Synopsis

Malaysia's construction sector is entering a new era of transparency and accountability. The Government Procurement Act 2025 marks a major shift in the public procurement landscape, especially for construction, which is one of the most regulated and high-risk sectors. At the same time, anticipated amendments to the Competition Act 2010 will significantly heighten scrutiny over tendering behaviour, joint ventures, subcontracting arrangements, and pricing decisions. This webinar examines how these legal developments intersect, and what they mean for contractors, consultants, developers and legal advisors. Participants will gain a clear understanding of competition law risks in construction, the red flags that commonly trigger investigation, and practical strategies to strengthen compliance and manage exposure in upcoming projects.
