Day 2 (17 Nov, Wednesday) 7.00 – 8.00am 8.30am - 1.00pm 2.00pm – 9.00pm	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Breakfast at hotel CIE – IEM International Symposium at the Fubon International Conference Center, South Road, Taipei Visit to Marty's Shrine, the shrine's grand and magnificent architectural style is similar to that of the Taihe Dian Imperial Palace in Beijing. Then proceed to the National Palace Museum, located in the Waishuanghsi neighbourhood of the Shihlin District, is the pride of Taiwan. It ranks as one of the four best museums in the world, in a class with the Louvre, the British Museum and the Metropolitan Museum of Art. Visit to Pixiu Culture Center then to Shilin Night Market, the night market encompasses two distinct sections sharing a symbiotic relationship: a section formerly housed in the old Shihlin Market building containing mostly food vendors and small eateries; and the surrounding businesses and shops selling other nonfood items. The food court holds 539 stalls, and the second floor serves as a parking lot for 400 cars. Dinner of Taiwan Local Food in Shihlin Market at own expenses.
Day 3 (18 Nov, Thursday) 7.00 – 8.00am 8.30am - 6.00pm 7.30pm	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Breakfast at hotel Visit to Hsin-Chu Scientific Park and the neighbouring area. The Scientific Park was established by the government of the Republic of China (Taiwan) on December 15, 1980. it straddles Hsinchu City and Hsinchu County on the island of Taiwan. More than 400 high-tech companies, mainly involved in the semiconductor, computer, telecommunication, and optoelectronics industries, have been established in the park since the end of December 2003. Hsinchu Science Park (HSP) is now one of the world's most significant areas for semiconductor manufacturing. Its 400 technology companies accounted for 10% of Taiwan's gross domestic product in 2007. It is home to the world's top two semiconductor foundries, Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Company (TSMC) and United Microelectronics Corporation (UMC), both of which were established at the nearby Industrial Technology Research Institute and Taiwan is the only country that possesses a professional division-of-labor system in the semiconductor industry and also has the highest density of 12-inch wafer-producing fabs, most of which are based in the park. There is also a science-themed amusement park nearby. Next door to the science park are two of Taiwan's science and engineering powerhouses, National Chiao Tung University and National Tsing Hua University Dinner
