

The Malaysia Competition Commission (MyCC) is an independent body & agency, mandated to enforce the Competition Act 2010 (Act 712). An Act that encourages economic development by promoting and protecting the process of beneficial competition; to consumers, businesess and the economy. Section 4 of the Act prohibits anti-competitive agreements, also known as cartel, conducts between enterprises; that could significantly prevent, restrict or distort competition in any market. This leads to the lack of innovation by enterprises and consequently putting consumers at a disadvantage.



Price Fixing is one of the infamous cartel conducts by business operators and associations; and is described as a practice of colluding with others to fix a price on a product, rather than allowing the official price to be determined by the market. But what about fixed fees set by associations? Does it infringe the Act itself?

<u>SESSION 1 – Understanding Principle of Competition: Differentiating</u> Between Cartels and Associations

In 2019, Ms. Hanis was one of the representatives from the ASEAN Member State countries; who got selected to participate in a 3 months Secondment Program at the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) in Sydney, Australia.

SESSION 2 - The Liberalisation of Fixed Fees: Is This an Attainable Reality?
