote of thanks to the various members who may not have served on the above Committees, but voluntarily served as IEM representatives to the various government bodies and organisations.

4 STANDING COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

4.1 The role of the Standing Committee chaired by the Deputy President, Ir. Ong Ching Loon is to conduct the financial management of the properties and affairs of the IEM. Regular meetings were held every 3rd Thursday of the month.

4.2 Main Sources of Income

4.2.1 Annual Subscription

Financing of the operating expenditure of the Institution continue to depend largely on the collection of members' annual subscriptions. For the year 2019, income from annual subscriptions stood at approximately 70% of the total income compared to 65% in 2018, 51% in 2017 and 57% in 2016.

In accordance with the Bylaws, reminders to members on their annual subscription payments were sent out by the Institution. For the year 2019, 91.2% of the members had settled their subscriptions by the end of the year. IEM wish to thank all members who had promptly settled their subscriptions.

As at the end of the financial year 2019, 2,304 members are in arrears of subscription for 2019 compared to 4,638 in 2018. The total outstanding collection for the year amounted to RM301,645 compared to RM372,050 in 2018. IEM would like to appeal to these members to settle the arrears as soon as possible.

4.2.2 Rental

A new tenant, Merdeka Strategic Development Centre Sdn Bhd was secured for first and second floor of Wisma IEM with a two-year tenancy commencing February 2019 with an option to renew for another two years.

The ground floor of Bangunan Ingenieur continue to be rented out to Pizza Hut at a monthly rental of RM16,907. Pizza Hut's tenancy was renewed in November 2018 for another three years.



4.2.3 Activities Income

The IEM Technical Divisions continue to organise activities such as courses, seminars, workshops etc for the benefit for members' professional development as well as generate some income for the Institution. Income generated contributes to the improvement of facilities as well as services of the Institution. For the year 2019, income generated by the Technical Divisions amounted to RM318,845 which indicated a rather large drop compared to 2018.

Nevertheless, various efforts are being initiated to improve the activities so as to be more relevant to attract more participants.

4.2.4 Diversification of Income Streams

In an effort to reduce IEM's dependency on annual subscriptions, the Standing Committee embarked on an initiative to look into diversification of IEM's income streams. Four possible new income streams were identified namely:

- (i) Organising an annual IEM/Engineering Exhibition
- (ii) Secure annual sponsorships for IEM
- (iii) Providing advertising opportunities to generate more income for IEM
- (iv) Sale of Publications

For a start, (i), (ii) and (iii) had been put into action. IEM has entered a partnership with exhibition organizer, CIS Network Sdn Bhd to organize an annual IEM Convention. This convention will comprise of an engineering exhibition cutting across all disciplines – for a start in 2020, the exhibition named "ENGINEER" will cover the four major disciplines of Civil, Mechanical, Electrical and Chemical under one roof. This 5-year partnership will bring a confirmed annual income of at least RM200,000 to IEM. The Standing Committee would greatly appreciate support from all IEM members for the Convention scheduled from 23rd to 26th September 2020 at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre.

For annual sponsorship and advertising opportunities, IEM is introducing a Sponsorship and Advertising Package for companies to promote their engineering related products and services. The intention is to expose IEM members to the various products and services with latest technologies as well as generate income for IEM. These packages would nevertheless be subject to the IEM Commercialisation Guidelines so as to ensure IEM's impartiality.

4.3 Administrative Expenses

In order to control expenses and at the same time, provide adequate services to members, the Standing Committee implements strict but effective budgetary control measures. In view of the increase in operating costs and the drop in income due to the economic situation, various costs control measures were implemented to ensure that operating costs are controlled within the limited funds of the Institution while at the same time ensuring that services to members are not impaired.

4.4 Sub Committee on Human Resources

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad looked into the recruitment and deployment of staff for the Secretariat. Meetings were regularly held to deal with matters relating to Human Resource of Secretariat. As at 31 December 2019, the Secretariat's staff strength 42 including three staff under the International Office that is financed by AER, FEIAP and APEC Engineers Register.

4.5 Sub Committee on IEM Infrastructure

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Chen Harn Shean continued to monitor the maintenance and renovation of Bangunan Ingenieur and Wisma IEM. The function of the Sub Committee also covered managing the usage of the meeting rooms, security system of IEM, fire protection, electrical installations, ICT computerisation and networking, general facilities, etc. For 2019, the Sub Committee handled the renovation and refurbishment of the Ground Floor of Wisma IEM to provide better services such as a more spacious place for lunch or refreshments. Named **D'Place@IEM**, the new cafeteria is able to accommodate 130 pax with a better ambience to improve members' appetite. There is also a Members' Lounge and a Digital Maker Space operated by the ICT Special Interest Group.

The Standing Committee acknowledges that there are still some shortcomings to the facilities and will continue to look into further improvement within the constraints of the Institution's finance.

4.6 Sub Committee on IEM IT Infrastructure

Ir. Guansagaran Kristnan was appointed to chair this newly formed Sub Committee that is tasked to look into the IT Infrastructure of IEM. The Sub Committee is now reviewing the contract of the vendor for IEM portal as well as preparing a road map to move the IEM portal to cloud.



5 STANDING COMMITTEE ON ADMISSIONS AND PRACTICAL TRAINING

- 5.1 Ir. Mohd Aman bin Hj. Idris was appointed as the Chairman for the Standing Committee for the session 2019/2020. The main role of this Standing Committee was to scrutinise applications for candidates applying for election/admission/transfer to the various grades of membership. This Standing Committee also worked closely with the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualifications in organising awareness talks relating to Corporate membership/Professional Engineer and career in engineering.
- 5.2 Up to 31 December 2019, a total of 6087 candidates were approved for election, admission and transfer to the various grades as listed below:

5.3 Sub-Committee on Membership Applications Board (MAB).

Ir. Dr Lee Yun Fook continued to chair the Sub-Committee for the second session 2019/2020. The Sub-Committee also continued its role of vetting and assessing applications for the various grades of membership of the Institution.

5.3.1 Processing of AER, AAE and IPE/APEC International Engineer Register Applications

The Membership Applications Board's also vetted and recommended applications from members for their Asia-Pacific Economic Co-operation Engineer Register / International Professional Engineers Register, ASEAN Engineer, Associate ASEAN Engineer and Associate ASEAN Technologist membership. The following is the breakdown of applications for these Registers:

- 33 approved for the Asia-Pacific Economic Co-operation Engineer Register / International Professional Engineers Register (APEC/Int.PE)
- 22 approved for ASEAN Engineer (AE)
- 26 approved for Associate ASEAN Engineer (AAE)
- 1 approved for Associate ASEAN Technologist (AET)

5.4 Sub-Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions

Ir. Fam Yew Hin continued to chair the Sub-Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions for the first three months. Thereafter, Ir. Dr. Aidil Chee Tahir was appointed as the new Chairman for the Sub-Committee for the session 2019/2020. During the year, the Sub-Committee conducted membership drive talks/events at various international and local engineering related organizations, Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) and governmental agencies. The Technical Divisions and IEM Branches also contributed towards the success of the membership drive initiative by organizing 90 membership drive events/ talks and other related activities in 2019.

The Sub-Committee organized a brainstorming session on 27 July 2019. The main objective of the session was to review the previous year's activities and to establish an effective plan to increase the Institution's membership and relevance within the engineering fraternity, as well as exploring strategies and ideas to attract new members. In addition, the Sub-Committee continued to organize road-shows at IEM Branches across Malaysia. The objective of the road-shows was to create an awareness about IEM and to encourage non-IEM engineers to join as a member, as well as sharing with both IEM and non-IEM members on how to become a Professional Engineer.

In November 2019, the Sub-Committee organized an IEM Speakers' Training Session which was attended by representatives from various Technical Divisions, as well as IEM membership drive past speakers. During the session, an updated presentation material was shared with the participants.

For the year 2019, the Sub-Committee had successfully engaged two (2) Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) to sign a MOU with IEM to recruit new student members and graduating engineering members.

In summary, through these various initiatives, IEM will continue to expand and remain an inclusive and relevant organization to all engineering practitioners.



5.5 Sub Committee on IEM Log Book Training Scheme (renamed as Sub Committee on Engineering Competency Development)

The Sub Committee was chaired by Ir. Abdul Razak bin Yakob. The primary responsibilities of the Sub Committee were to assess and confirm the logbooks prepared by the mentees and reviewed by their respective mentors. The logbooks were prepared to document the work and practical experience training progress of mentees career as an engineer and to ensure that the experience can lead the engineer to accumulate adequate experience to be developed into a Professional Engineer. The logbook has to be in conformance to the requirements of the IEM's Engineering Competency Development (ECD) Guidelines. A total of 187 log books were reviewed and confirmed in the year 2019.

Apart from meeting one Saturday every month for the above activities, the Sub Committee has conducted various works as part of the effort to revamp the mentor mentee programme quality in IEM. Following are the activities conducted:

- a. Engagement Sessions This year, as part of the revamp effort, the Sub Committee combined the workshops for mentor and mentee to become an engagement session for mentors and mentees. The sessions were held on 16 March 2019 and 13 July 2019. The Mentor/Mentee Engagement sessions were conducted in HQ and broadcasted to all IEM Branches (where facilities are available).
- b. IEM's Next Top Mentor 2018 As part of the effort to recognize the mentor's contribution to the organization, ECD created an event where mentees can propose their mentor to be recognized as top mentor in IEM. It is a competition where the top five (5) mentors are recognized during the AGM. Below are the top five (5) mentors recognized at the AGM on 20 April 2019:

- c. Logbook format The new format was created to replace the dated format which was created more than 20 years ago. The new format is created based on the Professional Interview (PI) format, where the logbook can be prepared to get the candidates ready for the future PI. The new format for the ECD (log book) programme is available via online effective January 2019. The new format is required to be used by mentees registered from 1 January 2019.
- d. List of IEM ECD Mentors and Mentees There has been confusion on the definition of mentors and mentees. For clarity, IEM ECD Mentors and Mentees are those registered with ECD programme. Any other mentors acting on their own initiative are not part of the programme if they are not registered with the programme. To ensure this is clear to all members, the list of registered mentors and mentees under this programme were released / updated two (2) times in 2019.
- e. The updated ECD Programme Registration forms for Mentees and Mentors registration had been posted on the website.
- The updated IEM ECD Guidelines had also posted on the website.
- g. Senior Mentors As part of the effort to recognize mentor's contribution, together with the Sub-Committee on PI Development, we introduced a listing for Senior Mentor. The write up for this effort and how it can contribute to the organization is available on the website. The list of recognized senior mentors based the set criteria is also published on the website.

The Sub Committee on ECD wishes to thank the Executive Committee and Standing Committee on Admissions and Practical Training for the support provided to ensure the activities above able to be completed.

5.6 IEM Training Board

The IEM Training Board chaired by Ir. Li Thang Fai continued to deal mainly on the approval of the training programmes, conferences, technical talks, seminars etc in relation to the requirement of BEM's Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for Professional Engineers.

The main task of the Training Board is to evaluate the training programmes organised by IEM various Committees and Branches. The Training Board also responsible for the approval of CPD hour application from external training providers. In addition, the Training Board also conducted audits on the selected programmes for verifying conformity.

5.7 Special Committee on Structured Training

Ir. Mohd. Radzi Salleh continued to chair the Special Committee on Structured Training for session 2019/2020 for the fifth session. The purpose of the Structured Training programme is to assist the graduate members/engineers who lacked design experience to gain the relevant experience to enable them to be eligible to sit for the Outcome Based Professional Interview.

For the year 2019, the Search Committee on Electrical continued with the third session of the 24-day Electrical Engineering Design course. A total of four (4) participants attended the course. The course ended on 21 December 2019. Apart from the Electrical course, the Search Committee in Chemical Engineering had their first session of the 24-Saturday Structured Training Programme Design in Chemical Engineering (STPD) course on 28 September 2019. The STPD programme is currently ongoing until April 2020. The Search Committee on Civil Engineering plan to conduct the next sub-discipline programme on Structural Design Engineering tentatively in March 2020.

In addition to the above, the Special Committee is also in discussion with Prasarana Berhad for a joint collaboration on the Structured Training. Both parties were currently looking into drafting a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) on the Structured Training programme. It is hoped that the MoA would be signed in the first quarter of 2020.

6. STANDING COMMITTEE ON EXAMINATIONS AND QUALIFICATIONS

6.1 Ir. Prof Dr Norlida binti Buniyamin was the new Chairperson for the session 2019/2020. The main responsibility of this Standing Committee was to regulate the professional interviews as well as working closely with the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC) on the accreditation of the engineering degree programmes.

6.2 Professional Interview Board

Ir. Tu Yong Eng continued as Chairman of the PI Board for the session 2019/2020. The main responsibility of the Professional Interview Board was to co-ordinate the conventional and the outcome based professional interviews held at the Head Office as well as the IEM Branches. The Professional Interview Board, on behalf of the BEM also assigned Examiners for the Professional Assessment Examination (PAE) candidates of the BEM. In addition to this, the PI Board would also recommend the Professional Interview results to the Standing Committee for acceptance. For the year 2019, the PI Board together with the Sub Committee on PI Development had conducted eight (8) Professional Interview awareness talks and workshops for the Graduate Members and four (4) IEM Certification and Training workshops on the Outcome Based Professional Interview (fka Enhanced Professional Interview) for the Interviewers.

6.2.1 Professional Interviews

IEM approved a total of eighty two (82) applications for the Professional Assessment Examination (PAE) from the Board of Engineers, Malaysia (BEM) in 2019. Fifty three (53) candidates passed whereas twelve (12) were unsuccessful for the PAE.

6.3 IEM Accreditation Board

Ir. Prof Dr. Zainal Abidin Ahmad continued to be the Chairman for the IEM Accreditation Board for session 2019/2020. The role of the IEM Accreditation Board was to assist the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC). IEM is one of the constituents of the EAC to evaluate local engineering degree programmes offered by both private and public Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) in the country.

6.4 Sub Committee on Professional Interview Development

The Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Chen Harn Shean had drafted guidelines for not only the Candidates but also the Assessors of the Membership Applications Board (MAB) as well as for the Interviewers of the Outcome Based Professional Interview. The Sub Committee had also amended and updated the application forms from time to time.

The Sub Committee also worked closely with the Professional Interview Board especially on conducting the outcome based Professional Interview workshops for the Candidates and also the Interviewers and Assessors. In addition, the Sub Committee had also assisted the Sub Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions (MDP) for talks concerning the outcome based Professional Interview to the graduate engineers as well as the members applied to sit for the Professional Interview.

For the year 2019, the Sub Committee also had their members conducted talks at the outcome based professional interview workshops organised by six (6) IEM Branches. The Sub Committee was also currently looking into having the professional interview process be automated. The main objective was to reduce the errors and mistakes done manually so as to increase efficiency in the processing of the outcome based Professional Interview applications.



6.5 Review Committee on IPEA/APEC Review for Audit 2020

The Sub Committee on IPEA/APEC Review for Audit 2020 chaired by Ir. Chen Harn Shean was formed mainly to re-draft the Assessment Statement for the IPEA/APEC, to prepare the Reviewer's Report and to ensure the processing the applications for the IPEA/APEC International register is in line with the requirements of the said international register for the audit 2020. This was to ensure that the Members had obtained the two (2) years of responsible charge of significant engineering works in order to be approved as an APEC/IntPE member.

In addition to this, the Sub Committee was also currently recording the Professional Interviews sessions for the four (4) major engineering disciplines; Chemical, Civil, Electrical/Electronic and Mechanical for the IPEA/APEC review audit 2020. The recording for the audit 2020 would be completed in June 2020.

7 STANDING COMMITTEE ON INFORMATION AND PUBLICATIONS

7.1 For Session 2019/2020, the Standing Committee was chaired by Ir. Dr. Wang Hong Kok. The Standing Committee is responsible for the publication of the IEM monthly Jurutera bulletin, IEM Journal, IEM Directory, IEM official website and the library. In the year under review, the Standing Committee met regularly on every 2nd Tuesday of the month.

7.2 Jurutera

The Chief Editor and Bulletin Editor for the session were Ir. Dr. Wang Hong Kok and Ir. Abdul Razak bin Yakob respectively. Twelve issues of the bulletin were published for the year 2019. The titles for the issues are:

The Standing Committee had decided not to publish any hard copies of the IEM directory. The last printed IEM directory (printed copy and CD) was produced in 2016. An online directory which is updated "real time" is made available on the IEM website.

7.5 IEM Website and Homepage

The Standing Committee continued to monitor and improve the webpage. Efforts were made to make the website more user-friendly and to keep members updated with useful announcements. For the session, the Committee also embarked on the initiative to post recorded videos of talks conducted at IEM HQ on the website for the benefit of IEM members.

7.6 Library

The Sub Committee on Library chaired by Ir. CMM Aboobucker met 10 times in the year 2019.

This year we added 71 new of physical books to our library collections. Increasing from 7,036 books in 2018 to 7,135 books in 2019. The titles cover numerous disciplines. Apart from engineering and management topics, there are books on other general topics which are of interest to the engineering fraternity, e.g. cyber security, Al artificial intelligences, climate change, aeronautical engineering, risk management and public administration

Focus in future to increase purchasing of e- books, The IEM library has acquired 374 e-books on engineering and technology topics by end of year 2019. These collections are very popular among members. Apart from technical books, online Journals in the field of Geotechnical Engineering also can be accessed such as NRC Canadian Geotechnical Journal and ASCE Journal Geotechnical and Geoenvironmental Engineering.



Announcement and information on new physical books as well as eBooks are announced regularly through the IEM Portal under the heading, "Benefit and Services". Announcements are also made during IEM events and through TV display screen at Bangunan Ingenieur located near the Lift lobby entrance.

Members who wish to borrow physical books can reserve them through the IEM Portal. Members are also encouraged to submit recommendations of new titles either physical or using special format available in the IEM Portal.

The IEM Library also has continuously liaised with SIRIM Technical Library in providing a service to borrow local and international Standards through SIRIM Membership Card. Members can use this SIRIM Membership Card and loan the required materials except Malaysian Standard, journals, and technical reports. Borrowed materials are to be returned within two weeks. Many members in the academic and consulting field use this facility.

9.8 IEM Arbitrator Appointment / ADR Advisory Board

Ir. Ellias Saidin was appointed to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee for 2019-2020 session.

9.8.1 New Member to Register as IEM Arbitrators

The announcement to call all members to register as a Panel of IEM Arbitrators has been made at IEM Bulletin in November 2019 and IEM official Website.

9.9 Sub Committee on Screening of Complaints and Queries

Ir. Khoo Choong Keow was appointed to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee to screen the complaints made against members on grounds of ethics, unfair dismissal, professional misconducts, unethical practice of Professional Engineers and other issues.

The Sub Committee will determine whether such complaints warrant a need to set up disciplinary Adhoc Committee to hear such cases. During the 2019-2020 session, there was no new complaint receive. The previous complaints in 2018/2019 were finalized as follows:-

- a) The Complaint against IEM Member for using M.I.E.M and ASEAN Engineer on business card. The hearing was conducted and the Complainant sent resignation letter to terminate the membership. Case closed.
- b) The Complaint between IEM Council and Executive Committee Members on Unethical & Unprofessional Behavior. The discussion between members involved were done and all parties were given letter of advice for good conduct.
- c) The Complaint by a Member against the IEM President. The Chairman of Sub Committee DARP had been appointed to screen the complaint and recommend to Excomm. The recommendation was forwarded to Excomm for deliberation.

9.10 Sub Committee on Legislation Affecting Engineering Profession

Ir. Lai Sze Ching continued his service to provide regular updates and information on the following legislation on how such legislation would impact the engineering profession:

- Registration of Engineers Act 1967 (Rev 2016)
- Technologists and Technicians Act 2015 (Act 768)

9.11 Outside Bodies Representation (OBR)

The Chairman, Ir. Ellias Saidin was assigned to appoint representatives to attend and participate by maintaining and establishing close rapporteur and participate into various government agencies in meetings with various outside bodies between IEM with Local Authorities and Government or Public sector. Ir. Hj. Mohd. Radzi bin Salleh with Ir. Yap Soon Hoe formed a Joint Working Group with representatives from PPC and CA to study and re-structure the system and produce a manual for the IEM Outside Bodies Representation.

The aim of the updated OBR Manual is to have more generic manual for IEM as it was previously more PPC focused and as of now it involves other Standing Committees such as Corporate Affairs and others. IEM Outside Bodies Representatives will be categorized into the followings:

- (i) One time off event / functions i.e. dinners, opening ceremony, forum, dialogue etc. for example from MBAM, IFE, CIDB, SIRIM, MATRADE, MIDA, ASM, ASLI, Universities, etc.
- (ii) Continuously meetings, workshop, i.e. SIRIM TCs, WGs, MATRADE NAPSEC, DSM MSDAM, MyENC, MyNSC, etc.

These representatives require to have an adequate level of professional competency to enable offering expert views and opinions in their respective areas of professional practices. The IEM representatives are also expected to sustain members' participations and well equipped with the latest trend or current development of knowledge and industry experience on the expert topics.



Currently, more than 100 members from IEM Excomm, Council and the respective Standing Committee, Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups (SIG), Sections and branch representatives representing IEM in more than 150 technical committees, working groups, opening ceremonies, dinner, events, technical dialogue and meetings at various local governments, agencies, institutions, organisations and universities.

As for this exercise, the Secretariat reports and refers all incoming invitations by external parties by referring to and consulting with the IEM President assisted by the PPC Chairman, IEM Honorary Secretary and relevant Committees Chairmen to appoint and identify IEM representatives to attend external meetings and events whilst, the PPC Secretariat handles the necessary administrative works.

All representatives that/who attended the external meetings will be required to submit a copy of the Outside Bodies Representation (OBR) report form within a week from the meeting date especially those representatives who are actively involved in the outside bodies meetings. The reports shall indicate the issues raised in the meetings which affect engineering profession in general and in particular those converned IEM. All incoming reports will be tabled at the monthly meeting of the Standing Committee on Professional Practice, Technical Divisions and thereafter will be reported to the President and Excomm if there is any matters that require further deliberation or action.

Out of total of 205 invitation received in year 2019 (144 representative attended the meetings and 61 representative attended the social activities), only 64 representatives with 35 reports submission received. Representatives attended the important external meetings regularly to expedite with the submission.

IEM also continues to support other local and international events and become one of the jointly organized and supporters without financial commitment. For these events supported by IEM, the organisers have been provided with an IEM logo for their promotional materials. In return, IEM requested for copy of the conferences proceeding. All representatives attended the conferences are required to pass the conference proceeding to the library for safe-keeping. The representatives are requested to email the Outside Bodies Report to Secretariat for acknowledgment.

IEM continues to provide and assist with comments and input required by the industries such as Malaysian Standard (MS) draft for the Department of Standards Malaysia (DSM), SIRIM Berhad and Jabatan Kerja Raya (JKR).

Most of the details received has been uploaded regularly into IEM official Website (refer to http://www.myiem.org.my/content/Related_to_Engineering-382.aspx) and also has been forwarded to Library and InfoPUB for dissemination to IEM Members.

10 STANDING COMMITTEE ON WELFARE AND SERVICE MATTERS

10.1 Under the Chairmanship of Vice President, Ir. Dr Tan Chee Fai, this Standing Committee continues to look into improving IEM's services to members as well as matters pertaining to the welfare of IEM members. Activities such as the IEM Family Day and IEM Engineering Week were successfully organised during the session.

10.2 IEM Benevolent Fund

Total contribution amounting to RM26,926.31 was received from members in the year 2019. IEM would like to record its appreciation to the members for their kind support and generosity. Balance available in the fund as at 31 December 2019 is RM541,630.04.

10.3 Jurutera Wargamas (JWS) and Exempted Members

The scheme specially designed for members who are senior citizens or disabled aimed to reduce the annual subscription for these members to an affordable amount. The affected members would only need to pay 25% of the annual subscription fee with the balance to be settled from the IEM Benevolent Fund Account. 10.4 Employment Survey

The Standing Committee had finalized the survey questionnaire which is anticipated to be distributed by in February 2020.

10.5 **IEM Family Day 2019**

IEM Family Day serves as an avenue for networking among senior and young engineers and helpful for IEM Council members to obtain feedback on IEM activities. It also promotes the fostering of closer rapport between members. IEM Family Day 2019 was held on 29 September 2019 at Tunku Abdul Rahman University College, Kuala Lumpur and attracted approximately 500 participants comprising IEM Council members, IEM members and their families. SPM/STPM/A-Level award recipients were all invited to this function. Certificates of achievement and cash were given to the children of IEM members who achieved outstanding results in their SPM, STPM and A-Level 2019. This year a total of 29 SPM, 1 STPM and 4 A-Level students were rewarded. There were more than 10 types of challenging and fun games for children and adults. These include fun games, giant bubbles, traditional games etc. IEM hired a caterer to set up foods serving local and western favourites and many other delicious foods.



10.6 IEM Engineering Week 2019 (EW2019)

The Standing Committee organised the 23rd IEM Engineering Week (EW2019) from 4th – 10th August 2019. A one week programme that focused on the following was arranged:-

- To promote Engineering Profession to the public in conjunction to the IEM Engineering Week 2019.
- To promote Engineering to the general public to encourage secondary school students to pursue Engineering as a profession.

The highlight of the IEM EW2019 was the Opening Ceremony which coincided with the IEM Engineer's Run 2019 that was held at Setia City Convention Centre with more than 1000 runners participating.

EW2019 also organised the 4th IEM Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) Competition 2019 where 7 secondary schools from Klang Valley participated.

10.7 Insurance Matters

Several insurance schemes were arranged with insurance companies for members such as:

10.8 Affinity Programme

The Committee continues to negotiate with vendors and merchants to look into joint collaboration for the benefit of IEM members. For the year 2019, the Committee had obtained corporate rates from several hotels in Klang Valley, Mercedes Benz, Audi, BMW, BP Healthcare, Institut Jantung Negara, World of Sports, Red Wing Shoes, Focus Point etc. The Sub Committee also managed to continue the collaboration for the year 2020.

The Committee will continue to implement more activities for the welfare of members as well as providing excellent services to the members.

ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisations (AFEO) Secretariat

The AFEO Governing Board continues to maintain the AFEO Secretariat Management Committee at IEM to facilitate the AFEO Secretariat in performing its duties and responsibilities. IEM was reappointed as the Secretariat and Treasurer for AFEO for session 2019-2020 with Ir. Prof Dr Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin as the Secretary-General and Ir. Mohd Khir Muhammad as the Honorary Treasurer.

Dr Gong Ke from CAST took over the presidency of WFEO from Dr Marlene Kanga at the General Assembly held on 24 November 2019 in Melbourne, Australia.

The IEM President and Hon Secretary were the official representatives of the IEM at the General Assembly. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof Dr Chuah Hean Teik received the conferment of the WFEO Excellence Award for Engineering Education for 2019.

11.15 Commonwealth Engineers Council (CEC)

The CEC had been operating as a virtual organisation working within WFEO. Matters concerning the Council were circulated via emails and letters. Commonwealth Engineers Council (CEC) is a professional body of the Commonwealth representing 45 engineering institutions in 44 countries across five continents. During the WFEO General Assembly in Melbourne in November, CEC held its first physical meeting in many years and it will be looking into revisions to its Constitution.

HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT

- The 2019 fiscal Statement of Accounts and the Balance Sheet of the Institution are as presented. The accounts are maintained 1. by the Standing Committee on Finance to which the Hon. Treasurer is the Secretary.
- 2. The financial statements presented comprise of three sets of accounts. The columns denoted by "Institution" refers to the financial performance of IEM but these figures do not include the financial position of the IEM Branches who file their financial statements with the IRB of the respective states.
- The columns denoted by "Group" refers to the consolidated accounts of IEM, IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd and IEM Academy 3. Sdn Bhd. There are some columns where figures are shown under "Institution" but blank under "Group" and vice versa. This is due to the figures being related party transactions which were eliminated on consolidation.
- The total income for year 2019 is RM5,014,556 which is RM98,964 lower than that of year 2018. The total income included 4. RM428,887 being net income from Institutional services, rental income RM744,396.
- The drop in revenue is due mainly to lesser Surplus from activities of the Technical Divisions which only recorded RM383,295 5. compared to RM558,314 in 2018.
- The main source of income continue to be annual subscriptions which amounted to RM3,464,860 for 2019 which made up 6. approximately 69% of the total income of the Institution compared to 65% in 2018 and 51% in 2017. At the end of 2019, there was subscriptions still owing from members amounting to RM301,645 compared to RM372,050 in 2018.
- 7. The total expenditure of the Institution was RM5,170,734, which was RM910,697 lower than that of year 2018. The main operating expenditure items were personnel emoluments RM2,240,141 (43%), administrative expenses RM1,124,845, finance cost (term loan interest) RM96,819 and Branch Subsidies RM451,840. Branch Subsidies for West Malaysia Branches would be increased to 30% of respective collection with effect from 2020.
- 8. Expenses for year 2019 was 15% lower than 2018.
- 9. Various initiatives had been implemented to save operating costs including the move to paperless meetings in IEM thereby reducing cost of printing as well as posting of minutes of meetings/meeting documents to Committee Members. As can be seen from the accounts, due to this initiative, printing and stationery dropped by 30% while postage dropped by 23%.
- However, with effect from February 2020, Pos Malaysia had announced a hike of between 70 85% in postage charges. At 10. the end of 2018, a circular was sent together with the annual renewal notice to seek members' consent to send e-Bulletin instead of the hard copy. Members who consent to this will be issued the e-Bulletin via email beginning middle of 2019. To date the number of members who had opted for the e-Bulletin is around 625. In order to enable the e-Bulletin to be more easily accessible and readable by members via mobilephones, IEM will be working with a vendor to introduce a mobile app to improve IEM's communication with IEM members.
- Financially, IEM as an Institution, recorded a deficit of RM212,933 in financial year 2019 as compared to a deficit of 11 RM1,021,277 in financial year 2018.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2019

1. Basis of preparation

(a) Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the Institution of Engineers, Malaysia ("hereinafter referred to as the "Institution") have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standards ("MPERS") and the constitution and by-laws of the institution.

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared assuming that the Group and the Institution will continue as a going concern which contemplates the realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities in the normal course of business.

The financial statements of the Group and the Institution have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise indicated in the significant accounting policies in Note 1(c).

(b) Functional and presentation currency

These financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is the Group's and the Institution's functional currency. All financial information is presented in RM and has been rounded to the nearest RM except when otherwise stated.

(c) Significant accounting judgments, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the Group's and the Institution's financial statements requires the Council to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of income, expenditure, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities at the reporting date. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that could require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in the future.

Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the end of the reporting period, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next reporting period are set out below:

(i) Useful lives of property, plant and equipment

The Group and the Institution regularly review the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment based on factors such as business plan and strategies, expected level of usage and future technological developments. Future results of operations could be materially affected by changes in these estimates brought about by changes in the factors mentioned above. A reduction in the estimated useful lives of property, plant and equipment would increase the recorded depreciation and decrease the value of property, plant and equipment.

(ii) Impairment of financial assets

The Group and the Institution assess at end of each reporting period whether there is any objective evidence that a receivable is impaired. To determine whether there is objective evidence of impairment, the Group and the Institution consider factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments.

Where there is objective evidence of impairment, the amount and timing of future cash flows are estimated based on historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics.

(iii) Income taxes

Judgement is involved in determining the provision for income taxes. There are certain transactions and computations for which the ultimate tax determination is uncertain during the ordinary course of business.

The Group and the Institution recognise liabilities for expected tax issues based on estimates of whether additional taxes will be due. Where the final tax outcome of these matters is different from the amounts that were initially recognised, such differences will impact the income tax and deferred tax provisions in the period in which such determination is made.



(iv) Deferred tax assets and liabilities

Deferred tax implications arising from the changes in corporate income tax rates are measured with reference to the estimated realisation and settlement of temporary differences in the future periods in which the tax rates are expected to apply, based on the tax rates enacted or substantively enacted at the statements of financial position date. While management's estimates on the realisation and settlement of temporary differences are based on the available information at the statements of financial position date, changes in business strategy, future operating performance and other factors could potentially impact on the actual timing and amount of temporary differences realised and settled. Any difference between the actual amount and the estimated amount would be recognised in the profit or loss in the period in which actual realisation and settlement occurs.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Business combinations and consolidation

(i) Business combinations

The Group applies the acquisition method to account for all business combinations. If the acquisition of an assets or of assets does not constitute a business, it is accounted for as an asset acquisition.

The Group identifies the acquisition date of a business combination as the date on which the Group obtains control of an acquiree. Control is obtained when the Group commence to have the power to direct financial and operating policy decisions of the investee so as to obtain benefits from its activities. This may require fulfilment of precedent conditions, such as completion of due diligence audit, and shareholder's approvals if they are specified in a sale and purchase agreement.

As of the acquisition date, the Group recognises, separately from goodwill, the identifiable assets acquired (including identifiable intangible assets), the liabilities assumed (including contingent liabilities) and any non-controlling interest in the acquiree. The identifiable assets acquired and liabilities assumed are measured their acquisition - date fair values, except for those permitted or required to be measured on other bases by MPERS. Non-controlling interest at the acquisition date is measured at its acquisition date share of net assets, excluding goodwill.

The costs of a business combination is measured at fair value, calculated as the sum of the acquisition-date fair value of assets transferred (including contingent consideration), the liabilities incurred to former owners of the acquiree and the equity instruments issued by the Group. Expenses incurred in connection with a business combination are capitalised in the cost of business combination.

The cost of a business combination is allocated to the share of net assets acquired to determine the initial amount of goodwill on combination. In a business combination achieved in stages (including acquisition of a former associate or a former joint venture), the cost of each exchange transaction is compared with the share of net assets to determine the goodwill of each exchange transaction on a step-by-step basis. Any increase in equity interest in an investee after the acquisition date is accounted as an equity transaction between the parent and the non-controlling interest and the effect is adjusted directly in equity.

In the initial accounting for a business combination is not complete by the end of the reporting period in which the combination occurs, the Group uses provisional fair value amounts for the items which the accounting is incomplete. The provisional amounts are adjusted to reflect new information obtained about facts and circumstances that existed as the acquisition date, including additional assets or liabilities identified in the measurement period. The measurement period for completion of the initial accounting ends after one year from the acquisition date.

(ii) Subsidiaries and basis of consolidation

The Group recognises a subsidiary based on the criterion of control. A subsidiary is an entity (including special purpose entities) over which the Group has the power to govern the financial and operating policy decisions of the investee so as to obtain benefits from its activities. In circumstances when the voting right's are not more than half or when voting rights are not the dominant determinant of control, the Group uses judgements to assess whether it has de facto control, control by other arrangements (including control of special purpose entities), or by holding substantive potential voting rights.

The financial statements of the Institution and all its subsidiaries used in the preparation of the consolidated financial statements are prepared as of the same reporting date. The consolidated financial statements are prepared using uniform accounting policies for like transactions, other events and conditions in similar circumstances.

The carrying amount of investments in each subsidiary of a parent in the Group is eliminated against the parent's portion of equity in each subsidiary. The consolidated financial statements combine like items of assets, liabilities, equity, income, expenses and cash flows of the Institution and all its subsidiaries. The results of subsidiaries acquired or disposed of during the year are included in the consolidated statement of income and expenditure from the effective date of acquisition (which is the date the group assumes control of an investee) or up to effective date (which is the date group ceases to have control of an investee).



All intra-group balance and transactions are eliminated in full on consolidation. Unrealised profits or losses arising from intra-group transactions are also eliminated in full on consolidation, except when an unrealised loss is an impairment loss.

When the Group ceases to control a subsidiary, the difference between the proceeds from the disposal of the subsidiary and its carrying amount at the date control is lost is recognised in profit or loss in the statements of income and expenditure as a gain or loss on disposal of the subsidiary. The cumulative amount of any exchange differences that relate to a foreign subsidiary recognised in other comprehensive income is not reclassified to profit or loss on disposal of the subsidiary. If the Group retains an equity interest in the former subsidiary, it is accounted for as a financial assets (provided it does not become an associate or a joint venture). The carrying amount of the investment retained at the date that the entity ceases to be a subsidiary is regarded as the cost on initial measurement of the financial assets.

Any decrease in equity stake in a subsidiary that does not result in a loss of control is accounted for as an equity transaction and the financial effect is adjusted directly in the consolidated statements of recognised gains and losses.

(b) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The policy of recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with Note 2 (I).

(i) Recognition and measurement

Cost includes purchase price for purchased assets, any other costs directly attributable in bringing the asset to its present location and condition for its intended use, cost of replacing component parts of the assets, and the present value of the expected cost for the decommissioning of the assets after their use. The cost of self-constructed assets also includes the cost of materials and direct labour. Borrowing cost and all other repair and maintenance costs are recognised in income and expenditure as incurred.

The cost of property, plant and equipment recognised as a result of a business combination is based on fair value at acquisition date. The fair value of property is the estimated amount for which a property could be exchanged on the date of valuation between a willing buyer and a willing seller in an arm's length transaction after proper marketing wherein the parties had each acted knowledgeably, prudently and without compulsion. The fair value of other items of plant and equipment is based on the quoted market prices for similar items.

When significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Gains or losses arising on the disposal of property, plant and equipment are determined as the difference between the disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the assets and are recognised in income and expenditure.

(ii) Subsequent costs

The cost of replacing part of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the carrying amount of the item if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the part will flow to the Group and the Institution and its cost can be measured reliably. The costs of the day-to-day servicing of property, plant and equipment are recognised in the profit or loss as incurred. Investment property whose fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort is measured on the cost model.

(iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is recognised in the profit or loss on straight line basis to write off the cost or valuation of each asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life. Freehold land is not depreciated. Leased assets are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Property, plant and equipment under construction are not depreciated until the assets are ready for its intended use.

Property, plant and equipment are depreciated based on the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed at each reporting period end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the property, plant and equipment.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Any gain or loss on derecognition of the asset is included in the profit or loss in the year the asset is derecognised.

(c) Investment properties

Investment properties are properties which are held either to earn rental income or for capital appreciation.

Properties which are occupied by the Institution are accounted for using cost model as undue cost of no material benefit to the member is required, if an independent valuation is carried out.

Investment properties are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, consistent with the accounting policies for property, plant and equipment.

Depreciation of the leasehold land and building is charged to statements of income and expenditure on a straight line basis over the estimated useful lives of 99 years and 50 years respectively.

Investment properties are derecognised when they have been disposed of or when investment properties is permanently withdrawn from use and no future economic benefit is expected from its disposal. Any gain or loss on the retirement or disposal of an investment property is recognised in statements of income and expenditure in the year of retirement or disposal.

(d) Goodwill

Goodwill is initially measured at cost. Following initial recognition, goodwill is measured at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses.

Amortisation is based on the cost of an asset less it's residual value and is recognised in profit or loss on a straight line basis over a period of 10 years.

For the purpose of impairment testing, goodwill acquired is allocated, from the acquisition date, to each of the Company's cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination.

The cash-generating unit to which goodwill has been allocated is tested for impairment annually and whenever there is an indication that the cash-generating unit may be impaired, by comparing the carrying amount of the cash-generating unit, including the allocated goodwill, with the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit. Where the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised in the profit or loss. Impairment losses recognised for goodwill are not reversed in subsequent periods.

Where goodwill forms part of a cash-generating unit and part of the operation within that cash-generating unit is disposed of, the goodwill associated with the operation disposed of is included in the carrying amount of the operation when determining the gain or loss on disposal of the operation. Goodwill disposed of in this circumstance is measured based on the relative fair values of the operations disposed of and the portion of the cash-generating unit retained.

(e) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities, are recognised on the statements of financial position when, and only when, the Group and the Institution become a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recognised at the transaction price plus transaction costs if they are not measured at fair value through profit or loss unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction. Financial assets and financial liabilities that constitute a financing transaction are measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument. Transaction costs for financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in income and expenditure in period in which they are incurred.

The Group and the Institution classify their financial assets and financial liabilities into the following categories:

(i) Financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value with any gains or losses arising from changes in the fair values recognised in income and expenditure in the period in which the changes arise. If the fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort, the financial assets is subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

(ii) Financial assets and financial liabilities measured at amortised cost

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Financial assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. Gains and losses are recognised in profit or loss when the financial assets and financial liabilities are derecognised or impaired, and through the amortisation process.

A financial asset or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset has expired or has been settled, or control of the asset is not retained or the Group and the Institution have transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership. On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the carrying amount and the sum of consideration received, including any newly created rights and obligations, is recognised in income and expenditure.

A financial liability or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as a derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability, and the difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in income and expenditure.

(f) Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the statements of financial position if, and only if, there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

(g) Subscription in arrears

Subscription in arrears of one year and more and where, in the opinion of the Council, are no longer recoverable from its members are written off to the statements of income and expenditure.

(h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, balances and deposits with banks and highly liquid investments which have an insignificant risk of changes in fair value with original maturities of three months or less, and are used by the Group and the Institution in the management of their short-term commitments. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents are presented net of bank overdrafts and pledged deposits.

(i) Capital reserve fund

Fund raised from members for the purchase of property, plant and equipment are capitalised as Capital Reserve Fund.

(j) Library fund

Enrolment fee received from corporate members for library membership of the Institution and donation received from members or non-members for capital expenditure of the library are capitalised as Library Fund.

(k) Building fund

Funds and donations received from members for the purchase of Wisma IEM are capitalised in Building Fund. A separate bank account has been kept for the fund.

(I) Stem fund

STEM stands for Science, Technologies Engineer Malaysia. It is a fund collected from members for student.

(m) Impairment of assets

(i) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of non-financial assets (except for inventories, amount due from contract customers, deferred tax assets, and investment property measured at fair value) are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or cash-generating units. For the purpose of goodwill impairment testing, cash-generating units to which goodwill has been allocated are aggregated so that the level at which impairment testing is performed reflects the lowest level at which goodwill is monitored for internal reporting purposes. The goodwill acquired in a business combination, for the purpose of impairment testing, is allocated to a cash-generating unit or a group of cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination.



The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and its value-in-use. In assessing value-in-use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pretax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset or cash-generating unit.

An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or cash-generating unit exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which such impairment loss is recognised directly against any revaluation surplus for the asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same asset. Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) and then to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) on a pro rata basis.

An impairment loss in respect of goodwill is not reversed. In respect of other assets, impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at the end of each reporting period for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognised. The reversal is limited so that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its recoverable amount, nor exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, had no impairment loss been recognised for asset in prior years. Such reversal is recognised in the profit or loss unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase.

(ii) Financial assets

All financial assets, other than those categorised as fair value through profit or loss, investments in subsidiary companies, associates and joint ventures are assessed at each reporting date whether there is any objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events having an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the asset.

To determine whether there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets has been incurred, The Education Fund considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments. For certain categories of financial assets, such as trade receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are subsequently assessed for impairment on a collective basis based on similar risk characteristics. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Group's past experience of collecting payments, an increase in the number of delayed payments in the portfolio past the average credit period and observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with defaults on receivables.

If any such evidence exists, the amount of impairment loss is measured as the difference between the assets' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows (excluding future expected credit losses that have not yet been incurred) discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The carrying amount of the asset is reduced through the use of an allowance account and the amount of impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss. Receivables together with the associated allowance are written off when there is no realistic prospect of future recovery.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised in profit or loss, the impairment loss is reversed, to the extent that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not been recognised at the date the impairment is reversed. The amount of reversal is recognised in income and expenditure.

(n) Revenue and other income

(i) Member's subscription fee

Member's subscription fee is payable annually at the beginning of the financial year. Only that subscription which is attributable to the current financial year is recognised as income. Subscription relating to periods beyond the current financial year is taken up in the statements of financial position as subscription in advance under current liabilities. Subscription is payable in full irrespective of the date of resignation of members during the financial year.

(ii) Advertisement in Bulletin/Journal

Advertisement income receivable for the placement of advertisement in bulletin/journal published by the Institution is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

(iii) Rental income

Rental income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

(iv) Credit cards commission

Credit cards commission from the banks are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.



(v) Interest Income

Interest income is recognised on accruals basis using the effective interest method.

(vi) Dividend income

Dividend income is recognised when the right to received payment is established.

(o) Employee benefits expense

(i) Short term employee benefits

Wages, salaries, bonuses and social security contributions are recognised as an expense in the reporting period in which the associated services are rendered by employees of the Group and of the Institution. Short term accumulating compensated absences such as paid annual leave are recognised when services are rendered by employees that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences. Short term non-accumulating compensated absences such as sick and medical leave are recognised when the absences occur.

The expected cost of accumulating compensated absences is measured as additional amount expected to be paid as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the end of the reporting period.

(ii) Defined contribution plans

As required by law, companies in Malaysia contribute to the state pension scheme, the Employee Provident Fund ("EPF"). Such contributions are recognised as an expense in the profit or loss as incurred. Once the contributions have been paid, the Group and the Institution have no further payment obligations.

(p) Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred. Borrowing costs consist of interest and other costs that the Group and the Institution incurred in connection with the borrowing of funds.

(q) Tax expense

Tax expense in income and expenditure comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax and deferred tax is recognised in income and expenditure.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the financial year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is recognised using the liability method for all temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the statement of financial position and their tax bases. Deferred tax is not recognised for the temporary differences arising from the initial recognition of goodwill, the initial recognition of assets and liabilities in a transaction which is not a business combination and that affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to the temporary differences when they reverse, based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

A deferred tax asset is recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS AT 31 DECEMBER 2019

1. Basis of preparation

(a) Statement of Compliance

The financial statements of The Education Fund of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia ("the Fund") have been prepared in accordance with Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standard ("MPERS") and the rules of The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia.

The financial statements of the Fund have been prepared under the historical cost convention, unless otherwise indicated in the significant accounting policies below.

(b) Functional and Presentation Currency

These financial statements are presented in Ringgit Malaysia ("RM"), which is the Fund's functional currency. All financial information is presented in RM and has been rounded to the nearest RM except when otherwise stated.

2. Summary of significant accounting policies

(a) Revenue

Interest Income

Interest income is recognised on accruals basis using the effective interest method.

Donation received

Donation is recognised in the statement of income and expenditure on cash receipt basis.

(b) Income taxes

Tax expense in income and expenditure comprises current and deferred tax. Current tax and deferred tax is recognised in income and expenditure.

Current tax is the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the financial year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period, and any adjustment to tax payable in respect of previous years.

Deferred tax is recognised using the liability method for all temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the statement of financial position and their tax bases. Deferred tax is not recognised for the temporary differences arising from the initial recognition of goodwill, the initial recognition of assets and liabilities in a transaction which is not a business combination and that affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to be applied to the temporary differences when they reverse, based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

A deferred tax asset is recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which the temporary difference can be utilised. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realised.

At the end of each reporting period, the carrying amount of a deferred tax asset is reviewed, and is reduced to the extent that it is no longer probably that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow the benefit of a part or all of that deferred tax asset to be utilised. Any such reduction will be reversed to the extent that it becomes probably that sufficient taxable profit will be available.

A current or deferred tax is recognised as income and expense in profit or loss for the period, except to the extent that the tax arises from items recognised outside profit or loss. For an income or expense item recognised in other comprehensive income, the current or deferred tax expense or tax income is recognised in other comprehensive income. For items recognised directly in equity, the related tax effect is also recognised directly in equity.







(c) Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. The policy of recognition and measurement of impairment losses is in accordance with Note 2 (g).

(i) Recognition and measurement

Cost includes purchase price for purchased assets, any other costs directly attributable in bringing the asset to its present location and condition for its intended use, cost of replacing component parts of the assets, and the present value of the expected cost for the decommissioning of the assets after their use. The cost of self-constructed assets also includes the cost of materials and direct labour. Borrowing cost and all other repair and maintenance costs are recognised in income and expenditure as incurred.

The cost of property, plant and equipment recognised as a result of a business combination is based on fair value at acquisition date. The fair value of property is the estimated amount for which a property could be exchanged on the date of valuation between a willing buyer and a willing seller in an arm's length transaction after proper marketing wherein the parties had each acted knowledgeably, prudently and without compulsion. The fair value of other items of plant and equipment is based on the quoted market prices for similar items.

When significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. Gains or losses arising on the disposal of property, plant and equipment are determined as the difference between the disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the assets and are recognised in income and expenditure.

(ii) Subsequent costs

The cost of replacing part of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised in the carrying amount of the item if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the part will flow to The Education Fund and its cost can be measured reliably. The costs of the day-to-day servicing of property, plant and equipment are recognised in the income and expenditure as incurred. Investment property whose fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort is measured on the cost model.

(iii) Depreciation

Depreciation is recognised in the income and expenditure on straight line basis to write off the cost or valuation of each asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life.

Property, plant and equipment are depreciated based on the estimated useful lives of the assets as follows:

Office equipment 10% Furniture and fittings 10% Computers 40%

The residual values, useful lives and depreciation method are reviewed at each reporting period end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the property, plant and equipment.

(d) Intangible assets

(i) Intangible assets acquired separately

The initial cost of a separate acquired intangible asset includes its purchase price and any directly attributable cost of preparing the asset for its intended use. Subsequent to initial recognition, intangible assets are measured at cost less accumulated amortisation and accumulated impairment losses. Amortisation is recognised in the income and expenditure on straight line basis to write off the cost of each intangible asset to its residual value over its estimated useful life from the date it is available for use.

Software are amortised based on the estimated useful lives of 5 years.

The estimated useful lives and amortisation methods are reviewed at the end of each reporting date, with the effect of any changes in estimate being accounted for on a prospective basis.

(ii) Derecognition of intangible assets

An intangible asset is derecognised on disposal, or when no future economic benefits are expected from use or disposal. Gains or losses arising from derecognition of an intangible asset, measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset, are recognised in income and expenditure when the asset is derecognised.

See accounting policy Note 2(g) to the financial statements on impairment of non-financial assets for intangible assets.



(e) Financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities, including derivative instruments, are recognised on the statements of financial position when, and only when, The Education Fund become a party to the contractual provisions of the financial instrument.

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially recognised at the transaction price plus transaction costs if they are not measured at fair value through profit or loss unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction. Financial assets and financial liabilities that constitute a financing transaction are measured at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument. Transaction costs for financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in income and expenditure in period in which they are incurred.

The Fund classifies their financial assets and financial liabilities into the following categories:

(i) Financial assets and financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at fair value with any gains or losses arising from changes in the fair values recognised in income and expenditure in the period in which the changes arise. If the fair value cannot be measured reliably without undue cost or effort, the financial assets is subsequently measured at cost less impairment.

(ii) Other financial assets and other financial liabilities measured at amortised cost

After initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Financial assets are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. Gains and losses are recognised in income and expenditure when the financial assets and financial liabilities are derecognised or impaired, and through the amortisation process.

A financial asset or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the contractual rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset has expired or has been settled, or control of the asset is not retained or the Fund have transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership. On derecognition of a financial asset, the difference between the carrying amount and the sum of consideration received, including any newly created rights and obligations, is recognised in income and expenditure.

A financial liability or part of it is derecognised when, and only when, the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as a derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability, and the difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in income and expenditure.

(f) Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the statements of financial position if, and only if, there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, or to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

(g) Impairment of assets

(i) Non-financial assets

The carrying amounts of non-financial assets (except for inventories, amount due from contract customers, deferred tax assets, and investment property measured at fair value) are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is any indication of impairment. If any such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated.

For the purpose of impairment testing, assets are grouped together into the smallest group of assets that generates cash inflows from continuing use that are largely independent of the cash inflows of other assets or cash-generating units. For the purpose of goodwill impairment testing, cash-generating units to which goodwill has been allocated are aggregated so that the level at which impairment testing is performed reflects the lowest level at which goodwill is monitored for internal reporting purposes. The goodwill acquired in a business combination, for the purpose of impairment testing, is allocated to a cash-generating unit or a group of cash-generating units that are expected to benefit from the synergies of the combination.

The recoverable amount of an asset or cash-generating unit is the higher of fair value less costs to sell and its value-in-use. In assessing value-in-use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset or cash-generating unit.



An impairment loss is recognised if the carrying amount of an asset or cash-generating unit exceeds its estimated recoverable amount. Impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which such impairment loss is recognised directly against any revaluation surplus for the asset to the extent that the impairment loss does not exceed the amount in the revaluation surplus for that same asset. Impairment losses recognised in respect of cash-generating units are allocated first to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) and then to reduce the carrying amounts of the other assets in the cash-generating unit (group of cash-generating units) on a pro rata basis.

An impairment loss in respect of goodwill is not reversed. In respect of other assets, impairment losses recognised in prior periods are assessed at the end of each reporting period for any indications that the loss has decreased or no longer exists. An impairment loss is reversed only if there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the recoverable amount since the last impairment loss was recognised. The reversal is limited so that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed its recoverable amount, nor exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation or amortisation, had no impairment loss been recognised for asset in prior years. Such reversal is recognised in the profit or loss unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case the reversal is treated as a revaluation increase.

(ii) Financial assets

All financial assets, other than those categorised as fair value through profit or loss, investments in subsidiary companies, associates and joint ventures are assessed at each reporting date whether there is any objective evidence of impairment as a result of one or more events having an impact on the estimated future cash flows of the asset.

To determine whether there is objective evidence that an impairment loss on financial assets has been incurred, the Fund considers factors such as the probability of insolvency or significant financial difficulties of the receivable and default or significant delay in payments. For certain categories of financial assets, such as trade receivables, assets that are assessed not to be impaired individually are subsequently assessed for impairment on a collective basis based on similar risk characteristics. Objective evidence of impairment for a portfolio of receivables could include the Fund's past experience of collecting payments, an increase in the number of delayed payments in the portfolio past the average credit period and observable changes in national or local economic conditions that correlate with defaults on receivables.

If any such evidence exists, the amount of impairment loss is measured as the difference between the assets' carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows (excluding future expected credit losses that have not yet been incurred) discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate. The carrying amount of the asset is reduced through the use of an allowance account and the amount of impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss. Receivables together with the associated allowance are written off when there is no realistic prospect of future recovery.

If, in a subsequent period, the amount of the impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be related objectively to an event occurring after the impairment was recognised in profit or loss, the impairment loss is reversed, to the extent that the carrying amount of the asset does not exceed what the carrying amount would have been had the impairment not been recognised at the date the impairment is reversed. The amount of reversal is recognised in income and expenditure.

(h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash on hand, balances and deposits with banks and other highly liquid investments which have an insignificant risk of changes in fair value with original maturities of three months or less, and are used by the Fund in the management of their short-term commitments. For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents are presented net of bank overdrafts and pledged deposits.
