MINUTES OF 61st ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA HELD ON 25 JULY 2020 VIA HYBRID MODE AT 9.00AM

MEMBERS PRESENT – AS PER APPENDIX A

1.0 OPENING ADDRESS BY THE PRESIDENT

- 1.1 The President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi called the AGM to order at 9.07am and thanked the members for making time to attend the AGM. The President then reported on the activities / events held since May 2019 until July 2020. He further informed that with the Movement Control Order (MCO) imposed from 18 March 2020 until tentatively 31 August 2020 due to pandemic had drastically changed the way of life of IEM members as well as operations of IEM. The economic had also be greatly impacted and this had affected businesses and careers. The President further informed that during this period, IEM had done its bit in charitable works. He then thanked the members and donors who contributed to the COVID-19 Fund which was used to purchase 3-ply medical face masks. These masks had been donated to the following organisations:
 - *i)* University Hospital for the medical front-liners (10,000 face-masks)
 - ii) Malaysian Association of the Blind for their vision impaired members (5,000 face-masks)
 - iii) Malaysian Federation of the Deaf for the hearing impaired members (5,000 face-masks)

The President also informed the AGM that due to the COVID-19 pandemic, he will be the longest serving President of the Institution since its inception, serving from 21 April 2018 until 25 July 2020 which was two (2) years three (3) months and three (3) days.

The President then proceeded with a short summary of his involvement with the Institution since 1987 in which he served as Branch Chairman, member of the various Sub Committees and Standing Committees, the Council, Excomm and currently as President of IEM. In addition to his serving as a member of the Institution, the President had also penned down his thoughts and visions in five (5) issues of the Jurutera.

He added that during his tenure as President, he had engaged close working relationships with all the IEM Branches including a Chapter of one of the Branches and has endeavoured to maintain close rapport with various Ministries as well as the Heads of the international engineering organisations such as World Federation of Engineering Organisation (WFEO), ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisation (AFEO), International Engineering Alliance (IEA), Commonwealth Engineers' Council (CEC), Federation of Engineering Institution of Islamic Countries (FEIIC) and Federation of African Engineering Organisation (FAEO).

The President also reported that IEM successfully celebrated its 60th Anniversary Annual Dinner on 20 April 2019 at Sunway Resort Hotel where IEM managed to sell 139 tables which was considered as a record-breaking performance where IEM's Annual Dinner was concerned. He then congratulated the IEM Annual Dinner Organising Chairman, Ir. Gopal Narian Kutty for organizing the event.

The President further commented that as a professional learned society, IEM should instill respect, encouragement and promote diversity of opinions amongst the members. He commented that being a President of the Institution was not an easy task as he had to face many challenges. In upholding and preserving the sanctity and dignity of the office of IEM President, he regretted that the personal friendship which he had with some of the members had been strained.

On another note, the President informed that for the past month since 3 June 2020, IEM had been embroiled in crisis management of an international event due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He further informed that not less than twenty (20) official meetings were conducted mainly to ensure that there would not be any financial or legal implication to IEM due to the event. After considerable negotiations, a joint announcement was successfully agreed upon by both parties in order to proceed with the international event.

The President thanked the Task Force for their tenacity in coming to an amicable resolution on this organizing of the event. He also thanked the relevant Committees that were involved namely the Oversight Committee which comprised of Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah, Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik and Ir. Dr. Tan Yean Chin, the WTC Organising Committee Chairman, Ir. Dr. Ooi Teik Aun, the Deputy President, Ir. Ong Ching Loon and the IEM TC Board of Directors who have provided tremendous assistance to the President. The AGM was informed that the joint announcement was finally signed on the night of 11 July 2020 with international coverage and also published in one of the daily newspapers the following day.

The President then informed that although he might have had disagreement over certain issues with some senior members, he did it mainly for the best interest of the Institution. The President further stressed that he would not have achieved his task as a President without the strong support of the Excomm and the Vice Presidents. He further informed that for the sixteen (16) Excomm meetings, the attendance by the Excomm members was 90% and he personally thanked Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Chong Luin and Ir. Fam Yew Hin for their 100% attendance.



The President also thanked the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad for his support and contribution during the trying times. The President further conveyed his appreciation to the Secretariat who has provided their assistance and at times, beyond office hours. Lastly, but not least the President thanked the members for their support, guidance and advice during the last two (2) years.

The President then proceeded to report on the following items:

1.2 Updates on IEM for Session 2019/2020

The AGM was informed that the current standing of the IEM membership was 53,894 members comprising of the various grades of which 31,419 were Student members.

The President further informed that he attended the following international meetings:

- 1) Mid-term AFEO Governing Board meeting held in Brunei on 29 April 2019
- 2) ITA meeting in Naples, Italy in May 2019
- 3) IEA Meeting in Hong Kong from 10-14 June 2019
- 4) CAFEO 37 in Jakarta, Indonesia from 11-14 September 2019

Apart from attending the above-mentioned meetings, he also attended and shared dialogue sessions with a number of visitors from various professional engineering institutions such as Engineers Australia, China Association of Science and Technology, Myanmar Board of Engineers, Persatuan Insinyur Indonesia as well as other organisations namely the Association of Consulting Engineers Malaysia (ACEM) and Mesyuarat Majlis Standard dan Akreditasi Malaysia (MSDAM).

IEM had also signed Memorandums of Understanding with a few Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) such as Northwestern Polytechnical University (NPU), China on 29 June 2019, Heriot-Watt University on 8 July 2019 and KDU University College on 17 October 2019. Apart from the IHLs, IEM also signed MoU with Malaysia Oil and Gas Council (MOGSC) on 8 July 2019 and Malaysia Green Technology Corporation on 9 October 2019.

The President also attended the World Federation Engineering Organisation (WFEO) held from 14-19 November 2019 where he met the African delegates representing FAEO at WFEO General Assembly in Melbourne, Australia. Apart from the mentioned meetings, the President also attended the Commonwealth Engineers Council (CEC) meeting on 19 November 2019 and the FEIAP General Assembly on 21 November 2019 in Melbourne, Australia.

The President also officiated the launching of the IEM Maker Space on 5 October 2019 at Wisma IEM and a soft launch on the IEM Convention organised by CIS Network on 12 December 2019.

The AGM was also informed that during the Movement Control Order (MCO), the IEM Secretariat was closed and all meetings were held online. Two (2) press statements were issued during this period.

During the MCO, the President and the Deputy President were also invited to attend a dialogue session with the Minister in the Prime Minister's Department, Y.Bhg. Dato' Sri Mustapha Mohamad on issues related to building sectors on 23 April 2020. Subsequently, on 20 May 2020, the Deputy President attended a meeting with the Minister of Finance, Y.Bhg. Senator Tengku Dato' Sri Zafrul Tengku Abdul Aziz.

The President also attended a meeting organised by the Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) chaired by the Deputy Secretary General of MITI, Dato' Sri Norazman Ayob to discuss on the operations of the service industry during the MCO on 28 April 2020. On 24 and 25 June 2020, the President together with the Deputy President attended the IEA Meeting via virtual platform.

2.0 AGENDA for AGM

Upon concluding his report, the President then presented the Agenda for the AGM as follows:

- 1. Confirmation of Minutes of 60th Annual General Meeting held on 20 April 2019
- 2. Matters Arising from the 60th Annual General Meeting held on 20 April 2019
- 3. Presentation of Honorary Secretary's report
- 4. Presentation of Financial Statements for the Year ended 31 December 2019
- 5. Proposed Amendments to the Constitution
- 6. Questions Submitted by members
- 7. Presentation of the Results of Election for Council Session 2020/2021
- 8. Presidential Address for Session 2020/2021

Since there was no objection to the Agenda, the President proceeded with 61st Annual General Meeting proper.



3.0 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF 60th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING HELD ON 20 APRIL 2019

The President invited members to go through the minutes of the previous AGM which was printed on pages 52 until page 70. The AGM was also requested to go through the attendance list from pages 71 to 75 and the Bahasa Malaysia version which was on pages 76 to 94.

President further informed that should any member wish to comment, he/she would need to click on the "RAISE HAND" icon.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) informed that the composition of members for the Special Committee on Amendments to the IEM Constitution on page 19 should include Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad, Ir. Fam Yew Hin and Ir. Lee Boon Chong.

Since there were no further errors highlighted in the minutes, Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05613) proposed that the minutes of the 60th Annual General Meeting held on 20 April 2019 be confirmed and adopted. The motion was seconded by Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157).

4.0 MATTERS ARISING

The President provided clarifications on the following items raised at the 60th Annual General Meeting held on 20 April 2019:

4.1 *Page 53 –55*

Item 3.0 - Simplifying Process for Membership

The AGM was informed that various promotional exercises were carried out to increase membership especially for the grades of Member of IEM (MIEM) and Graduate.

It was noted that for the last session, the membership for MIEM was increased by 599. However, the Graduate membership was still not up to expectation.

In view of this, the Standing Committee on Welfare had taken steps to look into getting additional benefits to attract more members including graduate engineers to join IEM. Apart from this, the AGM was informed that the Logbook Sub Committee repositioned and renamed as Engineering Competency Development Sub Committee were also actively promoting the IEM Logbook and Mentor scheme. IEM was also in the midst of arranging an Online Mentoring scheme aimed at providing more benefits as well as guidance to graduate engineers so that they will join IEM.

4.2 Page 60-61

Item 7.0 - On the issue of the complaint against the President by a member, the AGM to note that Council directed the Standing Committee on Professional Practice to look into the complaint

The AGM was informed that further to the letter of complaint presented at the last AGM and thereafter at the 419th Council meeting held on 21 October 2019, a Screening Panel was formed by the Standing Committee on Professional Practice to determine whether the complaint was against:

- the office of the President; or
- the person holding the office of the President

Council at the time, was informed that Excomm, after considerable debate and discussion established that the complaint was not against a member and as such, no Investigation Committee need to be formed for the case. It was concluded by Excomm that the complaint was more on governance rather than on misconduct of an individual. It was further established that the complaint was on the way the President chaired the meetings.

The AGM also noted that Excomm after deliberation and with temporary retirement of the President from the meeting, took a vote by secret ballot on whether there was a need to form an Investigation Committee. The majority voted not in favour and Excomm concluded that there was no necessity to form an Investigation Committee on this matter.

Council had thus agreed that the matter was considered as closed.

4.3 Page 62 – 65 – Item 8.0 Amendments to Constitution

The AGM was informed that comments made at the last AGM were taken into consideration and the revised amendments would be presented under Item 6 of the Agenda.



5.0 ANNUAL REPORT FOR SESSION 2019/2020

The President then invited the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad to present the various activities and events organised in 2019 which was printed on pages 101 to 109 of the Annual Report. The Honorary Secretary proceeded to report on the matters highlighted in the Annual report as follows:

5.1 Council and Excomm

For the Session 2019/2020, the Council with a total of 72 members had five (5) Council meetings. The Council at their meetings discussed matters related to policy as well as management of properties and affairs of the Institution.

Excomm comprised of nineteen (19) members. Due to the Movement Control Order (MCO) the AGM had to be delayed. It was noted that Excomm for the first time in IEM history, had sixteen (16) meetings for session 2019/2020. The role of Excomm was to mainly implement and carry out the decisions of the Council.

5.2 Standing Committees and Day-to-Day Operations

The AGM was informed that Excomm continued to be assisted by eight (8) Standing Committees in the day-to-day operations. Each of the Standing Committees was chaired by a Vice President with the Finance Committee being chaired by the Deputy President.

5.3 Membership

The Honorary Secretary informed that up to 31 December 2019, a total of 6,087 candidates were approved for admission/election/transfer to the various grades. Out of the new members recruited, 4,563 were students. However, 2,304 members were in arrears of membership and needed to be suspended. The overall total of IEM membership was 53,894 of which 32,260 were from the Branches.

In terms of breakdown of membership by grades, the Honorary Secretary further informed that Student membership had the most percentage that is 58.3% followed by Corporate Members (23%), Graduate (18%), Companion (0.4%) and the other grades such as Incorporated, Affiliate and Associate were 0.4%.

5.4 **Professional Interview**

The AGM noted that for session 2019/2020, a total of 207 candidates applied to sit for the Professional Interview (PI). It was further noted that 170 candidates have passed which made up a passing rate of 82%. The number of candidates who failed the PI was 21 which made up a failure rate of 17%. A total of 10 candidates were still waiting for their results.

5.5 IEM Publication

The Honorary Secretary informed the AGM that the "Jurutera" - IEM Bulletin had all this while been published monthly.

However, due to the MCO, the first issue of the e-Bulletin which was in a readable format and not necessary to be downloaded was introduced for ease of reading. The AGM was further informed that due to the 100% increase in the postage fee, the "Jurutera" would no longer be sent by post to the members individually. However, a small number of copies had been printed and were available for the members to collect at the IEM HQ or the Branches.

It was further reported that two (2) issues of the Journal had been published and IEM was currently looking into having the IEM Journal SCOPUS indexed. Members were encouraged to submit their papers for the IEM Journal.

5.6 **IEM Activities 2019**

The Honorary Secretary reported that there were altogether 430 events held for the last session 2019/2020. These events included evening talks, technical visits, courses and seminars, competitions and IEM social events such as golf and bowling tournaments, IEM Family and Engineering Week.

5.7 Members' Benefits

The AGM was informed that since the introduction of the IEM Loyalty Card in 2017, IEM had signed up more merchants to provide additional benefits for the members. Apart from providing discounts to IEM members on various categories such as automobiles (*BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Volvo, Audi, etc.*), restaurants and sportswear, the additional merchant was under the healthcare category, Institut Jantung Negara (IJN).



5.8 Events at IEM Branches

The Honorary Secretary reported that the IEM Branches namely Negeri Sembilan, Sarawak, Southern and Penang managed to hold their Annual Dinners accordingly before the MCO. It was noted that a campaign on Dengue Awareness was organised by the Melaka Branch on 23 August 2019.

5.9 Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic

The AGM was informed that the directive issued by the Registrar of Society (ROS) on 16 March 2020 disallowing all societies to organise activities where there would be a gathering of people such as meetings and activities had affected IEM as a whole.

An Ad-Hoc Committee on COVID-19 was formed mainly to look into the impact of the pandemic and the MCO on IEM and its members. The members of the said Ad-Hoc Committee comprised of the President, the Deputy President, the incoming Deputy President, the Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer as well as the seven (7) Vice Presidents.

Amongst the proactive actions taken by the Ad-Hoc Committee was to write to the Government namely the Prime Minister, the Ministry of Finance (MoF), Ministry of International Trade and Industry (MITI) and the Ministry of Works (MoW) providing suggestions and recommendations in response to the first Government initiative (PRIHATIN). IEM also offered the expertise of its members to assist the government if needed.

In addition to the above, the IEM President and Deputy President were also invited to attend a few meetings initiated by the Economic Action Council (EAC), MITI and the MoF.

Subsequent to the meetings, IEM had provided feedback and proposals as follows:

- EAC Risks and Challenges Faced by the Professionals in Construction Sector due to COVID-19 Pandemic on 23 April 2020
- MITI i. Issues Faced by Professional Services (PS) when Commencing Business on 10 April and 28 April 2020

The AGM was further informed that in order to enable IEM to provide feedback on the needs of IEM members, IEM had also conducted three (3) surveys with the respective dates and number of responses received as follows:

- 1. Impact of COVID-19 on IEM Members categorised to Employees, Employers and Retired Engineers from 5-9 April 2020 with 801 responses
- 2. Impact on COVID-19 on Students from 30 April-7 May 2020 with 379 responses
- 3. Follow-up Survey on Impact of MCO on IEM members categorised to Employees, Employers and Retired Engineers from 22 May-7 June 2020 with 465 responses

5.10 IEM Circulars

The Honorary Secretary further reported that to date, IEM had issued seven (7) circulars with information for IEM members. It was noted that Circular No. 8 and Circular No. 9 would be released soon. The Circulars were also available on the IEM website at www.myiem.org.my for the members information.

5.11 IEM Adapting to New Normal

The AGM noted that IEM had to adapt to the New Normal since the enforcement of the Movement Control Order (MCO) as physical meetings and activities were not allowed. In view of this, IEM had to immediately move the meetings and activities to virtual platform.

The Honorary Secretary reported that in order to facilitate meetings to be conducted online, IEM signed up for three (3) virtual accounts to cater for the meetings of all Committees and Technical Divisions of IEM. The AGM was also informed that the Excomm meeting held on 6 April 2020 would go into IEM history as the first ever Excomm meeting conducted virtually.

5.12 IEM Webinar

The AGM was informed that with the imposition of the restriction from ROS, IEM had to urgently look into moving its activities to virtual platform. The first IEM webinar was conducted on 18 April 2020 by the Engineering Competency Development Sub Committee. It was noted that more than 300 members registered for the webinar but due to the constraints of IEM's account, only 100 participants could attend. IEM had conducted about 70 webinars since then, with more than 10,289 attendees of which 40% were from Klang Valley and approximately 1% from overseas. The AGM was further informed that another 43 webinars were in the pipeline. With the overwhelming response from members, IEM signed up for a higher capacity account which enabled the webinars to cater to 500 participants.

The Honorary Secretary reported that with Recovery MCO announced on 7 June 2020 and the lifting of the restriction by ROS, IEM would be looking into resuming physical activities soon. Nevertheless, taking into consideration the safety and health of members as well as the need for physical distancing, IEM may probably consider a hybrid mode for activities. This would also enable members from outside Klang Valley to benefit from the numerous activities organised at HQ.

5.13 IEM Secretariat Set-Up

The Honorary Secretary went on to brief the AGM on the set up of IEM Secretariat which comprised of 39 staff. Currently, there are six (6) staff in the Managerial level, 24 Executives and nine (9) Assistant Executives.

5.13.1 Long Service IEM Secretariat Staff

The Honorary Secretary took the opportunity to inform the AGM that there were some IEM Secretariat staff who had served IEM for a long time. They were:

He expressed his appreciation to the IEM Secretariat for their support and assistance during his two (2) year tenure as Honorary Secretary.

The President thanked the Honorary Secretary for his presentation and proceeded to invite questions from the members. The President informed that only five (5) questions would be accepted. The members were requested to click on the **RAISE HAND** icon and the IT Secretariat would allow the members to type in his/her question. The question would be flashed on the screen before a response is given.

Past President, Y.Bhg. Datuk Ir. Dr. Ow Chee Sheng who was attending the AGM all the way from New Zealand commented that it was not possible for attendees to unmute and speak as the AGM was being conducted using webinar. He informed that some international bodies were using "*GoToMeeting*" platform which enables attendees to speak and suggested that IEM look into more user-friendly online platform. The President noted the suggestion and agreed that IEM would explore more options to conduct online meetings in the near future.

Since there were no further comments or questions via online and from Council members in the auditorium, Y.Bhg. Dato' Ahmad Murad bin Omar (F04741) proposed that the Annual Report be adopted. The motion was seconded by Ir. Haidel Heli (F22455).



6.0 ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2019

The President then invited the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Chen Harn Shean to present the financial statements for The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia for the period 1 January 2019 to 31 December 2019. Ir. Chen Harn Shean informed the AGM that the accounts presented would be from pages 157 to 183.

6.1 The Honorary Treasurer informed the AGM that the financial statements presented comprised of three (3) sets of accounts that is those of IEM, IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd and IEM Academy Sdn Bhd.

The financial statements did not include the Branch accounts.

The AGM was informed that the main focus of the presentation was the accounts of IEM that was referring to the column "Institution".

- 6.2 The Honorary Treasurer reported that the total income for 2019 was approximately RM5,014,556. The figure comprised of the main income (RM3,841,273), the Institutional Services (RM428,887) and the rental income (RM744,396). It was noted that the overall income decreased by 2% in 2019 compared to 2018.
- 6.3 The Honorary Treasurer further reported that there was a 6.9% improvement on the amount of the annual subscriptions collected i.e. 91.2% in 2019 compared to 88.8% in 2018.
- 6.4 The rental income had also increased by 14% and there was a 39% increase in the fixed deposit interest. However, the Institutional services, arbitration levy and credit card commission have decreased by 17%, 76% and 11% respectively.
- 6.5 The Honorary Treasurer informed that the total expenses for 2019 was RM5,170,734, a reduction of 15% compared to 2018 which was RM6,081,431. The main contributors to the decrease in the expenses were from the personal emoluments which decreased by 19%, intersociety activities (13%), administrative expenses (11%), building maintenance (7.2%) and finance expenses (1%). However, it was reported that the Branch subsidies increased by 8% as it would based on increase in annual subscription collected.

The AGM was further informed that beginning this year (2020), Peninsular Malaysia Branches would be given an increase in their subsidy from 20% to 30% while the East Malaysia Branches' subsidy would remain at 40%. This was in response to the call from the Branches to increase their subsidies mainly to provide better services to their members in their respective regions.

6.6 The Honorary Treasurer reported that the overall performance of the Institution was a deficit of RM212,933 in 2019 compared to deficit of RM1,021,277 for the year 2018. This was considered a huge improvement compared to the year 2018.

The President then thanked the Honorary Treasurer for his report and proceeded to invite questions from the members. The members who were attending online were requested click on the RAISE HAND icon should they wish to ask any question.

While waiting for questions to be raised on the financial statement, the President informed AGM that the Past Presidents present online were Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin, Y.Bhg. Datuk Ir. Dr. Ow Chee Sheng, Ir. Choo Kok Beng, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong and Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr. Gue See Sew.

6.7 Questions Session – Accounts

6.7.1 YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) informed the AGM that at the last AGM meeting, he raised the question on the "*Trade and non-Trade Receivables*" and he now noted that the collection had increased tremendously compared to last year. He then congratulated IEM on this achievement.

However, YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) pointed out that the *"Trade and Non-Trade Payables"* had increased double fold. This was cited on page 172 of the Annual report. It was commented that the figures for 2019 was RM1,305,323 compared to RM752,682 for the year 2018.

The Honorary Treasurer explained that the huge increase of the figure was mainly due to the WTC2020's income and expenses which can only be recognised in 2020 as the event would be held in 2020. YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) suggested that there should be a note to indicate the explanation.

The President also informed that in 2019, that there was an increase in the collection of subscription in arrears which was RM448,789 compared to the previous year which was RM372,050. However, the AGM was informed that the income from activities had reduced and hoped that more events would be organised in the year 2021.



6.7.2 There was a question raised by Ir. Loo Chee Kin (M15863) on the decline of income from the Technical Divisions (TD) on page 178 and what IEM intend to do in order to improve the publicity of events organised by the TDs and Special Interest Groups (SIG). Ir. Loo Chee Kin (M15863) also suggested that IEM should start looking at having more Memorandums of Understanding (MoU) with other organisations.

The President thanked Ir. Loo for his question and informed that IEM will continue to improve the activities organised including conducting activities via online platform.

6.7.3 Ir. Sivalingam a/l Veluppillai (F09546) queried on the difference between personnel emoluments and administrative expenses. The President explained that the personnel emoluments were on the staffs' salaries whereas the latter was expenses apart from the staffs' salary as stated on page 174. The President informed that the personnel emoluments had decreased by 19% compared to last year.

As there were no further questions from the floor as well as online, YBhg. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) proposed the adoption of the Financial Statements for IEM for the year ended 31 December 2019. The motion was seconded by Ir. Mohd Aman bin Hj. Idris (F02176). The AGM then adopted the Financial Statement.

7.0 EDUCATION FUND FINANCIAL STATEMENT – 31 DECEMBER 2018

The Honorary Treasurer then continued to report on the Financial Statements of the Education Fund for the year ending 31 December 2019 from page 194 to page 204.

- 7.1 The AGM was informed that donations received amounted to RM113,123 in 2019 compared to RM49,810 in 2018. This donation received included RM50,000 contributed by the Geotechnical Engineering Technical Division to set up the TT Chiam Memorial Scholarship.
- 7.2 The Fixed Deposit Interest earned in 2019 was RM48,682, with a slight improvement compared to the year 2018 which was RM43,234.
- 7.3 Where the expenditure was concerned, the Honorary Treasurer further reported that the scholarship given out in 2019 was RM42,000. He further informed that the Presidential scholarship together with the Tan Sri Prof Chin Fung Kee Memorial Scholarship and Ir. Thean Lip Thong Scholarship had been advertised.

The Honorary Treasurer informed the AGM that the Ir. Thean Lip Thong Scholarship was for students from Universiti Malaya whereas the Tan Sri Prof. Chin Fung Kee Memorial Scholarship was for other universities.

- 7.4 The AGM was also informed that the overall deficit was RM20,721 compared to RM60,198 in 2018. This was in compliance with the 50% Spending Rule of Inland Revenue Board (IRB) for Tax Exempt Account.
- 7.5 Ir. Simon Yeong Chin Chow (F18660) commented that there were no figures stated under the item *"Non-trade receivables"* for 2019 on page 194. The Honorary Treasurer noted the error by the auditors and will be rectified. It was nevertheless pointed out by YBhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) that there was a figure appearing on this item on page 195 for the same heading. The AGM was informed that IEM would be replacing the auditors.
- 7.6 Ir. Simon Yeong Chin Chow (F18660) also queried on the types of IEM Events projected under the expenditure heading for 2019 which amounted to RM86,445. The Honorary Treasurer informed that the events included seminars and courses. It was noted that the Branches would need to apply or write to HQ should they require some allocation of funds from the Education Fund. Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) however clarified that since the allocation was from the Education Fund, the request should be related to education such as supporting the engineering students.
- 7.7 There was a query from Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) on how IEM would deal with the donation of RM50,000 contributed by the Geotechnical Engineering Technical Division since IEM had to comply with the 50% tax exemption.

The Deputy President, Ir. Ong Ching Loon (F11938) explained that in order to comply with the 50% tax exemption, IEM had to ensure that the money would be spent on activities related to education.

7.8 Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) suggested that IEM should check with the IRB as this was a revolving fund and if IEM spent less than 50% per year what would be the consequences and whether the IRB had any provision on this.

Further to the query by Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691), Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) highlighted that the 50% spent was for the previous year. President also informed that IEM received the donations towards the end of the previous year and 50% of the money could not be spent.



Since there were no questions from the floor, Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai (F18343) proposed the adoption of the Education Fund financial statement for the year ended 31 December 2019 and the motion was supported by Ir. Sreedaran a/I Raman (M38681). The AGM then adopted the Education Fund financial statement.

8.0 PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS

The President informed the AGM that the proposed amendments were presented on pages 6 to 8. The President further informed that approval of the amendments by the AGM would be via e-voting. Members were requested to ensure that they had their User ID and Password for the portal on-hand when they receive the SMS.

The President then invited Ir. Lai Sze Ching to go through the amendments article by article of which all the comments from the last AGM had been addressed. The following Articles were mentioned:

8.1 ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

Article 2.2

The amendments were on the change of name from Companion to Senior Graduate Members and inclusion of four (4) new grades of membership:

(ea) Engineering Technologists Members (eb) Engineering Technologist Graduate Members (ec) Engineering Technician Members (ed) Engineering Technician Graduate Members

8.2 <u>Article 2.5</u>

The amendments were on including the pre-fix for the above-mentioned new membership grades:

Senior Graduate Member S.Grad.I.E.M. Engineering Technologist Member E.T.I.E.M. Engineering Technologist Graduate Member Grad. E.T.I.E.M. Engineering Technician Member E.Tn.I.E.M. Engineering Technician Graduate Member Grad. E.Tn.I.E.M.

8.3 <u>Article 2.14</u>

The amendment was on changing the membership grade name from Companion to Senior Graduate Member. In addition, the following new Articles had been inserted:

2.15A Engineering Technologist Member: An Engineering Technologist

Member shall be a person who in respect to his educational attainments and his practical training, complies with the relevant Bylaws and Regulations.

2.15B Engineering Technologist Graduate Member:

An Engineering Technologist Graduate Member shall be a person who in respect to his age, his educational attainments and his practical training, complies with the relevant Bylaws and Regulations.

2.15C Engineering Technician Member:

An Engineering Technician Member shall be a person who in respect to his educational attainments and his practical training, complies with the relevant Bylaws and Regulations.

2.15D Engineering Technician Graduate Member:

An Engineering Technician Graduate Member shall be a person who in respect to his age, his educational attainments and his practical training, complies with the relevant Bylaws and Regulations.

8.4 ARTICLE IV SOURCES OF INCOME

Article 4.1 – Entrance and Transfer Fees

The amendment was on the change of name from Companion to Senior Graduate Member.

The following fees were inserted:



- who has been an Associate Member for at least one (1) year, and who applies for transfer to this grade of membership within one (1) year after obtaining the required qualifications for admission to the this grade.

- (ii) who does not fulfil the requirements in (cd)(i) above.

8.5 <u>Article 4.2 Annual Subscription</u>

Article 4.2.1

The AGM was informed on the change of name for *"Companion"* to *"Senior Graduate Member"*. In addition, the following four (4) new sub-section had been inserted after Graduate Member with the respective fees:

8.6 <u>Article 4.4 – Economic Activities</u>

The AGM was further informed that the additional wordings had been inserted (in italic and bold) as follows:

"The Institution is allowed to engage in economic activities such as sell, purchase, invest, rent, own movable or immovable assets as well as other economic activities such as setting up companies under Companies Act 2016, *conduct or co-organise training activities as training provider, exhibition, conferences etc.*

8.7 <u>Article 5.1</u>

The AGM was informed on the amendments as follows:

- k) Five (5) Companion Senior Graduate Members or Graduate Members, as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- I) One (1) woman Member as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- m) One (1) Engineering Technologist Member, as prescribed in the Bylaws,
- n) One (1) Engineering Technician Member, as prescribed in the Bylaws.

8.8 <u>Article 5.2</u>

The AGM was informed that there were no amendments to the said article except to align the items accordingly:

- (b) A Vice President shall hold office for a term of two (2) sessions and may be re-elected but may not hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- (b) (a) The Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer shall hold office for a term of one (1) session. They may be reelected, but may not hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- (c) A Council Member shall hold office....
- (c) The Chairman of each Branch of the Institution....

8.9 <u>Article 5.4</u>

The AGM was further informed on the insertion of the numbering items, 5.1 (m) and 5.1 (n) as well as removing the word "and" to the said Article 5.4 as follows:

The Vice Presidents, the Honorary Secretary and the Honorary Treasurer and Council Members except those under Article 5.1 (k), and 5.1(l), **5.1(m**) and **5.1(n**), shall be elected from amongst the Corporate Members by secret ballot in the manner as prescribed in this Constitution and the Bylaws and Regulations made thereunder.

The Members of the Council under Article 5.1 (k), and 5.1(l), 5.1(m) and 5.1(n), shall be appointed in the manner as prescribed in the Bylaws.

8.10 <u>Article 5.7</u>

The Deputy President shall be elected by only the Corporate Members of the Council from amongst the Corporate Members of the Council who are or had served as Vice Presidents.



8.11 <u>Article 5.11</u>

Insertion of a new paragraph after the first paragraph as follows:

For the purpose of this Article, "Officer" means the member of the Council or Executive Committee or the Standing Committee.

8.12 <u>Article 5.14</u>

The AGM was further informed on the amendments to the following items accordingly:

- h) One (1) Companion Senior Graduate Member or Graduate Member appointed by the Branch Committee
- *i)* One (1) Engineering Technologist Member appointed by the Branch Committee
- *j)* One (1) Engineering Technician Member appointed by the Branch Committee

8.13 ARTICLE X INTERPRETATION

<u>Article 10.9</u>

The AGM further noted the change of name on the membership grade for Companion as well as the insertion of the four (4) new grades as follows:

"Non-corporate Members" means Distinguished Honorary Fellows, Honorary Fellows and Honorary Members who are not engineers and Graduate Members, Companions Senior Graduate Member, Engineering Technologist Member, Engineering Technologist Graduate Member, Engineering Technician Member, Engineering Technician Graduate Member, Incorporated Members, Affiliate Members, Associate Members or Student Members.

In conclusion, Ir. Lai Sze Ching informed the AGM that there were no major amendments as it was mainly on ensuring that the changes were consistent amongst the articles especially on renaming the membership grade of Companion to Senior Graduate Member and inserting the four (4) new membership grades.

The President then re-assured the AGM that after approval by the AGM, the proposed amendments would also be sent for the general balloting where a majority vote of 2/3 of the votes in favour was required for the approval to the amendments of the above-mentioned articles.

8.14 Questions Session – Amendments to the Constitution

The President then invited questions form the members on the amendments before proceeding with the voting process.

8.14.1 Ir. Gunasagaran Kristnan (F08216) commented that amending the Articles 2.2, 2.5 and 2.14 and referring to Article 4.1, he felt that the word ".....a Non-corporate Member in any grade....." was contradicting. He further commented that there were altogether thirteen (13) membership grades but only nine (9) membership grades could apply for non-corporate membership.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) explained that there were no amendments made to Article 4.1 as it was the existing Article. It was noted that only the entrance fees were inserted. He further suggested that should Ir. Gunasagaran Kristnan wish to comment further on the said Article, he could raise this issue at the next round of amendments to the IEM Constitution. The President further reiterated that these amendments had been previously approved by Council.

- 8.14.2 Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) was invited to pose his questions to the AGM as follows:
- 8.14.2.1 *i) Why was there a need to amend the Constitution?*

The President explained that the amendments were done as IEM wish to include a few new categories of membership as well as to finetune some of the earlier articles for clarity.

8.14.2.2 *ii) With the introduction of the four (4) new membership grades, there was a need for IEM to market the said membership grades and look into providing benefits for these group of members.*

Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) commented that other Institutions were also catering to the needs of these groups and suggested that IEM could cooperate with other institution rather than having these groups of members to join IEM.

The President further explained that three (3) Institutions which had such grades were the Malaysia Board of Technology (MBOT), Malaysia Society for Engineering and Technology (MySet) and IEM. The AGM was informed that IEM chose to introduce these new membership grades so as to be more inclusive. Moreover, IEM is currently



looking into providing a pathway for the engineering technologists to be full-ledged engineers. In addition, it was agreed that IEM would need to look ahead as there would be more engineering technologists and technicians graduating in the near future and to have them join IEM would enable IEM to include the whole engineering fraternity.

8.14.2.3 *iii) Grammatical errors in the Articles that needed to be corrected*

The President agreed that the errors would be corrected before submitting to the ROS.

8.14.2.4 *iv)* Titles should be given to Members only and not other membership grades

v) The abbreviations should be without the full stop for example; Senior Member SMIEM and not S.M.I.E.M as stated in the Constitution

The President explained that there was no change to the abbreviations which were currently as such in the Constitution. Should Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) wish to have it amended, he would need to write in to IEM with the suggestion to amend the said article in the Constitution.

Y.Bhg. Academician Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) further reiterated President's explanation that the amendments were approved in principle at the last AGM. The main issue was the wordings of which, the last AGM requested the Council and Excomm to look into. This AGM was mainly to accept the wordings and thereafter proceed to vote on the amendments to the Constitution.

The President then further read the question posed by Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) as follows:

8.14.2.5 What is the difference between 2.15B and 2.15D?

The President informed that for 2.15B, they were graduates of engineering technology programmes whereas for 2.15D, they were graduates of engineering diploma programmes.

8.14.2.6 Ir. Dr. Tan Yean Chin (F11712) interjected that since the amendments had been approved in principle at the last AGM and that Council and Excomm had amended accordingly, he suggested that his AGM should proceed with the voting process. He also commented that should any member wish to vote against the amendments, the members were free to do so during the voting exercise.

President also agreed with the suggestion of Ir. Dr.Tan Yean Chin (F11712) to proceed with the voting exercise.

8.14.2.7 However, the AGM noted Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) suggestion that there was a need to look at the command of English or the grammatical errors as earlier pointed out by Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942). The AGM noted the typo error for Article 4.1 (b) (ii) (i) as it should be ".... who has been **a** Associate Member....".

The AGM noted that this would be rectified before the amendments were sent out for balloting later.

The AGM was then guided by the EMCEE on the step-by-step procedure for the e-voting exercise through the members' mobile. It was noted that 25 minutes would be allocated for the voting exercise.

While waiting for the results on the e-voting of the amendments to the Constitution, the President answered to the questions posed by the following members via online:

8.14.2.8 Ir. Gan Ting Wei (M16465) suggested to have online talks to replace the offline talk.

President responded that IEM would continue to arrange more online webinars for the benefit of members. However, he informed that there could be some speakers who might not be comfortable to present via webinars. It was noted that for such cases, IEM would try to seek their consent to have their presentation recorded to be played online thereafter or forward to the Branches for them to arrange the similar presentation but without the speaker being present in person. It was further noted that a Facilitator would be appointed by the Branch to handle the questions and answer session should there be any.

8.14.2.9 Ir. S. Jagathisen (M05107) queried on how can a retired Corporate Members be of service to the Institution. He further informed that he had posed the same question two (2) years ago. However, he did not get any response.

The President informed that retired members could volunteer to serve in the IEM Technical Divisions. Issues concerning technical matters or IEM's representation to outside organisations would be referred to the relevant Technical Divisions for their input. In addition, retired members could also volunteer to present talks on their areas of expertise for the benefit of other members especially the young engineers. This could be done if they were serving in the Technical Divisions.



8.14.2.10 Ling Yang Ming (M78075)

Will IEM consider conducting Seminar on virtual meeting post MCO? I think it is recommended and innovative options to continue; also please consider to have an IEM App for better services.

The President responded that IEM's Technical Divisions were in the midst of planning for some seminars to be organised virtually and members would be notified accordingly once finalised. In addition, IEM had been working on the IEM Mobile App prior to the MCO and discussions were on-going with the vendor. The President further informed that more information concerning the IEM Mobile App would be presented in the incoming President's Presidential Address.

8.14.2.11 Mohd Khairul Anwar bin Mohd Hatta (M102455)

Looking at post COVID-19 economy landscape. What are the key strategies that need to be adopted by engineering/ construction companies to remain competitive in ever evolving and challenging market?

The President responded that engineers were versatile and it would up to them to decide what would be best for them in such trying times.

8.14.2.12 Chan Khung Leong (G22094)

May I add my "Ts. and P.Tech (Professional Technologist) by Malaysia Board of Technologists title to the IEM directory? Thanks.

The President informed that members could write in to IEM HQ and provide the necessary documentation as proof to add the title "Ts" into IEM's database.

8.14.2.13 Ooi Zi Xun (M45549)

What are IEM contributions / proposals to government on MCO recovery for engineering consultancy practice and construction industry?

The President informed that this issue had been presented by the Honorary Secretary in his presentation.

8.14.2.14 Hazlee Azil Illias (M52562)

The vision of IEM is "The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia aims to be the premier professional organisation pivotal to Malaysia achieving Vision 2020." However, now it is already 2020. IEM should review itself to see whether it has achieved its vision or not.

The President responded that for the new Session 2020/2021, IEM would be reviewing its Strategic Plan on whether it has achieved this mission.

He further explained that IEM had not now moved on to a new Vision as depicted on page 3 of the Annual Report that is *"The Institution of Engineers, Malaysia aims to be the premier learned engineering society championing the adoption of ethics and professional best practices in all sectors of the industry".*

8.14.2.15 Ho Choon Kwang William (M17178)

i) How would the voting system be like for members attending virtually?

The President informed that as indicated in the email blasts to members, an SMS would be sent to all members attending the AGM. A link would be provided for the members to be directed to the IEM website "member log-in" page for the members to log-in to vote. A pass code would also be provided in the SMS. The members would need to key in the pass code and then proceed to vote.

ii) Is there any CPD awarded for full attendance?

The CPD for attendance of the AGM virtually is 2.

iii) What about the annual dinner?

The President responded that in view of the COVID-19 pandemic, the IEM Annual Dinner for 2020 had to be cancelled.

8.14.2.16 The President then further read out the additional question received from a member on the amendments to the Branch Rules. The President informed that the amendments to the Branch Rules had been rectified and would be forwarded to the respective Branch.



8.14.2.17 Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) also commented on the Mission and Vision statement. He further commented that the statement was very general and queried on how would the Standing Committees interpret the mission and objective to make progress.

President explained that the incoming President would be forming a Committee to look into enhancing and improving the Strategic Plan of the Institution.

The results from the e-voting was tabulated and presented as follows:

As the results indicated that generally more than 70% had voted in favour of the amendments, it was concluded that the amendments were approved by the AGM. The President then informed the AGM that another round of the balloting would be conducted after the AGM to all the Corporate members in order to comply with the requirement of IEM's Constitution before the amendments can be submitted to the ROS.

The President thanked the members for voting favourably on the amendments.

9.0 ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE ELECTION RESULTS FOR COUNCIL 2020/20201 SESSION

The President then invited the Election Officer, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah to announce the results of the election for the session 2020/2021. Prior to announcing the election results, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah requested the AGM to observe a one minute silence in remembrance of the late Y.Bhg. Dato' Pang Leong Hoon who passed away in July 2019.

Upon completion of the one minute silence, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah went on to pay tribute to the late Y.Bhg. Dato' Pang Leong Hoon who was first appointed as Election Officer for the 1994/95 Council elections and had served for the last 25 sessions which made up 40% of the IEM's 61 years' history.

The presentation of the Election results by the late Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon had always been one segment of the AGM which all members enjoyed and he will be deeply missed.

9.1 President

Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah informed the AGM that Ir. Ong Ching Loon, the President-elect would take over the Presidency from Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi in accordance with Section 5.2 of the IEM Bylaws.

9.2 Deputy President

The Election Officer informed the AGM that nomination for the post of Deputy President was closed on 31 October 2019 and six (6) valid nominations were received. Subsequent to that, ballot papers were sent out to all Council Members on 8 November 2019 and the balloting was closed on 21 December 2019.

The AGM was informed that Ir. Prof. Dr. Norlida binti Buniyamin received the highest votes and was elected as the Deputy President of the Institution in accordance with Bylaws Section 5.3.

SENARAI AHLI-AHLI YANG HADIR – SEPERTI DILAMPIRAN A

1.0 KATA-KATA ALUAN OLEH YANG DIPERTUA

- 1.1 Yang DiPertua, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi merakamkan ucapan terima kasih dan mengalu-alukan kehadiran para ahli ke Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan (MAT) yang ke-61 dan seterusnya memulakan mesyuarat pada pukul 9.07am. Beliau kemudian melaporkan aktiviti / acara yang berlangsung semenjak bulan Mei 2019 sehingga bulan Julai 2020. Beliau juga memaklumkan bahawa Perintah Kawalan Pengerakan berkuatkuasa dari 18 Mac sehingga 1 Ogos 2020 berikutan pandemic Covid-19 telah menyebabkan operasi IEM and para ahli mengalami perubahan yang drastic. Malah ia juga mempengaruhi keadaan ekonomi negara, gaya hidup, karier dan juga perniagaan rakyat Malaysia. Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan bahawa IEM telah melakukan kerja-kerja amal semasa negara dilanda pandemic tersebut. Beliau mengucapkan terima kasih kepada para penderma kepada tabung Covid-19 dimana ia telah digunakan untuk membeli pelitup muka 3 lapis untuk organisasi-organisasi seperti berikut:
 - i) Hospital Universiti –10,000 keping pelitup muka
 - ii) Persatuan Bagi Orang Buta Malaysia- 5,000 keping pelitup muka
 - iii) Persekutuan Orang Pekak Malaysia 5,000 keping pelitup muka

Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan MAT bahawa beliau akan merupakan Yang DiPertua paling lama berkhidmat di Institusi disebabkan pandemik Covid-19 iaitu mulai 21 April 2018 sehingga 25 Julai 2020 iaitu selama dua (2) tahun tiga (3) bulan dan tiga (3) hari.

Yang DiPertua seterusnya memaklumkan para Ahli mengenai perjalanan beliau dari seorang Ahli biasa Insitusi Jurutera Malaysia sejak tahun 1987 yang kemudiannya dilantik sebagai Pengerusi Cawangan, perkhidmatan beliau dalam Jawatankuasa Kecil, Jawatankuasa Tetap, Jawatankuasa Majlis, Jawatankuasa Eksekutif sehingga menjadi Yang DiPertua. Selain berkongsi pengalaman beliau sepanjang perkhidmatan sebagai seorang ahli IEM, Yang DiPertua juga berkongsi visi dan pandangan beliau dalam lima (5) isu terbitan majalah Jurutera.

Seterusnya Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan bahawa sepanjang tempoh perkhidmatannya sebagai Yang DiPertua, beliau telah berjaya mengadakan hubungan kerja rapat bersama kesemua Cawangan IEM di samping usaha beliau untuk mengekalkan hubungan erat dengan pelbagai Kementerian serta Ketua Organisasi Kejuruteraan Antarabangsa seperti Pertubuhan Kejuruteraan Persekutuan Dunia (WFEO), Persekutuan Pertubuhan Kejuruteraan ASEAN (AFEO), Perikatan Kejuruteraan Antarabangsa (IEA), Majlis Jurutera Komanwel (CEC), Persekutuan Institusi Kejuruteraan Negara-negara Islam (FEIIC) dan Persekutuan Organisasi Kejuruteraan Afrika (FAEO).

Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan kejayaan IEM dalam menganjurkan sambutan Majlis Makan Malam Ulang Tahun ke-60 pada 20 April 2019 di Sunway Resort. Beliau seterusnya melaporkan bahawa IEM berjaya menjual 139 buah meja yang dianggap sebagai catatan rekod tertinggi sepanjang sejarah IEM. Beliau kemudian mengucapkan tahniah kepada Pengerusi Penganjur Makan Malam Tahunan IEM, Ir. Gopal Narian Kutty di atas kejayaan tersebut.

Yang DiPertua seterusnya melafazkan komen beliau bahawa IEM sebagai sebuah badan profesional harus menyemai rasa hormat sesama ahli dan pada masa yang sama, menggalakkan kepelbagaian pendapat di antara para ahli. Beliau mengulas bahawa peranan Yang Dipertua Institusi bukanlah tugas yang mudah kerana beliau terpaksa menghadapi pelbagai cabaran dalam menegakkan dan memelihara martabat jawatan Yang Dipertua IEM dan ini telah menyebabkan hubungan persahabatan dengan segelintir ahli menghadapi sedikit tekanan.

Dalam perkembangan lain, Yang DiPertua memaklumkan sejak 3 Jun 2020, IEM terlibat dalam pengurusan krisis untuk penganjuran persidangan antarabangsa disebabkan pandemik Covid-19. Beliau selanjutnya memberitahu MAT bahawa selama sebulan yang terakhir ini, tidak kurang dari dua puluh (20) perbincangan rasmi telah dilakukan terutamanya untuk memastikan bahawa IEM tidak akan terlibat dalam implikasi kewangan dan undang-undang berhubungan dengan penganjuran persidangan tersebut. Kata sepakat dengan ITA, badan antarabangsa yang memiliki persidangan tersebut telah berjaya dicapai dan pengisytiharan bersama oleh kedua-dua belah pihak untuk meneruskan penganjuran persidangan antarabangsa itu telah dibuat pada awal bulan hb Julai.

Yang DiPertua merakamkan ucapan terima kasih kepada Pasukan Petugas Khas atas bimbingan, nasihat dan ketabahan mereka dalam perbincangan dengan IAT. Beliau juga mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Jawatankuasa berkaitan yang terlibat dalam isu ini iaitu Jawatankuasa Pengawasan yang dianggotai oleh Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah, Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik dan Ir. Dr. Tan Yean Chin, Ketua Jawatankuasa Penganjur WTC yang diketuai oleh Ir. Dr Ooi Teik Aun serta ahli Lembaga Pengarah IEM TC yang diketuai oleh Ir. Ong Ching Loon yang telah banyak membantu Yang DiPertua.



Yang DiPertua kemudian memaklumkan walaupun beliau mungkin mempunyai perselisihan faham mengenai masalah tertentu dengan beberapa ahli, beliau menjelaskan bahawa semua yang dilakukan adalah demi kepentingan IEM. Yang DiPertua menekankan lagi bahawa beliau mungkin tidak mampu menyelesaikan tugasnya sebagai Yang DiPertua tanpa sokongan kuat dari Ahli Eksekutif dan Timbalan Yang DiPertua. Beliau memaklumkan bahawa sebanyak enambelas mesyuarat Ahli Eksekutif telah diadakan sepanjang sesi 2019/2020 dan kehadiran anggota adalah 90%. Beliau turut merakamkan ucapan terima kasih kepada Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Chong Luin dan Ir. Fam Yew Hin di atas kehadiran penuh dalam semua mesyuarat tersebut.

Yang DiPertua juga merakamkan ucapan terima kasih kepada Setiausaha Kehormat, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad di atas sokongan dan sumbangannya pada waktu yang sukar. Yang Dipertua juga menyampaikan penghargaannya kepada Urusetia yang telah membantu walau di luar waktu pejabat. Akhir sekali, Presiden mengucapkan terima kasih kepada para ahli di atas sokongan, bimbingan dan nasihat mereka selama dua (2) tahun ini.

Seterusnya Yang DiPertua memberi laporan terhadap perkara di bawah:

1.2 Kemaskini untuk Sesi 2029/2020

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa kedudukan semasa keahlian IEM adalah seramai 53,894 ahli yang terdiri daripada pelbagai gred dimana 31,419 adalah ahli Pelajar.

YangDiPertua seterusnya memaklumkan bahawa beliau telah menghadiri mesyuarat antarabangsa seperti berikut:

- 1) Mesyuarat Lembaga Pentadbiran AFEO pertengahan diadakan di Brunei pada 29 April 2019
- 2) Mesyuarat ITA di Naples, Itali pada bulan Mei 2019
- 3) Mesyuarat IEA di Hong Kong dari 10-14 Jun 2019
- 4) CAFEO 37 di Jakarta, Indonesia dari 11-14 September 2019

Selain menghadiri mesyuarat-mesyuarat yang disebutkan di atas, beliau juga menghadiri dan berkongsi sesi dialog bersama delegasi dari pelbagai institusi kejuruteraan profesional seperti Jurutera Australia, Persatuan Sains dan Teknologi China, Lembaga Jurutera Myanmar, Persatuan Insinyur Indonesia serta organisasi iaitu Persatuan Jurutera Perunding Malaysia (ACEM) dan Majlis Standard dan Akreditasi Malaysia (MSDAM).

IEM juga telah menandatangani Memorandum Persefahaman dengan beberapa Institusi Pengajian Tinggi (IPT) seperti Universiti Politeknik Northwestern (NPU), China pada 29 Jun 2019, Universiti Heriot-Watt pada 8 Julai 2019 dan KDU University College pada 17 Oktober 2019. Selain dari IPT, IEM juga menandatangani MoU dengan Majlis Minyak dan Gas Malaysia (MOGSC) pada 8 Julai 2019 dan Perbadanan Teknologi Hijau Malaysia (MGTC) pada 9 Oktober 2019.

Yang DiPertua juga telah menghadiri Pertubuhan Kejuruteraan Persekutuan Dunia (WFEO) yang diadakan pada 14-19 November 2019 dimana beliau telah bertemu dengan delegasi dari Afrika yang mewakili FAEO di Majlis Umum WFEO di Melbourne, Australia. Selain dari pertemuan yang disebutkan, Yang DiPertua juga menghadiri mesyuarat Majlis Jurutera Komanwel (CEC) pada 19 November 2019 dan Mesyuarat Agung FEIAP pada 21 November 2019 di Melbourne, Australia.

Yang DiPertua juga merasmikan pelancaran 'IEM Maker Space' pada 5 Oktober 2019 di Wisma IEM dan pelancaran Konvensyen IEM yang dianjurkan oleh CIS Network pada 12 Disember 2019.

MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa semasa Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP), Pejabat Urusetia IEM ditutup dan semua mesyuarat diadakan secara di dalam talian. Dua (2) kenyataan media dikeluarkan selama waktu itu.

Sewaktu PKP dilaksanakan, Yang DiPertua dan Timbalan Yang DiPertua juga dijemput menghadiri sesi dialog bersama Menteri di Jabatan Perdana Menteri, Y.Bhg. Dato' Sri Mustapha Mohamad mengenai isu-isu yang berkaitan dengan sektor bangunan pada 23 April 2020. Kemudian, pada 20 Mei 2020 pula , Timbalan Yang DiPertua telah menghadiri mesyuarat bersama Menteri Kewangan, Y.Bhg. Senator Tengku Dato' Sri Zafrul Tengku Abdul Aziz.

Yang DiPertua juga telah menghadiri mesyuarat yang dianjurkan oleh Kementerian Perdagangan Antarabangsa dan Industri (MITI) yang dipengerusikan oleh Timbalan Ketua Setiausaha MITI, Y.Bhg. Dato' Sri Norazman Ayob untuk membincangkan isu-isu operasi industri perkhidmatan semasa PKP dilaksanakan pada 28 April 2020. Pada 24 dan 25 Jun 2020, Yang DiPertua bersama dengan Timbalan Yang DiPertua menghadiri Mesyuarat IEA secara platform maya.

2.0 AGENDA

Setelah selesai menyampaikan laporan, Yang DiPertua seterusnya membentangkan Agenda untuk MAT seperti berikut:

Yang DiPertua seterusnya meneruskan Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-61 selepas tiada bantahan terhadap Agenda yang dibentangkan.

3.0 PENGESAHAN MINIT MESYUARAT AGUNG TAHUN KE-60 PADA 20 APRIL 2019

Yang DiPertua menjemput para ahli untuk membaca minit MAT yang dicetak dimuka surat 52 hingga 70. MAT juga diminta untuk membaca senarai kehadiran dari muka surat 71 hingga 75. Versi Bahasa Malaysia yang terdapat dimuka surat 76 hingga 94.

Yang DiPertua selanjutnya memaklumkan sekiranya terdapat ahli yang ingin memberi komen, mereka perlu mengklik ikon "RAISE HAND".

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) memaklumkan bahawa komposisi ahli Jawatankuasa Khas mengenai Pindaan Perlembagaan IEM dimuka surat 19 perlu meletakkan nama Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad, Ir. Fam Yew Hin dan Ir. Lee Boon Chong.

Oleh kerana tiada lagi kesilapan dalam minit mesyuarat, Ir. Yam Teong Sian (F05613) mencadangkan agar minit Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-60 yang diadakan pada 20 April 2019 disahkan dan diterima pakai. Usul tersebut telah disokong oleh Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Dato 'Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157).

4.0 PERKARA BERBANGKIT

Yang DiPertua seterusnya memaklumkan mengenai perkara-perkara yang dibangkitkan pada Mesyuarat Agung Tahunan ke-60 yang diadakan pada 20 April 2019:

4.1 Muka surat 53 - 55

Item 3.0 - Memudahkan Proses Keahlian

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa pelbagai aktiviti promosi telah dilakukan untuk meningkatkan keahlian ahli terutamanya untuk gred Ahli Korporat dan Siswazah.

Untuk sesi yang lepas, keahlian untuk MIEM telah meningkat sebanyak 599. Walau bagaimanapun, keahlian ahli Siswazah masih belum mencapai tahap yang memberangsangkan.

Sehubungan dengan itu, Jawatankuasa Tetap Kebajikan telah mengambil langkah untuk mendapatkan faedah tambahan bagi menarik lebih ramai jurutera siswazah untuk menjadi ahli IEM. Selain itu, MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Jawatankuasa Kecil Buku Log telah dijenamakan semula sebagai Jawatankuasa Kecil Pembangunan Kompetensi Kejuruteraan yang juga secara aktif mempromosikan skim Buku Log dan Mentor IEM. IEM juga dalam proses menyediakan program Mentor Atas Talian yang bertujuan untuk memberi lebih banyak faedah serta panduan kepada jurutera siswazah agar mereka berminat untuk menjadi ahli IEM.

4.2 Muka surat 60 – 61

Item 7.0 - Mengenai isu aduan terhadap Yang DiPertua oleh seorang ahli, MAT yang akhir telah memutuskan untuk Majlis mengarahkan Jawatankuasa Tetap Amalan Profesional untuk meneliti aduan tersebut.

MAT dimaklumkan berikutan surat aduan yang dibentangkan semasa MAT yang lepas dan selepas mesyuarat Majlis ke-419 yang diadakan pada 21 Oktober 2019, Panel Pemeriksaan telah dibentuk oleh Jawatankuasa Tetap Amalan Profesional untuk menentukan sama ada aduan itu terhadap :

- jawatan Yang DiPertua; atau
- orang yang memegang jawatan Yang DiPertua



Majlis diberitahu bahawa Jawatankuasa Kerja, setelah pelbagai perbahasan dan perbincangan dilakukan, telah membuat kesimpulan bahawa aduan tersebut bukan terhadap seseorang ahli dan oleh yang demikian Jawatankuasa Penyiasatan tidak perlu dibentuk untuk kes tersebut. Jawatankuasa Kerja berkeputusan bahawa aduan tersebut lebih berkaitan dengan pengurusan dan bukannya atas kesalahan yang diperlakukan oleh seseorang. Dinyatakan juga bahawa aduan itu adalah di atas cara Yang DiPertua mempengerusikan mesyuarat.

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Jawatankuasa Eksekutif, setelah membuat undian di mana Yang DiPertua berundur dari mesyuarat untuk seketika, telah memutuskan bahawa Jawatankuasa Penyiasatan tidak perlu dibentuk untuk perkara tersebut.

MAT mengambil maklum bahawa Majlis juga telah bersetuju bahawa perkara itu dianggap selesai.

4.3 Muka surat 62-65 - Item 8.0

Cadangan Pindahan Perlembagaan

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa komen yang dibuat pada MAT yang lepas telah dipertimbangkan dan pindaan yang disemak akan dikemukakan di bawah Perkara 6 di dalam Agenda.

5.0 LAPORAN TAHUNAN SESI 2019/2020

Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput Setiausaha Kehormat, Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad untuk membentangkan pelbagai aktiviti dan acara yang telah diatur pada tahun 2019. Ia dicetak pada mula surat 101 hingga 109 dalam Laporan Tahunan. Setiausaha Kehormat kemudian meneruskan laporan mengenai perkara-perkara yang dinyatakan dalam laporan Tahunan seperti berikut:

5.1 Majlis dan Jawatankuasa Eksekutif

Untuk Sesi 2019/2020, Majlis dengan anggota berjumlah 72 ahli telah mengadakan lima (5) mesyuarat. Majlis dalam mesyuarat membincangkan perkara-perkara yang berkaitan dengan dasar serta pengurusan harta dan urusan Institusi.

Jawatankuasa Eksekutif mempunyai seramai sembilan belas (19) ahli. Oleh kerana Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP), MAT terpaksa ditangguhkan. Jawatankuasa Eksekutif untuk pertama kalinya dalam sejarah IEM, telah mengadakan enam belas (16) mesyuarat untuk sesi 2019/2020. Peranan Jawatankuasa Eksekutif adalah untuk melaksanakan keputusan Majlis.

5.2 Jawatankuasa Tetapan dan Operasi Harian

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa Jawatankuasa Eksekutif dibantu oleh lapan (8) Jawatankuasa Tetap dalam operasi harian. Tujuh Jawatankuasa Tetap diketuai oleh seorang Naib Yang DiPertua manakala Jawatankuasa Tetap Kewangan dipengerusikan oleh Timbalan Yang DiPertua.

5.3 Keahlian

Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan bahawa sehingga 31 Disember 2019, sejumlah 6,087 calon telah lulus untuk kemasukan / pemilihan / pindah ke pelbagai gred. Dari ahli baru yang direkrut, 4,563 adalah pelajar. Walau bagaimanapun, 2,304 ahli perlu digantung keahlian kerana tidak mejelaskan yuran tahunan. Keseluruhan keahlian IEM adalah seramai 53,894 dimana 32,260 adalah ahli-ahli dari Cawangan-cawangan IEM.

Dari segi pecahan keahlian mengikut gred pula, Setiausaha Kehormat seterusnya memaklumkan bahawa keahlian Siswa mempunyai peratusan tertinggi iaitu 58.3% diikuti oleh Ahli Korporat (23%), Siswazah (18%), "Companion" (0.4%) dan gred lain seperti sebagai 'Incorporated'', "Affiliate" dan "Associate" adalah 0.4%.

5.4 Temuduga Profesional

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa untuk sesi 2019/2020, seramai 207 calon telah mendaftar untuk mengikuti Temuduga Profesional (PI). 170 calon telah lulus iaitu 82%. Jumlah calon yang gagal dalam PI adalah 21 orang iaitu 17%. Seramai 10 calon masih menunggu keputusan mereka.

5.5 Penerbitan IEM

Setiausaha Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa majalah IEM iaitu "Jurutera" telah diterbitkan setiap bulan sepanjang sesi 2019/2020.

Namun disebabkan PKP, edisi pertama e-Buletin dalam format mudah dibaca dan tidak perlu dimuat turun telah diperkenalkan untuk kemudahan pembacaan. MAT dimaklumkan disebabkan oleh kenaikan kos pos sebanyak 100%, "Jurutera" tidak akan lagi dihantar melalui pos kepada ahli secara individu. Namun, sebilangan kecil salinan telahdicetak untuk diambil sendiri oleh ahli di Ibu Pejabat IEM atau Cawangan.



Selanjutnya dilaporkan dua (2) edisi Jurnal telah diterbitkan dan IEM kini sedang berusaha untuk pengindexan SCOPUS untuk Jurnal IEM. Para ahli digalakkan untuk menghantar kertas kerja mereka untuk terbitan dalam Jurnal IEM.

5.6 Aktiviti IEM 2019

Setiausaha Kehormat melaporkan terdapat keseluruhan 430 acara yang telah diadakan untuk sesi 2019/2020. Acara ini merangkumi ceramah, lawatan teknikal, kursus dan seminar, pertandingan dan acara sosial IEM seperti pertandingan golf dan boling, Minggu Keluarga dan Minggu Kejuruteraan IEM.

5.7 Faedah Ahli

MAT dimaklumkan sejak Kad Kesetiaan IEM diperkenalkan pada tahun 2017, IEM telah berjaya mendaftar semakin ramai peniaga untuk memberikan faedah tambahan kepada para ahli. Selain memberikan diskaun kepada ahli IEM dalam pelbagai kategori seperti kenderaan (BMW, Mercedes-Benz, Volvo, Audi, dll.), restoran dan pakaian sukan, terdapat juga kategori penjagaan kesihatan seperti Institut Jantung Negara (IJN).

5.8 Acara di Cawangan IEM

Setiausaha Kehormat juga melaporkan Cawangan IEM iaitu Negeri Sembilan, Sarawak, Selatan dan Pulau Pinang berjaya mengadakan Majlis Makan Malam Tahunan mereka sebelum perlaksanaan PKP. Dilaporkan juga kempen Mengenai Kesedaran Denggi telah dianjurkan oleh Cawangan Melaka pada 23 Ogos 2019.

5.9 Kesan Pandemik Covid-19

MAT dimaklumkan tentang arahan yang dikeluarkan oleh Pendaftar Pertubuhan (ROS) pada 16 Mac 2020 di mana semua pertubuhan adalah dilarang untuk mengadakan sebarang aktiviti yang memerlukan perhimpunan ramai orang seperti perjumpaan dan aktiviti.

Jawatankuasa Ad-Hoc mengenai Covid-19 telah dibentuk untuk mengesan impak pandemik dan PKP terhadap IEM dan para ahli IEM. Ahli Jawatankuasa Ad-Hoc tersebut terdiri daripada Yang DiPertua, Timbalan Yang DiPertua, Timbalan Yang DiPertua yang akan datang, Setiausaha Kehormat dan Bendahari Kehormat serta tujuh (7) Naib Yang DiPertua.

Antara tindakan proaktif yang telah diambil oleh Jawatankuasa tersebut adalah berhubung dengan Pejabat Perdana Menteri, Kementerian Kewangan (MoF), Kementerian Perdagangan Antarabangsa dan Industri (MITI) dan Kementerian Kerja Raya (MoW) untuk memberi cadangan sebagai tindak balas kepada inisiatif Kerajaan. IEM juga menawarkan kepakaran ahli-ahli untuk membantu kerajaan sekiranya diperlukan.

Selain daripada itu, Yang DiPertua dan Timbalan Yang DiPertua IEM juga dijemput untuk menghadiri beberapa mesyuarat yang dianjurkan oleh Majlis Tindakan Ekonomi (EAC), Kementerian Industri dan Perdagangan Antarabangsa (MITI) dan Kementerian Kewangan (MoF).

IEM juga telah memberikan maklumbalas dan cadangan seperti berikut :

- EAC Risiko dan Cabaran yang Dihadapi oleh Profesional di Sektor Pembinaan kerana Pandemik Covid-19 pada 23 April 2020
- MITI i. Masalah yang Dihadapi oleh Perkhidmatan Profesional (PS) ketika memulakan Perniagaan pada 10 April dan 28 April 2020
 - ii. Pasca-PKP Langkah-langkah Pemulihan Ekonomi pada 13 dan 19 Mei 2020

MoF Pembangkitan Semula Ekonomi pada 28 Mei 2020

- i. Cadangan Penyediaan Rangka Strategi Rancangan Malaysia Ke Dua Belas (RM ke-12)
 - ii. Cadangan Isu Berkaitan Gubalan RUU Pelaksanaan Langkah Sementara untuk Mengurangkan Kesan COVID-19 pada 2 Jun 2020

Demi membantu IEM dalam penyediaan maklum balas mengenai keperluan ahli-ahli IEM, IEM juga telah melaksanakan tiga (3) tinjauan di kalangan ahli-ahli IEM. Jumlah responden yang telah memberi maklumbalas adalah seperti berikut:

- 1. Kesan Covid-19 pada Ahli IEM dikategorikan kepada Pekerja, Majikan dan Jurutera Bersara dari 5-9 April 2020 - seramai 801 responden
- 2. Kesan Covid-19 kepada Pelajar dari 30 April-7 Mei 2020 seramai 379 responden
- 3. Tinjauan Susulan mengenai Kesan MCO pada anggota IEM dikategorikan kepada Pekerja, Majikan dan Jurutera Bersara dari 22 Mei-7 Jun 2020 seramai 465 responden



5.10 Pekeliling IEM

Setiausaha Kehormat selanjutnya melaporkan setakat ini, IEM telah mengeluarkan tujuh (7) pekeliling untuk makluman ahli IEM. Pekeliling No. 8 dan Pekeliling No. 9 akan segera dikeluarkan tidak berapa lama lagi. Pekeliling-pekeliling ini boleh didapati di laman web IEM di www.myiem.org.my untuk maklumat ahli.

5.11 Norma Baru untuk IEM

MAT difahamkan bahawa IEM harus menyesuaikan diri dengan Norma Baru sejak penguatkuasaan Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP) kerana perjumpaan dan aktiviti fizikal tidak dibenarkan. Oleh itu, IEM harus segera membiasakan diri untuk bermesyuarat dan melakukan aktiviti secara maya.

Setiausaha Kehormat kemudian melaporkan bahawa IEM telah mendaftar sebanyak tiga (3) akaun atas talian untuk memenuhi keperluan bermesyuarat bagi Jawatankuasa dan Bahagian Teknikal IEM. MAT juga dimaklumkan bahawa mesyuarat Jawatankuasa Eksekutif yang diadakan pada 6 April 2020 akan menjadi sejarah IEM sebagai mesyuarat Jawantankuasa Eksekutif yang julung kali dilaksanakan secara maya.

5.12 Webinar IEM

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa disebabkan larangan dari ROS, IEM perlu mempertimbangkan untuk menukarkan mod pengendalian aktiviti-aktiviti ke platform maya. Webinar IEM yang pertama telah berjaya dilaksanakan pada 18 April 2020 oleh Jawatankuasa Kecil Pembangunan Kompetensi Kejuruteraan. Lebih daripada 300 orang ahli telah mendaftar untuk webinar ini tetapi atas kekangan akaun, hanya 100 peserta sahaja dapat diterima. IEM telah mengadakan 70 webinar dengan lebih dari 10,289 peserta di mana 40% adalah dari Lembah Klang dan kira-kira 1% dari luar negara. MAT dimaklumkan bahawa 43 webinar lain telah dikenalpasti. Dengan sambutan yang luar biasa dari ahli, IEM telah mendaftar untuk akaun yang berkapasiti lebih tinggi bagi membolehkan webinar IEM memenuhi bilangan 500 peserta.

Setiausaha Kehormat juga melaporkan dengan Pemulihan PKP yang diumumkan pada 7 Jun 2020 dan kelonggaran larangan oleh ROS, IEM akan cuba meneruskan aktiviti secara fizikal. IEM perlu mempertimbangkan keselamatan dan kesihatan ahli serta keperluan untuk penjarakkan sosial, maka IEM akan cuba menjalankan aktiviti secara hibrid. Ini juga bagi membolehkan ahli dari luar Lembah Klang untuk bersama mendapat manfaat dari pelbagai aktiviti yang diadakan di Ibu Pejabat.

5.13 Urusetia IEM

Setiausaha Kehormat seterusnya melaporkan MAT mengenai penubuhan Urusetia IEM yang terdiri daripada 39 kakitangan. Pada masa ini, terdapat enam (6) kakitangan di peringkat Pengurusan, 24 Eksekutif dan sembilan (9) Penolong Eksekutif.

5.13.1 Urusetia Yang Paling Lama Berkhidmat di IEM

Setiausaha Kehormat mengambil kesempatan untuk memaklumkan MAT bahawa terdapat beberapa kakitangan Urusetia IEM yang telah lama berkhidmat dengan IEM. Mereka adalah:

Beliau mengucapkan penghargaan kepada Urusetia IEM di atas sokongan dan bantuan mereka selama dua (2) tahun beliau berkhidmat sebagai Setiausaha Kehormat IEM.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan ribuan terima kasih kepada Setiausaha Kehormat di atas pembentangan laporannya dan terus menjemput sebarang pertanyaan dari para ahli. Yang DiPertua memaklumkan hanya lima (5) soalan yang akan diterima. Para ahli diminta untuk mengklik ikon 'RAISE HAND' dan Urusetia IT akan membenarkan para ahli untuk menaip soalan. Soalan tersebut akan dipaparkan di layar sebelum sebarang jawapan/tindak balas diberikan.

Bekas Yang DiPertua, Y.Bhg. Datuk Ir. Dr. Ow Chee Sheng yang menyertai MAT dari New Zealand memberi komen bahawa sukar untuk para hadirin untuk berucap kerana MAT dijalankan menggunakan webinar. Y.Bhg. Datuk memaklumkan bahawa ada antara badan antarabangsa yang menggunakan platform "GoToMeeting" yang membolehkan para hadirin untuk berucap dan mencadangkan agar IEM mencari platform dalam talian lain yang lebih mesra pengguna. Yang DiPertua mengambil maklum akan cadangan tersebut dan bersetuju untuk mencari lebih banyak pilihan bagi tujuan mesyuarat dalam talian akan datang.

Oleh kerana tiada lagi komen atau pertanyaan lebih lanjut melalui talian dan juga dari ahli Majlis di oditorium, Y.Bhg. Dato' Ahmad Murad bin Omar (F04741) mencadangkan agar Laporan Tahunan diterima. Usul tersebut disokong oleh Ir. Haidel Heli (F22455).

6.0 AKAUN BAGI TAHUN BERAKHIR 31 DISEMBER 2019

Yang DiPertua seterusnya kemudian menjemput Bendahari Kehormat, Ir. Chen Harn Shean bagi membentangkan penyata kewangan untuk Institusi Jurutera, Malaysia untuk tempoh 1 Januari 2019 hingga 31 Disember 2019. Ir. Chen Harn Shean memaklumkan akaun yang dikemukakan adalah dari muka surat 157 hingga 183.

6.1 Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa penyata kewangan yang dibentangkan terdiri daripada tiga (3) set iaitu IEM, IEM Training Center Sdn Bhd dan IEM Academy Sdn Bhd.

Penyata kewangan tersebut tidak termasuk akaun Cawangan.

MAT dimaklumkan bahawa fokus utama pembentangan adalah akaun IEM yang boleh dirujuk pada ruangan "Institusi".

- 6.2 Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan jumlah pendapatan untuk tahun 2019 adalah sekitar RM5,014,556. Angka tersebut terdiri dari pendapatan utama (RM3,841,273), Perkhidmatan Institusi (RM428,887) dan pendapatan sewa (RM744,396). Pendapatan keseluruhan telah menurun sebanyak 2% pada tahun 2019 berbanding tahun 2018.
- 6.3 Bendahari Kehormat selanjutnya melaporkan terdapat peningkatan sebanyak 6.9% pada jumlah yuran keahlian tahunan yang dikutip iaitu 91.2% pada tahun 2019 berbanding 88.8% pada tahun 2018.
- 6.4 Bendahari Kehormat melaporkan pendapatan sewa juga meningkat sebanyak 14% serta kenaikan 39% dalam faedah simpanan tetap. Walau bagaimanapun, perkhidmatan Institusi, pungutan timbang tara dan komisen kad kredit masing-masing telah menurun sebanyak 17%, 76% dan 11% masing-masing.
- 6.5 Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya memaklumkan jumlah perbelanjaan untuk tahun 2019 adalah sebanyak RM5,170,734, penurunan sebanyak 15% berbanding tahun 2018 iaitu RM6,081,431. Penyumbang utama kepada penurunan perbelanjaan adalah dari emolumen urusetia yang menurun sebanyak 19%, aktiviti 'intersociety' (13%), perbelanjaan pentadbiran (11%), penyelenggaraan bangunan (7.2%) dan perbelanjaan kewangan (1%). Namun dilaporkan subsidi Cawangan telah meningkat sebanyak 8% berdasarkan peningkatan yuran keahlian tahunan yang telah diterima.

MAT dimaklumkan pada tahun 2020, Cawangan di Semenanjung akan diberi kenaikan subsidi dari 20% ke 30% sedangkan subsidi untuk Cawangan Malaysia Timur akan dikekalkan pada 40%. Ini adalah untuk memberi dorongan kepada Cawangan untuk memberikan perkhidmatan yang lebih baik kepada ahli di negeri masing-masing.

6.6 Bendahari Kehormat seterusnya melaporkan prestasi keseluruhan bagi Institusi adalah defisit sebanyak RM212,933 pada tahun 2019 berbanding RM1,021,277 untuk tahun 2018. Ini dianggap sebagai peningkatan yang besar berbanding tahun 2018.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Bendahari Kehormat di atas pembentangan beliau dan terus membuka ruang untuk sebarang pertanyaan dari para ahli. Ahli yang hadir di dalam talian diminta mengklik ikon "RAISE HAND" sekiranya mereka ingin mengemukakan sebarang pertanyaan.

Sementara menunggu pertanyaan diajukan, Yang DiPertua memaklumkan MAT bahawa Bekas Yang DiPertua turut hadir bersama di dalam talian dan mereka adalah Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Datuk Ir. (Dr.) Hj. Ahmad Zaidee Laidin, Y.Bhg. Datuk Ir. Dr Ow Chee Sheng, Ir. Choo Kok Beng, Ir. Vincent Chen Kim Kieong dan Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Dr. Gue See Sew.



6.7 Sesi Soal Jawan - Akaun

6.7.1 Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) memaklumkan semasa MAT yang terdahulu, beliau telah mengemukakan pertanyaan mengenai "Trade and non-Trade Receivables" dan menyatakan bahawa kutipan telah meningkat dengan baik dibandingkan tahun lalu. YBhg. Dato' kemudian mengucapkan tahniah kepada IEM di atas pencapaian ini.

Walau bagaimanapun, Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) memaklumkan "Trade and Non-Trade Payables" telah meningkat dua kali ganda. Ini dipetik di mukasurat 172 didalam Laporan Tahunan. Untuk tahun 2019, perkara tersebut merekodkan RM1,305,323 berbanding RM752,682 untuk tahun 2018.

Bendahari Kehormat menjelaskan peningkatan besar tersebut disebabkan oleh pendapatan dan perbelanjaan WTC2020 yang hanya dapat di ambilkira dalam akaun pada tahun 2020. Ini disebabkan persidangan tersebut akan diadakan pada tahun 2020. Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276) mencadangkan agar perinciannya direkodkan.

Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan pada tahun 2019, terdapat peningkatan kutipan tunggakan yuran tahunan yang berjumlah RM448,789 berbanding tahun sebelumnya iaitu RM372,050. Walau bagaimanapun, MAT dimaklumkan pendapatan dari aktiviti telah berkurangan dan berharap lebih banyak acara akan dianjurkan pada tahun 2021.

6.7.2 Ir. Loo Chee Kin (M15863) mengajukan soalan mengenai penurunan pendapatan dari Bahagian Teknikal (TD) di mukasurat 178. Beliau bertanya tentang tindakan yang akan diambil oleh IEM untuk meningkatkan publisiti untuk aktiviti yang dianjurkan oleh TD dan Kumpulan Minat Khas (SIG). Ir. Loo Chee Kin (M15863) juga menyarankan agar IEM mengadakan lebih banyak Memorandum Persefahaman (MoU) dengan organisasi lain.

Yang DiPertua mengucapkan terima kasih kepada Ir. Loo dan memberitahu IEM akan terus meningkatkan aktiviti yang diatur termasuk menjalankan aktiviti melalui platform dalam talian.

6.7.3 Ir. Sivalingam a/l Veluppillai (F09546) bertanya tentang perbezaan antara emolumen kakitangan dan perbelanjaan pentadbiran. Yang DiPertua menjelaskan emolumen kakitangan adalah gaji pekerja yang merupakan sebahagian daipada perbelanjaan seperti yang dinyatakan di mukasurat 174. Yang DiPertua memaklumkan emolumen pekerja telah menurun sebanyak 19% berbanding tahun lalu.

Oleh kerana tiada lagi pertanyaan lanjut dari dalam talian dan juga di oditorium, Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) mencadangkan Penyata Kewangan untuk IEM untuk tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2019 diterima. Usul tersebut disokong oleh Ir. Mohd Aman bin Hj. Idris (F02176). MAT seterusnya menerima Laporan Kewangan tersebut.

7.0 LAPORAN KEWANGAN DANA PENDIDIKAN – 31 DECEMBER 2018

Bendahari Kehormat kemudian melaporkan Penyata Kewangan Dana Pendidikan untuk tahun yang berakhir pada 31 Disember 2019 dari mukasurat 194 hingga 204.

- 7.1 MAT dimaklumkan sumbangan yang diterima adalah berjumlah RM113,123 pada tahun 2019 berbanding RM49,810 pada tahun 2018. Ini disebabkan sumbangan sebayank RM50,000 oleh Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Geoteknik untuk menubuhkan Biasiswa Peringatan TT Chiam.
- 7.2 Faedah Deposit Tetap yang diperolehi pada tahun 2019 adalah RM48,682 dengan sedikit peningkatan berbanding tahun 2018 iaitu RM43,234.
- 7.3 Bendahari Kehormat selanjutnya melaporkan biasiswa yang diberikan pada tahun 2019 adalah RM42,000. Beliau seterusnya memaklumkan MAT bahawa biasiswa Yang DiPertua bersama dengan Biasiswa Peringatan Tan Sri Prof. Chin Fung Kee dan Biasiswa Ir. Thean Lip Thong telahpun diiklankan.

Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan MAT bahawa Biasiswa Ir.Thean Lip Thong adalah untuk pelajar dari Universiti Malaya sedangkan Biasiswa Peringatan Tan Sri Prof. Chin Fung Kee adalah untuk universiti lain.

- 7.4 Bendahari Kehormat selanjutnya melaporkan defisit keseluruhan adalah RM20,721 berbanding RM60,198 pada tahun 2018. Ini mematuhi Peraturan Perbelanjaan 50% Lembaga Hasil Dalam Negeri (LHDN) untuk Akaun Pengecualian Cukai.
- 7.5 Ir. Simon Yeong Chin Chow (F18660) mengulas tiada angka yang dinyatakan di bawah item "Non-trade receivables" untuk tahun 2019 di mukasurat 194. Bendahari Kehormat menyatakan ia kesalahan yang dibuat oleh juruaudit dan akan diperbaiki. Perkara tersebut telah dijelaskan oleh Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Andy Seo Kian Haw (F13276). Beliau menyatakan bahawa terdapat angka pada perkara tersebut di mukasurat 195. MAT dimaklumkan juruaudit tersebut akan digantikan dengan juruaudit yang baharu.



- 7.6 Ir. Simon Yeong Chin Chow (F18660) juga bertanya mengenai apakah jenis aktiviti IEM yang dinyatakan di bawah tajuk perbelanjaan untuk tahun 2019 yang berjumlah RM86,445. Bendahari Kehormat memaklumkan aktiviti tersebut merangkumi seminar dan kursus. Cawangan juga boleh membuat permohonan kepada Ibu Pejabat sekiranya mereka memerlukan peruntukan dari Dana Pendidikan. Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) bagaimanapun mengingatkan MAT bahawa ia dalah peruntukan dari Tabung Pendidikan dan sebarang permintaan harus berkaitan dengan pendidikan seperti menyokong pelajar kejuruteraan.
- 7.7 Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) mengajukan soalan bagaimana IEM menangani sumbangan sebanyak RM50,000 yang disumbangkan oleh Bahagian Teknikal Kejuruteraan Geoteknik kerana IEM harus mematuhi garis panduan pengecualian cukai di mana sebanyak 50% daripada sumbangan yang diterima perlu digunakan pada tahun seterusnya.

Timbalan Yang DiPertua, Ir. Ong Ching Loon (F11938) menjelaskan untuk mematuhi pengecualian cukai, IEM harus memastikan bahawa wang tersebut akan dibelanjakan untuk aktiviti yang berkaitan dengan pendidikan.

7.8 Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) mencadangkan agar IEM berbincang dengan LHDN kerana ini adalah dana pusingan. Sekiranya IEM membelanjakan kurang dari 50% dalam tahun berikutnya, apakah akibatnya dan adakah LHDN mempunyai peruntukan mengenai hal ini.

Merujuk kepada soalan yang diajukan oleh Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691), Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik (HF09157) menekankan bahawa 50% yang perlu dibelanjakan adalah untuk sumbangan yang diterima pada tahun sebelumnya. Yang DiPertua juga memaklumkan IEM menerima sumbangan menjelang akhir tahun dan 50% wang tidak dapat dibelanjakan.

Oleh kerana tiada lagi pertanyaan dari para ahli, Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai (F18343) mencadangkan Penyata Kewangan Tabung Pendidikan untuk tahun berakhir 31 Disember 2019 diterima dan usul tersebut disokong oleh Ir. Sreedaran a/l Raman (M38681). MAT kemudian menerima Penyata Kewangan Tabung Pendidikan.

8.0 CADANGAN PINDAAN KEPADA PERLEMBAGAAN DAN UNDANG-UNDANG

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan MAT cadangan pindaan tersebut dibentangkan pada muka surat 6 hingga 8. Yang DiPertua selanjutnya menerangkan persetujuan pindaan oleh MAT akan dilakukan melalui "e-voting". Ahli diminta untuk memastikan bahawa mereka mempunyai ID Pengguna dan Kata Laluan sewaktu menerima SMS.

Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput Ir. Lai Sze Ching untuk membaca satu persatu artikel yang mana semua komen telah dibahaskan semasa MAT yang lepas. Artikel berikut adalah :

8.1 <u>KEAHLIAN ARTIKEL II</u>

Artikel 2.2

Pindaan adalah mengenai pertukaran nama dari "Companion" kepada Ahli "Senior Graduate" dan memasukkan empat (4) gred keahlian baru:

(ea) Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan (eb) Ahli Siswazah Teknologi Kejuruteraan (ec) Ahli Juruteknik Kejuruteraan (ed) Ahli Siswazah Juruteknik Kejuruteraan

8.2 <u>Artikel 205</u>

Pindaan perlu dilakukan untuk keahlian baru yang disebutkan di atas:

Ahli Siswazah Senior S.Grad.I.E.M. Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan E.T.I.E.M. Ahli Siswazah Teknologi Kejuruteraan Grad. E.T.I.E.M. Ahli Juruteknik Kejuruteraan E.Tn.I.E.M. Ahli Siswazah Juruteknik Kejuruteraan Grad. E.Tn.I.E.M.

8.3 <u>Artikel 2.14</u>

Pindaan tersebut adalah untuk menukar nama gred keahlian dari "Companion" ke Ahli "Senior Graduate". Sebagai tambahan, Artikel baru berikut telah disisipkan:

2.15A Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan

Seseorang yang mempunyai pencapaian pendidikan dan latihan amali yang selaras dengan keperluan dalam Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang Kecil Institusi



2.15B Ahli Siswazah Teknologi Kejuruteraan

Ahli Siswazah Teknologi Kejuruteraan adalah seseorang yang dari segi umur, pencapaian pendidikan dan latihan amali, mematuhi keperluan dalam Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang Kecil Institusi

2.15C Ahli Juruteknik Kejuruteraan 2.15C

Ahli Juruteknik Kejuruteraan adalah seseorang yang mempunyai pencapaian pendidikan dan Latihan amali yang selaras dengan keperluan dalam Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang Kecil Institusi

2.15D Ahli Siswazah Juruteknik Kejuruteraan

Ahli Siswazah Juruteknik Kejuruteraan adalah seseorang yang dari segi umur, pencapaian pendidikan dan latihan amali, mematuhi keperluan dalam Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang Kecil Institusi

8.4 ARTIKEL IV PUNCA PENDAPATAN

Artikel 4.1 - Bayaran dan Yuran Pindahan

Pindaan tersebut dilakukan terhadap pertukaran nama dari "Companion" menjadi Ahli "Senior Graduate".

Yuran berikut adalah:

MAT dimaklumkan perkataan tambahan telah disisipkan (dalam huruf miring dan tebal) seperti berikut:

"Institusi ini dibenarkan untuk terlibat dalam kegiatan ekonomi seperti menjual, membeli, melabur, menyewa, memiliki aset alih atau tetap serta aktiviti ekonomi lain seperti menubuhkan syarikat di bawah Akta Syarikat 2016, *menjalankan atau menganjurkan aktiviti latihan bersama sebagai pusat latihan, pameran, persidangan dll.*

8.7 <u>Artikel 5.1</u>

MAT dimaklumkan pindaan seperti berikut:

- k) Lima (5) Ahli "Senior Graduate" atau Ahli Siswazah, seperti yang dinyatakan dalam Undang-undang Kecil,
- I) Seorang (1) Ahli Wanita seperti yang ditetapkan dalam Undang-undang Kecil,
- m) Seorang (1) Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan, sebagaimana ditentukan dalam Undang-Undang Kecil,
- n) Seorang (1) Ahli Juruteknik Kejuruteraan, seperti yang ditentukan dalam Undang-undang Kecil.



8.8 <u>Artikel 5.2</u>

MAT dimaklumkan tiada pindaan pada artikel tersebut kecuali untuk menyelaraskan nombor artikel tersebut:

- (b) Naib Yang DiPertua akan memegang jawatan selama dua (2) penggal dan boleh dipilih semula tetapi tidak boleh memegang jawatan lebih dari dua (2) penggal berturut-turut.
- (b) (a) Setiausaha Kehormat dan Bendahari Kehormat akan memegang jawatan selama satu (1) penggal. Mereka mungkin dipilih semula, tetapi mungkin tidak memegang jawatan lebih dari dua (2) penggal berturut-turut.

(c) Seorang Ahli Majlis akan memegang jawatan.... (c) Ketua setiap Cawangan Institusi....

8.9 <u>Artikel 5.4</u>

MAT dimaklumkan mengenai penyisipan item nombor 5.1 (m) dan 5.1 (n) serta mengeluarkan perkataan "dan" pada Artikel 5.4 tersebut sebagai berikut:

Naib Yang DiPertua, Setiausaha Kehormat dan Bendahari Kehormat dan Ahli Majlis kecuali yang di bawah Artikel 5.1 (k), dan 5.1 (l), 5.1 (m) dan 5.1 (n), akan dipilih dari kalangan Ahli Korporat melalui undian rahsiayang termaktub dalam Perlembagaan dan Undang-undang kecil serta Peraturan di bawahnya.

Ahli-ahli Majlis di bawah Artikel 5.1 (k), dan 5.1 (l), 5.1 (m) dan 5.1 (n), harus dilantik dengan cara yang ditentukan dalam Undang-undang kecil.

8.10 <u>Artikel 5.7</u>

Timbalan Yang DiPertua hanya akan dipilih oleh Ahli Korporat dikalangan Ahli Majlis yang telah atau pernah berkhidmat sebagai Naib Yang DiPertua.

8.11 <u>Artikel 5.11</u>

Penyisipan perenggan baru setelah perenggan pertama adalah seperti berikut:

Di dalam Artikel, "Pegawai" bermaksud anggota Majlis atau Jawatankuasa Eksekutif atau Jawatankuasa Tetap.

8.12 <u>Artikel 5.14</u>

MAT dimaklumkan mengenai pindaan perkara berikut:

- h) Seorang (1) "Companion" Ahli "Senior Graduate" atau Ahli Siswazah yang dilantik oleh Jawatankuasa Cawangan
- i) Seorang (1) Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan yang dilantik oleh Jawatankuasa Cawangan
- *j)* Seorang (1) Ahli Juruteknik Kejuruteraan yang dilantik oleh Jawatankuasa Cawangan

8.13 ARTIKEL X TAKSIRAN

<u>Artikel 10.9</u>

MAT maklum di atas pertukaran nama pada gred keahlian untuk "Companion" serta empat (4) gred baru seperti berikut:

"Ahli Bukan Korporat" bermaksud Felo Terhormat, Felo Kehormat dan Ahli Kehormat yang bukan jurutera dan Ahli Siswazah, Ahli "Senior Graduate", Ahli Teknologi Kejuruteraan, Ahli Siswazah Teknologi Kejuruteraan, Ahli Juruteknik Kejuruteraan, Ahli Siswazah Juruteknik Kejuruteraan, Ahli yang Diperbadankan, Ahli Gabungan, Ahli Bersekutu atau Ahli Pelajar.

Secara kesimpulannya, Ir. Lai Sze Ching memaklumkan MAT tiada pindaan besar berlaku hanya terdapat perubahan kecil terutamanya penamaan semula gred keahlian "Companion" kepada Ahli "Senior Graduate" dan memasukkan empat (4) gred keahlian baharu.

Yang DiPertua setelah mendapat persetujuan MAT memaklumkan pindaan yang dicadangkan juga akan melalui proses undian melalui pos dimana majoriti 2/3 diperlukan sebagai persetujuan terhadap pindaan artikel tersebut.



8.14 Sesi Soalan - Pindaan Perlembagaan

Yang DiPertua seterusnya membuka sesi pertanyaan dari para ahli mengenai pindaan sebelum meneruskan proses pengundian.

8.14.1 Ir. Gunasagaran a/l Kristnan (F08216) memberi komen Artikel 2.2, 2.5 dan 2.14 dan merujuk pada Artikel 4.1, beliau merasakan perkataan *"……Ahli Bukan Korporat dalam apa-apa gred……"* adalah bertentangan. Beliau selanjutnya mengulas terdapat tiga belas (13) gred keahlian secara keseluruhan tetapi hanya sembilan (9) gred keahlian yang boleh dikira sebagai keahlian bukan korporat.

Ir. Lai Sze Ching (F04687) menjelaskan tiada pindaan yang dibuat pada Artikel 4.1 kerana ia adalah Artikel yang sedia ada. Beliau menjelaskan bahawa hanya bayaran kemasukan yang disisipkan. Beliau seterusnya mencadangkan sekiranya Ir. Gunasagaran Kristnan ingin mengulas lebih lanjut mengenai Artikel tersebut, beliau boleh berbuat demikian semasa pindaan Perlembagaan IEM yang seterusnya. Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa pindaan ini telah disetujui oleh Majlis.

- 8.14.2 Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) seterusnya dijemput untuk mengemukakan soalannya kepada MAT.
- 8.14.2.1 *i)* Mengapa perlu meminda Perlembagaan?

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan pindaan itu dilakukan kerana IEM ingin memasukkan beberapa kategori keahlian baru dan juga menyelesaikan beberapa artikel untuk lebih jelas.

8.14.2.2 *ii)* Dengan pengenalan empat (4) gred keahlian baru ini, ia merupakan keperluan bagi IEM untuk mempromosi keahlian tersebut dan memberi faedah bagi kumpulan ahli tersebut.

Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) mengulas terdapat Institusi lain juga memenuhi keperluan kumpulan ini dan menyarankan agar IEM dapat bekerjasama dengan mereka berbanding dengan kemasukan kumpulan-kumpulan ini untuk menyertai IEM.

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan terdapat tiga (3) Institusi yang mempunyai gred sedemikian iaitu Lembaga Teknologi Malaysia (MBOT), Persatuan Kejuruteraan dan Teknologi Malaysia (MySet) dan IEM. MAT dimaklumkan IEM telah memilih untuk memperkenalkan gred keahlian baru agar lebih inklusif apatah lagi IEM kini sedang berusaha untuk menyediakan jalan bagi para teknologi untuk menjadi jurutera. Di samping itu, IEM perlu memandang ke hadapan kerana akan ada lebih ramai teknologis dan juruteknik yang graduat pada masa akan datang. Ini bagi membolehkanIEM merangkumi keseluruhan industri kejuruteraan.

8.14.2.3 *iii) Kesalahan tatabahasa dalam Artikel yang perlu diperbetulkan*

Yang DiPertua bersetuju terdapat kesalahan yang perlu diperbaiki sebelum dihantar pada ROS.

- 8.14.2.4 *i)* Gelaran harus diberikan kepada Ahli sahaja dan bukan gred keahlian yang lain
 - ii) Singkatannya harus tanpa tanda titik misalnya; Ahli Kanan SMIEM dan bukan S.M.I.E.M seperti yang dinyatakan dalam Perlembagaan

Yang DiPertua menjelaskan tiada perubahan pada singkatan nama dalam Perlembagaan. Sekiranya Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) ingin membuat perubahan, beliau perlu menulis dan mencadangkan kepada IEM untuk mengubah artikel tersebut dalam Perlembagaan.

Y.Bhg. Ahli Akademik Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik's (HF09157) mengulangi penjelasan dari Yang DiPertua bahawa pindaan tersebut telah disetujui secara prinsip pada MAT yang lepas. Pada MAT yang lalu, Majlis dan Jawatankuasa Eksekutif telah diminta untuk meneliti perkataan-perkataan dalam pemindahan tersebut sahaja. MAT bersetuju untuk menerima perkataan tersebut dan seterusnya memilih untuk meminda Perlembagaan.

Yang DiPertua kemudian membaca soalan yang diajukan oleh Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) seperti berikut:

8.14.2.5 Apakah perbezaan antara 2.15B dan 2.15D?

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan untuk 2.15B, mereka adalah lepasan program teknologi kejuruteraan sedangkan untuk 2.15D, mereka adalah lepasan program diploma kejuruteraan.

8.14.2.6 Ir. Dr. Tan Yean Chin (F11712) menambah disebabkan pindaan tersebut telah dipersetujui secara prinsip pada MAT yang lepas, Majlis dan Jawatankuasa Eksekutif telah meminda dengan wajarnya. Beliau juga menyarankan MAT agar meneruskan dengan proses pengundian. Beliau turut menyarankan sekiranya ada ahli yang ingin memilih untuk menentang pindaan tersebut, ahli tersebut mempunyai kebebasan melakukannya semasa proses pengundian.

Yang DiPertua juga bersetuju dengan cadangan Ir. Dr. Tan Yean Chin (F11712) untuk meneruskan proses pengundian.



8.14.2.7 Walau bagaimanapun, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah (HF01691) menyarankan ada keperluan untuk melihat penguasaan bahasa Inggeris atau kesalahan tatabahasa seperti yang ditunjukkan sebelumnya oleh Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942). MAT mencatat kesilapan untuk Artikel 4.1 (b) (ii) (i) sepatutnya adalah ".... yang **pernah** menjadi Ahli Bersekutu....".

MAT menyatakan ia akan diperbaiki sebelum pindaan tersebut dihantar untuk proses pengundian melalui pos.

Seterusnya Pengerusi Majlis memberi penjelasan langkah demi langkah untuk pelaksanaan "e-voting" melalui telefon bimbit. 25 minit akan diperuntukkan untuk pelaksanaan pngundian ini.

Sementara menunggu hasil "e-voting" pindaan Perlembagaan, Yang DiPertua menjawab pertanyaan yang diajukan oleh ahli lain:

8.14.2.8 Ir. Gan Ting Wei (M16465) mencadangkan untuk mengadakan ceramah secara fizikal untuk menggantikan ceramah secara atas talian.

Yang DiPertua menyatakan IEM akan terus mengatur lebih banyak webinar secara atas talian untuk kepentingan para ahli. Beliau juga memberitahu mungkin ada sebilangan penceramah yang tidak selesa untuk menyampaikan ceramah melalui webinar. Untuk kes seperti itu, IEM akan berusaha meminta persetujuan mereka agar rakaman tersebut dimainkan secara dalam talian atau dihantar kepada Cawangan untuk mereka mengatur aktiviti yang sama tanpa penceramah perlu hadir secara langsung. Seorang pengantara akan dilantik oleh Cawangan untuk menangani sesi soal jawab sekiranya ada.

8.14.2.9 Ir. S. Jagathisen (M05107) bertanya bagaimana Ahli Korporat yang telah bersara dapat memberi perkhidmatan kepada Institusi. Beliau selanjutnya memberitahu beliau ada mengajukan pertanyaan yang sama dua (2) tahun yang lalu namun tidak mendapat jawapan.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan bahawa ahli yang telah bersara boleh menjadi sukarelawan untuk berkhidmat di Bahagian Teknikal IEM. Jika terdapat masalah teknikal atau masalah dari organisasi luar, ia akan merujuk Bahagian Teknikal yang bersesuaian. Di samping itu juga ahli yang telah bersara boleh menjadi sukarelawan untuk memberi ceramah mengenai bidang kepakaran mereka untuk kepentingan ahli yang lain terutamanya jurutera muda. Ini dapat dilakukan sekiranya mereka berkhidmat di Bahagian Teknikal.

8.14.2.10 Ling Yang Ming (M78075)

Adakah IEM akan mempertimbangkan untuk mengadakan seminar atau mesyuarat secara maya selepas PKP? Saya menyesyorkan inovatif ini diteruskan. Saya berharap agar dipertimbangkan untuk mewujudkan Aplikasi IEM untuk perkhidmatan yang lebih baik.

Yang DiPertua memberitahu Bahagian Teknikal IEM sedang merancang beberapa seminar untuk diatur secara maya dan para ahli akan dimaklumkan. Di samping itu, IEM sedang berusaha menghasilkan Aplikasi Mudah Alih sebelum PKP dan perbincangan sedang dijalankan dengan pembekal. Yang DiPertua selanjutnya memberitahu lebih banyak maklumat mengenai Aplikasi Mudah Alih IEM akan dibentangkan dalam ucapan Yang DiPertua akan datang.

8.14.2.11 Mohd Khairul Anwar bin Mohd Hatta (M102455)

Melihat kepada keadaan ekonomi pasca Covid-19, apakah strategi utama yang perlu digunapakai oleh syarikat kejuruteraan / pembinaan untuk terus berdaya saing dalam pasaran yang sentiasa berkembang dan mencabar?

Yang DiPertua menyatakan sebagai seorang jurutera yang serba boleh terserah kepada mereka untuk memutuskan apa yang terbaik pada masa yang mencabar ini.

8.14.2.12 *Chan Khung Leong (G22094)*

Bolehkah sekiranya saya menambahkan "Ts. dan P.Tech (Teknologis Profesional) yang diberikan oleh Lembaga Ahli Teknologi Malaysia ke direktori IEM? Terima kasih.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan ahli boleh menulis surat ke Ibu Pejabat IEM dan memberikan dokumen yang lengkap sebagai bukti untuk menambahkan gelaran "Ts" ke dalam pangkalan data IEM.

8.14.2.13 *Ooi Zi Xun (M45549)*

Apakah sumbangan / cadangan IEM kepada kerajaan mengenai pemulihan PKP untuk syarikat perundingan kejuruteraan dan industri pembinaan?

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan isu ini telah dibentangkan oleh Setiausaha Kehormat di dalam pembentangannya sebentar tadi.



8.14.2.14 Hazlee Azil Illias (M52562)

Visi IEM - "Institusi Jurutera, Malaysia bertujuan untuk menjadi organisasi profesional yang utama dan terpenting bagi Malaysia untuk mencapai Wawasan 2020." Namun, sekarang sudah menjelang tahun 2020. IEM harus mengkaji semula untuk melihat sama ada mencapai visinya ataupun tidak.

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan untuk Sesi 2020/2021 yang baru, IEM akan mengkaji semula Pelan Strategiknya dan akan membuat rumusan samada IEM telah mencapai misi tersebut mahupun tidak.

Beliau menjelaskan dengan lebih lanjut bahawa IEM telah beralih ke Visi baru seperti yang dipaparkan di mukasurat 3 Laporan Tahunan.

8.14.2.15 Ho Choon Kwang William (M17178)

i) Bagaimana sistem pengundian bagi ahli yang hadir?

Yang DiPertua memaklumkan seperti yang ditunjukkan dalam e-mel kepada ahli, SMS akan dihantar kepada semua ahli yang menghadiri MAT. Pautan akan diberikan kepada ahli untuk masuk ke laman web di mana ahli perlu log masuk untuk mengundi. Kod sekuriti juga akan diberikan di dalam SMS. Ahli hanya perlu memasukkan kod sekuriti dan kemudian membuat undian.

ii) Adakah CPD diberikan untuk kehadiran penuh?

CPD untuk kehadiran AGM adalah 2.

iii) Bagaimana dengan makan malam tahunan?

Yang DiPertua memberitahu memandangkan pandemic Covid-19, Majlis Makan Malam Tahunan IEM untuk tahun 2020 telah dibatalkan.

- 8.14.2.16 Yang DiPertua kemudian membacakan soalan tambahan yang diterima dari seorang ahli mengenai pindaan Peraturan Cawangan. Yang DiPertua memaklumkan pindaan terhadap Peraturan Cawangan telah diperbaiki dan akan dihantar ke Cawangan masing-masing.
- 8.14.2.17 Ir. Cader Mohideen Mohamed Aboobucker (M13942) juga mengulas pernyataan Misi dan Visi. Beliau selanjutnya mengatakan pernyataan itu sangat umum dan menyoal bagaimana Jawatankuasa Tetap mentafsirkan misi dan objektif ini bagi mencapai kemajuan.

Yang Dipertua memaklumkan Yang DiPertua yang bakal dilantik ini akan membentuk sebuah Jawatankuasa untuk mengkaji peningkatan Pelan Strategik Institusi.

Yang DiPertua kemudian menjemput Pegawai Pemilihan, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah untuk mengumumkan keputusan pemilihan untuk sesi 2020/2021. Sebelum mengumumkan keputusan, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah meminta MAT untuk bertafakur selama satu minit bagi mengenang mendiang Y.Bhg. Dato' Pang Leong Hoon yang meninggal dunia pada bulan Julai 2019.

Setelah selesai bertafakur, Y.Bhg. Dato' Paduka Hj. Ir. Prof. (Dr.) Keizrul Abdullah terus memberi penghormatan kepada mendiang Y.Bhg. Dato' Pang Leong Hoon yang pertama kali dilantik sebagai Pegawai Pemilihan untuk pemilihan Majlis 1994/95 dan telah berkhidmat untuk 25 penggal yang merangkumi 40% daripada sejarah 61 tahun IEM.

Pembentangan keputusan pemilihan oleh mendiang Dato' Ir. Pang Leong Hoon menjadi salah satu segmen MAT yang dinanti oleh semua ahli dan pastinya mendiang akan dirindui.

9.1 Yang DiPertua



3. THE COUNCIL AND THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- 3.1 Four Council and ten monthly Executive Committee (Excomm) meetings were held during the session to look into the management of the properties and affairs of the Institution.
- 3.2 Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the government imposing Movement Control Orders (MCO/CMCO/RMCO) since March 2020, Council and Excomm meetings had to be held via virtual or hybrid mode. Due to the MCO imposed for the second time at the beginning of 2021, the 424th Council meeting was held fully virtual for the first time in IEM's history on 18 January 2021.
- 3.3 I wish to thank all members of the Council, Executive Committee, Standing Committees, Branches, Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups, Sections, Sub Committees, Ad Hoc Committees and other Committees for their participation, contribution and support in the activities of the Institution in the furtherance of its objective to promote the science and profession of engineering in the spirit of a learned society. Various initiatives were carried out to ensure that IEM's operations and service to members continue with minimum interruptions during the last session despite the imposition of the movement control orders.
- 3.4 I must also express a vote of thanks to the various members who may not have served on the above Committees, but voluntarily served as IEM representatives to the various government bodies and organisations.

4. STANDING COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

4.1 The role of the Standing Committee chaired by the Deputy President, Ir. Prof. Dr. Norlida binti Buniyamin is to conduct the financial management of the properties and affairs of the IEM. Regular meetings were held every 3rd Thursday of the month.



4.2 Main Sources of Income

4.2.1 Annual Subscription

Financing of the operating expenditure of the Institution continue to depend largely on the collection of members' annual subscriptions. For the year 2020, income from annual subscriptions stood at approximately 65.8% of the total income compared to 70% in 2019, 65% in 2018, 51% in 2017 and 57% in 2016.

In accordance with the Bylaws, reminders to members on their annual subscription payments were sent out by the Institution. For the year 2020, 87.1% of the members had settled their subscriptions by the end of the year. IEM wish to thank all members who had promptly settled their subscriptions.

As at the end of the financial year 2020, 3,401 members are in arrears of subscription for 2020 compared to 2,304 in 2019. The total outstanding collection for the year amounted to RM434,686 compared to RM301,645 in 2019. IEM would like to appeal to these members to settle the arrears as soon as possible.

4.2.2 Rental

As reported at the last AGM, Merdeka Strategic Development Centre Sdn Bhd took up tenancy of the first and second fioor of Wisma IEM with a two-year tenancy commencing February 2019 with an option to renew for another two years. Another new tenant, EJAB Engineering took up tenancy of approximately 1,000sf of space since December 2020 for a period of three years.

The ground floor of Bangunan Ingenieur continue to be rented out to Pizza Hut at a monthly rental of RM15,995.30. Pizza Hut's tenancy was renewed in November 2020 for another three years.

4.2.3 Activities Income

In view of the imposition of the various movement control orders and SOPs related to physical distancing and restriction on physical events, IEM embarked on conducting events or activities for members virtually. Free webinars were held for IEM members from April to July 2020. Thereafter, a token charge was imposed to ensure that registered members really participate in the webinars as there was limited capacity. There was overwhelming response from IEM members.

Despite having to resort to organizing activities online for members, the Technical Divisions generated income of RM181,583 for the period from August to December 2020. For the year 2019, income generated by the Technical Divisions was RM318,845. The Standing Committee on Finance wish to thank the Technical Divisions for their efforts.

4.2.4 Diversification of Income Streams

In an effort to reduce IEM's dependency on annual subscriptions, IEM had confirmed collaboration with CIS Network Sdn Bhd to organize an annual exhibition named ENGINEER. This exhibition will be held in conjunction with an annual convention named IEM CONVENTION.

This 5-year partnership will bring a confirmed annual income of at least RM200,000 to IEM. The Standing Committee would greatly appreciate support from all IEM members for the Convention scheduled from 9th to 11th September 2021 at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre.

4.3 Administrative Expenses

In order to control expenses and at the same time, provide adequate services to members, the Standing Committee implements strict but effective budgetary control measures. In view of the increase in operating costs and the drop in income due to the economic situation, various costs control measures were implemented to ensure that operating costs are controlled within the limited funds of the Institution while at the same time ensuring that services to members are not impaired.

In 2020, Pos Malaysia announced increase in postage charges by 100% which would result in high administrative costs for posting of the monthly Bulletin to IEM members. In view of the increase in postage and the movement control orders hampering the printing of the hard copy Bulletin, IEM moved to circulating the e-Jurutera with effect from April 2020. The e-Jurutera and e-Journal is sent to members via email blast. Members can opt to read the publication via a flipbook programme or download the publication for retention.

4.4 Sub Committee on Human Resources

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Secretary, Ir. Dr. David Chuah Joon Huang looked into the recruitment and deployment of staff for the Secretariat. Meetings were regularly held to deal with matters relating to Human Resource of Secretariat. As at 31 December 2020, the Secretariat's staff strength 41 including three staff under the International Office that is financed by AER, FEIAP and APEC Engineers Register.



4.5 Sub Committee on IEM Infrastructure

The Sub Committee chaired by the Honorary Treasurer, Ir. Chen Harn Shean continued to monitor the maintenance and renovation of Bangunan Ingenieur and Wisma IEM. The function of the Sub Committee also covered managing the usage of the meeting rooms, security system of IEM, fire protection, electrical installations, ICT computerisation and networking, general facilities, etc. For the year 2020, the Sub Committee looked into setting up of facilities to enable IEM to conduct webinars and virtual meetings.

The Standing Committee acknowledges that there are still some shortcomings to the facilities and will continue to look into further improvement within the constraints of the Institution's finance.

4.6 Sub Committee on IEM IT Infrastructure

Ir. Guansagaran a/l Kristnan was appointed to chair this Sub Committee that is tasked to look into the IT Infrastructure of IEM. The Sub Committee is now reviewing the contract of the vendor for IEM portal as well as preparing a road map to move the IEM portal to cloud.

5. STANDING COMMITTEE ON ADMISSIONS AND PRACTICAL TRAINING

- 5.1 Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai was appointed as the new Chairman for the Standing Committee for the session 2020/2021. The main role of this Standing Committee was to scrutinise applications for candidates applying for election/admission/transfer to the various grades of membership. This Standing Committee also worked closely with the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualifications in organising awareness talks relating to Corporate membership / Professional Engineer and career in engineering.
- 5.2 Up to 31 December 2020, a total of 4123 candidates were approved for election, admission and transfer to the various grades as listed below:

5.3 Sub-Committee on Membership Applications Board (MAB)

Ir. Dr Lee Yun Fook continued to chair the Sub-Committee for the third session 2020/2021. The Sub-Committee also continued its role of vetting and assessing applications for the various grades of membership of the Institution.

5.3.1 Processing of AER, AAE and IPE/APEC International Engineer Register Applications

The Membership Applications Board's also vetted and recommended applications from members for their Asia-Pacific Economic Co-operation Engineer Register / International Professional Engineers Register, ASEAN Engineer, Associate ASEAN Engineer and Associate ASEAN Technologist membership. The following is the breakdown of applications for these Registers:

- 25 approved for the Asia-Pacific Economic Co-operation Engineer Register / International Professional Engineers Register (APEC/Int.PE)
- 18 approved for ASEAN Engineer (AE)
- 22 approved for Associate ASEAN Engineer (AAE)
- 1 approved for Associate ASEAN Technologist (AET)

5.4 Sub-Committee on Membership Drive and Promotions

Ir. Dr. Aidil Chee Tahir chaired the Membership Drive and Promotions Sub-Committee (MDP) for the session 2019/2020 with the mandate to increase the number of IEM memberships through various recruitment initiatives.



During the year, MDP had organized numerous membership drive activities at several local and international universities with the objective of raising awareness and creating interest in IEM. Representatives from IEM and MDP had also delivered talks on topics such as Introduction to IEM, Route to MIEM as well as subjects relating to current issues and developments in the field of engineering. In light of the Movement Control Order imposed by the Malaysian Government due to the Covid-19 pandemic, MDP had moved towards conducting talks via on-line webinars and established a Google based membership application platform which successfully garnered 1776 student registrations for the period of July to December 2020.

In October, MDP was invited to participate in the 2020 International Project Management Conference (IPMC 2020) organized by PETRONAS. During this 4-days virtual experiential conference, MDP had the opportunity to engage with a variety of conference participants, sharing information and details about IEM.

Through the initiative efforts by MDP, IEM is set to enter into a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) in the 1st quarter of 2021. IEM is also in the midst of renewing its MOU with Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) in the near future.

MDP believes that through its activities and initiatives, IEM will continue to grow and remain an inclusive and relevant organization for all engineering practitioners moving forward.

5.5 Sub Committee on IEM Log Book Training Scheme

The Sub-Committee was chaired by Ir. Mohd Azha bin Abu Samah for session 2020/2021. The primary responsibilities of the Sub-Committee were to assess and confirm the logbooks prepared by the mentees after being reviewed and endorsed by their respective mentors. The logbooks were prepared to record and document the competencies element progress and practical working experience of the mentees' during their career as an engineer. It is also to ensure that the experience obtained can lead the engineer to accumulate adequate competency elements, experience, and readiness to sit for the Professional Interview. The logbooks are to be in conformance to the requirements of the IEM's Engineering Competency Development (ECD) Guidelines. A total of one hundred and thirty-three (133) logbooks were reviewed and recommended for endorsement by the Admission and Practical Training (APT) Standing Committee Chairman in year 2020.

The Sub-Committee has conducted various activities as part of the effort to revamp the Mentor-Mentee programme's quality in IEM. The activities recorded are as follows:

a. Engagement Sessions

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the implementation of Movement Control Order (MCO) in the country from 18 March 2020, many events were switched from physical face to face to online platform. It has given the opportunity for ECD to have their 1st ECD Webinar talk entitled Engineering Competency Development - Your Path to becoming a Professional Engineer which was organised on 18 April 2020. It was then followed by the 2nd Webinar on 16 May 2020 with the same title.

In year 2020, there were three (3) e-Workshops entitled Workshop on Managing Engineering Competency Development (ECD) Log Book had been organised. These One (1) Day workshops were conducted on 8 and 29 August 2020, and on 26 September 2020 respectively.

b. IEM's Top Mentor Award 2019

The Sub-Committee continue to organise this award as part of the effort to recognize mentor's contribution to the organization. This is an event where mentees can nominate their mentor to be recognized as top mentor in the IEM. 5.7 Special Committee on Structured Training

Ir. Mohd. Radzi Salleh continued to chair the Special Committee on Structured Training for session 2020/2021 for the sixth session. The purpose of the Structured Training programme was mainly to assist the graduate members/engineers who lacked design experience to gain the relevant experience to enable them to be eligible to sit for the Outcome Based Professional Interview. There were four (4) Search Committees that had been formed to conduct the structured training programmes. They are the Chemical, Civil, Electrical and Mechanical.

For the year 2020, the Search Committee in Chemical Engineering had their first session of the 24-Saturday Structured Training Programme Design in Chemical Engineering (STPD) course on 28 September 2019 and ended on 19 September 2020. There was a delay in completing the 24-Saturday STPD programme due to the MCO and the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Search Committee on Civil Engineering also conducted a 8-Saturday Course on Structural Engineering Design. The said programme ended on 19 September 2020. The Search also planned to conduct another two more modules; one on "Construction Practice" and the other on "General Infrastructure Works & Highway Engineering". These modules would be tentatively organised in the year 2021.

The Special Committee had for the first time, organised a "One (1) hour Webinar Session on Structured Training" on 19 December 2020 (Saturday) and fifty-five (55) participants attended the event. The main objective of the webinar was an awareness programme to the members especially the young graduate members and also MIEM who wish to gain additional knowledge on engineering design.

In addition to the above, the Special Committee was also looking into joinltly collaborating with MRCB-George Kent and CREaTE, JKR on the structured training programme for their engineers/staff for the year 2021.

6. STANDING COMMITTEE ON EXAMINATIONS AND QUALIFICATIONS

6.1 Ir. Hj. Mohd Aman bin Haji Idris was the new Chairman for the session 2020/2021. The main responsibility of this Standing Committee was to regulate the professional interviews as well as working closely with the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC) on the accreditation of the Engineering Degree programmes. This Standing Committee also works with Engineering Technology Accreditation Council (ETAC) on the accreditation of the Diploma/Degree Engineering Technology programmes.

6.2 **Professional Interview Board**

Ir. Ng Yong Kong was appointed as the new Chairman of the PI Board for the session 2020/2021. The main responsibility of the Professional Interview Board was to co-ordinate the conventional and the outcome based professional interviews held at the Head Office as well as the IEM Branches. The Professional Interview Board, on behalf of the BEM also assigned Examiners for the Professional Assessment Examination (PAE) candidates of the BEM. In addition to this, the PI Board would also recommend the Professional Interview results to the Standing Committee for acceptance. For the year 2020, the PI Board together with the Sub Committee on PI Development had conducted eighteen (18) Professional Interview awareness talks and workshops for the Graduate Members and four (4) webinars of IEM Certification and Training workshops on the Outcome Based Professional Interview (fka Enhanced Professional Interview) for the Interviewers.

6.2.1 Professional Interviews

IEM approved a total of one hundred and twenty eight (128) applications for the Professional Assessment Examination (PAE) from the Board of Engineers, Malaysia (BEM) in 2020. Sixty seven (67) candidates passed whereas twenty two (22) were unsuccessful and thirty nine (39) candidates were waiting to be interviewed for the PAE.



6.3 IEM Accreditation Board

Ir. Prof. Dr. Zainal Abidin Ahmad continued to be the Chairman for the IEM Accreditation Board for session 2020/2021. The role of the IEM Accreditation Board was to assist the Engineering Accreditation Council (EAC). IEM is one of the constituents of the EAC to evaluate local Engineering Degree programmes offered by both private and public Institutions of Higher Learning (IHLs) in the country.

6.4 Sub Committee on Professional Interview Development

The Sub Committee chaired by Ir. Chen Harn Shean worked closely with the Professional Interview Board especially on conducting the outcome based Professional Interview workshops for the Candidates and also the Interviewers and Assessors. The Sub Committee is also responsible to look into further improvement to the process and to analyse the shortcomings or problems.

6.5 Professional Interview Advisory Panel

The Professional Interview Advisory Panel chaired by Ir. Tu Yong Ng was formed mainly to provide assistance, advice and guidance to the candidates who failed the Professional Interview (PI) especially on the areas that the candidates are weak in. The Panel would only meet as and when there is a request from a candidate for advice on the PI. With effect from 2020, all letters issued to candidates who failed the PI would also inform candidates of this service by IEM.

6.6 Task Force on Engineering Technologists and Engineering Technicians

The Registrar of Society (ROS) has on 6 November 2020 approved the IEM Constitution Amendments, to allow four (4) additional membership grades to be incorporated for Engineering Technologist and Engineering Technician. The amendment of the constitution is to promote inclusiveness in the engineering fraternity.

A Task Force on Engineering Technologists and Engineering Technicians headed by Ir. Fam Yew Hin was subsequently formed and the first formal meeting was held on 25 November 2020. The objective of such Task Force is to formalise the planning, admission procedure, recruitment as well as establishing a pathway/route for engineering technologists and technicians.

The formal recruitment of these four (4) membership grades is currently planned to be launched in second quarter of 2021.

7. STANDING COMMITTEE ON INFORMATION AND PUBLICATIONS

7.1 For Session 2020/2021, the Standing Committee was chaired by Ir. Dr. Leong Wai Yie. The Standing Committee is responsible for the publication of the IEM monthly Jurutera bulletin, the IEM Journal, the IEM Directory, the website and the library. In the year under review, the Standing Committee met regularly on every 2nd Tuesday of the month.

7.2 Jurutera

The Chief Editor and Bulletin Editor for the session were Ir. Dr. Leong Wai Yie and Ir. Dr. Bhuvendhraa Rudrusamy respectively. Twelve issues of the bulletin were published for the year 2020. The titles for the issues are:

7.4 IEM Directory 2015/2016

The Standing Committee had decided not to publish any hard copies of the IEM directory. The last printed IEM directory (printed copy and CD) was produced in 2016. An online directory which is updated "real time" is made available on the IEM website.

7.5 **IEM Website and Homepage**

The Standing Committee continued to monitor and improve the webpage. Efforts were made to make the website more user-friendly and to keep members updated with useful announcements.

7.6 Library

The Sub Committee on Library chaired by Ir. CMM Aboobucker met 9 times in the year 2020. Three more representatives of Technical Divisions joined our Sub Committee from July 2020. About five meetings were held on-line.

This year we added 88 new of physical books to our library collections, increasing from 7,135 books in 2019 to 7,223 books in 2020. The titles cover numerous disciplines. Apart from engineering and management topics, there are books on other general topics which are of interest to the engineering fraternity, e.g. social media strategies, cyber security, artificial intelligence (AI), health and disease control, risk analysis, management and modern manufacturing. Our focus in future will be on acquiring more electronic books. The IEM library has acquired 431 e-books on engineering and technology topics by end of year 2020. These collections are very popular among members especially during this pandemic COVID-19.

Apart from technical books, online Journals in the field of Geotechnical Engineering also can be accessed. These are NRC Canadian Geotechnical Journal and ASCE Journal of Geotechnical and Geoenvironmental Engineering. Besides these ICE Journals are also available in three popular titles which are Geotechnique, Geotechnical Engineering and Ground improvement.

Sub Committee on Library also organised a Webinar Talk last December 2020. The Speaker, Ir. Gary Lim illustrated how members in the academic field as well as in consultancy could use the various electronic books to their quick reference and advantage. Regular announcements and information on new physical books as well as eBooks are made through the IEM Portal under the heading, "Benefit and Services". Announcements are also made during IEM events and through TV display screen at Bangunan Ingenieur located near the Lift lobby entrance. Members who wish to borrow physical books can reserve them through the IEM Portal.

The IEM Library also has continuously liaised with SIRIM Technical Library in providing a service to borrow local and international Standards through SIRIM Membership Card. Members can use this SIRIM Membership Card and loan the required materials except Malaysia Standards, journals, and technical reports. Borrowed materials (up to a limit of 15 items) are to be returned within two weeks. Many members in the academic and consulting field use this facility.

8. STANDING COMMITTEE ON ACTIVITIES

8.1 The Standing Committee was chaired by Vice President, First Admiral Dato' Ir. Haji Ahmad Murad bin Haji Omar (R) for session 2020/2021 while the Vice Chair is Ir. Gunasegaran a/l Kristnan.

The Standing Committee continues to supervise the activities of Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups, Sections and Branches of the IEM. The main objective of this Standing Committee is organising Technical Talks, Technical Visits, Seminars/Courses, Conferences, Social Events and all other activities.

Since COVID-19 first recorded and spreading around the world the planet sending billions into lockdown, all have no choice than to adjust themselves to a "new normal", meaning a new way of living and going about our lives, working and interactions with other people. Due to this, most events are being organised via virtual platform instead of via physical event.

IEM have successfully conducted a very good numbers of virtual events via 'GoToWebinar' and 'Zoom Platform' for our Technical Talks, Seminar, Workshop and Courses including online Conferences and Symposium for year 2020 for period from April – December.

Unfortunately, with the pandemic COVID-19 spreading, some of IEM's annual events were not organised, mainly IEM 60th Annual Dinner 2020, IEM Golf Tournament, IEM Bowling Tournament, Engineering Week, Engineering Run, Family Day and also few scheduled Competitions & Conferences were postponed to a later date. Technical Visits were unable to be conducted due to current KKM SOPs.

 - The Advisory Board will be the focal point of technical expertise on disaster preparedness within IEM.
 Topics involves: Floods, Haze and Wild Fires, Landslides and Rockslides, Earthquake, Coastal Erosion, Land Subsidence, Tsunami, Catastrophic Chemical Release**, etc.
 ** these are taken as large catastrophic events. Smaller fires or chemical control measures would be interest of other committees (Fire Advisory Board and/or Technical Divisions i.e. Chemical Engineering*)

(a) Webinar on Flood Disaster Standard

The event was jointly organized and hosted by ASEAN Engineering Register (AER) and was successfully attended by various engineers from ASEAN countries on 28 April 2020.

(b) Webinar on Guideline for Flood Abatement Equipment The event was jointly organized with Persatuan Insurans Am Malaysia (PIAM) on 13 August 2020 and was attended by 143 of PIAM members.

9.5.3 Selangor Disaster Management Unit and Smart Selangor

IEM was an observer in the Selangor Disaster Management Unit Working Group on High Tide Flooding Phenomena. IEM also had updated and translated the guide book on high tide flooding for the working group.

9.5.4 Position Paper On The Impacts Of Sea Level Rise On Coastal Communities And Development

From the Forum on the Impact of Climate Change on Water Related Disaster, which was held on 10 October 2018 in Wisma IEM, Petaling Jaya, the committee had agreed to form a Working Group to write on the position paper on the matter. At the moment, the position paper is pending of approval from the IEM Council to proceed to the next level.



9.5.5 AFEO Working Groups

The Advisory Board (DRRAB) at its meeting agreed to nominate Ir. Loo Chee Kin (Chairman) as the main representative and the Deputy Chairman or Secretary DRRAB as the alternative representative to serve and attend this AFEO Working Group. The WG meetings will be held twice a year in conjunction with the AFEO meetings. The representative/s will need to contribute on disaster matters and also on 'Manual on Disaster of ASEAN'. 9.5.6 Position Paper On The Impacts Of Sea Level Rise On Coastal Communities And Development

From the Forum on the Impact of Climate Change on Water Related Disaster, which was held on 10 October 2018 in Wisma IEM, Petaling Jaya, the committee had agreed to form a Working Group to write on the position paper on the matter. At the moment, the position paper is pending of approval from the IEM Council to proceed to the next level.

9.5.7 Call for Experts and Volunteers

The IEM Disaster Risk Reduction Advisory Board (DRRAB) under the IEM Standing Committee on Professional Practice (PPC) is compiling a list of volunteers to join the Advisory Board team. Kindly provide your input and interest to IEM Secretariat.

9.6 Sub Committee on Standards Writing (SW)

Ir. Hj. Mohd Radzi Salleh continued to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee for 2020-2021 session to consolidate progress reports from the relevant Committee in IEM. IEM continues to provide expert opinion through representation to various Standard Malaysia Technical Committee and Working Group which previously from SIRIM.

9.7 Sub Committee on Street, Drainage & Building Act 1974 (Act 133) & Uniform Building Bylaws (Revised) 1984

Ir. Yasotha Chetty continued to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee to provide IEM's views and input to the Ministry of Urban Wellbeing, Housing and Local Government via representation to the Working Group Committees on relevant matters.

9.8 IEM Arbitrator Appointment / ADR Advisory Board

Ir. Dr. Wang Hong Kok was appointed to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee for 2020-2021 session.

9.8.1 New Member to Register as IEM Arbitrators

IEM received 7 applications to register as IEM Arbitrator. There were 2 applicants from IEM members and 3 members from outside bodies. The applications were screened by the Sub Committee of Dispute Avoidance on Resolution Practice (DARP). Only one applicant, Ir. Lai Sze Ching qualified to be enrolled. The interview session was conducted on 28 October 2020 by the Panel Board of Interview which consist of President of IEM, Chairman of PPC and 2 Arbitrators. Ir. Lai Sze Ching has successfully appointed as IEM Arbitrator in Mechanical Engineering discipline.

9.9 Sub Committee on Screening of Complaints and Queries

Ir. Khoo Choong Keow continued to serve as the Chairman of the Sub Committee to screen the complaints made against members on grounds of ethics, unfair dismissal, professional misconducts, unethical practice of Professional Engineers and other issues.

The Sub Committee will determine whether such complaints warrant a need to set up disciplinary Adhoc Committee to hear such cases. During the 2020 session, the complaint received are as follow:

(a) The Complaint against IEM member on Plagiarism.

The complainant claimed that the respondent had used his idea and concept of PHD for the respondent's full bright award. The complaint was screened by the Screening Committee of Complaint to give a recommendation as to whether an Investigation Committee needs to be set up. The Committee had interviewed the complainant to understand the nature of the complaint on 23 September 2020. The Committee further requested the Respondent to provide an explanation of the complaint against him. The matter is still under investigation.

(b) Misconduct of Professional Engineer in Bintulu.

The complaint is between the house buyer and the developer. The developer was said to have paid a substantial amount of money to BDA engineer through its consultant. It was claimed that the consultant company had falsely certified the infrastructure work constructed in full compliance with the approved plan. The consultant company was represented by an engineer who is IEM member. The complainant requested IEM to investigate if the consultant company had breached its professional conduct. A letter from IEM was sent to the complainant to refer the matter to the Board of Engineers Malaysia as the nature of the complaint made against the company.



(c) Drawing Layout Endorsement Issue.

IEM received an email from IEM members regarding the drawing of the layout endorsement which was rejected by the DOE of Perak. The endorsement was invalid due to the fact that his qualification does not match the required discipline. The Committee confirmed that the qualification of the Submitting Person must be in line with the registered discipline and not by experience. A letter was issued to the member to seek clarification from BEM as IEM is not a regulatory body to decide on this issue.

9.10 Sub Committee on Legislation Affecting Engineering Profession

Ir. Lai Sze Ching continued his service to provide regular updates and information on the following legislation on how such legislation would impact the engineering profession:

9.11 **Outside Bodies Representation (OBR)**

The appointed Chairman, Ir. Dr. Wang Hong Kok continues to oversee representatives to attend and participate by maintaining and establishing close rapporteur and participate into various government agencies in meetings with various outside bodies between IEM with Local Authorities and Government sector.

As for this exercise, the Secretariat reports and refers all incoming invitations made by external parties by referring and consult with the IEM President assisted by the PPC Chairman, IEM Honorary Secretary and relevant Committees Chairmen to appoint and identify IEM representatives to attend external meetings and events whilst, the PPC Secretariat handles the necessary administrative works.

Currently, more than 100 members from IEM Excomm, Council and the respective Standing Committee, Technical Divisions, Special Interest Groups (SIG), Young Engineers Section (YES) and branch representatives representing IEM in more than 150 technical committees, working groups, opening ceremonies, dinner, events, dialogue and meetings at various local governments, agencies, institutions, and universities.

All representatives attended the external meetings will be required to produce a copy of the Outside Bodies Representation (OBR) report form within a week from the meeting date. All incoming reports will be tabled at the monthly meeting of the Standing Committee on Professional Practice, Technical Divisions and thereafter will be reported to the President or Excomm if there is any matter that require further deliberation or decision.

IEM also continues to provide and assist with comments and input required by the industries such as Department of Standards Malaysia (DSM), Bomba, SIRIM and Jabatan Kerja Raya (JKR) by participating and serving as committee members in various meetings, dialogues and workshops. Aside from all this, IEM also continues to support other locals and international events and become one of the jointly organized and supporters without financial commitment. For these events supported by IEM, the organizers have been provided with an IEM logo for their promotional materials. In return, IEM will be given the proceedings of the conferences for the library and also complimentary seats to attend the conference.

Most of the details received has been uploaded regularly into IEM website (refer to https://www.myiem.org.my/content/ related_to_engineering_services_database-855.aspx) and also forwarded to Library and InfoPub for dissemination to IEM members.

10. STANDING COMMITTEE ON WELFARE AND SERVICE MATTERS

10.1 Ir. Prof. Dr. Ruslan bin Hassan served as Chairman for Session 2020/2021 and continued to look into means of improving the welfare and benefits to IEM members. This Standing Committee held its monthly meetings on every 3rd Tuesday of the month to discuss, review, recommend, approve and implement issues or matters pertaining to the welfare of IEM members. Activities such as the IEM Family Day and IEM Engineering Week were unfortunately been called off due to RMCO lifted during the session. Thus, Welfare coordinate more online webinar talks, which can benefit members of the Institution, were also planned and organized.

10.2 IEM Benevolent Fund

A total of 55,369.99 was received in the early year of 2020. IEM would like to record its appreciation to the members for their kind support and generosity. The balance available in the fund as at 31 December 2020 is 55,405.25.

10.3 Jurutera Wargamas (JWS) and Exempted Members

The scheme specially designed for members who are senior citizens or disabled was aimed to reducing the annual subscription for these members to an affordable amount. The affected members would need to pay 25% of the annual subscription fee with the balance to be settled from the IEM Benevolent Fund Account. For year 2020, there were 4 applications has been approved for the scheme.



10.4 IEM Job Gallery

10.4.1 *IEM Job Advertosement*

This is a job vacancy advertisement programme. The programme provides job vacancy advertisements through the IEM Website to its members and non-members who are looking for engineers on a full time/contract or on part time basis to fill job vacancies in their respective companies. Job seekers can search for their desired employment in the IEM Website under 'Job Gallery' section for the latest job vacancy advertisements. There is no charges imposed for the job vacancy advertisement.

10.4.2 Job Bank and Match-Make

Welfare also assisting members who has difficulties on finding jobs due the MCO situation. Members are invited to submit their resume into Job Bank and Welfare will assist to match with suitable vacancy available.

10.5 **IEM Family Day 2020**

In line with the safety guidelines by the Ministry of Health (MOH) Malaysia, this annual event has been cancelled for this year. However, the Recognition Award for SPM/STPM/A-Level award recipients were still being offered to the children of IEM members who achieved outstanding results in their SPM, STPM and A-Level in 2019 exam. Certificates of achievement and prize shall be given to the winners. For this year a total of 20 SPM, 2 STPM & 5 A-Level students were rewarded.

10.6 **IEM Engineering Week 2020**

No event conducted at this year.

10.7 Insurance Matters

Several insurance schemes were arranged with insurance companies for members. Some of which were with AON Brokers Malaysia Sdn Bhd on Professional Indemnity Insurance, Zurich Insurance on Life and other General Insurance.

10.8 Affinity Programmes

IEM continue to collaborate with CIMB on the affinity credit card program which would benefit IEM where 0.1% of the amount spent by members using the card would contribute as rebate to IEM. Among of the other benefits is that IEM members could also pay their annual subscription via direct debit from the card. IEM members are encouraged to apply or convert their existing card to the CIMB AFFINITY CARD as 0.1% rebates is a substantial income to IEM whereby the more you spend, the more your contribution to IEM. In year 2020, CIMB also introduced a new segment for Young Professional under the Affinity Programme.

10.9 Webinar Talks

Welfare began to organize more webinar talks that can benefit IEM members with interesting topics on health issues, leaderships and financial management. This also include additional skills for the young engineers. Welfare is actively inviting more speakers from various background to conduct webinar talks.

10.10 Other Benefit Projects

The Committee continues to negotiate with vendors and merchants to look into join collaboration for the benefit of IEM members. For the year 2019, the Committee had renewed corporate rates from Mercedes Benz, Audi, BMW & Mini, Volvo, BP Healthcare, Institut Jantung Negara, HSC Medical Center, World of Sports, Red Wing Shoes, Focus Point etc. The Sub-Committee also managed to continue the collaboration for the year 2020 with new merchants such as Wolverine, Subaru and Evolution Wellness (Chi Fitness, Celebrity Fitness, Fitness First Malaysia).

The Committee will continue to implement more activities for the welfare of members as well as providing excellent services to the members.

10.11 Financial Aid for Engineer in Distress

Understanding the struggling to survive the Covid-19 crisis and the MCO restrictions, Welfare is collaborating with Bank Islam Malaysia Berhad (BIMB) by offering financial assistance to IEM members especially to those who have lost their employment or reduced monthly income. Among the product offered are personal financing, house financing, SME and others.

11. STANDING COMMITTEE ON CORPORATE AFFAIRS

11.1 The Standing Committee continues to oversee various initiatives to improve the image of IEM. The Committee had been tasked to ensure that the position of IEM remains as the premier engineering institution in Malaysia and in the ASEAN region. This Standing Committee continues to handle also the co-ordination of the international involvement of IEM, monitors the activities of the various IEM foreign initiatives as well as looking into local issues such as



- · Forging ties with other professional bodies locally and overseas
- Representation of the Institution in public and statutory authorities and other relevant organisations
- Fostering closer rapport with them in order to enhance the public image and status of the Institution.
- · Handling affairs of PR duties as part of its monthly agenda.

Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad took over the Chairmanship from Ir. Prof. Dr. Jeffrey Chiang Choong Luin and continued to look into means of improving the image of the Institution in the eyes of its members and general public.

11.2 MoUs with Overseas Engineering Institutions

The Chairman of the Subcommittee on MoU is Ir. Hj. Mohd. Ali bin Yusoff. In the year under review IEM established Agreements / MoUs with the following institutions:

11.3 MoUs with Universities / Institutions of Higher Learning

In addition to overseas engineering institutions, IEM also embarked on signing MOU's with Universities and Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL's) in Malaysia.

However, due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, MoU signing with Institutions of Higher Leaning had to be postponed.

11.4 Interview Sessions, Press Releases and Press Statements

For the year under review, the Standing Committee continues to be active in providing press releases and press statements on various engineering issues and matter of National interest.

A total of three (3) press statements were sent and four (4) press clippings were published in the media. The press statements and clippings were uploaded onto the IEM Web Portal Newsroom for the general member's information.

11.5 Branding of IEM

In the period under review, Subcommittee on Social Media were initiated to look into means of improving the branding of the Institution and to have solid social media presence. An Instagram page was created under the name @myiem_official and growing numbers of followers after its inception.

Besides Instagram page, IEM also embarked on having a Telegram page for easier communication with its members. The page's purpose is to share IEM's latest events and activities and also to share information on various engineering issues and matter of national interest that can benefit IEM members.

11.6 "Engineers Meet the Public" Session

Based on the Key Results Areas (KRA) from the President Ir. Ong Ching Loon, IEM has to engage more activities with the public so as to have more interaction. The Standing Committee was requested to look into organizing an Engineer Meet the Public Session. Engineer Meet-the-Public Session was conceived as service to offer solutions to the general populace, who might be troubled by problems related to Engineering. Whether it is contractual dispute, technical negligence or delay of project, IEM is ready to send a member from the right discipline to assist the complainant and work out a solution. As the nurturing of future talents is of utmost importance, the platform is also open to members of the public who may wish to seek the view of professionals in the selection of Engineering courses. By offering this Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) programme that is beneficial to the needy, it is expected to raise the profile of IEM as a professional learned society that cares about the well-being of the general public.

11.7 Dialogues with Government Ministers, Government Agencies, Ministry Officials and Local Councils

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, dialogues with Government Ministers, Government Agencies, Ministry Officials and Local Councils had to be postponed. However few dialogues between IEM technical divisions and technical agencies i.e. DOSH and BOMBA were conducted online.

11.9 International Secretariat

In order to oversee the various initiatives to improve the image of Institution and the position of IEM as the leader of engineers in Malaysia and ASEAN region, this Standing Committee handles the co-ordination of the international involvement of IEM and monitors the activities of the various IEM foreign initiatives.

11.9.1 ASEAN Federation of Engineering Organisations (AFEO) Secretariat

The IEM continued to host the AFEO's Secretariat with Ir. Mohd Khir bin Muhammad taking over the position of Secretary-General for the year 2020/2021 on 25 August 2020 during the IEM AGM.

The Midterm Meeting of the AFEO Board of Governors was hosted by Board of Engineers, Cambodia from 17-27 August 2020 and again due to the pandemic COVID-19 lockdown where international travels were banned, the meeting was conducted virtually by the AFEO Secretariat based in IEM.

For the 1st time the founding members of AFEO were present at the Governing Board meeting together with representatives from various organisations including Laos.

Due to the risk posed by the pandemic still not resolved, VUSTA (Vietnam) decided to host the 38th CAFEO 2020 from 18 – 26 November 2020 via hybrid mode allowing local Vietnam engineers to participate physically while the overseas delegates attended online. Approximately 50 representatives from IEM attended the Work Group meetings and 100 participants attended the Conferences, business networking sessions, virtual exhibitions and webinar sessions. The opening ceremony of CAFEO 38 was officiated by the Deputy Prime Minister of Vietnam on 25 November 2020 with the theme "Fostering Initiatives and Actions by AFEO to Building a Sustainable and Prosperous ASEAN Community". The 38th AFEO Governing Board chaired by VUSTA with the signing of the Ha Noi Declaration took place on 26 November 2020. VUSTA then handed the chairmanship to PUJA (Brunei) who will be hosting CAFEO 39 in Bandar Seri Begawan in late 2021 with the theme "Engineering and Climate Change."

11.9.2 ASEAN Engineering Register

IEM was re-appointed to host the Secretariat of the ASEAN Engineering Register (AER). The ASEAN Engineering Register Executive Committee continue to be based at IEM Ir. Yau Chau Fong was appointed as the AER Head Commissioner on 25 August 2020 and chaired the monthly meetings to look into the affairs of the AER membership for the 10 countries.



The total membership of the various grades from IEM and TAM for the ASEAN Engineering Register in Malaysia is 2,844. The number of members registered by IEM for the grades of ASEAN Engineer (AE) and Associate ASEAN Engineer (AAE) is recorded at 2,493. The breakdown is indicated below:

11.9.3 AER National Monitoring Committee (NMC)

Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai took over the Chairmanship of this Committee. The main role of the AER NMC in IEM is to process applications for IEM members and TAM members applying to be registered as AER through TAM. The Committee also arranged for AER certificates and medallions presentation to successful applicants from IEM and TAM.

11.9.4 Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation and Engineers Mobility Forum (APEC/EMF) International Engineer Register Committee

The APEC Engineer/IntPE status in Malaysia is set up amongst three organisations namely BEM, IEM and ACEM. The BEM Board President Y.Bhg. Dato' Ir. Haji Mohamad Zulkefly bin Sulaiman chaired the National Monitoring Committee Meeting which is also based at BEM. The APEC NMC consists of two representatives each from BEM, IEM and ACEM, whereby IEM is represented by the IEM President, Ir. Ong Ching Loon, and Deputy President, Ir. Prof Dr Norlida Buniyamin.

The processing of applications from IEM members for these Registers is under the purview of the Standing Committee on Admissions and Practical Training chaired by Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai. The IEM Membership Application Board chaired by Ir. Dr. Lee Yun Fook would vet and process all applications and forward the submissions to the Standing Committee for approval. To date, a total of 462 members have registered for both the Registers.

IEM's status in the APEC/IPEA Register was reviewed by IEA in 2020 and documents for the audit had been finalized and submitted for review by the auditors from US, Hong Kong and Korea. The Review Audit was completed in December 2020 and expected to be approved at the June 20-25 IEA Meeting in Ireland.



IEM had also sent in the application to for Provisional Signatory of the International Engineering Technologists Agreement (IETA) and Agreement for International Engineering Technicians (AIET) Registers. Result will also be known at the IEA meeting in June 2021.

11.10 International Engineering Alliance (IEA)

The International Alliance Meeting (IEAM 2020) which was to be organized in South Africa too had to be cancelled due to the pandemic and the virtual online meeting was conducted by the IEA Secretariat in Wellington, New Zealand from 21-28 June 2020.

IEM was represented by the then President, Ir. David Lai Kong Phooi, Incoming President, Ir. Ong Ching Loon and Chair of the Standing Committee on Examinations and Qualifications, Ir. Prof. Dr. Norlida binti Buniyamin. IEM members who also attended meetings of the Accords/Agreement included Ir. Chen Harn Shen, Ir. Lee Boon Chong, Ir. Fam Yew Hin, Ir. Prof. Dr. Leong Wai Yie and Ir. Dr. Tan Chee Fai. Malaysia represented by BEM were granted provisional membership of the Sydney and Dublin Accords.

The next IEA meeting scheduled from 22-25 June 2021 would also be held virtually.

11.11 Federation of Engineering Institutions of Asia and the Pacific (FEIAP)

IEM continue to host the FEIAP Secretariat for another five years from 2018 until 2023 with Ir. Dr. Tan Yean Chin as the Secretary General. Prof. Dr. Hwang Wei, Provost of Northwestern Polytechnical University (NWPU) of Chinese Association of Science and Technology (CAST) continued as the FEIAP President for a second session. Dr. Charlie Than of Myanmar Engineering Council (MEngC) continued as the FEIAP President-Elect. The 28th General Assembly was also conducted virtually on zoom platform from 25 July 2020.

During the General Assembly, Y.Bhg. Tan Sri Dato' Ir. Prof. Em. Dr. Chuah Hean Teik was re-appointed as the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Engineering Education while Ir. Yeoh Su Hong maintained his chairmanship of the Youth Talent Development Working Group. The Standing Committees of FEIAP had their yearly meeting from 21- 24 July 2020 online hosted by the FEIAP Secretariat based in IEM.

The 29th General Assembly to be hosted by Philippines Technological Council (PTC) would be held in Cebu Island, Philippines in conjunction with the 5th FEIAP Convention on 24- 26 July 2021.

11.12 Federation of Engineering Institutions of Islamic Countries (FEIIC)

The IEM representatives appointed by Excomm were Ir. Mohd Khir Muhammad, Ir. Dr. Norlida Buniyamin and Ir. Prof. Dr. Ruslan Hassan. Ir. Prof. Dr. Ruslan presence would be on self-financing basis. Dr. Jamil Jarallah Bagawi of Saudi Council of Engineers (SCE) continued as the FEIIC President while the Deputy President is Engr. Jawed Qureshi of Pakistan Engineering Council (PEC). The Malaysian representatives, Ir. Prof. Megat Johari bin Megat Mohd Noor was elected the Vice President while Ir. Prof. Dr. Ruslan was elected as its Council member.

There was no meeting held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

11.13 World Federation of Engineering Organisations (WFEO)

Prof. Gong Ke took over the Presidency of WFEO with Engr. Mustafa bin Shehu of Nigerian Society of Engineers (NSE) being elected as the Executive Vice President of WEFO. The President-Elect is José Manuel Vieira of FEANI, the European Federation of National Engineering Associations.

IEM's official representatives to WFEO are the President and Hon Secretary. WFEO GA 2021 hosted by Colegio Federado de Ingenieros y de Arquiectos de Costa Rica (CFIA) is planned from 24-29 October 2021 in San Jose, Costa Rica. WFEO continue to organize webinars for its members touching on issues related to their Standing Technical Committees such as Engineering and the Environment, Women in Engineering, Engineering and Capacity Building etc. The WFEO President held webinar sessions with the members' jurisdiction providing General Information on WFEO activities and plan for the coming year.

IEM would continue to support all the activities of WFEO, the latest being activities held in conjunction with the World Engineering Day on 4 March 2021.

11.14 Commonwealth Engineers Council (CEC)

CEC had been re-accredited by the Commonwealth Secretariat in 2021.

11.16 International Tunnelling Association (ITA)

Ir. Dr. Boon Chia Weng continued as the IEM representative for the ITA young members with Ir. Dr. Ooi Teik Aun as the IEM representative. ITA with IEM Training Centre had organized the virtual conference for ITA-AITES World Tunnel Digital Congress 2020 (WTC 2020) and Exhibition on the 11 to 17 September 2020.

THE INSTITUTION OF ENGINEERS, MALAYSIA HONORARY TREASURER'S REPORT ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

- 1. The 2020 fiscal Statement of Accounts and the Balance Sheet of the Institution are as presented. The accounts are maintained by the Standing Committee on Finance to which the Honorary Treasurer is the Secretary.
- 2. The financial statements presented comprise of three sets of accounts. The columns denoted by "Institution" refers to the financial performance of IEM but these figures do not include the financial position of the IEM Branches who file their financial statements with the IRB of the respective states. The amalgamated accounts of all Branches are presented on page 173 to 174.
- 3. The columns denoted by "Group" refers to the consolidated accounts of IEM, IEM Training Centre Sdn Bhd and IEM Academy Sdn Bhd. There are some columns where figures are shown under "Institution" but blank under "Group" and vice versa. This is due to the figures being related party transactions which were eliminated on consolidation.
- 4. The total income for year 2020 is RM4,960,180 which is RM54,377 lower than that of year 2019. The total income included RM336,888 being net income from Institutional services, rental income RM820,520.
- 5. The drop in revenue is due mainly to lesser Surplus from activities of the Technical Divisions which only recorded RM181,583 compared to RM383,295 in 2019. Many activities had to be put on hold since March 2020 due to the imposition of Movement Control Order by the government as well as restrictions on gatherings by National Security Council and Registrar of Societies.
- 6. The main source of income continue to be annual subscriptions which amounted to RM3,385,223 for 2020 which made up approximately 68.2% of the total income of the Institution compared to 69.8% in 2019, 65% in 2018 and 51% in 2017. At the end of 2020, there was subscriptions still owing from members amounting to RM434,686 compared to RM301,645 in 2019.
- 7. The total expenditure of the Institution was RM4,983,593, which was RM183,519 lower than that of year 2019. The main operating expenditure items were personnel emoluments RM2,440,120 (49%), administrative expenses RM659,959, finance cost (term loan interest) RM60,835 and Branch Subsidies RM529,421. Branch Subsidies for West Malaysia Branches had been increased to 30% of the collection from the respective Branches with effect from 2020.
- 8. Expenses for year 2020 was 3.6% lower than 2019.
- 9. Various initiatives had been implemented to save operating costs including the move to paperless meetings in IEM thereby reducing cost of printing as well as posting of minutes of meetings/meeting documents to Committee Members. In view of the MCO and the move to the new normal, IEM decided to send digital copies of the IEM publications namely the Jurutera and Journal to members. For the first time, IEM Council election was also conducted via e-Balloting.
- 10. Financially, IEM as an Institution, recorded a deficit of RM23,414 in financial year 2020 compared to a deficit of RM212,933 in financial year 2019.



NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Institution is a registered institution registered under the Society Act, 1966 and domiciled in Malaysia.

The registered office and principal place of office is located at Bangunan Ingenieur, Lot 60 & 62, Jalan 52/4, Peti Surat 223, Jalan Sultan, 46720 Petaling Jaya, Selangor Darul Ehsan.

The Institution is principally engaged in the business as promote and advance the science and profession of all aspects of engineering. The principal activities of the subsidiaries are described in Note 6 in the notes to the financial statements. There has been no significant changes in the nature of these principal activities of the Institution and of its subsidiaries during the financial year.

The financial statements of the Group and of the Institution are presented in the functional currency, which is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the entity operates. The functional currency of the Group and of the Institution is Ringgit Malaysia as the sales and purchases are mainly denominated in Ringgit Malaysia and receipts from operations are usually retained in Ringgit Malaysia and funds from financing activities are generated in Ringgit Malaysia.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Malaysian Private Entities Reporting Standard ("MPERS") and the constitution and by-laws of the institution.

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for the revaluation of certain assets and liabilities.

The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below:

2.1 BASIS OF CONSOLIDATION

The Group financial statements include the audited financial statements of the Institution and all of its subsidiaries. Subsidiaries are those companies in which the Group has power, directly or indirect, to exercise control over the financial and operating policies so as to obtain benefits from its activities. Investments in subsidiaries are stated at cost less impairment losses.

All inter-company transactions, balances and resulting unrealised gains are eliminated; unrealised losses are also eliminated unless cost cannot be recovered. Where necessary, adjustments are made to the financial statements of subsidiaries to ensure consistency of accounting policies with those of the Group.

The financial statements of the parent and its subsidiaries are all drawn up to the same reporting date.

Subsidiaries are consolidated using the acquisition method of accounting from the date control is transferred to the Group and are no longer consolidated from the date control ceases. The results of the subsidiary companies acquired during the financial year are included in the consolidated financial statements from the date of their acquisition.

Minority interests in the consolidated balance sheets consist of the minorities' share of fair values of the identifiable assets and liabilities of the acquiree as at the date of acquisition and the minorities' share of movements in the acquiree's equity. Losses applicable to the minority in excess of the minority in excess of the minority's interest in the subsidiary's equity are allocated against the interest of the Group except to the extent that the minority has a binding obligation and is able to make good the losses.

2.2 INVESTMENTS IN SUBSIDIARIES

Investments in subsidiaries are stated at cost in the balance sheet of the Institution, and are reviewed for impairment at the end of the reporting period if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying values may not be recoverable.

On the disposal of the investments in subsidiary, the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the investments is recognised in profit or loss.

2.3 GOODWILL

Goodwill represents the excess of the fair value of purchase consideration of subsidiaries acquired over the Institution's share of the fair values of their identifiable assets and liabilities at the date of acquisition.

The carrying amount of goodwill is written down for impairment if the recoverable amount is less than its carrying value.



2.4 PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment is recognised as an asset when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Group and to the Institution and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. After recognition as an asset, an item of, property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line method so as to write off the depreciable amount of the following assets over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

Depreciation of an asset begins when it is ready for its intended use.

If there is an indication of a significant change in factors affecting the residual value, useful life or asset consumption pattern since the last annual reporting date, the residual values, depreciation method and useful lives of depreciable assets are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively.

The carrying amounts of items of plant and equipment are derecognised on disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from their use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising from the derecognition of items of plant and equipment, determined as the difference between the net disposal proceeds, if any, and the carrying amounts of the item, is recognised in profit or loss. Neither the sale proceeds nor any gain on disposal is classified as revenue.

2.5 INVESTMENT PROPERTIES

Investment property which is held to earn rentals or for capital appreciation or both, is measured initially at its cost. Transaction costs are included in the initial measurement.

After recognition as investment property, items of investment property whose fair value can be measured reliably without undue cost or effort are measured at fair value at each reporting date with changes in fair value recognised in profit or loss. If a reliable measure of fair value is no longer available without undue cost or effort for an item of investment property measured at fair value, it is thereafter account for as property, plant and equipment in accordance with Section 17 of the MPERS. The carrying amount of the investment property on that date becomes its cost.

Property interests held under operating leases are not classified and accounted for as investment property.

2.6 IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS, OTHER THAN INVENTORIES AND FINANCIAL ASSETS

At each reporting date, the Group and the Institution assesses whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.

When there is an indication that an asset may be impaired but it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of the individual asset, the Group and the Institution estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

The recoverable amount of an asset and a cash-generating unit is the higher of the fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset.

If the recoverable amount of an asset or a cash-generating unit is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised to reduce the carrying amount to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss for a cash-generating unit is firstly allocated to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cash-generating unit, and then, to the other non-current assets of the unit pro rata on the basis of the carrying amount of each appropriate asset in the cash-generating unit. Impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case it is treated as a revaluation decrease.



The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's or cash-generating unit's fair value less to sell, value in use and zero.

An impairment loss recognised in prior periods for an asset or the appropriate assets of a cash-generating unit is reversed when there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the asset's recoverable amount. An impairment loss is reversed to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation, if no impairment loss had been recognised in prior periods. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case it is treated as a revaluation increase.

2.7 FINANCIAL ASSETS

Financial assets are recognised in the statement of financial position when the Group and the Institution becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, financial assets are measured at transaction price, include transaction costs for financial assets not measured at fair value through profit or loss, unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction for the counterparty to the arrangement.

After initial recognition, financial assets are classified into one of three categories: financial assets measured at fair value through profit or loss, financial assets that are debt instruments measured at amortised cost, and financial assets that are equity instruments measured at cost less impairment.

i) Financial Assets At Fair Value Through Profit Or Loss

Financial assets are classified as at fair value through profit or loss when the financial assets are within the scope of Section 12 of the MPERS or if the financial assets are publicly traded or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably without undue cost or effort.

Changes in fair value are recognised in profit or loss.

If a reliable measure of fair value is no longer available for an equity instrument that is not publicly traded but is measured at fair value through profit or loss, its fair value at the last date that instrument was reliably measurable is treated as the cost of the instrument, and it is measured at this cost amount less impairment until a reliable measure of fair value becomes available.

ii) Financial Assets That Are Debt Instruments Measured At Amortised Cost

After initial recognition, debt instruments are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Debt instruments that are classified as current assets are measured at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be received.

Effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of financial assets and of allocating the interest income over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimate future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial assets or, when appropriate, a shorter period, to the carrying amount of the financial assets.

iii) Financial Assets That Are Equity Instruments Measured At Cost Less Impairment

Equity instruments that are not publicly traded and whose fair value cannot otherwise be measured reliably without undue cost or effort, and contracts linked to such instruments that, if exercised, will result in delivery of such instruments, are measured at cost less impairment.

iv) Impairment Of Financial Assets

At the end of each reporting period, the Group and the Institution assesses whether there is any objective evidence that financial assets that are measured at cost or amortised cost, are impaired.

Objective evidence could include:

- significant financial difficulty of the issuer; or
- a breach of contract; or
- the lender granting to the borrower a concession that the lender would not otherwise consider; or
- it becoming probable that the borrower will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation; or
- observable data indicating that there is a measurable decrease in the estimated future cash flows from the financial assets since the initial recognition of those assets.



For certain category of financial assets, such as trade receivables, if it is determined that no objective evidence of impairment exists for an individually assessed financial asset, whether significant or not, the assets are included in a group with similar credit risk characteristics and collectively assessed for impairment.

Impairment losses, in respect of financial assets measured at amortised cost, are measured as the differences between the assets' carrying amounts and the present values of their estimated cash flows discounted at the assets' original effective interest rate.

If there is objective evidence that impairment losses have been incurred on financial assets measured at cost less impairment, the amount of impairment losses are measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the best estimate of the amount that the Group and the Institution would receive for the asset if it were to be sold at the reporting date.

The carrying amounts of the financial assets are reduced directly, except for the carrying amounts of trade receivables which are reduced through the use of an allowance account. Any impairment loss is recognised in profit or loss immediately. If, in subsequent period, the amount of an impairment loss decreases, the previously recognised impairment losses are reversed directly, except for the amounts related to trade receivables which are reversed to write back the amount previously provided in the allowance account. The reversal is recognised in profit or loss immediately.

v) Derecognition Of Financial Assets

Financial assets are derecognised when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial assets expire, or are settled, or the Group and the Institution transfers to another party substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial assets.

On derecognition of financial assets in their entirety, the differences between the carrying amounts and the sum of the consideration received and any cumulative gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period of the transfer.

2.8 SUBSCRIPTION IN ARREARS

Subscription in arrears of one year and more and where, in the opinion of the Council, are no longer recoverable from its members are written off to the statements of income and expenditure.

2.9 CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents in the statement of cash flows comprise cash and bank balances, short-term bank deposits and other short-term, highly liquid investments that have a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition, net of bank overdrafts.

2.10 CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

Fund raised from members for the purchase of property, plant and equipment are capitalised as Capital Reserve Fund.

2.11 LIBRARY FUND

Enrolment fee received from corporate members for library membership of the Institution and donation received from members or non-members for capital expenditure of the library are capitalised as Library Fund.

2.12 BUILDING FUND

Funds and donations received from members for the purchase of Wisma IEM are capitalised in Building Fund. A separate bank account has been kept for the fund.

2.13 STEM FUND

STEM stands for Science, Technologies Engineer Malaysia. It is a fund collected from members for student.

2.14 LIABILITIES AND EQUITY

i) Classification Of Liabilities And Equity

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified in accordance with the substance of the contractual arrangement, not merely its legal form, and in accordance with the definitions of a financial liability and an equity instrument.

2.15 PROVISIONS

A provision is recognised when the Group and the Institution has an obligation at the reporting date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The risks and uncertainties are taken into account in reaching the best estimate of a provision. When the effect of the time value of money is material, the amount recognised in respect of the provision is the present value of the expenditure expected to be required to settle the obligation.

2.16 LEASES

Operating Leases

A lease is classified as an operating lease if it does not transfer substantially all the risks and rewards incidental to ownership. Lease payments under operating leases are recognised as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

2.17 FINANCIAL LIABILITIES

Financial liabilities are recognised in the statement of financial position when the Group and the Institution becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, financial liabilities are measured at transaction price, include transaction costs for financial liabilities not measured at fair value through profit or loss, unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction for the Group and the Institution to the arrangement.

After initial recognition, financial liabilities are classified into one of three categories: financial liabilities measured at fair value through profit or loss, financial liabilities measured at amortised cost, or loan commitments measured at cost less impairment.

i) Financial Liabilities Measured At Fair Value Through Profit Or Loss

Financial liabilities are classified as at fair value through profit or loss when the financial liabilities are within the scope of Section 12 of the MPERS or if the financial liabilities are publicly traded or their fair value can otherwise be measured reliably without undue cost or effort.

If a reliable measure of fair value is no longer available for an equity instrument that is not publicly traded but is measured at fair value through profit or loss, its fair value at the last date that instrument was reliably measurable is treated as the cost of the instrument, and it is measured at this cost amount less impairment until a reliable measure of fair value becomes available.

ii) Financial Liabilities Measured At Amortised Cost

After initial recognition, financial liabilities other than financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss when the financial liabilities are derecognised or impaired.

Effective interest method is a method of calculating the amortised cost of financial liabilities and of allocating the interest expense over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimate future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liabilities or, when appropriate, a shorter period, to the carrying amount of the financial liabilities.

iii) Loan Commitments Measured At Cost Less Impairment

Commitments to receive loan that meet the conditions of Section 11 of the MPERS are measured at cost less impairment.

iv) Derecognition Of Financial Liabilities

Financial liabilities are derecognised when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires.

Any difference between the carrying amounts of the financial liabilities derecognised and the consideration paid is recognised in profit or loss.



2.18 REVENUE

i) Member's subscription fee

Member's subscription fee is payable annually at the beginning of the financial year. Only that subscription which is attributable to the current financial year is recognised as income. Subscription relating to periods beyond the current financial year is taken up in the statements of financial position as subscription in advance under current liabilities. Subscription is payable in full irrespective of the date of resignation of members during the financial year.

ii) Advertisement in Bulletin / Journal

Advertisement income receivable for the placement of advertisement in bulletin / journal published by the Institution is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

iii) Rental income

Rental income is recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

iv) Credit cards commission

Credit cards commission from the banks are recognised when the right to receive payment is established.

v) Interest income

Interest income is recognised on accruals basis using the effective interest methods.

vi) Dividend income

Dividend income is recognised when the right to received payments is established.

2.19 EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS

i) Short-Term Employment Benefits

Short-term employment benefits, such as wages, salaries and other benefits, are recognised at the undiscounted amount as a liability and an expense when the employees have rendered services to the Group and the Institution.

The expected cost of accumulating compensated absences are recognised when the employees render services that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences. The expected cost of non-accumulating compensated absences, such as sick and medical leaves, are recognised when the absences occur.

The expected cost of accumulating compensated absences are measured at the undiscounted additional amount expected to be paid as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the end of the reporting period.

The expected cost of profit-sharing and bonus payments are recognised when the Group and the Institution has a present legal or constructive obligation to make such payments as a result of past events and a reliable estimate of the obligation can be made. A present obligation exists when the Group and the Institution has no realistic alternative but to make the payments.

ii) Defined Contribution Plan

Contributions payable to the defined contribution plan are recognised as a liability and an expense when the employees have rendered services to the Group and the Institution.

2.20 INCOME TAX

Tax expense is recognised in profit or loss, except that a change attributable to an item of income or expense recognised as other comprehensive income is also recognised in other comprehensive income.

Tax payable on taxable profit for current and past periods is recognised as a current tax liability to the extent unpaid. If the amount paid in respect of the current and past periods exceeds the amount payable for those periods, the excess is recognised as a current tax asset.

Current tax assets and liabilities are measured at the amounts expected to be paid or recovered, using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the reporting date.



Current tax liabilities and assets are offset if, and only if the Group and the Institution has a legally enforceable right to set off the amounts and plan either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Deferred tax is provided in full on temporary differences which are the differences between the carrying amounts in the financial statements and the corresponding tax base of an asset or liability at the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all taxable temporary differences that are expected to increase taxable profit in the future. Deferred tax assets are recognised for all deductible temporary differences that are expected to reduce taxable profit in the future and the carry forward of unused tax losses and unused tax credits.

Deferred tax liabilities and assets are not recognised in respect of the temporary differences associated with the initial recognition of an asset or a liability in a transaction that is not a business combination and at the time of the transactions, affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit. Deferred tax liabilities are also not recognised for temporary difference associated with the initial recognition of goodwill.

Deferred tax liabilities and assets reflect the tax consequences that would follow from the manner in which the Group and the Institution expects to recover or settle the carrying amounts of their assets and liabilities and are measured at the tax rates and laws that are expected to apply to the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the reporting date.

3. CRITICAL ACCOUNTING JUDGEMENTS AND KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

3.1 CRITICAL JUDGEMENTS IN APPLYING THE ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The judgements, apart from those involving estimations described below, that management has made in the process of applying the accounting policies and that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognised in the financial statements, other than those disclosed in the Notes, are as follows:

i) Contingent Rental

The Group and the Institution has entered into tenancy agreements for the lease of land and staff housing, which contain contingent rental features based on predetermined revenue thresholds. The Group and Institution has determined that these contingent rental features are not embedded derivatives to be separately accounted for due to the economic characteristics and risks of these contingent rental features are closely related to the economic characteristics and risks of the underlying tenancy agreements. There are no leverage features contained within these contingent rental features.

3.2 KEY SOURCES OF ESTIMATION UNCERTAINTY

The key assumptions concerning the future, and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the reporting date, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next year, other than those disclosed in the Notes, are as follows:

i) Depreciation Of Property, plant And Equipment

The estimates for the residual values, useful lives and related depreciation charges for the property, plant and equipment are based on commercial factors which could change significantly as a result of technical innovations and competitors' actions in response to the market conditions. The Group and the Institution anticipates that the residual values of its property, plant and equipment will be insignificant. As a result, residual values are not being taken into consideration for the computation of the depreciable amount. Changes in the expected level of usage and technological development could impact the economic useful lives and the residual values of these assets, therefore future depreciation charges could be revised.

ii) Impairment Of Goodwill On Consolidation

The Group determines whether goodwill on consolidation is impaired at least on an annual basis. This requires an estimation of the value-in-use of the subsidiaries to which goodwill is allocated. Estimating a value-in-use amount requires management to make an estimate of the expected future cash flows from the subsidiaries and also to choose a suitable discount rate in order to calculate the present value of those cash flows.

The calculation of the value-in-use amount is most sensitive to the following assumptions:

- (a) Budgeted gross margin. Gross margins are based on historical averages achieved in the preceding three (3) financial years, adjusted to reflect anticipated efficiency and productivity improvements.
- (b) Growth rates. The forecasted growth rates are based on published industry data and do not exceed the sustainable long-term average growth rate for the relevant industries.



- (c) Pre-tax discount rates. The discount rates reflect current market assessment of specific risks of the subsidiaries. These discount rates have consistently been used by management as the benchmark rates in project appraisals of the subsidiaries.
- iii) Income Taxes

There are certain transactions and computations for which the ultimate tax determination may be different from the initial estimate. The Group and the Institution recognises tax liabilities based on its understanding of the prevailing tax laws and estimates of whether such taxes will be due in the ordinary course of business. Where the final outcome of these matters is different from the amounts that were initially recognised, such difference will impact the income tax expense and deferred tax balances in the year in which such determination is made.

iv) Impairment of Receivables

An impairment loss is recognised when there is objective evidence that a financial asset is impaired. Management specifically reviews its loans and receivables financial assets and analyses historical bad debts, customer concentrations, customer creditworthiness, current economic trends and changes in the customer payment terms when making a judgement to evaluate the adequacy of the allowance for impairment losses. Where there is objective evidence of impairment, the amount and timing of future cash flows are estimated based on historical loss experience for assets with similar credit risk characteristics. If the expectation is different from the estimation, such difference will impact the carrying value of receivables.







NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2020

1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The Institution is a registered institution registered under the Society Act, 1966 and domiciled in Malaysia.

The principal office is situated at Bangunan Ingenieur, Lot 60 & 62, Jalan 52/4, Peti Surat 223, Jalan Sultan, 46720 Petaling Jaya, Selangor Darul Ehsan.

The Education Fund of the Institution of Engineers, Malaysia is principally to contribute towards further progress and advancement of all disciplines of the engineering profession by the provision of scholarships and educational loans and also the provision of grants for seminars, conferences, research and other related engineering education activities. There have been no significant changes in the nature of these principal activities of the Institution during the financial year.

The financial statements of the Institution are presented in the functional currency, which is the currency of the primary economic environment in which the entity operates. The functional currency of the Institution is Ringgit Malaysia as the sales and purchases are mainly denominated in Ringgit Malaysia and receipts from operations are usually retained in Ringgit Malaysia and funds from financing activities are generated in Ringgit Malaysia.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis unless otherwise stated.

The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below:

2.1 PLANT AND EQUIPMENT

The cost of an item of plant and equipment is recognised as an asset when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Institution and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. After recognition as an asset, an item of plant and equipment are measured at cost less any accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses.

Depreciation is provided on a straight-line method so as to write off the depreciable amount of the following assets over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

Office equipment	10%
Furniture and fittings	10%
Computers	40%

Depreciation of an asset begins when it is ready for its intended use.

If there is an indication of a significant change in factors affecting the residual value, useful life or asset consumption pattern since the last annual reporting date, the residual values, depreciation method and useful lives of depreciable assets are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively.

The carrying amounts of items of plant and equipment are derecognised on disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from their use or disposal. Any gain or loss arising from the derecognition of items of plant and equipment, determined as the difference between the net disposal proceeds, if any, and the carrying amounts of the item, is recognised in profit or loss. Neither the sale proceeds nor any gain on disposal is classified as revenue.

2.2 INTANGIBLE ASSETS

Intangible assets are measured on initial recognition at cost. Following initial recognition, intangible assets are carried at cost less any accumulated amortisation and impairment losses, if any. The useful lives of intangible assets assessed to be finite are amortised on a straight line basis over the estimated economic useful lives. The amortisation period and the amortisation method for an intangible asset with a finite useful life are reviewed at least at each reporting date.

Intangible assets that have been capitalized are amortised on a straight line basis over the period of their expected benefit, but not exceeding 5 years commencing from the period when the intangible assets are available for use.

Gain or loss arising from derecognition of an intangible asset is measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised.

2.3 IMPAIRMENT OF ASSETS, OTHER THAN INVENTORIES AND FINANCIAL ASSETS

At each reporting date, the Institution assesses whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the recoverable amount of the asset is estimated.



When there is an indication that an asset may be impaired but it is not possible to estimate the recoverable amount of the individual asset, the Institution estimates the recoverable amount of the cash-generating unit to which the asset belongs.

The recoverable amount of an asset and a cash-generating unit is the higher of the fair value less costs to sell and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset.

If the recoverable amount of an asset or a cash-generating unit is less than the carrying amount, an impairment loss is recognised to reduce the carrying amount to its recoverable amount. An impairment loss for a cash-generating unit is firstly allocated to reduce the carrying amount of any goodwill allocated to the cashgenerating unit, and then, to the other non-current assets of the unit pro rata on the basis of the carrying amount of each appropriate asset in the cash-generating unit.

Impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at a revalued amount, in which case it is treated as a revaluation decrease.

The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's or cash-generating unit's fair value less to sell, value in use and zero.

An impairment loss recognised in prior periods for an asset or the appropriate assets of a cash-generating unit is reversed when there has been a change in the estimates used to determine the asset's recoverable amount. An impairment loss is reversed to the extent that the asset's carrying amount does not exceed the carrying amount that would have been determined, net of depreciation, if no impairment loss had been recognised in prior periods. A reversal of an impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss, unless the asset is carried at revalued amount, in which case it is treated as a revaluation increase.

2.4 FINANCIAL ASSETS

Financial assets are recognised in the statement of financial position when the Institution becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

On initial recognition, financial assets are measured at transaction price, include transaction costs for financial assets not measured at fair value through profit or loss, unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction for the counterparty to the arrangement.

2.5 CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents in the statement of cash flows comprise bank balances and short-term bank deposits that have a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition.

2.6 PROVISIONS

A provision is recognised when the Institution has an obligation at the reporting date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

The risks and uncertainties are taken into account in reaching the best estimate of a provision. When the effect of the time value of money is material, the amount recognised in respect of the provision is the present value of the expenditure expected to be required to settle the obligation.

2.7 FINANCIAL LIABILITIES

Financial liabilities are recognised in the statement of financial position when the Institution becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. On initial recognition, financial liabilities are measured at transaction price, include transaction costs for financial liabilities not measured at fair value through profit or loss, unless the arrangement constitutes, in effect, a financing transaction for the Institution to the arrangement.

2.8 INCOME RECOGNITION

i) Interest income

Interest income is recognised n accruals basis using the effective interest method.

ii) Donation received

Donation is recognised in the statement of income and expenditure on cash receipt basis.



2.9 EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

i) Short-Term Employment Benefits

Short-term employment benefits, such as wages, salaries and other benefits, are recognised at the undiscounted amount as a liability and an expense when the employees have rendered services to the Company.

The expected cost of accumulating compensated absences are recognised when the employees render services that increase their entitlement to future compensated absences. The expected cost of non-accumulating compensated absences, such as sick and medical leaves, are recognised when the absences occur.

The expected cost of accumulating compensated absences are measured at the undiscounted additional amount expected to be paid as a result of the unused entitlement that has accumulated at the end of the reporting period.

The expected cost of profit-sharing and bonus payments are recognised when the Company has a present legal or constructive obligation to make such payments as a result of past events and a reliable estimate of the obligation can be made. A present obligation exists when the Company has no realistic alternative but to make the payments.

10. SIGNIFICANT EVENT DURING THE FINANCIAL YEAR

The outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 ("COVID-19") in early 2020 has affected the business and economic environments of the Company. The governments and various private corporations have taken different measures to prevent the spread of the virus such as travel bans, quarantines, closures of non-essential services, social distancing and home quarantine requirements which impacted businesses, our customers and the Institution's operations directly or indirectly.
